FOR THE BLUE RAIDERS ...

Middle Tennessee hits the road to face a pair of Southeastern Conference foes, taking on the Rebels of Ole Miss Friday at 7 p.m. in Oxford, Miss., before taking on Mississippi State Sunday at 1 p.m. in Starkville.

The Blue Raiders and 24th-ranked Rebels have met one time previously, with Ole Miss posting a 10-0 victory in Oxford in Middle Tennessee's inaugural season of soccer, 1996.

The Blue Raiders and Bulldogs also met in 1996 in Starkville, a 5-0 MSU victory in Middle Tennessee's first match as a program.

NEWS AND NOTES...

- Of a possible 77 starts this season, 35 have been made by newcomers for the Blue Raiders, with sophomore Claire Ward and freshmen Katy Rayburn and Beth Wade starting all seven matches this far. Five other Blue Raiders have drawn starts in every match, including seniors Emily Carter and Christina Mascaro, juniors Laura Miguez and Jessica Northcutt, and sophomore Danielle Perreault.

- Junior Laura Miguez has four goals and six assists in seven matches so far this season and now has 34 points in her last 18 matches dating to last season. The Dallas, Texas, native has also scored at least one point in 13 of those 18 matches. Miguez tied the single-match points record of eight set earlier this season by Rebecca Rodriguez, as Miguez tallied three goals and two assists versus Birmingham Southern. Her final goal against BSC also moved the 5-2 forward into first place on the career points list at Middle Tennessee with 51, surpassing Hailee Walsh's (1998-99) total of 50.

- Senior Emily Carter netted her 19th career goal in the victory over Birmingham Southern Sunday, giving the Evansville, Ind., native 43 career points, tying her with current teammate Danielle LaDuke for third on the all-time list. Carter's 19 goals ranks her second on the career goals list behind Hailee Walsh's 21 in 1998-99.

- Middle Tennessee's loss to Southwest Missouri State Friday snapped a three-match home winning streak to start the year for the Blue Raiders, the longest since the 1999 squad won the first four matches at home.

MIGUEZ TIES RECORD IN BLUE RAIDER VICTORY

Junior Laura Miguez tallied her second career hat trick and added two assists to tie a Middle Tennessee single-game points record with eight, as the Blue Raiders scored three times in each half to defeat Birmingham Southern, 6-1, at Blue Raider Field.

Miguez scored the first and third goals of the match for the winners and then added another score in the final minute of the match to break the single-game points record of seven previously held by teammate Danielle LaDuke as well as former Blue Raider Makini Wall.

The Blue Raiders wasted little time in getting on the board in the match, as Jessica Northcutt played a long ball over the defense in the 13th minute. Miguez ran down the ball and chipped it over BSC keeper Andria Gray for a 1-0 lead. Senior Christina Mascaro tallied her first score of the season in the 23rd minute, using the strong north breeze to boot a corner kick into the back of the net for a 2-0 Blue Raider advantage. Middle Tennessee added another score in the 27th minute, as Rebecca Rodriguez fed Miguez across the six-yard box for another goal, her second of the match and third in two matches for the Dallas, Texas, junior.

LaDuke had a couple of scoring chances in the second half foiled by Gray, and the visiting Panthers came back to cut into the lead late in the second half. BSC's Allie Thrasher made a long run down the leftside and beat Blue Raider keeper Danielle Perreault in the 80th minute, cutting the deficit to 3-1.

But the Blue Raiders came right back to take a three-goal lead again, as Miguez passed to Rodriguez, whose shot was deflected to Emily Carter. Carter put it into the net for her second goal of the year. Middle Tennessee added another tally in the 89th minute, as Miguez played a long ball across the field that Brooke Ward ran down and placed low and right past Gray. Miguez then had a well-struck ball that Gray deflected off the crossbar and into the net in the final minute for the last score of the match.

"The difference was, we came out and played a little more aggressive than we usually do," Blue Raider head coach Aston Rhoden said. "Everybody played hard.

"We were able to get the forwards the balls they wanted, and they were able to put them away. We used the advantages we were given today, like homefield advantage, to win this one, because Birmingham Southern is not a bad team."

BLUE RAIDERS FALL, 2-1

Visiting Southwest Missouri State score 10 minutes into the second half to take the lead and hung on for a 2-1 victory over Middle Tennessee in soccer action at Blue Raider Field.

The Bears (2-4-2) ended a six-match home winning streak for the Blue Raiders dating to last season, scoring the final two goals of the match after Middle Tennessee took a 1-0 lead two-thirds of the way through the first half.

Neither team mustered many scoring chances in the opening 45 minutes, and both battled a gusting wind that favored the winners in the first half.

The Blue Raiders got on the board first when freshman Rebecca Rodriguez played across the top of the box to junior Laura Miguez in the 32nd minute, and Miguez beat SMS keeper Alexis Stormo low and right. The goal was the first of the season for Miguez and her 25th and 26th points in the last 17 matches dating to last season.

But the Bears came right back in the 37th minute, as Stephanie Schultz served a ball into the box that Blue Raider keeper Danielle Perreault misread. The ball bounced over Perreault's head and Southwest Missouri State's Katie DeCarlo put it into the net to knot the match at one heading to halftime. Shots were 6-3 for Middle Tennessee in the first half, and the keepers had a pair of saves each.

The Bears then took the lead 10 minutes into the second half, as Caroline Rocker played a through-ball to Mary Litvan, who beat Perreault low and right for a 2-1 SMS advantage.

Perreault made two point-blank saves later in the half to keep the visitors from adding to the lead, as the Blue Raiders struggled to keep possession and create quality scoring chances.

"It's the same old story. I'm very disappointed with the way we played," Blue Raider head coach Aston Rhoden said. "We made one mistake and they got a goal out of it. We just didn't take advantage of our opportunities. Our level of concentration has to pick up. That's how we lost to Southern Miss and Tulane and that's how we lost today."

RODRIGUEZ NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Middle Tennessee freshman Rebecca Rodriguez was named the Sun Belt Conference Soccer Player of the Week Tuesday for September 9 after netting a school-record four goals against Louisiana-Monroe and helping the Blue Raiders to a 3-0-0 start.

The Dallas, Texas, native scored four times in a 15-minute stretch last Friday against ULM to lead the Blue Raiders to a 5-0 victory in the first match of the Middle Tennessee Classic.

Rodriguez entered the match with just over six minutes remaining in the first half and scored twice before the break, one on a rebound after a Laura Miguez shot hit the post, and the other unassisted.

The Bishop Lynch High School product then scored twice more in the first eight minutes of the second half, first on an assist from fellow freshman Rachel Holmes, then off another rebound from a Miguez shot.

MORE NEWS & NOTES

- Sophomore keeper Danielle Perreault started the season with three straight shutouts, making just

three saves in the three Blue Raider victories. The three shutouts equals the number posted by the team in both 2001 and 2002 and is halfway to the team season record of six set in 1998. Middle Tennessee has posted three straight blankings only one other time in school history, shutting out Tennessee Tech, Troy State and Tennessee Tech again from September 24-October 1, 1997.

- Junior Laura Miguez was named Preseason All-Sun Belt in a poll of league coaches. The Dallas, Texas, native earned First Team All-SBC honors in 2002.

- Middle Tennessee tied a school-record with 44 shots in the victory over Belmont. The Blue Raiders also took 44 shots versus Austin Peay on October 20, 2002.

- The victory in the season-opener over Belmont was the first for the Blue Raiders since 2000, a 1-0 triumph over Tennessee Tech.

- With the 1-0 win over Belmont, the Blue Raiders improved to 3-5 all-time in season-openers, including 2-2 at home. All eight season-openers in Middle Tennessee soccer history have been shutouts.

MIGUEZ NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SBC, BLUE RAIDERS PICKED FIFTH

Junior Laura Miguez has been named to the Preseason All-Sun Belt soccer team while Middle Tennessee was picked to finish fifth in a poll of the league's coaches.

Miguez, the Blue Raiders leading scorer in 2002 with nine goals and three assists for 21 points, was one of three forwards on the team, joining Marilyn Marin of North Texas and Mychael Movius of Denver up top.

"With Laura making First Team All-Conference last season, that really helped her earn this honor and it's great for her to be selected again," Blue Raider head coach Aston Rhoden said. "We're hoping she lives up to the expectations and it's a great award for Laura."

Denver's Melissa Behrent, Rebecca Kahn of South Alabama and Western Kentucky's Jocelyn Roach were voted to the team as midfielders, while Elena Esquibel of Arkansas-Little Rock, South Alabama's Melissa Moeschl, Jamie Norwood of Denver and Western Kentucky's Melissa Robinson were named as defenders. South Alabama's Amber Angermeier was voted the all-conference keeper, with Marin bagging Player of the Year honors.

Denver edged North Texas for the top spot in the predicted order of finish by the coaches, with the Pioneers garnering five first-place votes and 77 points to four first-place votes and 74 points for North Texas. Western Kentucky was third with 53 points, with South Alabama in fourth (48) and Middle Tennessee fifth (45). Florida International (41), Louisiana-Lafayette (31), Arkansas State (19) and Arkansas-Little Rock (17) round out the poll.

"Being picked fifth gives us a chance to work higher into the conference mix. We feel good about our team and our ability to improve as the season progresses, and this gives us something to shoot for, especially since third and fifth are so close."



Middle Tennessee athletic director Boots Donnelly announced the hiring of Aston Rhoden as the Blue Raider soccer coach on February 4, 2002, the third head coach in the program's history.

Rhoden became the head coach at Middle Tennessee after serving at North Alabama in Florence, Ala., in the same capacity for six seasons. At North Alabama, Rhoden started the program from scratch, playing the first season as a club team before moving to varsity status in his second year at the helm. He compiled 39 wins during his tenure at UNA, including a pair of 11-win campaigns.

Rhoden was hired at UNA after serving as the staff coach for the Alabama Youth Soccer Association since 1993 and as an assistant soccer coach at Randolph High School in Huntsville, Ala. He also served as the Director of Coaching for the Rocket City Kicks Soccer Club in Hunts-

ville and is currently a staff coach for the Tennessee Olympic Development Program (ODP).

The Jamaica native received his bachelor's in Computer Science and Mathematics from the University of Alabama-Huntsville in 1989. Currently he holds a National "A" Coaching License from the United States Soccer Federation (USSF) as well as the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Premier Diploma.

Rhoden played collegiately at Alabama-Huntsville, earning the Leadership Award in 1988 and was the school's Outstanding Student-Athlete for 1985-86. Following his four-year playing career at UAH, Rhoden served as a graduate teaching assistant at UAH for a year and began coaching youth soccer teams in Huntsville in 1989.

In addition to his time at UAH, Rhoden's playing experience includes time on the Jamaican Youth National Team in 1980-81, playing on the Real Mona FC, Division I Major League team in Jamaica from 1981-84 and playing on the Shamrock FC, Division I Adult Soccer League team in Huntsville since 1990.
