#### THIS WEEK FOR THE BLUE RAIDERS ...

Middle Tennessee hosts South Alabama Friday and then Louisiana-Lafayette Sunday for Senior Day in the final regular season matches for the Blue Raiders.

The Blue Raiders host the Jaguars Friday at 2 p.m. at Blue Raider Soccer Field. USA leads the all-time series, 2-1, taking matches in 1999 and 2000 in Mobile before Middle Tennessee broke through with a 2-1 overtime triumph last season, also in Mobile. Danielle LaDuke scored late in the first overtime to give the Blue Raiders the victory.

Julia Herman leads the Jaguars with 10 goals and 23 points, followed closely by Tanya Allegretti (7g, 5a), as well as Heather Adamus (4g, 4a) and Rebecca Kahn (5g, 1a).

The Ragin' Cajuns and Blue Raiders are tied 1-1 in the all-time series, with UL-Lafayette taking a 1-0 victory last season in Lafayette. Middle Tennessee won in 2000, 5-1, in Murfreesboro.

Stacy Smith is the only Ragin' Cajun player in double figures in points with 17, netting eight goals and one assist

#### MIGUEZ SCORES TWICE IN 2-0 VICTORY

Middle Tennessee's Laura Miguez scored twice and keeper Emily Shrum preserved her third shutout of the season, as the Blue Raiders defeated Western Kentucky, 2-0, at Blue Raider Soccer Field.

The Blue Raiders avenged a tough 1-0 loss from last season to the Lady Toppers, as Miguez scored in the 20th minute and again in the final minute of the match for the victory.

The two teams traded possession for the first 25 minutes of the match, but it was Middle Tennessee that took advantage of a scoring opportunity to get on the board first.

After a cross was cleared by the Lady Toppers, senior defender Sarah Schulz stepped forward and chipped a ball back into the box. Miguez beat WKU keeper Amy Uhlman to the ball, chipping it past Uhlman for her sixth goal of the season and an early 1-0 Middle Tennessee advantage.

The two clubs went to halftime with the score still 1-0 and neither team mustering many scoring chances in the first 45 minutes. The Blue Raiders had five shots to two for WKU, and the Lady Toppers had the only corner kick of the half.

In the second half the Lady Toppers controlled the possession and had a host of scoring opportunities, including hitting the post once and the crossbar once, much the same as the Blue Raiders did in their defeat a year ago. Shrum made a pair of saves in the second half and the Blue Raider defense cleared away a number of dangerous crosses.

In the final two minutes Middle Tennessee had a pair of corner kicks, the first after Miguez ripped a shot from the top of the 18 that was saved by WKU keeper Melissa Bailey. Bailey played the final 59 minutes for the Lady Toppers in goal.

After the second corner kick was headed over the net by Blue Raider Christina Mascaro, Bailey's goal kick was redirected downfield by Middle Tennessee's Jessica Northcutt. Miguez gained control, took one dribble and fired it in the back of the net for the clincher.

"It was a very good team effort, probably one of the best we've had all year," Blue Raider head coach Aston Rhoden said. "We took advantage of some chances and played well for the 90 minutes. This is a very big win and now we need to carry the momentum into these final four matches."

Middle Tennessee outshot WKU, 16-9, in the match, and had all four of its corners in the final 45 minutes. Bailey made three saves for the Lady Toppers in goal.

#### **BLUE RAIDERS WIN 2-1**

Middle Tennessee's Laura Miguez and Emily Carter each scored a goal and the Blue Raiders set a school record for shots with 44 in a 2-1 victory over Austin Peay at Blue Raider Soccer Field.

Miguez scored on an assist from Christina Mascaro in the 17th minute and Carter's goal came on a rebound just six minutes later to stake the Blue Raiders to an early 2-0 advantage. The margin would have been much more if not for APSU keeper Sarah Broadbent, who made seven saves in the opening 45 minutes and 17 in the match.

The Lady Govs got just one scoring opportunity in the first half and Stephanie Schwetz made it count, making a long run before sending a shot low and left and into the back of the net in the 36th minute.

The Blue Raiders continued to barrage Broadbent with shots in the second half, taking 23 after the break, but were unable to score. Schwetz made one run midway through the second half looking to tie the match, but Middle Tennessee keeper Emily Shrum came off her line to make her only save of the match.

The Blue Raiders outshot APSU, 44-2, in the match, and had 14 corners to none for the Lady Govs.

#### BLUE RAIDERS DROP 4-2 DECISION

Georgia State's Kim Forrest scored a goal and added two assists, as the homestanding Lady Panthers defeated Middle Tennessee, 4-2, on Senior Day for GSU.

Forrest scored in the third minute of the match on a free kick from 25 yards to give the Lady Panthers a quick 1-0 advantage, but the Blue Raiders came right back to knot the match at one. Lindsey Bopp sailed a long shot from

40 yards into the net in the fourth minute.

The Lady Panthers would score twice more in the first half on breakaways, as Forrest fed Brooks Daniel in the 15th minute for a score, and then Kelly Higgins assisted on a Laura Walls goal in the 36th minute for a 3-1 GSU lead at halftime.

After the break Shanna Stricklin and Forrest assisted on a Sarah Feske goal in the 48th minute, but the Blue Raiders cut the deficit to two when freshman and Murfreesboro native Brooke Ward scored in the 83rd minute on an assist from Laura Miguez.

Middle Tennessee continued with the pressure for the final seven minutes, but could not muster another score. Georgia State outshot the Blue Raiders, 18-15, in the match, and had eight corners to four for Middle Tennessee. Blue Raider keeper Emily Shrum made four saves in the opening 45 minutes, while Danielle Perreault came on in the second half to make six saves.

#### BLUE RAIDERS IN CONFERENCE STATISTICS

Middle Tennessee's Laura Miguez ranks in the Top 10 in the Sun Belt in three categories and the squad moved into the Top Three in shots in this week's league statistics.

The Blue Raiders rank third in the conference in shots per game at 19.41.

Miguez is second in the league in shots per game (3/76), sixth in goals per game (0.47) and tied for second in game-winning goals with three. Emily Carter ranks fourth in the SBC in shots per game (3.25) while Danielle LaDuke is fifth (2.94) in the category. Christina Mascaro is tied for sixth (0.33) in the league in assists per contest.

Keeper Emily Shrum ranks fifth in the conference in goals-against-average (1.85), as well as seventh in saves per outing (3.87) and eighth in shutouts per game (0.20).

In conference matches only, Miguez is third in goals per outing (0.67) and fifth in points per contest (1.33), as well as tied for second in GWG with two. Shrum ranks seventh in shutouts per contest and eighth in GAA.

#### NEWS AND NOTES...

∠The two home wins for the Blue Raiders over the weekend improved the squad to 5-1-1 at home this season with two matches remaining. The Blue Raiders have never won more than six matches at home in a season, reaching that feat twice before, in 1999 (6-1-1) and 2001 (6-5).

Middle Tennessee had one of the worst starts in school history, but has rebounded to win seven of its last 10 matches and has a chance to match the school record for wins in a season this week. Three times in the last four seasons the Blue Raiders have won 10 matches, including 1998, '99 and '01.

Middle Tennessee ran its winning streak to three with the triumph over Arkansas State on October 6. The Blue Raiders won three straight twice in 2001 but have not four consecutive matches since August 28 - September 15, 1999, when the squad won five straight.

Z Laura Miguez had a goal in both wins over Arkansas-Little Rock and Arkansas State, picking up her fourth and fifth goals of the season. Miguez scored only four goals as a freshman, but added eight assists. The Dallas, Texas, native is now second in scoring on the club with 11 points (5g, 1a) this season. Miguez has five goals in her last five contests.

≤ Sophomore Sarah Linder did not start against Arkansas-Little Rock, her only missed start of the year.

EFreshman midfielder Lindsay Estes badly sprained her right ankle at Stetson on September 29 and will probably miss three weeks. Estes remains in a walking boot and will return to the doctor on October 21. Sophomore Ashley Hicks has battled an injury with her right knee all season and underwent orthoscopic surgery October 7 to determine the cause of the injury. Hicks could return in two weeks.

★ Christina Mascaro had three assists, and Danielle LaDuke and Jessica Northcutt each had two assists in the win over Stetson. The contest was the first multi-assist game for a Blue Raider since Megan McGregor had two versus Appalachian State on October 17 of last year.

#### **ROAD WARRIORS IN 2002**

The Blue Raiders began the 2002 season with three straight road matches and play eight of their first 11 away from home before finishing the campaign with six of the last nine matches at Blue Raider Soccer Field. Included in the first 11 contests are matches at Southwest Missouri State, Eastern Illinois, Auburn, Alabama, and the conference opener against Florida International.

Last season's squad set a team-record with four road victories, ending the year 4-4 away from home. Middle Tennessee had never won more than three road matches in a season before 2001, winning three in four consecutive seasons from 1997-2000. The Blue Raiders ended the year with a 4-3 road record in the regular season, the first winning road record in school history. The Blue Raiders set a school record last year by winning three straight road matches, defeating UT Martin (9/5), Arkansas-Little Rock (10/5) and Arkansas State (10/7).

#### YOUTH, NEWCOMERS A PLUS IN 2002

Once again the freshman class has shown considerable skill and knowledgable play during preseason camp and the first two weeks of the campaign, making playing time that much harder to come by for returning players.

Caroline McHugh, Sarah Schmidt and Brooke Ward have been the most impressive for the Blue Raiders in the eight-player freshman class, but all eight have shown flashes of consistency and skill in the weeks leading into the season opener. All three of the aforementioned entered camp in tremendous shape, and their play during two-a-days was evident of their offseason work.

Also, Megan Ziegler, Lindsay Estes and Melissa Wellman grew more and more comfortable as preseason work progressed. The other two freshmen, forward J'Keta Wilford and keeper Danielle Perreault, have shown tremendous skill in practice, but will find playing time hard to come by at their respective positions.

Three transfers have also made themselves right at home in the midfield for the Blue Raiders, as Christina Mascaro, Ashley Elliott and Melissa Funke have all helped the entire squad become more familiar with head coach Aston Rhoden's style of play. The trio played at North Alabama for Rhoden, with Mascaro and Funke logging two years in the system, and Elliott gaining playing time in 2001.

#### BLUE RAIDERS PICKED SIXTH IN COACHES POLL

The Sun Belt Conference women's soccer coaches have picked the University of Denver to win the Sun Belt Conference championship in 2002. In just the third year of league competition, the Sun Belt has crowned three different regular season champions - South Alabama and Florida International in 2000; and North Texas in 2001 - and two different tournament champions - FIU in 2000 and Denver in 2001.

Last season the Denver Pioneers, under 2001 Sun Belt Coach of the Year Jeff Hooker, became the first team to represent the league in the NCAA Women's Soccer National Tournament by earning an at-large bid. Denver welcomes back nine starters, including All-American defender Jamie Norwood and all-region goalkeeper Erica Izard. Norwood recorded a team-high nine assists, while pacing a defense that only allowed 13 goals last season. Izard is back for her final season in net after recording an impressive 14 shutouts last season. The Pioneers are ranked No. 7 in the 2002 Soccer Buzz Central Region preseason poll.

With the addition of an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, several teams will be pushing Denver for the top spot in the league. Perennial contenders North Texas and Florida International finished second and third in the preseason coaches poll.

With 10 starters returning, including Sun Belt Freshman of the Year Danielle LaDuke, and nine of the top 10 scorers from last season, the 2002 campaign begins with high expectations for Middle Tennessee and first-year head coach Aston Rhoden. LaDuke tied the Blue Raider record with 13 goals in 2001 and finished the season with 27 points, second-best single season record.

Middle Tennessee athletic director Boots Donnelly announced the hiring of Aston Rhoden as the Blue Raider soccer coach on February 4, 2002, as the third head coach in the program's

history.

Rhoden comes to Middle Tennessee from North Alabama in Florence, Ala., where he served as the head coach for the past five seasons, compiling 39 wins during his tenure, including a pair of 11-win campaigns. He began the UNA program as a club team in 1996 before beginning varsity play the following season.

Rhoden was hired at UNA after serving as the staff coach for the Alabama Youth Soccer Association since 1993, and as an assistant soccer coach at Randolph High School. He also served as a volunteer assistant coach at Martin Methodist College in Pulaski, Tenn., and as the Director of Coaching for the Rocket City Kicks Soccer Club in Huntsville.

The Jamaica native received his bachelor's in Computer Science and Mathematics from the

University of Alabama-Huntsville in 1989 and received a National "A" Coaching License from the United States Soccer Federation.

Rhoden played collegiately at Alabama-Huntsville, earning the Leadership Award in 1988 and was the school's Outstanding Student-Athlete for 1985-86. Following his four-year playing career at UAH, Rhoden served as a graduate teaching assistant at UAH for a year, and began coaching youth soccer teams in Huntsville in 1989.

In addition to his time at UAH, Rhoden's playing experience includes time on the Jamaican Youth National Team in 1980-81, playing on the Real Mona FC, Division I Major League team in Jamaica form 1981-84 and playing on the Shamrock FC, Division I Adult Soccer League team in Huntsville since 1990.
