THIS WEEK FOR THE BLUE RAIDERS ...

The Middle Tennessee Blue Raiders and second-year head coach Scott Ginn begin the season with a trip to the Southern Miss Tournament in Hattiesburg, Miss., Friday, August 31-Sunday, September 2. MT will face the homestanding Golden Eagles at 5 p.m. on Friday before taking on Nicholls State at 1 p.m. Sunday.

The Blue Raiders return 10 letterwinners from last season's 8-11 squad, including seniors Megan Holsten, Jessica Busey and Rachael Sulkers. Junior Sarah Schulz holds the school record for career assists with 17 in her first two seasons in the Blue and White, and returns to lead the offensive attack.

MT's first opponent, Southern Miss, comes off a 9-8 season of a year ago under second-year head coach Matt Clark. The Golden Eagles finished fifth in Conference USA in 2000, and return seven starters and 14 letterwinners from last year's squad.

Nicholls State returns five starters and seven letterwinners from last year's 2-16 club. The Colonels finished seventh in the Southland Conference a year ago, and square off against the Blue Raiders on Sunday.

HOLSTEN. NEVINS NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS

Senior Megan Holsten and junior Breann Nevins were named team captains for the 2001 season by the coaching staff during preseason camp.

Holsten, a 5-6 defender from Baton Rouge, La., has started 54 of the 56 matches in which she has played during her Blue Raider career. The Episcopal High School product has three goals and seven assists for 13 points during her career, including four assists last season.

Nevins, a 5-11 defender from Newburgh, Ind., has started all 40 matches during her two seasons in the Blue and White. The Castle High School product is able to use her height to deflect crosses in the box.

GINN RAISES FITNESS LEVEL

Second-year head coach Scott Ginn instituted a fitness test for all players beginning this season, a grueling set of four short and four long runs. All eight drills have a time requirement, and no player shall receive a game jersey until the entire set is passed at one testing.

Heading into the opening weekend of play, 24 of MT's 26 players have passed the test, far ahead of Ginn's wildest expectations, especially with so many new faces in this year's program.

FRESHMEN, FRESHMEN AND MORE FRESHMEN

The 2001 edition of the Blue Raiders will feature 13 newcomers, including 12 true freshmen in addition to the 12 returning players.

Many of the newcomers will see significant playing time to begin the season, with as many as five cracking the starting lineup in the opener against Southern Miss. Second-year head coach Scott Ginn made a concerted effort to add quality skill players in addition to depth during the offseason, and has done so with the addition of 12 freshmen and one sophomore transfer.

Newcomers who could make an immediate impact include:

- Danielle LaDuke, a freshmen from upstate New York who will see lots of time as a forward. She is extremely skilled and adds a much-needed scoring punch for the Blue Raiders.
- Ashley Hicks, a freshman from Georgia who could also add scoring potential. Hicks has battled some nagging injuries during preseason practice, but when healthy she provides

- Laura Miguez, a freshman from the Dallas area has shown a tremendous amount of speed on long runs on the outside. She is still learning to use the whole field, but her speed should be a tremendous asset.
- Megan Schwanke, a freshman from North Carolina should gets lots of playing time in the central midfield. She has shown a knack for distributing the ball to the right people and has picked up the defensive system well. She battled a hip injury early in the preseason, but looks to have fully recovered.
- Lisa Langrish, a freshman from England, started off shaky but has grown comfortable with her new surroundings and teammates and it has showed in her play. Langrish has tremendous passing skills and a good shot, and given open face she can create for her other teammates from her midfield position.
- Sarah Welsh, a sophomore who came to MT after playing her freshman season at South Carolina-Spartanburg. Welsh adds depth and experience in the back, where the Blue Raiders may be strongest in 2001.

MT PICKED FIFTH BY LEAGUE COACHES

The Middle Tennessee soccer team was chosen fifth in the 2001 Sun Belt Preseason Women's Soccer Poll announced last week by the league office, as voted on by league coaches.

Florida International is expected to pick up where it left off in Sun Belt Conference competition last season. The Golden Panthers were picked first, collecting 71 points and six first-place votes from the league's head coaches to edge out the Denver Pioneers in second place. North Texas was picked third, followed by South Alabama, Middle Tennessee and Arkansas State. Three new programs round out the poll - second-year program Arkansas-Little Rock and first-year program Western Kentucky tied for seventh place, with second-year program Louisiana-Lafayette picked ninth. 2001 will be the second season of championship women's soccer competition in the Sun Belt Conference.

While last year's leading scorer for Middle Tennessee, Kenya Hickey, won't be on the field, she will be on the sideline as a graduate assistant for the Lady Raiders. Junior Sarah Schulz now holds a school-record 17 career assists, including six last season, and provides support in the offense. Sophomore Jenny Cox, a First Team All-Sun Belt honoree, finished the 2000 campaign scoring 15 points on five goals and five assists. Junior defender Sheri Robbins contributed nine points last season on three goals and three assists. In the net, senior Jessica Busey and sophomore Emily Shrum will challenge for the spot vacated by Jennifer Robb

2001 PREVIEW GINN ADDS DEPTH TO STRONG NUCLEUS

With seven of his top eight scorers returning and a recruiting class of 13, expectations are running high as Scott Ginn begins his second season at the helm of the MT program.

Gone is leading scorer Kenya Hickey to graduation, though she has joined the coaching staff as a graduate assistant for the upcoming campaign. But returning players Emily Carter, Jenny Cox, Sheri Robbins, Lindsey Bopp and Megan Holsten combined for 13 goals and 39 points in 2000, including four game-winners. With such a strong nucleus of players returning, the 2001 squad should surpass last year's win total of eight.

"We set a goal to win 12-13 games this season, which is very achievable. No team at MT has won more than 10 games in one season. We also expect to finish no worse than third in the conference. If we can accomplish those two things, and with the expanded NCAA field to 64 teams, we could very well be playing in November.

"We'll be a much better team this season, much faster and more skilled."

Junior Sarah Schulz, who led the Blue Raiders in assists for the second straight year with six, now has a school-record 17 assists in her two years in the Blue and White.

First Team All-Sun Belt honoree Jenny Cox returns for her sophomore campaign after scoring 15 points on five goals and five assists in 2000. She was the only Lady Raider to be named to the conference first team, as the departed Hickey made the second team.

Cox tallied a pair of game-winning goals last season, including the only goal of the match in a 1-0 victory over Drury. Her other game-winner was the first of two scores in the second half of a 4-2 win at Arkansas State.

Junior defender Sheri Robbins contributed nine points last season on three goals and three assists. Robbins had her only game-winning goal of the season in MT's first victory of 2000, a 3-2 triumph at Arkansas-Little Rock. The match at UALR on September 1 of last year marked the first for MT in the Sun Belt Conference after playing in the OVC for two seasons.

Sophomore midfielder Emily Carter tallied three goals and an assist, while senior Megan Holsten was third on the squad in assists with four in tallying six points last year, including the game-winning goal against conference foe Louisiana-Lafayette.

One large hole that Ginn will have to fill this season is at goalie. Jennifer Robb graduated after last season with every individual and career mark in Middle Tennessee history.

Senior Jessica Busey and sophomore Emily Shrum will vie for the starting spot in net. Busey played her first two years for the Lady Raiders but did not log any minutes last season. She has played in 10 matches during her career at MT with two starts, and has one shutout.

Shrum saw action in nine matches last season, logging 238 minutes in net as a backup for Robb. The Hendersonville, Tenn., native combined with Robb for one shutout on the season and made 14 saves.

One of Ginn's goals for this season was to add depth, and with 15 newcomers to the program, he certainly has the bodies to do that.

"We needed to add some new players with the new conference and level of playing going up, just to bring new perspective and freshness to the program."

Fourteen true freshmen and one sophomore transfer join the squad in 2001, making playing time and a starting lineup difficult to decipher when preseason camp begins in August.

"The foundation has been built here at Middle Tennessee. Now we just have to take it to the next level and build on what's been done over the last few years."

Ginn became the second head coach at Middle Tennessee, inheriting a team that posted 10 wins

the previous season and 30 victories in the program's four-year history. His first season at the helm of the MT program brought an 8-11-0 overall record, 3-4 in the Sun Belt Conference. The 2000 season marked the first year that Middle Tennessee competed in the Sun Belt in all sports, and for the soccer program it meant a step up in competition, now facing quality programs such as South Alabama, North Texas, Florida Interntational and Denver.

The 2000 squad had just four seniors and put together a three-match winning streak midway through the year before falling to Denver in the first round of the Sun Belt Tournament in Mobile, Ala. This year's squad returns eight starters and 10 letterwinners from last year's unit, and will feature 15 newcomers to the program.

Ginn posted a four-year record of 39-35-1 at Barton, and led the Bulldogs to several school records during his tenure, including wins in a season and winning percentage in a season.

During his final campaign at Barton, he led the Bulldogs to a 9-8-1 overall record with a 7-3-1 mark in the Carolinas-Virginia Athletics Conference. Ginn's charges ended their season on penalty kicks in the quarterfinals of the CVAC tournament after a 0-0 score could not determine the outcome of the game.

Ginn was a four-year letterman for the Barton men's team, serving as captain during his senior season of 1989. He went on to serve as an assistant coach for the men's team for the two seasons following his graduation.

Following his stint as an assistant at Barton, Ginn took on duties as a clinician and coach for the Stone Mountain Youth Soccer Association and assistant coach for the women's program at Berry College in Rome, Ga.

During his stay in Georgia, he led his 1993 U18 boys team to a second-place finish in the State Championships, and Berry College advanced to the NAIA national tournament after holding a ranking for the entire season.

Ginn continues to increase his knowledge base by being active in camps across the country. He has worked the All-Star Soccer Camp, Hall of Fame Soccer Camp, University of Florida Soccer Camp, and the Greensboro Dynamo Soccer Camp.

Interestingly enough, Ginn learned the game while living in Paraguay where his parents were missionaries for many years.

Prior to his college days, Ginn had already completed a four-year stint in the US Army. Ginn was a member of the 82nd Airborne Division from 1981-1985.

Ginn holds an "A" license from the United States Soccer Federation and an Advanced National Diploma from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.

Ginn recently completed his master's degree in sports administration from East Carolina Univ.
