SERIES RECORD

■ Saturday's football game between Middle Tennessee and New Mexico State will be the first-ever meeting on the gridiron between the two schools.

BLUE RAIDERS AT FLOYD

■ Since Floyd Stadium opened in 1933, the Blue Raiders have compiled an overall mark of 235-86-13 (.723), including a record 31-game win streak from 1987-94. MT is 12-4 at Floyd since the renovation in 1998 and have won eight in a row. Under Andy McCollum, the Blue Raiders are 10-2; 1-0 at home with the only losses coming to Troy State and UCF.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME

■ The Blue Raiders have found home life enjoyable under Andy McCollum. Middle Tennessee has averaged 2,252 yards per season on the turf at Floyd Stadium since McCollum's arrival. In the team's 12 games at home under Andy Mac, the offense is churning out an average of 487.2 yards per contest. To break it down even further, the Blue Raiders have accumulated 3.34 miles of offense inside Floyd Stadium under McCollum. Of the 5.846 total

yards amassed during this two-year plus span, 3,350 yards have come through the air and 2,496 have come on the ground. The Blue Raiders have also turned up the scoring at home, too. The team has rung up 522 points during this stretch for an average of 43.5 points per game. Recent history also favors the Blue Raiders as they have put up 40-plus points in six of their last seven games at Floyd Stadium.

LAST GAME FIRSTS

■ True freshman Blake Morris made his first collegiate start when he lined up at the rightside linebacker spot at Ole Miss ... LB Chris Gatlin made his first start of the season at linebacker last week ... Chris Johnson made his first start at the left outside linebacker spot since the 2000 South Florida game ... DE Wes Stephens made his first start at Ole Miss since getting the nod against Florida in 2000.

NEWSON ALONE IN SECOND

■ With his fifth touchdown catch of the season last week, senior **Kendall Newson** ran his career total to 19. That mark puts him in second place all alone on Middle Tennessee's career list. Newson needs two more TD grabs to tie

HICKS MOVES UP

■ Despite playing briefly due to a hamstring injury the past two games, sophomore **Dwone Hicks** has still inched up the all-time rushing list at Middle Tennessee. With nine carries for 79 yards at Ole Miss, Hicks ran his career mark to 2,166 yards and surpassed Kelverrick Green for eighth place on the all-time list. Hicks needs 87 more yards to take over seventh place from Brigham Lyons (2,250).

KELLY PASSES CREWS

■ With five points scored against Ole Miss, placekicker **Brian Kelly** ran his career point total to 111 points and surpassed Matt Crews for seventh place on the all-time points scored by kicking list. Kelly, who attempted and made his first field goal in nearly one month, needs just seven more points to take over sixth place from Dick Martin.

VERSATILE LINEMAN

■ Redshirt sophomore Brandon Westbrook started at left guard against Ole Miss, which marked the first time in his career he has started at the guard spot. It also was the third straight game Westbrook has started at a different position along the offensive line. He started at left tackle the first five games of the year, then started at right tackle at North Texas before moving in at guard vs Ole Miss. To showcase his versatility even more, Westbrook played left guard, left tackle and right tackle during the course of the Ole Miss game.

STEPHENS MAKES IMPACT

■ DE Wes Stephens, who started last week for the first time since the second game of the 2000 season, made his presence felt at Ole Miss. Stephens collected a sack, a tackle for loss,

a pass deflection and forced an intentional grounding call against the Rebels. The sack was Stephens' second of the year and the fifth of his career.

CALICO TIES SANFORD

■ Tyrone Calico's fourth quarter touchdown reception tied him with Sulecio Sanford for ninth on the Blue Raiders' all-time list. Calico, who has four TD catches on the year, now has 11 for his career and needs one more to tie Cory Simpson for eighth place.

WOODS NEW TACKLE LEADER

■ Sophomore free safety Michael Woods took over the tackle lead from linebacker Scotty Brown after collecting a season best 12 stops at Ole Miss. Woods has 45 total tackles on the season to go with three TFL's and two interceptions. Woods has averaged eight tackles a game since making the move to free safety two games ago.

JOHNSON SEES TIME

■ QB Jason Johnson saw his first extensive playing time of the season when he played all but one series at Ole Miss last week. Johnson threw for a season-high 115 yards on 11-for-25 passing to go along with his first two touchdown passes of the year. It marked just his second multiple touchdown pass game of his career (2 vs Maryland in 2000).

HEAD COACH ANDY MCCOLLUM

2000 TSWA Coach of the Year

One of the most fierce recruiters in the nation, Andy McCollum is in his third season as head coach at Middle Tennessee where he owns a mark of 14-15, including a 6-5 mark in 2000. After leading the Blue Raiders to a

winning season last year in only the programs second campaign in I-A, McCollum was tabbed the 2000 Tennessee Sports Writers Association Coach of the Year.

A former coach and player under legendary Blue Raider coach Boots Donnelly, McCollum has brought with him an exciting offensive strategy and a defensive scheme predicated on speed. In his first year, the Blue Raiders set four team records and 15 single-game and/or single-season marks. The Middle Tennessee passing offense ranked 32nd in the nation, while two receivers were rated among the top 26 in catches per game. In his second season, the offense set a school record with five 40plus point games, and then added three individual single-game marks, five individual single-season records, and five individual career marks.

McCollum, who was at Middle Tennessee in the mid '80s, made his way back to Murfreesboro after nine years as an assistant at Baylor and UTEP.

In 1989, McCollum, 42, left Middle Tennessee to become wide receivers coach under offensive coordinator David Culley at Texas-El Paso. That year, UTEP was rated 10th nationally in passing. From 1990-93, McCollum was in charge of the linebackers, while doubling as the special teams coordinator.

In 1993, McCollum joined Chuck Reedy's staff at Baylor as linebackers coach and immediately earned a reputation as an outstanding recruiter and top-flight tactician. In 1995 and 1996, McCollum was rated among the top ten recruiters in the nation by Max Emfinger.

In the spring of 1995, he left for the University of Tennessee to serve as linebacker coach but returned seven weeks later to take over the role of assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at

Baylor.

VMacicom

As defensive coordinator in 1995, the Bears ranked No. 5 nationally in total defense, No. 5 in pass defense,

No. 9 in scoring defense and No. 12 in rushing defense. As special teams coordinator that

same season, the Bears were deemed as having the SWC's top unit after recording eight blocked punts and converting four of those into touchdowns.

McCollum, who was named Middle Tennessee's 13th head coach on Dec. 8, 1998, got his start in coaching when Donnelly picked up the phone in 1981 and asked him to be a graduate assistant. After just one year as a graduate assistant in which he was head coach of the junior varsity squad, McCollum was

named full-time in 1982.

From 1981-84, McCollum served as an assistant coach working with wide receivers, tight ends and special teams. In 1985, MT was ranked No. 1 in I-AA going 11-0 in regular season play. In 1988, McCollum's Blue Raider secondary led the nation in pass defense and set three new NCAA records.

During his time as an assistant at Middle Tennessee, McCollum recruited or coached the likes of Dwight Stone, Tony Burse, David Little, Don Griffin, Vince Hall, Kenny Tippens, Marty Carter, Walter Dunson, Steve Dark and Ricky Martin. All of the above are former Blue Raider greats who are either playing in the NFL or did at one time.

McCollum, from Marietta, GA, graduated from Austin Peay in 1981, where he was a four-year letterman as an offensive guard and tight end and later earned his masters degree from MT in 1983.

McCollum, who has coached eight all-Americans, 29 all-conference picks and 24 players who have moved to the NFL, is married to the former Gwen Wilkinson. The couple has one son, Drew, and a daughter, Andrea.

OVER THE AIR WAVES

All Blue Raider football games can be heard on WBOZ FM 104.9 and all across middle Tennessee on WMOT FM 89.5 and WVRY 105.1. WBOZ will be carrying Blue Raider football for the sixth straight season, while WMOT is back for a fourth straight year on the network following a six-year absence. Dick Palmer is in his 21st season as the Blue Raiders' play-by-play announcer, while former MT assistant coach Preston O'Neal is handling the color analysis for the eighth straight year. MT Marketing and Promotions director, Chip Walters, will be handling sideline commentary and locker room interviews.

LEE FOR SIX ... FINALLY

■ Sophomore running back **Reshard Lee** has had a number of big plays this season and many opportunities to get into the endzone, but the North Texas game marked his first trip across the goal line. Late in the fourth quarter, Lee rambled in from three yards out for his first collegiate touchdown. Lee led the Blue Raiders with 79 yards on a personal best 13 carries. The Brunswick, GA, native is second on the team in rushing with 493 yards to go along with an 8.1 yard average.

BRADLEY STAYS HOT

■ Senior Jykine Bradley, who is 14th nationally in interceptions, continues to prove why he is one of the better corners in the Sun Belt Conference. In week one he was voted the SBC Defensive Player of the Week following a sixtackle performance, then took team MVP honors after his effort against Troy State. Bradley collected his conference leading fourth interception at North Texas. In his last 15 games, Bradley has registered seven interceptions and has nine for his career (needs one more to tie for sixth on the all-time list).

YOUELL HAVING SOLID YEAR

■ Arguably the steadiest receiver of Middle Tennessee's potent corp of pass catchers has been junior **David Youell**. The Sevierville, TN, native is third on the team in receptions with 22 and is on pace to have his best year in terms of number of catches. Youell's top season was 2000 when he snared 30 passes for 252 yards. Youell enters the New Mexico State game with 233 receiving yards, which is only 20 yards shy of setting a new personal season best.

FORCING TURNOVERS

■ In Sun Belt Conference play, the Blue Raider defense continues to force turnovers. In four league games, the Middle Tennessee defense has registered 10 takeaways. For the year, MT has forced 13 turnovers and only three have come against non-conference foes.

SUN BELT HOME OPENER A NIGHT TO REMEMBER

■ For those associated with the football programs at Middle Tennessee and Idaho, the Oct. 6 Sun Belt battle was a first in many ways. Not only was it MT's first home SBC game, but it was a game that set or tied four NCAA team records. The two teams combined for 128 points, 1,445 yards of offense, 18 touchdowns, 67 first downs, and 166 offensive plays. Following are the NCAA records set or tied in last Saturday's 70-58 Blue

COUNTS MAKES HISTORY

■ No matter how you slice it, the night quarterback **Wes Counts** had in the win over Idaho was undoubtedly the top offensive game by any player in Blue Raider history. The southpaw set three single-game records in leading the offense to 70 points and 685 total yards. Counts broke his own school record by throwing for 459 yards on 23 of 28 passing, then put his name in the record books again with six scoring passes to snap a 34-year old mark. His third record came in the second half when he completed his 15th straight pass to break the previous mark of 13 in a row established by Kelly Holcomb against Florida State in 1991.

COMPLETION LEADER

■ Senior Wes Counts, who leads the nation in completion percentage (71.2), is the Blue Raiders' career leader in completions with 634. Entering this week's game against New Mexico State, Counts is second nationally in passing efficiency (169.36). Over his career, Counts has completed 21 or more passes in a game 13 times and eight times he has completed 26 or more passes.

STORY IDEAS

- The strength and conditioning staff charted **Kendall Newson** during a three-hour workout for a Position Demand Analysis. How many steps he walked, jogged, and ran were calculated and put into yards. They charted Newson during a morning practice in full pads. Newson walked 1,055 yards (87 reps), ran 1,505 yards (84 reps) and sprinted 1,415 yards (80 reps) for a total of 3,975 yards or 2.3 miles. Newson's longest run of the practice was 45 yards, while his shortest was five yards. Take into consideration that one football game works out to about 72 snaps.
- Middle Tennessee's **Band of Blue** is now the largest college marching band in the state of Tennessee and is tied with Michigan for the sixth largest college marching band in the nation. The Band of Blue's 350 members is larger than the University of Tennessee's Pride of the Southland Band which has 330 members.
- QB Wes Counts' father is an associate athletic director for Middle Tennessee and his mother is the academic advisor for the Blue Raider football program. Wes, who already has his degree, used to carry cable on the sidelines for current QB coach Alex Robins
- Newcomer **Kerry Wright** owns the team's top 40 time at 4.38 and the best vertical leap at 37 inches. The sophomore also turned in a time of 3.92 in the 5-10-5 short shuttle run, which would have been the third best time at the 2001 NFL Combines.
- Sophomore running back **Don Calloway** has 16 brothers and sisters. His brother Selma was a running back at Georgia.
- Former walk-on **Joey Montalbano**, who was the 2001 Lifter of the Year for the Blue Raiders, was put on scholarship during two-a-day camp which was a total surprise to the Nashville, TN native. Montalbano, who starts on MT's kickoff team, is 5-9, 200, but bench presses 390.
- QB Jason Johnson was a receiver for Warwick High School in Newport News, VA, his junior year. The quarterback for Warwick that season was a guy by the name of Michael Vick, who was an all-American at Virginia Tech.
- Starting linebacker Michael Woods, from Valdosta, GA, is the cousin of current Tennessee Titan linebacker Randall Godfrey.
- The Blue Raider coaching staff hosts over 400 Boys and Girls Club kids each year for a free clinic at Floyd Stadium. During that same week, Andy McCollum puts on a golf tournament which raised nearly \$100,000 in 2001 for the club.

BACK-TO-BACK 600

■ For the first time in school history, the Blue Raiders put together back-to-back games with over 600 yards of total offense when they accomplished the feat against Vanderbilt and Troy State. In all, the Blue Raiders have registered five 600-plus yard outings and four of those have come under head coach Andy McCollum. This year the Blue Raiders have had 608 yards at Vanderbilt (11th best total in NCAA this year), 641 yards against Troy State (4th best total in NCAA this year), then a school record 685 versus Idaho (3rd best total in NCAA this year).

200 FOR HICKS

■ All-America candidate **Dwone Hicks** has tallied two 200-yard rushing games in his career, which is only one shy of equalling the school record of three set by Joe Campbell. Hicks, who had a 311-yard game last year against Louisiana Tech, picked up his second 200+ outing in the season opener at Vanderbilt. Against the Commodores, Hicks rushed 37 times for 203 yards and four touchdowns.

BILLINGS ONE OF BEST

■ Sophomore punter **Robert Billings** has quietly been putting together a fabulous season. Billings is averaging 42.2 yards a punt and has put five of his 22 kicks inside the 20-yard line. Billings' average of 42.2 would go down as the fourth best at Middle Tennessee if the season ended today. That average would also rank 42nd nationally if Billings had enough attempts.

COUNTS FOR 300

■ Senior quarterback **Wes Counts** tossed his sixth 300-yard passing game of his career when he rang up 459 yards in the win over Idaho. Counts' six 300-yard games are the most by any signal-caller in Blue Raider history. The Murfreesboro native, who did not top the 300-yard mark in 2000, has accomplished the feat twice this year.

THE LONGEST DRIVE ... EVER

■ In the second quarter at UL-Monroe on Sept. 22, Middle Tennessee put together a 14play drive that covered 99 yards and 35 inches for a touchdown. It was the longest drive in Blue

HICKS OVER 100 ... AGAIN

■ Junior **Dwone Hicks** recorded his 11th 100-yard rushing game when he collected 169 against Idaho. Hicks had eight 100-yard games in 2000 and one in 1999. SIx of Hicks' 100-yard efforts have come at home.

NEWSON MOST PRODUCTIVE

■ Arguably the most productive wide receiver in school history is senior **Kendall Newson**. The Decatur, GA, native enters the New Mexico State game as Middle Tennessee's career leader in receptions, receiving yards and 100-yard games. The only career mark Newson does not hold is touchdowns where he is currently second with 19, but only two behind all-time leader Herbert Owenby (21).

100-YD RECEIVING GAMES

■ Under Andy McCollum, the Blue Raiders have had 17 100-yard receiving games with 16 of those coming from wide receivers and one from a running back. **Kendall Newson**, who owns the school record with 12, has had 10 under Coach Mac, while **Tyrone Calico** has registered five. **Hansford Johnson** also has

MR. VERSATILITY

■ Senior Hansford Johnson is the definition of Mr. Versatility. During his career, the wide receiver has completed 6 of 8 passes for 137 yards and three touchdowns, has returned 47 punts for 529 yards and brought back 21 kickoffs for 201 yards. All of this and he has still managed to register 100 catches for 1,043 yards and seven TDs. Last season alone, Johnson caught two touchdown passes, threw two scoring strikes and ran for a touchdown making him the first Blue Raider to pass, rush and receive a TD since Jonathan Quinn (1995). At UL-Lafayette, Johnson attempted his first pass of the year which was caught by quarterback Wes Counts for an eight-yard score.

BLUE RAIDERS GET BLOCK

■ In the win at UL-Monroe, the Blue Raiders collected their second blocked kick in the Andy McCollum era. In the third quarter, Kareem Bland blocked a ULM extra point attempt to stop the Indians momentum. The other block in the McCollum era came last year against Louisiana Tech when Michael Woods blocked a punt.

TD BLAND

■ Safety Kareem Bland has shown during his brief career that he has a knack for the end zone and making big plays. The Conley, GA, native enters the UL-Monroe game with four career touchdowns. His scores have come on two interceptions, a fumbled punt and a fumble.

LOU GROZA WATCH

■ Middle Tennessee place kicker Brian Kelly has been placed on the watch list for the Lou Groza Award for the top collegiate kicker in 2001. Kelly proved his mettle last season, connecting on 11 of 13 field goal attempts and 39 of 44 PATs. Kelly is 3-for-5 in the field goal department this season.

QUICK HITTERS

■ The Blue Raiders have been in the red zone 33 times this year and have scored 28 times (85 percent). Middle Tennessee has 26 touchdowns and two field goals.

- Middle Tennessee's 294 yards of total offense at North Texas was its fewest in a game since gaining only 211 in a loss last year at UAB.
- The 70 points scored against Idaho equals the most put up by an Andy McCollum coached team and ties for the most in I-A this season. In 1999, the Blue Raiders scored 70 points in a win over UT-Martin. Overall, it was the second most points ever scored by a Blue Raider team (76 vs North Alabama in 1927) and the fourth time an MT squad has hit the 70point mark.
- As a I-A member (29 games), the Blue Raiders have scored 50 or more points seven
- Junior David Youell's 34-yard touchdown catch at ULL was the first of his career.
- Dwone Hicks has at least one rushing touchdown in eight of his last 11 outings.
- On every third down play that **Kendall** Newson has received the ball this season (8for-9) he has gotten the first down everytime but once.

- In his last 18 games, **Dwone Hicks** has tallied 32 rushing touchdowns.
- The Blue Raiders are 12-0 under Andy McCollum when leading at the half and are 13-0 when leading a game entering the fourth quar-
- In 39 career games played, Kendall Newson has caught at least eight passes in a game 12 times.

After a record-breaking sophomore season, Dwone Hicks has picked up where he left off and is on pace for another brilliant year. Hicks enters this week's game as the nation's third leading scorer and 25th leading rusher.

In 2000, Hicks earned national attention when he rushed for 1,277 yards and 19 touchdowns to lead Middle Tennessee's 16th rated offense. The Huntsville, AL, native also finished third nationally in scoring with 126 points, was 15th in rushing, and 30th in all-purpose yards. Hicks' eyeopening performance came against Louisiana Tech when he rolled over the Bulldogs for a school record 311 yards and six touchdowns. That effort earned him national recognition on ESPN and easily gave him Independent Football Player of the Week honors.

Hicks continued to rack up the awards and recognition as the 2001 season approached. He was named preseason Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Year, making him the first-ever recipient of the honor.

2001 SEASON RECAP AND BOXSCORES

Game 1 Middle Tennessee 37, Vanderbilt 28 Aug. 30, 2001; Nashville, TN

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Middle Tennessee did what many thought couldn't be done in its opener at Vanderbilt.

Surely, this Division I-A infant couldn't go on the road and beat an established Southeastern Conference opponent, the players had heard constantly.

Too soon into their I-A voyage.

Guess what? The Blue Raiders did it, piling up 608 yards of total offense on their way to a 37-29 win in front of 39,885 at Vanderbilt Stadium.

It was the program's first win against a Southeastern Conference opponent and also MTSU's first against the Commodores in 13 tries.

It also is the biggest win in the program's rich football history, while the offensive avalanche almost was the greatest in school history. The 608 yards were second-most to the 660 put up against UT-Martin in 1990.

"I couldn't be more proud of my team," said MTSU third-year coach Andy McCollum. "I said before this game no matter what the outcome there was no other team in the nation I would want to take to Vanderbilt, and you see why. My team has worked very hard over the last two years and it has finally paid off.

"Vanderbilt should know they got beat by a very good team, and we beat a well-coached football

Seldom do games that receive so much pregame billing live up to the hype.

The opener between MTSU and Vanderbilt did. And MTSU's offense was as good as advertised, maybe better.

The ground attack, led by junior tailback Dwone Hicks' game-high 203 yards and four touchdowns, accounted for 300 total yards, while the savvy senior quarterback went the distance and was 27-of-36 for 308 yards, no turnovers and sealing the win with a 9-yard scoring run on a fourth-and-7 play with 21 seconds remaining.

"I have no excuses," Vanderbilt coach Woody Widenhofer said. "MTSU came in and played very well and just plain beat us. They deserve to win. This is one of the toughest losses I have ever been a part of. I rank it right up there with the Kentucky loss that cost us a trip to a bowl.

"I thought (Wes) Counts had a great game for them. He made good decisions, made plays and, most importantly, didn't make mistakes."

While MTSU's offense came out smoking the defense wasn't holding up its end of the deal.

After stopping Vanderbilt on its first three possessions, the defense gave up with two big plays in the second quarter that helped spark a 28-point outburst and enabled the home team to take a 28-24 lead into the half.

That's when MTSU grew up, not only defensively, but as a team.

The Blue Raider defenders pitched a shutout in the second half, while the offense answered the call by picking up where it left off before the break.

Hicks' fourth touchdown, a 2-yard plunge, gave MTSU the lead for good, 30-28, with 4:20 remaining in the third quarter.

It would be enough.

"We've been wanting to beat a name (team) so bad that it hurt," said Hicks, who recorded his 10th 100-yard rushing game as a Blue Raider. "It feels good to get over the hump. This feels good because (Vanderbilt) is right down the street. Our fans were into it. (Our fans) knew we could do it. We knew we could do it, and we did."

Vanderbilt had a chance to regain the lead early in the fourth quarter but a botched snap prohibited the Commodores to get off what would have been a 23-yard field goal. From there, MTSU regained con-

The Commodores' final chance at coming from behind ended when Louis Kemp stopped Vanderbilt quarterback Greg Zolman one yard short of a first down on a fourth-and-2 play from the Vanderbilt 41.

Counts put the final touches on the riveting win eight plays later when he danced in untouched from seven yards out.

"It's big, it's big for the fans," Counts said. "It's just character and all the offseason work - that's when things started. This was a tremendous win, a team win, and that's what makes it special. We put up some numbers against a good defense tonight. We haven't even started to scratch the surface with our offense."

In addition to the big night turned in by Counts and Hicks, senior receiver Kendall Newson finished with nine receptions for 113 yards, while fellow receiver Tyrone Calico added six receptions for 83 yards.

The loss ruined an outstanding night for Vanderbilt receiver M.J. Garrett, who had eight catches for 219 yards and a touchdown.

Middle Tennessee 54, Troy State 17 Sept. 8, 2001; Murfreesboro, TN

MURFREESBORO, Tenn. — Middle Tennessee feared a Troy State ambush in the home opener with the Blue Raiders coming off the emotional 37-28 win at Vanderbilt just nine days earlier.

There was an ambush, all right, but it was provided by the Blue Raiders as they waylaid Division I-A newcomer Troy State 54-17 in front of 21,723 at Floyd Stadium for their fifth straight win.

The Blue Raiders avenged a 48-31 home loss to the Trojans two years ago and started the season 2-0 for the first time since the 1990. It also was the seventh straight win for MTSU at Floyd Stadium.

"To come out and beat a team that whipped us two years ago shows the improvement we are trying to gain," MTSU coach Andy McCollum said. "We wanted to represent in our house. We don't want anyone dancing on our field like (Troy State) did here two years ago."

Troy State (0-2) had little chance to do a victory dance this time, as the Blue Raiders dominated every phase of the game in the impressive thrash-

The Blue Raiders piled up 641 yards total offense one week after rolling up 608 at Vanderbilt. It's the first time in school history MTSU has produced more than 600 yards in consecutive games.

It got ugly for Troy State early as MTSU reached the end zone on five of its six first-half possessions to roll to a 33-3 halftime advantage.

So much for the possibility of a letdown.

"When you have to get up Friday morning and go to class at 8 following a big win after Vanderbilt, you get your feet back on the ground pretty fast," said MTSU quarterback Wes Counts. "(Players) weren't worried about a letdown. It really wasn't a big deal and we had nine days to get ready for it. We wanted to prove to a lot of people that last week wasn't a fluke."

Hard to argue.

Counts was clicking again, going 14-of-20 for 220 yards and hooking up with Dwone Hicks for one scoring pass and connecting with Kendall Newson on a 25-yard acrobatic, one-handed grab in the end zone to get the offensive highlights started.

Ten different MTSU players, led by Dwone Hicks' 74 yards on five receptions, had at least one catch.

Hicks also rushed for two touchdowns and had 55 yards on 12 carries.

MTSU's backfield had four backs with at least 55 yards. Sophomore Don Calloway led the way with 95 yards and two scores on 20 carries. Reshard Lee finished with 75 yards on six carries, all in the first half, and Jamison Palmer finished with 69 yards and two scores on just nine carries.

As a result, MTSU finished with 313 yards rushing and six touchdowns on the ground.

"It felt good to see everyone get in the game, and it felt good to get a little rest in the third and fourth quarters," said Hicks, who had a career-high 37 carries against Vanderbilt. "It felt good to beat a team that came in here and whipped us two years ago. We played as a complete unit."

And the defense was not to be ignored.

MTSU dominated Troy State's "Trojan Spread" offense, limiting it to 329 yards and only 61 yards rushing. Troy State was held out of the end zone until midway through the third quarter, when Heyward Skipper hauled in a 29-yard pass from Brock Nutter.

The Blue Raiders pass rush was strong out of the gate as evidenced by six sacks - the most for MTSU under McCollum.

"Last week we didn't have a strong pass rush," said defensive end Anthony Hood, who had two sacks and five tackles. "It didn't hurt us, but it didn't help us. Defensively, everything was clicking. We were challenged and we came out and performed."

Hood also had two tackles for loss, as did Louis Kemp. The Blue Raiders finished with seven tackles for loss and senior defensive back Jykine Bradley got into the act with a pair of interceptions and four passes defended.

"We wanted to see some (defensive) improvement," McCollum said. "We were able to get some turnovers and we had six sacks, which is good against a veteran quarterback. "The defensive front came out to play. Defensively you can see where we grew up in this game."

Middle Tennessee 38, UL-Monroe 20 Sept. 22, 2001; Monroe, LA

MONROE, **LA** — Experts believe Middle Tennessee's powerful offense will spark a run at the first Sun Belt Conference championship.

Defense, however, is the reason the Blue Raiders sit atop the Sun Belt standings this morning after turning back UL-Monroe, 38-20, in the first conference game in league history in front of 9,730 at Malone

Stadium on Saturday.

"It's a win and we just beat a good football team," MTSU coach Andy McCollum said. "We knew it was going to be tough coming in here and it was. It's great to get that first one, and I thought our defense did a tremendous job in the first half. They were the difference."

MTSU (3-0, 1-0) won its sixth straight and started 3-0 for the first time since 1990 with a stifling defense that not only hindered the Indians (0-3, 0-1) early, but set up two of the Blue Raiders' three first-half scores.

The Blue Raiders completely shut down the ground game, limiting the Indians to 84 yards rushing and tailback Ivory Brown to just 17 yards. UL-Monroe finished with 367 yards but more than 100 of those came in the fourth quarter after MTSU had built 31-6 lead.

"Defensive-wise we did what we were supposed to do," defensive end Tanaka Scott said. "We stuffed the run and made them throw it. I'm disappointed with the two touchdowns we gave up in the fourth quarter, but it was a good win."

Jykine Bradley's third interception of the season ended the Indians' first drive, and the offense converted the miscue into a 7-0 lead when quarterback Wes Counts connected with Kendall Newson for a 21-yard scoring strike.

UL-Monroe, trailing 14-0, was driving toward its first score when Michael Woods pounced on a fumble and returned possession to the Middle Tennessee offense.

Kicker Brian Kelly ripped a 42-yard field goal to put the Blue Raiders on top 17-0 eight plays later.

"We know our offense will put up points, and it's up to us to keep other teams from scoring," said line-backer Scotty Brown, who led MTSU with 11 tackles. "We knew coming into the game that for us to win the defense had to make plays. We gave up too much at the end and that must be corrected, but overall our defense played well."

It wasn't as if the offense didn't.

After all, the Blue Raiders had 509 yards total offense, led by Counts' 28-of-35 passing for 274 yards and two touchdowns, but losing three of four fumbles didn't sit well with the unit.

"It feels good to be 1-0 and have the first conference win," said receiver David Youell, who had a career-best seven receptions. "A win is always pleasing, but we have a lot to go back and work on. They gave us fits defensively."

In addition to Counts' big night, Newson had eight catches for 103 yards and running back Dwone Hicks scored four of the team's five touchdowns and finished with 74 yards rushing.

"They have the total package and we couldn't slow them up," UL-Monroe coach Bobby Keasler said. "Offensively, they are very strong. They have weapons and they use all of them."

MTSU went the distance on one of its drives - literally, when it marched 99 yards on 14 plays and never had to convert a third down.

The longest drive in school history concluded with Counts' 10-yard pass to Hicks and provided the Blue Raiders an early 14-0 lead.

"That was a humongous drive," McCollum said.
"We were backed up on the inch line and Monroe was trying to get field position. I thought that was a big key

early, but I want to give credit to the defense for what it did early."

Just ask UL-Lafayette coach Jerry Baldwin, who said the Blue Raiders defense was "suspect" prior to the game.

That suspect defense came up with four turnovers, allowed one touchdown and blanked the Ragin' Cajuns in the second half to spark the Blue Raiders to a 26-9 win in front of 12,101 at Cajun Field.

And it was that same suspect defense that stepped up and carried MTSU to its seventh straight win, fourth in a row on the road, as the Blue Raiders improved to 4-0 overall and 2-0 in the Sun Belt Conference.

"Our defense got called," MTSU coach Andy McCollum said. "Everybody talked about the offense going into this game, and our defense came out and played as good as I've seen the defense play since I've been at Middle Tennessee.

"They were called suspect, and they wanted to take the challenge. I couldn't be more proud of how they came out and played."

With MTSU's offense limited to a season-low 342 yards and unable to get into a flow early, it was the defense that stepped to the forefront.

Brandon Lynch and Scotty Brown came away with defensive gems in the third quarter that turned the tide in MTSU's favor for good, and Sheldon Durham's fumble recovery early in the fourth quarter broke the spirit of the upset-minded Raqin' Cajuns.

Sophomore Wardell Alsup put the exclamation mark on the sterling defensive effort with his first career interception midway through the fourth quarter.

Not bad for a suspect defense.

"Coach told us about the newspaper articles and what was being said," Brown said. "We had to hear that all week, and we were determined to come in and prove we are not a suspect defense. We came together after halftime and really put together a strong effort."

MTSU's offense wasn't as efficient as it had been in previous games. Wes Counts threw two interceptions and Jason Johnson had a fumble. The passing game accounted for just 53 yards with Counts completing just three of 14 passes for 44 yards. Johnson was 1-of-2 for 1 yard, and receiver Hansford Johnson completed his only pass, an 8-yard scoring strike to Counts on a throwback.

The ground game, however, was a different story as eight different Blue Raider ball carriers combined for 289 yards. Reshard Lee led the way with 127 yards on just eight carries, his first 100-yard game as a collegian.

Dwone Hicks finished with 98 yards and a 1-yard scoring run.

"I felt like we would perform better (offensively)," McCollum said. "I haven't seen us perform like that, but UL-Lafayette's defense had something to do with some of that. They have a very good defense. The big thing is we finished when we had to. It's hard to complain when you score 26 points in a win. We are not that spoiled around here."

The Cajuns (1-3, 0-1) jumped out to a 9-0 lead early in the second quarter, but MTSU got on the board with Hicks' run with 9:26 remaining in the first half to pull to within 9-7. The scoring drive was accentuated by Lee's dynamic 60-yard run.

MTSU took the lead for good when Counts lateraled the ball to Hansford Johnson, who pulled up and threw a perfect strike back to Counts to put the Blue Raiders ahead 13-9 after the two-point conver-

sion attempt failed.

The defense took it from there.

Lynch extended the lead when he scooped up a fumble and ran 50 yards for the score to give the Blue Raiders a 20-9 lead with 12:31 remaining in the third quarter.

The following possession ended in disaster for the Cajuns when Brown came up with his first career interception. Three plays later, Counts connected with receiver David Youell for a 34-yard scoring pass to cap the scoring.

Middle Tennessee 70, Idaho 58 Oct. 6, 2001; Murfreesboro, TN

MURFREESBORO, TN — The expected Sun Belt Conference showdown between league contenders Middle Tennessee and Idaho turned into a shootout at Floyd Stadium.

The teams combined for more than 1,400 yards and 128 points and set two NCAA Division I-A records with an entertaining brand of football, much to the delight of 23,106 fans - the second-largest crowd ever at Floyd Stadium.

By the time the dust settled MTSU (5-0, 3-0) remained unbeaten, ran its winning steak to eight and maintained its standing atop the Sun Belt Conference.

"We knew (Idaho) was a great offensive football team and this is a great win for us," MTSU coach Andy McCollum said. "We are 5-0 and that's the most important thing. I knew Idaho was explosive, but I didn't know they would be that explosive."

The Blue Raiders owned a seemingly comfortable 42-10 halftime cushion and appeared to be on the verge of running the Vandals (0-5, 0-1) out of town, but that was the first half.

McCollum warned his players the game was far from over at halftime, and he was right, but it didn't stop half of the announced crowd from heading home at intermission, believing the game was well in hand.

It wasn't

The fans who remained witnessed the greatest offensive exhibition by two football teams in Division I-A history. The 128 points were the most combined points between two I-A teams (besting the previous mark of 124 by Oklahoma and Colorado in 1980), and the Idaho's 58 points were the most by a losing team in I-A history.

Trailing 56-44 with 7:22 remaining, Idaho was knocking on the door and looking to cut the deficit to less than a touchdown, but Jonathan Shaw turned the Vandals away with MTSU's second interception of the night.

Junior tailback Dwone Hicks got the MTSU advantage back to three scores on the next play when he jetted 62 yards for his third touchdown of the night to put the Blue Raiders ahead 56-44 with 7:15 remaining.

It was the decisive turning point in the game, although Idaho went on to score two more times and MTSU added another score on Kerry Wright's 58-yard pass from Wes Counts.

"We came out with more of an attitude this week, had some confidence," Counts said. "We got on a roll, and usually when you get on a roll it's not going to stop."

It didn't for either team.

Counts was 23-of-28 for 459 yards and six touchdowns, breaking school records for career touchdown passes (44), passing yards (459) and consecutive completions (15).

And that was just the beginning.

Hicks continued his season-long dominance, rushing for 169 yards on 22 carries and three touch-

downs; and junior receiver Tyrone Calico had his best game of the season with five receptions for 160 yards and three scoring strikes.

It was part of a 685-yard output by the Blue Raiders and marked the fourth time in five games they have surpassed 500 yards total offense.

"I couldn't be more proud of the guys making plays," McCollum said. "I thought Wes did a tremendous job. I thought they all did a super job. It's what we expect out of them. Last week the defense pulled us through. This week the offense pulled us through. That's what team is about."

Idaho had 760 yards total offense, including a remarkable performance by sophomore quarterback Brian Lindgren.

Making his second start in relief of starter John Welsh, Lindgren was 49-of-71 for 637 yards and five touchdowns.

"There was a terrific out there by both teams. I've never seen anything like that before," Idaho coach Tom Cable said. "There is a reason this game is four quarters and we've got to convince our guys that we can go out and play for four quarters. Our quarterback was unbelievable and he's been that way for two weeks in a row.

"(MTSU) has some good athletes, probably the best we've seen this season with the exception of Washington. They were one of the best offenses we've seen."

And Idaho's was the best MTSU had seen - for one half - but the Blue Raiders' ability to hold the Vandals at bay was the difference.

North Texas 24, Middle Tennessee 21 Oct. 13, 2001; Denton, TX

DENTON, TX — Middle Tennessee was looking to complete a sweep of conference road games and solidify its standing atop the league standings at North Texas.

It was dealt a Sun Belt shocker instead.

The Blue Raiders (5-1, 3-1) were ambushed by previously winless North Texas (1-5, 1-1) and fell from the ranks of the unbeaten with a stunning 24-21 setback in front of 11,621 at Fouts Field.

"I am somewhere between hurt and humiliated to go out and play the way we did," MTSU senior receiver Kendall Newson said. "We showed lack of focus and didn't get the job done. We didn't represent Middle Tennessee very well and that's the biggest disappointment of all."

Not only did the Blue Raiders lose the game, but they lost several players in the process.

Junior tailback Dwone Hicks suffered a groin injury on the third possession and didn't return. He finished with 28 yards on four carries. Tailback Don Calloway broke his left ankle and is likely out for the season. Offensive lineman Jonathan Barry (knee) and defensive back Jykine Bradley (groin) also were knocked from the game.

The Blue Raiders, held to a season low in points and total yards (294), never led and trailed 14-0 early. They were able to pull to within 24-21 with 6:43 remaining, but couldn't complete the comeback bid and left the field with a look of astonishment as North Texas fans flooded the field and tore down the goal post in the south end zone.

"We're very humbled right now," MTSU coach Andy McCollum said. "This is a team game and we didn't get the win as a team. It starts with me and my staff. We'll learn from this and get better. You've got to give coach (Darrell) Dickey and his staff a lot of credit. They did a tremendous job preparing their team. They came out ready to play."

MTSU did not.

The Blue Raiders lost three fumbles, had an interception and couldn't sustain or finish drives against a North Texas team with the top-rated defense in the Sun Belt. Quarterback Wes Counts, who became the school's all-time leader in passing yards, was sacked four times and the offense never was in sync.

"We weren't ready to play and made too many mistakes," said Counts, who was 19-of-26 for 171 yards and threw two touchdowns. "We had a chance to do something special that hasn't been done (at MTSU) in a long time and blew it. We made too many mistakes. We got their best shot and we are not good enough to win making the mistakes we made today."

Mean Green running back Kevin Galbreath was one of the game's biggest factors, rushing for 144 yards on 34 carries. The North Texas rushing attack managed 216 yards and enabled its team to keep the ball 37:10.

"We beat a fine football team today," Dickey said. "For us to get in a shootout with them would have been a mistake. Our defense played well, but our offense holding the ball was a big key. My hat is off to our players. We were very fortunate to get the win."

Particularly considering MTSU's outstanding second-half defense. The Blue Raiders held North Texas to 91 yards and a field goal in the second half but it wasn't enough.

"We put our selves in a hole and we couldn't dig our way out," free safety Michael Woods said. "We could have come out and played better in the first half. That really hurt us. We came out in the second half and played hard, but we just didn't play hard enough."

North Texas quarterback Scott Hall's second touchdown, a 8-yard pass to George Marshall, staked the Mean Green to a 21-7 lead at the half, but MTSU cut the deficit to 21-14 when Counts connected with Newson on a five-yard scoring strike.

However, North Texas' 14 play, 55-yard drive resulting in a Jason Ball 42-yard field goal, increased the margin to 24-14 with 11:09 remaining.

Reshard Lee, who led MTSU with 79 yards on 13 carries, scored from the 3 to get the Blue Raiders to within 24-21 with 6:43 remaining and the defense held.

The Blue Raiders got the ball back with 4:28 remaining but they had to start from their 2 following a 79-yard punt from Ball that hit at the 42 and rolled the rest of the way.

MTSU gained 18 yards and was stopped on fourth down, igniting a celebration on the North Texas

sideline and sending the Blue Raiders to a shocking sethack

Ole Miss 45, Middle Tennessee 17 Oct. 20, 2001; Oxford, MS

OXFORD, MS — At least Middle Tennessee won't have to relive the nightmare it experienced during a 45-17 loss at Ole Miss.

The Blue Raiders (5-2) dropped their second straight game and head home facing a must-win situation against New Mexico State, and that's where the focus will be - starting immediately.

"This page is turned," MTSU coach Andy McCollum said. "We probably won't look at this film

(Sunday). New Mexico State was off today and have a week head start on us so it's important we get past this and get ready for that game. We were beaten by a very good football team today that didn't have the letdown so many expected following a big win against Alabama."

Ole Miss clearly had shifted its attention from the Alabama win to the challenge MTSU presented and was on top of its game. Quarterback Eli Manning completed 25-of-31 passes for 257 yards and three touchdowns, while tailback Joe Gunn ran for 112 yards and a score to spark the Rebels (5-1) to a 478-yard offensive output before a homecoming crowd of 46.886.

"It would be easy to overlook a team like Middle Tennessee since they are not in our conference and we just came off a big win over Alabama, but we came in on Monday and got our focus," Manning said. "We could not afford to overlook a powerful team like this. We had a good week of practice and we were determined to not have a letdown."

The Blue Raiders were held to 328 yards and quarterback Wes Counts was pulled in favor of backup Jason Johnson when he was intercepted by Syniker Taylor during the team's opening drive.

"We've always used a two-quarterback system," McCollum said. "Wes has played well for us but he didn't play well last week. We felt like it was time to give Jason a chance."

Johnson misfired on his first three passes before connecting with Kendall Newson on a 14-yard scoring play with 6:44 remaining in the first half to pull the Blue Raiders within 10-7, following Brian Kelly's extra point.

"I haven't played much so I had to get out there and try to get back to what I am supposed to be doing," said Johnson, who was 11-of-25 for 115 yards and two touchdowns. "We came here to win. We didn't come here to play a pretty good game."

It wasn't pretty but it wasn't as bad as the score would indicate, either.

The Blue Raiders trailed 17-10 halfway through the third quarter before Manning worked some magic when he fired a strike to Bill Flowers for a 29-yard touchdown just as he was hit by three MTSU defenders.

"The touchdown throw (Manning) had at the start of the second half - that's the mark of a champion," McCollum said. "He threw that completion despite being hit by two or three of our guys."

From there it got out of hand as Ole Miss would add three more scores to secure the win.

Injuries and penalties continued to plague the Blue Raiders. Fullback Jason Spray suffered a knee injury on the opening play and did not return, and the Blue Raiders were penalized 11 times for 103 yards.

Tailback Dwone Hicks and Jykine Bradley returned from injuries sustained last week. Hicks rushed for 79 yards on nine carries but left the game early in the third quarter when he aggravated his hamstring again.

Hicks was on his way to an apparent 36-yard touchdown run when he pulled up and went out of bounds at the 16. The drive stalled when Avery Hatten dropped a pass at the 5 on third-and-2 and Kelly came on to kick a 25-yard field goal to cut the deficit to 17-10.

"At the half our kids felt we were going to win," McCollum said. "We just didn't make something good happen. Scoring a touchdown instead of the field goal at the start of the second half would have provided some momentum."

Ole Miss went 74 yards in 15 plays to score on its opening possession when Charles Stackhouse plunged in from the 1 and went on top 10-0 on Jonathan Nichols' 27-yard field goal after MTSU's defense held the Rebels to three-and-out after Taylor had returned his interception to the 6.

MTSU cut it to 10-7 when Johnson hit Newson, but Ole Miss carried the momentum into the half when Chris Collins hauled in a 12-yard touchdown pass from Manning.
