MT Student Giveaway Set for "Pack the Park" Night

Two free airline tickets will be given to a Middle Tennessee student during "Pack the Park" night at the Tuesday, April 20 game against Vanderbilt, as the Blue Raiders try to set a new single-game attendance record. One lucky student will win two free round trip airplane tickets anywhere Southwest airlines flies in the continental United States compliments of Don Wright of Billboard Consultants. All students in attendance will be given a ticket at the gate and the winner will be decided based on their ticket numbers sometime during the game. The Blue Raiders and Commodores play at 7 p.m. Middle Tennessee will try and break the singlegame attendance mark of 2,733 set during the 2001 season. Fans are encouraged to arrive early for the game to reserve a general admission seat. Middle Tennessee sold a school-record 607 season tickets in 2004, including selling all 285 chairback seats. Fans also bought 309 family passes and 13 single passes, bettering the previous record by almost 100 season tickets.

Baseball Game Set for TV

The April 24 Sun Belt Conference baseball game between South Alabama and Middle Tennessee will be televised by Comcast Sports Southeast/ Charter Sports Southeast (CSS). The game has been rescheduled for a 2:30 p.m. start to accommodate the live telecast. The contest was originally slated for 4 p.m. The three-game series between the two Sun Belt powers is scheduled for April 23-25 in Mobile. CSS has approximately four million subscribers across 11 Southeastern states. Viewers in the middle Tennessee area may view the contest on cable Channel 27. South Alabama and Middle Tennessee have played some memorable games in recent years. During the 2001 campaign, Middle Tennessee's John Williams pitched a complete-game on the final day of the regular season, as the two teams shared the conference crown.

Jaggers Coming Through in the Clutch

Junior Nate Jaggers has enjoyed a recent surge in playing time, starting the last nine games as the designated hitter and taking advantage of the opportunity. The Louisville, Ky., native has upped his average almost 80 points during the nine games from .172 to the current .250. Jaggers is 11-for-35 (.314) with three runs scored and nine RBIs during the stretch, batting second in the order almost exclusively. The Pleasure Ridge Park HS product has three game-winning RBIs as well, driving in the winning run at Austin Peay on April 7, walking with the bases loaded Saturday against Arkansas State and singling in the winning run on Sunday versus ASU.

Phillips Taking Advantage of Opportunities ... Again

Senior Derek Phillips has hit safely in 18 of his 22 starts this season, hitting .360 (31-for-86) with seven doubles. The lefthanded hitter belted his first home run since February 29 on Friday against Arkansas State, a two-run shot. Phillips has served as the designated hitter most of the year until drawing his last seven starts at first base. The Knoxville, Tenn., native tied his career-high with three hits on both Friday and Sunday at Florida International, going 6-for-10 in two games in the series. In his last seven games, the Halls HS product is 12-for-28 (.429) with four runs scored, four doubles and five RBIs. He has slugged at .679 and has an on-base percentage of .484 during the stretch. Phillips has also raised his batting average in Sun Belt play to a team-leading .436, collecing 17 hits in 10 SBC contests. Last season during a 16-game stretch when Troy Harp broke his hand, Phillips caught 16 games in a row, batting .302 (16-for-53) with two doubles, two homers, eight RBIs and seven runs scored. The stretch was the most extensive playing time of his career behind the plate.

Mobley Stung in Defeat to Arkansas State

Junior righthander Chris Mobley struck out a career-high 13 batters Friday versus Arkansas State but allowed a pair of homers and got no help from his bullpen, suffering the loss in a 9-4 defeat. The Kingsport, Tenn., native allowed four runs in eight innings before running into trouble in the ninth with the game tied. Danny Borne came in and gave up one run but the big blow was a grand slam, propelling ASU to the victory. Mobley fell to 5-3 on the year and saw his ERA rise almost a run to 3.05 after giving up seven runs, the most in his career. The Dobyns-Bennett HS product deserved a better fate after keeping the Indians at bay for eight innings and giving the Blue Raiders a chance for victory. Mobley leads the club with 59.0 innings pitched in nine starts, as well as 75 strikeouts and a .213 opponent batting average. He has a 3-to-1 strikeout-to-walk ratio and has given up just 46 hits.

Williams Going Through Tough Luck

Senior John Williams pitched well on Saturday against Arkansas State but got no decision in a wild game that saw three ties and two lead changes before the Blue Raiders won in the bottom of the ninth. Williams tossed 6.1 innings in the contest, allowing five runs, two earned, with six strikeouts and no walks. In his last two outings, including two weeks ago at Florida International, the Murfreesboro, Tenn., native has pitched 14.0 innings, giving up four earned runs with 11 strikeouts and just one walk, but has an 0-1 mark. The Oakland HS product has lost three of his last four decisions after getting wins in his first three starts this year.

Mobley Enters National Statistics

Junior righthander Chris Mobley entered the national statistics this week, ranking 18th in the nation in strikeouts per game with 11.4. Mobley struck out a career-high 13 Friday against Arkansas State and has 75 strikeouts in 59.0 innings this season, leading the club in both categories. The Blue Raider pitching staff continues to rank 26th in the country in team earned run average, posting a 3.66 mark through 36 contests. Junior Eric McNamee fell just below the cutoff to rank in the Top 30 in the country in runs per game. McNamee has 45 runs scored in 36 contests.

Scouting the Commodores

Vanderbilt enters Tuesday's contest 26-10 overall, 7-8 in the SEC after dropping two-of-three at home to the redhot Arkansas Razorbacks. The Commodores are ranked anywhere from 24th (Baseball America) to 29th (NCBWA) this week. Senior Warner Jones leads the Commodores at the plate with a .449 average, collecting 66 hits in 36 games.

Scouting the Governors

Walker (.372) and Tommy Smith (.352) lead APSU at the plate, while the pitching staff posts a 4.52 ERA. The Govs used five pitchers in the first outing this season against Middle Tennessee and will likely use Wednesday as another staff day.

Versus ...

Middle Tennessee is 11-20 against Vanderbilt under head coach Steve Peterson, including a season sweep of the two games last year. The Blue Raiders won 9-5 at home and 4-2 in Nashville in 2003. The wins broke a three-game losing streak to the Commodores. Middle Tennessee is 6-7 at home under Peterson. The Blue Raiders are 17-37 against Vandy since 1976.

Middle Tennessee has already defeated Austin Peay once this season, 7-6, on April 7 in Clarksville, with Nate Jaggers driving in the winning run in a two-run ninth for the Blue Raiders. Peterson is 35-18 against the Governors, including 18-7 at home. The Blue Raiders are 70-34 versus APSU since 1976.

Williams Climbing Career Lists

Senior John Williams will leave his mark on Blue Raider baseball as one of the most successful pitchers in school history and continues to climb toward the top of four career lists. Williams made his 44th career start Friday against Arkansas State, moving past Dewon Brazelton for third on the all-time list. His 19 victories is tied for sixth with Steve Sonneberger (1983-86), while the lefthander ranks fourth on the career list in both innings pitched (276.0) and strikeouts (249). Junior righthander Chris Mobley is also in the Top 10 in strikeouts, ranking seventh with 195.

Senior Tributes Upcoming

The Middle Tennessee athletic department will honor seniors in men's and women's track this week during a pregame ceremony at Wednesday's baseball games. Before the 7 p.m. contest against Austin Peay, nine seniors from the men's and women's track teams will be honored. The final two Senior Days will take place in May, with baseball scheduled for Saturday, May 1, and softball on Sunday, May 9.

Church Continues Strong Start

Sophomore BJ Church missed the first three weeks of the season for disciplinary reasons, returning to throw a pair of relief outings before getting his first start of the year April 4 versus Louisiana-Lafayette. The Soddy Daisy HS product tossed 5.2 innings against the Ragin' Cajuns and getting the win, allowing three runs on three hits with 10 strikeouts, his most against an SBC opponent. The

righthander worked a season-long 6.1 innings at Florida International two weeks ago, allowing four runs, three earned, on four hits with five strikeouts. He did not figure in the decision, a 5-4, 10-inning victory, but deserved better. He went five-plus innings on Sunday versus Arkansas State, giving up four runs, three earned, on four hits with eight strikeouts. He is 1-0 with a 4.35 ERA this season, striking out 29 in 20.2 innings of work. In his last four starts against SBC opponents, the Hixson, Tenn., native is 2-0 in 23.0 innings of work, striking out 29 and allowing just 13 hits.

Streaks

Junior Brett Carroll extended his hitting streak to a career-high 13 with two hits on Sunday against Arkansas State, the longest since Chad Cooper hit in 14 straight last season. Carroll is batting .364 (20-for-55) with eight extra-base hits, nine RBIs and eight runs scored. He also has a slugging percentage of .636 ... Senior Derek Phillips extended his hitting streak to six with a double in the eighth on Sunday against Arkansas State, the second longest streak of his career. The lefthanded hitter is batting .480 (12-for-25) during the streak with four doubles, a home run, five RBIs and three runs scored. He has raised his season average to .360 and is hitting .436 in Sun Belt play with 17 hits in 10 SBC games. For the year Phillips has hit safely in 18 of his 22 starts, with the last seven starts coming at first base ... Senior Shane Kemp has hit safely in his last four games, going 4-for-15 (..267) with five runs scored and three stolen bases.

Carroll Consistent at the Plate

Junior Brett Carroll has hit safely in 31 of 36 games this season, including four consecutive two-hit games from March 6-10. The third baseman's three-run homer at Florida International on April 9 was his first round-tripper since March 16 at Samford, a span of 16 games. Carroll blasted his second homer of the weekend at FIU on April 11, a leadoff solo shot in the 10th to provide the margin of victory in a 5-4 triumph. Carroll hit another gametying shot on Friday versus Arkansas State, his third home run in seven games. The Knoxville, Tenn., native is currently on a career-high 13game hitting streak, batting .364 (20-for-55) with eight extra-base hits, nine RBIs and eight runs scored. He also has a slugging percentage of .636. In the last two weeks, Carroll has 13 hits in eight games with five runs scored, six RBIs and a .781 slugging percentage. The Bearden HS product has three hitting streaks this season of at least eight games, including the current 13-game stretch. Carroll moved into a tie for ninth on the all-time home run list with 32 with Friday's homer, tying

Jayhawk Owens (1988-90). He also moved into a tie for sixth on the all-time doubles list with Owens (1988-90) with 43 two-baggers against FIU.

Kemp Posting Big Power Numbers in Second Season

Senior Shane Kemp posted a dozen multi-hit and three multi-RBI games last season in his first as a Blue Raider. The Paris, Tenn., native already has 12 multi-hit and seven multi-RBI games in 2004 and leads the Blue Raiders with 31 RBIs. Kemp started hot as a firecracker but quickly cooled at the plate. The Columbia State CC transfer's batting average has leveled off and the versatile outfielder continues to hit for power, leading the Blue Raiders with nine home runs, including a three-run shot on Friday at Florida International. Kemp also showed his versatility over the weekend at FIU, making two starts in centerfield and one in right, and also played leftfield in the late innings of two contests. Kemp stole three bases against Arkansas State, helping the Blue Raiders tie Friday's game in the eighth with a pair of thefts. For the season the Henry County HS product has made 16 starts each in leftfield, 13 in rightfield and seven more in center.

Notes from the Arkansas State Series

Junior Brett Carroll extended his hitting streak to a career-high 13 with two hits on Sunday against Arkansas State, the longest since Chad Cooper hit in 14 straight last season. Blevins saw one inning of action on Saturday versus Arkansas State before working the final four innings on Sunday against ASU, allowing no runs on two hits with four strikeouts to get his second win of the week and improve his season record to 4-1 ... Senior Derek Phillips extended his hitting streak to six with a double in the eighth on Sunday against Arkansas State, the second longest streak of his career. The lefthanded hitter is batting .480 (12for-25) during the streak with four doubles, a home run, five RBIs and three runs scored. He has raised his season average to .360 and is hitting .436 in Sun Belt play with 17 hits in 10 SBC games. For the year Phillips has hit safely in 18 of his 22 starts, with the last seven starts coming at first base ... Senior Shane Kemp has hit safely in his last four games ... Junior Eric McNamee had his 20th multihit game of the year and 13 multi-run contest of the

season in Saturday's win over Arkansas State. The second baseman continues to lead the Blue Raiders in batting, runs scored, walks and hits, and has just 11 strikeouts this season in more than 175 plate appearances ... Junior Nate Jaggers is coming around after getting off to a slow start and making his hits count, driving in seven runs in four games last week with just three hits. The Louisville, Ky., native had two hits and four RBIs in Saturday's win over Arkansas State, including a walk-off walk in the bottom of the ninth. He singled in the eventual game-winner in the eighth on Sunday versus ASU.

Tidbits

Sophomore shortstop Jeff Beachum has 11 multihit contests this season, including a pair of four-hit games and two three-hit outings. Beachum has belted four home runs after recording no home runs during the 2003 campaign. The Cordova, Tenn., native also leads the club in stolen bases with nine after just two thefts last season ... Junior second baseman Eric McNamee has 20 multi-hit games and 13 multi-run outings this year, including seven three-hit contests. McNamee leads the team with a .417 (10-for-24) batting average with runners in scoring position. McNamee also leads the club with an astronomical .551 (38-for-69) average when batting as a leadoff hitter in an inning.

Mobley Named Pitcher of the Week

Junior righthander Chris Mobley was named the Sun Belt Conference Pitcher of the Week on Tuesday after his complete-game, two-hit shutout last Friday. The Kingsport, Tenn., native set careerhighs with nine innings pitched and 11 strikeouts in shutting out Southwest Missouri State last Friday, 4-0. Mobley has worked 16.0 innings in his last two starts, giving up two unearned runs and striking out 20. He leads the Blue Raiders with a 1.04 ERA and 36 strikeouts. Mobley is tied with John Williams with a 3-1 record, tossing 26.0 innings with opponents batting just .185. The honor is the second this season for a Blue Raider hurler after Williams won the award three weeks ago.

Williams Named National Pitcher of the Week

Senior John Williams earned Collegiate Baseball National Pitcher of the Week honors last Monday after striking out 12 batters in six innings and combining with Chase Swing for the third no-hitter in school history. Williams and Swing combined to throw just the third no-hitter in school history in a 4-0 win over IP-Fort Wayne on February 24. Williams struck out 12 and walked one in six innings. He was so dominant that he fanned 10 of the first 13 hitters in the game and a dozen of the 19 batters he faced before leaving the game with 90 pitches after six innings. Swing then got the final nine outs for his first save of the year and 12th of his career. It was the fifth career double-digit strikeout performance by Williams and his most since last season versus New Mexico State.

Williams Earns SBC Pitcher of the Week

Middle Tennessee senior lefthander John Williams picked up another award last week after combining for the third no-hitter in school history, this one the Sun Belt Conference Pitcher of the Week. Williams tossed six no-hit innings, striking out 12 and facing just one batter over the minimum. He combined with teammate Chase Swing for only the third no-hitter in school history. The Murfreesboro native struck out 10 of the first 13 batters of the game. His strikeout total was his fifth career double-digit strikeout contest and most since striking out 12 versus New Mexico State last season.

Peterson Gets No. 500

Blue Raider skipper Steve Peterson picked up his 500th coaching victory at Middle Tennessee in the second game of the 2003 Sun Belt Championships, a 6-5 triumph over Arkansas-Little Rock. Peterson got the 650th win of his career as a head coach at Vanderbilt on May 13, 2003, and is the winningest coach in Blue Raider history. Peterson's teams have won eight conference tournaments and have made seven NCAA Tournament appearances in his 16 years at the helm of the Blue Raider program.

Carroll, Swing Preseason All-Americans

Blue Raider juniors Brett Carroll and Chase Swing each garnered Preseason All-America selections for 2004 after their spectacular performances a year ago. Carroll was named to the Third Team by both the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) and Louisville Slugger/Collegiate Baseball. He also earned Honorable Mention accolades from CollegeBaseballInsider.com. Swing joined Carroll as a Third Team pick by the NCBWA.

FORMER BLUE RAIDERS HEAD TO SPRING TRAINING

Nine former Middle Tennessee baseball players took part in spring training this year, including three former standouts in Major League camp:

- Tullahoma, Tenn., native and 2001 first-round draft pick Dewon Brazelton was in camp with the Tampa Bay Devil Rays after pitching at every level in the club's organization last year and performing very well in the Arizona Fall League. He spent most of his offseason working out at a training center in the Phoenix area.
- Jason Maxwell was also in camp with the Devil Rays after spending the last two seasons in the Cincinnati Reds organization at Class AAA Louisville (KY). Maxwell played for the Blue Raiders for three seasons from 1991-93 and has since spent time in the Chicago Cubs, Detroit Tigers, Minnesota Twins and Texas Rangers organizations. Both Brazelton and Maxwell will start the year in AAA Durham (NC).
- The third former Blue Raider in major league camp, Jeremy Owens, joined the Boston Red Sox as a Rule V draft choice during the winter of 2002. Owens spent last season at Class AA Portland (ME) before getting called up to Class AAA Pawtucket (RI) for the International League playoffs. Steve Peterson begins his 17th season as the Middle Tennessee skipper as the winningest coach in program history.

Peterson has produced nine seasons with 30 or more wins, including a

school record 42 victories during the 1990 slate.

Peterson teaches a hard-nosed and aggressive style of baseball. His personable demeanor has made him a big hit among fans, boosters, players and recruits alike.

Peterson also adheres to the philosophy that defense and pitching wins championships. He has long been known for outstanding defensive teams, and the Blue Raiders have featured some of the area's most feared hurlers throughout the years.

Peterson has seen three of his pitchers earn All-America honors, including the only First Team All-American in school history, Dewon Brazelton. Under his watch, the Blue Raiders have seen nine single-season and eight career pitching records established.

The offensive output of the team has not been ignored under Peterson, as his recruits established most of the offensive records held at Middle Tennessee. Peterson has developed three players who hit .400 or better in a season along with the school's single-season and career home run records. His 1997 squad established the all-time record for batting average with a .323 clip.

Aside from wins and losses, Peterson has been instrumental in leaving the Blue Raiders' mark on college baseball in other ways. He brought home seven consecutive conference championships (either regular season or tournament) during one stretch and has guided his team to an NCAA Regional on seven different occasions. During his tenure, Peterson has captured one Sun Belt crown, a Sun Belt tournament title, eight OVC titles and seven OVC tournament crowns. For his efforts, Peterson has twice been named OVC Coach of the Year. He brought national attention to the program in the 2001 season, as his team found itself in the national rankings for the first time since 1982.

His efforts were clearly in evidence during the magical 2001 season. The Blue Raiders established the single-game attendance record at Reese Smith Field with a crowd of 2,733 on hand to witness the Blue Raiders' Friday night tilt against South Alabama. The team went on to set the single-season attendance mark with 26,218 coming

through the gates at Reese Smith Field. His squad saw 10 crowds of 1,000 or more during the season.

If the team accolades and accomplishments aren't enough, consider that Peterson has coached a Sun Belt Player of the Year and six OVC Players of the Year, a Sun Belt Pitcher of the Year and an OVC Pitcher of the Year, a First Team All-American, four Third-Team All-Americans, four Freshman All-Americans, and 35 First Team All-Conference players.

Professional baseball has seen 46 former Peterson protégés pass through the ranks with four players logging time in the Major Leagues.

Aside from playing baseball for a living, numerous former players have entered the coaching profession. Currently 24 former players are coaching at the high school, college or professional level.

Peterson was named the Tennessee Baseball Coaches Association College Coach of the Year, in 1992 and again in 2000. He was also inducted into the Rutherford County Old Timers Baseball Hall of Fame in 2003.

He has also been responsible for the tremendous growth of Blue Raider baseball camps. Since taking over the camp program in 1984, Peterson has developed one of the area's premier camps with most sessions sold out.

Peterson took two separate tours with the Blue Raiders as an assistant coach under John Stanford prior to becoming the team's skipper. During his runs between 1976-78 and 1985-87, the Blue Raiders won two OVC titles and four southern division crowns.

During the interim, Peterson served as the head coach at Roane State Community College in Harriman, Tenn. During his tenure from 1979-1984, Peterson's teams won a Tennessee state title in 1981 and he was twice named TJCAA Coach of the Year (1981, '84). While at Roane State, Peterson put together a sparkling record of 153-96, a .614 winning percentage.

His expertise also ranges away from on-thefield coaching. He is known as one of the top recruiters in the region and has a knack for keeping local talent close to home.

Peterson's reputation extends into fundraising as well. Events such as the annual Chuck Taylor Golf Tournament have become mainstays on the calendars of baseball supporters across middle Tennessee and have served to raise thousands of dollars for the improvement of Blue Raider baseball.

He spearheaded the effort to pay for the construction of the Stephen B. Smith Clubhouse and Indoor Training Facility, which opened its doors in 1998. One look inside the facility shows the amount of time and effort spent toward this endeavor. It has become known as one of the finest collegiate clubhouses and training facilities in the entire country.

Reese Smith Field has also benefited from Peterson's fundraising abilities. He has helped transform the park into a fan-friendly area by expanding the seating area, putting up a new information center just inside the gate, and expanding the restroom and concession facilities.

Peterson guided efforts during the summer of 2001 to expand the dugouts at Reese Smith Field. He is also currently spearheading an effort that would totally renovate the current stadium. The plans would call for a significant remodeling of the concession stand, improved and expanded restroom facilities, and a modern press box that would accommodate radio and television along with print media.

A native of Huntsville, Ala., Peterson stood out as a catcher under the legendary Rudy Abbott at Jacksonville State. He earned his bachelor's from Jacksonville State in 1973 and later earned a master's from Middle Tennessee in 1977.

Peterson is married to the former Rita Albert and the couple has three children, Jill, Jenny and John. Away from the diamond, he enjoys fishing for smallmouth bass.
