Notes: The Blue Raiders return home after posting a 6-2 mark on an eight-game road swing ... Middle Tennessee plays 8 of its next 10 over the next 11 days before beginning conference play ... The Blue Raiders have won five games in a row. The squad did that twice last season, both in the month of May. Middle Tennessee has also won five straight on the road, its first five-game winning streak since taking five in a row from April 11-18, 2001.

Blue Raiders Versus SMS

Under head coach Steve Peterson, Middle Tennessee has posted just a 2-12 mark against Southwest Missouri State, including a three-game sweep last season at SMS. The Blue Raiders are 1-4 at home against the Bears, winning 13-3 in 2002. The teams split a pair of games that season, as rain washed away the final game of the series. SMS swept a three-game series in Murfreesboro in 1999 and won eight in a row in the series before the Blue Raiders victory in the final game of the series in 2002.

McNamee Continues Hot Start

Junior Eric McNamee has been a major asset at the top of the lineup, setting the table for the Blue Raiders. The Nashville, Tenn., native has hit safely in nine of the 11 contests and reached safely in all 11, scoring a run in every game this season. He leads the club with 22 runs scored and 14 walks in compiling a .589 on-base percentage. The Columbia State CC transfer also leads the club with a .452 average with two doubles, two triples and six RBIs. Since moving to the leadoff spot five games ago, McNamee has reached base 20 times and scored 14 runs in 37 plate appearances. The Blue Raiders are 6-1 during the stretch. At Southeastern Louisiana last past weekend, the second baseman was 7-for-12 with four walks and seven runs scored, helping Middle Tennessee sweep a three-game series for the first time in almost three

Williams Dominant Again

Senior John Williams was one strike away from tossing a two-hit shutout at Southeastern Louisiana in the second game of a doubleheader this past Saturday, but ran into a little trouble and had to settle for his third victory of the season. The Murfreesboro, Tenn., native struck out 11 and walked just two, allowing five hits and giving up one run. It was the second double-digit strikeout

performance this season and the sixth of his career. The lefthander has allowed just one run in 21.2 innings pitched this season, ringing up 29 strikeouts with just three walks and giving up 11 hits. Williams also loves pitching in the state of Louisiana, upping his career mark to 5-0 with a 3.62 ERA in five career outings. He has defeated Louisiana-Lafayette three times, New Orleans once and Southeastern Louisiana once. The Oakland HS product has 26 strikeouts in 37.1 innings pitched in those five outings.

Kemp Resurgent at the Plate

Senior Shane Kemp struggled through much of last season at the plate, batting .259 in 59 games in 2003. But the Paris. Tenn., native has started his final season in the Blue & White hot as a firecracker. second on the team in average at .419 and leading in RBIs with 13. He has started all 11 games, seven in leftfield, two in centerfield and the last two in rightfield. The Henry County HS product batted fourth for the first time in his career Sunday at Southeastern Louisiana, going 3-for-4 with four RBIs and a run scored, his second four RBI game this year. He batted third in both games this week, going 3-for-8 with a home run, three RBIs and three runs scored. His home run against Belmont on Wednesday extended his hitting streak to seven games. After driving in 18 runs last season in 166 at-bats, Kemp has driven in 13 in 43 at-bats this year. He is 10-for-22 (.455) with runners on base and 7-for-14 (.500) with runners in scoring position.

Pitching Staff Stellar

The Blue Raider pitching staff has compiled a splendid 2.32 team ERA through the first 11 games this season, a far cry from the club's ERA of 5.50 last season. Sunday's win over Southeastern Louisiana was the first game where the Middle Tennessee starter did not get the decision. Starters Chris Mobley and John Williams have been spectacular,

Williams Named National Pitcher of the Week

Senior John Williams earned Collegiate Baseball National Pitcher of the Week honors last Monday after striking out 12 batters in six innings and combining with Chase Swing for the third no-hitter in school history. Williams and Swing combined to throw just the third no-hitter in school history in a 4-0 win over IP-Fort Wayne on February 24. Williams struck out 12 and walked one in six innings. He was so dominant that he fanned 10 of the first 13 hitters in the game and a dozen of the 19 batters he faced before leaving the game with 90 pitches after six innings. Swing then got the final nine outs for his first save of the year and 12th of his career. It was the fifth career double-digit strikeout performance by Williams and his most since last season versus New Mexico State.

Williams Earns SBC Pitcher of the Week

Middle Tennessee senior lefthander John Williams picked up another award last week after combining for the third no-hitter in school history, this one the Sun Belt Conference Pitcher of the Week. Williams tossed six no-hit innings, striking out 12 and facing just one batter over the minimum. He combined with teammate Chase Swing for only the third no-hitter in school history. The Murfreesboro native struck out 10 of the first 13 batters of the game. His strikeout total was his fifth career double-digit strikeout contest and most since striking out 12 versus New Mexico State last season. Williams was named a National Pitcher of the Week on Monday by *Collegiate Baseball*.

Peterson Gets No. 500

Blue Raider skipper Steve Peterson picked up his 500th coaching victory at Middle Tennessee in the second game of the 2003 Sun Belt Championships, a 6-5 triumph over Arkansas-Little Rock. Peterson got the 650th win of his career as a head coach at Vanderbilt on May 13, 2003, and is the winningest coach in Blue Raider history. Peterson's teams have won eight conference tournaments and have made seven NCAA Tournament appearances in his 16 years at the helm of the Blue Raider program.

Carroll, Swing Preseason All-Americans

Blue Raider juniors Brett Carroll and Chase Swing each garnered Preseason All-America selections for 2004 after their spectacular performances a year ago. Carroll was named to the Third Team by both the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) and Louisville Slugger/Collegiate Baseball. He also earned Honorable Mention accolades from CollegeBaseballInsider.com. Swing joined Carroll as a Third Team pick by the NCBWA.

The 2004 edition of the Blue Raiders will look very similar to last year's squad, with just two everyday players missing. Junior college transfer Eric McNamee started at second base to open the season, and the corner outfield spots will likely see a slew of faces in the opening weeks. Five position starters - Troy Harp (C), Josh Archer (1B), Jeff Beachum (SS), Brett Carroll (3B) and Chuck Akers (CF) will be in their familiar spots on the field, and Chris LeGuenec, Shane Kemp and Marcus Taylor will all see significant time in the outfield and at designated hitter. The only newcomer expected to see much action is freshman Michael McKenry, who will catch, DH, and may see some time in the outfield.

Peterson has produced nine seasons with 30 or more wins, including a

school record 42 victories during the 1990 slate.

Peterson teaches a hard-nosed and aggressive style of baseball. His personable demeanor has made him a big hit among fans, boosters, players and recruits alike.

Peterson also adheres to the philosophy that defense and pitching wins championships. He has long been known for outstanding defensive teams, and the Blue Raiders have featured some of the area's most feared hurlers throughout the years.

Peterson has seen three of his pitchers earn All-America honors, including the only First Team All-American in school history, Dewon Brazelton. Under his watch, the Blue Raiders have seen nine single-season and eight career pitching records established.

The offensive output of the team has not been ignored under Peterson, as his recruits established most of the offensive records held at Middle Tennessee. Peterson has developed three players who hit .400 or better in a season along with the school's single-season and career home run records. His 1997 squad established the all-time record for batting average with a .323 clip.

Aside from wins and losses, Peterson has been instrumental in leaving the Blue Raiders' mark on college baseball in other ways. He brought home seven consecutive conference championships (either regular season or tournament) during one stretch and has guided his team to an NCAA Regional on seven different occasions. During his tenure, Peterson has captured one Sun Belt crown, a Sun Belt tournament title, eight OVC titles and seven OVC tournament crowns. For his efforts, Peterson has twice been named OVC Coach of the Year. He brought national attention to the program in the 2001 season, as his team found itself in the national rankings for the first time since 1982.

His efforts were clearly in evidence during the magical 2001 season. The Blue Raiders established the single-game attendance record at Reese Smith Field with a crowd of 2,733 on hand to witness the Blue Raiders' Friday night tilt against South Alabama. The team went on to set the single-season attendance mark with 26,218 coming

through the gates at Reese Smith Field. His squad saw 10 crowds of 1,000 or more during the season.

If the team accolades and accomplishments aren't enough, consider that Peterson has coached a Sun Belt Player of the Year and six OVC Players of the Year, a Sun Belt Pitcher of the Year and an OVC Pitcher of the Year, a First Team All-American, four Third-Team All-Americans, four Freshman All-Americans, and 35 First Team All-Conference players.

Professional baseball has seen 46 former Peterson protégés pass through the ranks with four players logging time in the Major Leagues.

Aside from playing baseball for a living, numerous former players have entered the coaching profession. Currently 24 former players are coaching at the high school, college or professional level.

Peterson was named the Tennessee Baseball Coaches Association College Coach of the Year, in 1992 and again in 2000. He was also inducted into the Rutherford County Old Timers Baseball Hall of Fame in 2003.

He has also been responsible for the tremendous growth of Blue Raider baseball camps. Since taking over the camp program in 1984, Peterson has developed one of the area's premier camps with most sessions sold out.

Peterson took two separate tours with the Blue Raiders as an assistant coach under John Stanford prior to becoming the team's skipper. During his runs between 1976-78 and 1985-87, the Blue Raiders won two OVC titles and four southern division crowns.

During the interim, Peterson served as the head coach at Roane State Community College in Harriman, Tenn. During his tenure from 1979-1984, Peterson's teams won a Tennessee state title in 1981 and he was twice named TJCAA Coach of the Year (1981, '84). While at Roane State, Peterson put together a sparkling record of 153-96, a .614 winning percentage.

His expertise also ranges away from on-thefield coaching. He is known as one of the top recruiters in the region and has a knack for keeping local talent close to home.

Peterson's reputation extends into fundraising as well. Events such as the annual Chuck Taylor Golf Tournament have become mainstays on the calendars of baseball supporters across middle Tennessee and have served to raise thousands of dollars for the improvement of Blue Raider baseball.

He spearheaded the effort to pay for the construction of the Stephen B. Smith Clubhouse and Indoor Training Facility, which opened its doors in 1998. One look inside the facility shows the amount of time and effort spent toward this endeavor. It has become known as one of the finest collegiate clubhouses and training facilities in the entire country.

Reese Smith Field has also benefited from Peterson's fundraising abilities. He has helped transform the park into a fan-friendly area by expanding the seating area, putting up a new information center just inside the gate, and expanding the restroom and concession facilities.

Peterson guided efforts during the summer of 2001 to expand the dugouts at Reese Smith Field. He is also currently spearheading an effort that would totally renovate the current stadium. The plans would call for a significant remodeling of the concession stand, improved and expanded restroom facilities, and a modern press box that would accommodate radio and television along with print media.

A native of Huntsville, Ala., Peterson stood out as a catcher under the legendary Rudy Abbott at Jacksonville State. He earned his bachelor's from Jacksonville State in 1973 and later earned a master's from Middle Tennessee in 1977.

Peterson is married to the former Rita Albert and the couple has three children, Jill, Jenny and John. Away from the diamond, he enjoys fishing for smallmouth bass.
