SERIES RECORD

■ Saturday's football game between Middle Tennessee and Troy will be the 12th meeting between the two schools. The series, which MT leads 10-1, began in 1936. Middle Tennessee won the first eight meetings before the Trojans came away with their first win in 1999. MT is 7-1 against Troy in Murfreesboro and 3-0 at Troy. This will be the first ever meeting between the two schools as conference rivals.

SEASON FINALES

■ The Blue Raiders have a mark of 45-35-6 in regular season finales and have won 19 of their last 25. Under Head Coach Andy McCollum, Middle Tennessee is a perfect 5-0 in final regular season games.

MT IN SBC PLAY

■ Middle Tennessee has a mark of 15-11 in Sun Belt action all-time, including an 11-3 mark at home and a 4-8 record on the road.

NOTING MT-TROY

- The Blue Raiders have tallied five shutouts in the series.
- This will mark Middle Tennessee's first visit to Troy since 1953.
- In the 1999 game, the Blue Raiders compiled a school record 840 all-purpose yards.
- Even though they were not league foes in 2003, the game was a designated conference game.
- In the last two meetings, Middle Tennessee has tallied 24 total penalties.
- Middle Tennessee has eight sacks in the last two meetings combined.
- Trailing 20-17 in the fourth quarter of last year's game, Kerry Wright reeled in a 56-yard pass from Andrico Hines at the 9:33 mark to put the Blue Raiders ahead for good. Brian Kelly would later add a field goal to complete the scoring.

BATTLE FOR THE PALLADIUM

■ Greek Mythology holds that *The Palladium* is a wooden statue that fell from the Heavens. It was kept at the Temple of Athena in the city of Troy. According to legend, as long as *The Palladium* was preserved within the walls of the city, Troy would be safe and could not be taken. However, a "Raider" by the name of Odysseus - also known as the Raider of Cities - stole *The Palladium* during the Trojan War leading to the fall of Troy. In the spirit of the Blue Raiders and Trojans Greek mythology link, Middle Tennessee and Troy compete in The Battle for The Palladium during their annual Sun Belt Conference game. Legend dictates the winner of *The Palladium* gains an unknown and unexplainable advantage over the other making it more difficult to

regain control during future battles. The history between the two schools dates back to 1936 with the Blue Raiders owning a 10-1 advantage in the series. Now competing in the same conference for the first time, the legend may extend well after the football season is over. Many believe losing possession of *The Palladium* has an enduring effect, mystically influencing other athletic events throughout the year matching the Trojans and Raiders. It's just another factor to overcome in this rivalry game between Middle Tennessee and Troy.

BAKER, JACKSON SHINE

■ Middle Tennessee enjoyed its best rushing game in over a year against Louisiana-Monroe thanks to Lee Baker and Terry Jackson. Baker and Jackson both rushed for career-highs as the Blue Raiders put up 213 rushing yards on 38 attempts to turn in their best effort since gaining 222 yards at Idaho in 2003. Baker tallied 88 yards on 12 carries, while Jackson added 82 yards on 10 attempts.

MARKS SETS RECORD

■ Quarterback Clint Marks set a new singleseason passing record when he tallied 241 yards in a win over Louisiana-Monroe. Marks now has 2,618 passing yards this season surpassing the previous record of 2,603 yards set by Wes Counts in 1999.

IMPRESSIVE RUN

■ Over the past couple years, Middle Tennessee's **Kerry Wright** is one of the hottest players in college football. Over his last 22 games, Wright has caught 146 passes for 2,295 yards and



. Currently ranks third all-time in receptions with 164, third in receiving yardage (2,556) and is tied for first in touchdown receptions (21).

Honors: Selected to 2004 Biletnikoff Award "Watch List" ... Voted first team All-Sun Belt in 2003 ... Preseason Honorable Mention All-American by CollegeFootballNews.com ... CFN rated Wright 8th best receiver in nation ... Earned the offense's "Most Valuable Player" award during 2004 spring drills.

2004: Hauled in nine passes for 93 yards in the season opener at Akron, but his big play came on his first collegiate punt return for a touchdown ... Wright brought one back 75 yards for a big score against the Zips ... Followed Akron up with nine grabs for 147 yards and a touchdown versus Florida Atlantic ... Recorded eight receptions at ULL ... Caught nine passes for a season-best 178 yards and three touchdowns, including a career long 80-yard TD reception ... The 80-yarder went down as the fourth longest in school history ... Turned in his second straight 100yard receiving game with 112 on nine catches and a 37-yard TD at No. 22 Florida ... Collected nine receptions for 167 yards and two touchdowns in win over Utah State ... In his final home contest, Wright grabbed eight passes for 126 yards and two touchdowns.

2003: Played in all 12 games and started 11 times ... Ranked fifth nationally in receiving yardage ... Set a Sun Belt Conference and school record with 1,280 receiving yards ... 19 touchdowns. The East Point, Ga., native has 73 catches for 1,015 yards and 10 touchdowns after 10 games this season to go along with a 75-yard punt return for a score at Akron. Heading into the season finale vs Troy, Wright ranks No. 9 nationally in receptions per game and No. 9 in receiving yardage per game.

BIG DAY FOR WRIGHT

■ WR Kerry Wright had a huge day in his final home contest last Saturday. The East Point, Ga., native had eight receptions for 126 yards and two touchdowns. The two scores enabled him to set a new single-season touchdown receptions record with 10 and it ran his career mark to 21 to tie for the all-time record with Kendall Newson and Herbert Owenby. It also went down as his 10th career 100yard receiving game and the fifth of the season. On top of that, he moved his yardage total to 1,015

yards to become the first player in Middle Tennessee history to record two career 1,000-yard campaigns.

CHICOLA STEPPING UP

■ There's no question that this Blue Raider team is loaded with young talent, but no one has been any more impressive than true freshman tight end Stephen Chicola. The Jacksonville, Fla., native has reeled in 12 passes for 147 yards on the season and all 12 grabs have come in four of the last six games. Chicola enjoyed his best day as a collegian in the win over Utah State by setting career-highs in receptions and receiving yardage with four grabs for 69 yards. Chicola's previous high was a threecatch game against Arkansas State.

MARKS CHASING COUNTS

■ Sophomore QB Clint Marks, who has

passed for more than 200 yards in a school record eight of 10 games this year, moved into second place on the single-season completions list after collecting 22 in 32 attempts against Utah State, then adding 14 more at NMSU and 26 in a win over ULM. Marks now has 242 completions on the season and is just seven shy of Wes Counts' record of 249 set back in 1999.

SACKS ARE UP

■ Middle Tennessee's talented and youthful defensive line has been enjoying a solid season for the Blue Raiders. Entering this week's game against ULM, MT has registered 26 sacks on the year to rank as the second most in a single-season. The all-time record at Middle Tennessee is 27 established by the 2001 team. Leading the charge this year has been redshirt freshman Erik Walden, who has six total sacks. Redshirt freshmen Antoine Owens and Sean Mosley and senior Thomas Johnson are second on the team with three each.

SMITH HAVING BIG YEAR

■ Sophomore placekicker Colby Smith, one of 20 finalists for the Lou Groza Award, is enjoying a stellar year. The Franklin, Tenn., native is 14-for-16 in the field goal department. Smith is also a perfect 30-for-30 on PATs. Smith needs just three more made field goals to tie for the all-time single-season record (17).

SACKMASTER

■ Redshirt freshman Erik Walden, who has started the past four games at right defensive end, enters the Troy game as the team leader in quarterback sacks. The Dublin, Ga., native has six sacks on the season and five the past four games as a starter. The six sacks already rank tied for second on the single-season list and is just two shy of setting a new single-season record. For the year, Walden has 23 tackles (19 solos), 8.5 tackles for loss and six sacks.

WRIGHT IN TOP FIVE

■ WR Kerry Wright (East Point, Ga.) enters the Troy game ranked in the top five all-time at Middle Tennessee in receptions, receiving yardage and touchdown receptions. Wright has 164 career catches to rank third on the all-time list. He also ranks third in receiving yardage with 2,556 yards and needs 81 more yards to take over second place from Tyrone Calico (2,636). Wright has 21 touchdown catches to currently rank tied for the all-time record with Kendall Newson and Herbert Owenby.

WRIGHT FOR 100

■ Kerry Wright enters the Troy game with 10 career 100-yard receiving games and all 10 have

come over the past 21 games, including one at No. 8 Georgia, one at No. 23 Missouri in 2003 and one at No. 22 Florida in 2004. Wright, however, does not have enough games left to catch the all-time leader. That record belongs to **Kendall Newson** who had 14 from 1998-2001.

BRIGHT FUTURE

■ Middle Tennessee has one of the youngest team's in I-A which bodes for a very bright future in Murfreesboro for the Blue Raider faithful. Of the 44 players on the offensive and defensive two-deep roster, Middle Tennessee will welcome back 38 of them in 2005. As for starters, the Blue Raiders will have 18 returning in 2005 (nine on offense and nine on defense), along with punter/placekicker Colby Smith, deep snapper John Crawford and kickoff man Paul Wheeler.

■ Middle Tennessee has now scored points on its opening drive of the game for the fifth time over the past seven contests ... BLOCKED KICKS

■ Under McCollum, the Blue Raiders have blocked a total of 15 kicks with four being punts (Michael Woods vs Louisiana Tech in 2000, Chris Johnson vs ASU in 2001; Joey Montalbano vs ULM in 2002; Thomas Johnson vs UNT in 2002), six being extra points (Kareem Bland vs UL-Monroe in 2001 and two vs UNT in 2002; Pierre Ingram vs Clemson and Missouri in 2003; Thomas Johnson vs Troy State in 2003) and five field goals (Kareem Bland vs UConn in 2001; Jerry Vanderpool vs Tennessee in 2002 and Akron in 2004; Sean Mosley vs FAU in 2004, and Pierre Ingram vs ULL in 2004). The first multiple block game for MT came against North Texas in 2002 with three.

GOING OVERTIME

■ Middle Tennessee enters the Troy game having competed in four overtime games as a member of I-A and is 2-2 in those contests. The Blue Raiders had one overtime contest in 2000 and played three in 2003. In 2003, the Blue Raiders lost in one overtime at No. 23 Missouri, then bounced back to take an overtime win at Idaho before losing a four overtime game at home against Louisiana-Lafayette. The four overtime loss to the Ragin' Cajuns was the longest game in the history of Blue Raider football and was the longest in the history of the SBC.

STRONG IN THE BLUE ZONE

■ Over the past **56** games, the Blue Raider offense has performed admirably in the blue zone. During that span, the offense has appeared inside the opponents' 20-yard line **220** times and has come away with points on **182** occasions. That works out to 83 percent. Of the 182 scores, 145 have been touchdowns. In 2004, the Blue Raiders are a 32-for-37 in the blue zone.

100-YD RECEIVING GAMES

■ Under Andy McCollum, MT has had 33 100-yard receiving games with 32 of those coming from wide receivers and one from a running back. WR Kerry Wright (10) and WR Chris Henry (1) are the only current Blue Raiders to own a 100-yard receiving game.

LOOKING FOR 20

■ Under Andy McCollum, the Blue Raiders have compiled a mark of 30-15 when scoring 20 or more points. On the flip side, Middle Tennessee stands 0-21 when scoring less than 20 points for McCollum and Co.

OUICK HITTERS

- Center Marcus Gates recorded a careerhigh 19 knockdowns in the win over Utah State.
- MARKS SETS RECORD: Clint Marks set a new single-game total offense record when he collected 461 yards in the win over ASU. Marks eclipsed the previous mark of 451 set by Wes Counts vs Idaho in 2001.
- The five forced turnovers against Arkansas State went down as the most by the Blue Raiders since gaining five at Connecticut in 2000 a span of 42 games.
- The 80-yard touchdown pass from Clint Marks to Kerry Wright against ASU went down as the fourth longest pass play in school history. It was also the longest pass play in the I-A era.
- Middle Tennessee's 13 penalties at ULL tied for the second most in game by a Blue Raider team.
- Thomas Johnson enters the Troy contest with nine career sacks (seven over the past 18 games) to rank fourth all-time at Middle Tennessee (stats only started being kept in 1987).
- With the postponement of the season opener this year, Middle Tennessee now has to play for 11 consecutive weeks. The last time a Blue Raider squad played 11 straight weeks was in 1973.
- Junior College transfer Jeremiah Weaver rode a bus 33 hours to make the first day of drills on Aug. 11. Weaver arrived at 9 AM and reported to meetings shortly after.
- As a I-A member (67 games), the Blue Raiders have scored 50 or more points nine times.
- The Blue Raiders are 24-3 under Andy McCollum when leading at the half and are 27-3 when leading a game entering the 4th quarter.
- When trailing at the half, the Blue Raiders are just 5-32 under McCollum and two of those wins came in 2001.
- The Blue Raiders have scored in 95 of their last 97 games. The two miscues were a 10-0 shutout on the road against UL-Monroe in 1999 and a 55-0 loss in 2000 at Florida. MT has scored in 47 straight home games.



AKRON, Ohio. - In a strangely named stadium against an unfamiliar foe, MTSU football perhaps found what had escaped it for a while.

The Blue Raiders marched into the Rubber Bowl and promptly defeated Akron 31-24 in one of most heart-pounding victories in the program's recent history amid a crowd of 17,263 fans.

"All we did was play Middle Tennessee football, and some people have forgotten what that's all about," said senior receiver Kerry Wright. "It's about playing hard-nosed for four quarters and not backing down from anybody or any challenge.

"Maybe we've drifted away from that for a couple of years, but I think we're reminding people what it's all about now."

The win marked the Blue Raiders' second season-opening victory since jumping to Division I-A in 1999. The other came at Vanderbilt to start the 2001 season, where MTSU finished the year 8-3.

The Blue Raiders will play its home opener this Saturday against Florida Atlantic, which defeated three-time defending Sun Belt champion North Texas 20-13 Saturday night.

"This is big simply because we came on the road and beat a very good MAC football team," said MTSU coach Andy McCollum. "We faced a team that won last year, had the ninth best offense in the country last year and has as good of a best quarterback as I've ever seen.

"And the way we won says as much because our kids never gave up.

The Blue Raiders' moment of truth likely came when Akron and its home crowd simultaneously rose to the occasion early in the fourth quarter to steal the lead from MTSU for the first time in the game.

Heisman trophy candidate quarter back Charlie Frye, who passed for 399 yard on the night, connected with Dan Basch for an eight-yard touchdown pass that put Akron ahead 24-21 with 14:14 left in the game.

Determined not to let the Zips steal a win they had earned, the Blue Raiders stormed back with a 13-play, 71-yard drive that ended with Colby Smith's 28-yard field goal, the first of the sophomore's career.

"I thought I wasn't going to get my chance for that first kick, but I got it and it felt as great as I thought it would. It was big," Smith said.

The tide-turning play came soon after when senior cornerback Danny Tolbert snagged an interception off Frye to squash Akron's shot at the lead and hand MTSU an opportunity to deliver a dagger.

"We made plays that winning teams make because that's what we are right now. We're 1-0," Tolbert said.

The interception set up a 42-yard drive that was capped by tailback Eugene Gross' third rushing touchdown of the night, a three-yard burst over left guard.

Gross also scored from four yards and two yards, both in the first quarter.

Junior receiver Chris Henry kept MTSU's final scoring drive alive with a clutch 17-yard reception to move the football to the 11-yard line.

Henry made a career-high 10 receptions for 80 yards, two catches shy of the Blue Raiders' single-game record.

Quarterback Clint Marks delivered the final dart to

Henry, as he finished completing 23-of-30 passes for 228 yards and one interception.

Marks relieved starting quarterback Josh Harris, who was also nearly flawless running the Blue Raiders' attack.

Harris completed his first 10 passes, finishing 10of-11 for 111 yards and one interception.

"Josh did well for us. He had the one interception, but he looked good," McCollum said. "Clint did good, too, and we felt like Clint was maybe the hot hand to stay with. It was something where we couldn't miss with either."

At the head of the opposing huddle, Frye showed why he is ranked among the nation's top signal callers.

The Akron senior completed 31-of-44 passes, two touchdowns and one costly interception. However, Frye was sacked four times by an aggressive MTSU defensive line, and the Zips were largely contained around the goal line.

Redshirt freshman Sean Mosley sacked Frye and forced a fumble to end Akron's long drive to the 5-yard line to open the game.

Fellow redshirt freshman Bradley Robinson then recovered another Akron fumble at the Zips' 3-yard line that led to Gross' first score.

Leading 14-0, MTSU stopped Akron's third drive and scoring chance in the first quarter when Jerry Vanderpool blocked Jason Swiger's 39-yard field goal attempt.

Swiger later connected on a 39-yarder to cut MTSU's lead to 21-10 at halftime.

Kerry Wright boosted the Blue Raiders' first-half momentum with a 75-yard punt return touchdown, the first for MTSU in seven years.

"I think we needed to answer some questions, and I hope we did," Henry said. "I think we got a big win at an important time. This can lead to a lot of good things for us."

With past experience to pull from, MTSU knew it needed

sophomore Colby Smith nailed a 36-yard field goal to cut FAU's

to play all 60 minutes of its finest football to finish off Florida Atlantic.

Somehow amid a spirited home opener, about seven critical minutes went overlooked, as FAU rallied to beat MTSU 27-20 for the second straight season in front of 13,348 at Floyd Stadium.

"You never know what's going to happen with momentum, but I felt like we had it coming out after the half, and we kept it for a long drive," said MTSU coach Andy McCollum. "We just had a critical turnover and too many mistakes, and (FAU) took advantage of it."

The Blue Raiders took all the game's momentum into the halftime break and retained it for the first possession of the third quarter before an interception thrown in the end zone negated a 70-yard drive.

The Owls followed by scoring 21 unanswered points in a span of 6:40, and MTSU never recovered from the brief but biting sequence of miscues.

"When we came out in the second half, we were not as focused as they were, and they jumped on us," said MTSU senior linebacker Alvin Fite.

The Blue Raiders led comfortably 17-6 at halftime before quarterback Clint Marks tossed an interception that ignited the Owls' second-half surge and gave away MTSU's chance to perhaps put the game out of reach.

Marks threw three interceptions in the game despite tossing for career highs with 27-of-37 passing for 359 yards.

"You can't throw three interceptions and beat a team like that," McCollum said. "They got three turnovers, and we got none. That was the difference in the game."

FAU scored touchdowns on three straight drives to take the lead at 27-17, while MTSU went three plays and out during the same third-quarter span.

FAU quarterback Jared Allen passed for all three scores. Roosevelt Bynes caught a 36-yard touchdown pass after his score on the previous play was negated by an Owls' penalty.

Tight end Anthony Crissinger-Hill hauled in a 2-yard touchdown pass shortly after Marks was intercepted for the third time.

And then the most frustrating score allowed by MTSU's defense came when Larry Taylor snatched a 47-yard touchdown strike that slipped literally right through safety Kevin Copeland's hands.

"Nobody wants to intercept that ball more than Kevin Copeland. But when it comes down to it and you get into position to make a play, you have to make the play," McCollum said. "We have to find out a way to make the play when we get the chance because that's what wins ball games."

Overall, FAU gained 162 yards in the tide-turning third quarter, 136 through the air.

Once the MTSU defense found its footing in the fourth quarter, time ran short. MTSU

lead to 27-20.

However, only 24 seconds remained when the Blue Raiders regained possession - apparently not quite enough time to repay a last-play loss dealt a year earlier by the Owls.

If the Blue Raiders fell victim to a snowball of miscues late, they dodged an avalanche in the opening stages of the game.

MTSU kept FAU's long opening drive from reaching pay dirt with a red-zone stand that limited the Owls to a 28-yard field goal.

After Marks threw an interception on the Blue Raiders' first offensive snap, the MTSU defense again stood strong, holding FAU to a second field goal and simply a 60 lead.

Smith's 25-yard field goal capped a 59-yard drive by MTSU that included five straight completions by Marks.

Kerry Wright's 48-yard grab set up Lee Baker's 2-yard run to give MTSU a 10-6 lead. Wright made an acrobatic 3-yard catch in the second quarter for another score, and MTSU led 17-6.

The Blue Raiders' final claim for momentum in the first half came when Sean Mosley blocked an Owls' field goal on the last snap of the first half.

"We felt good going into the half because a lot of things were starting to click," Marks said. "We just had too many turnovers, and we lost our composure, and I put that completely on myself."

Wright led MTSU with nine receptions for 147 yards. Cleannord Saintil added five catches for 75 yards.

FAU's Allen finished 16-of-25 passing for 273 yards and three touchdowns.



The Blue Raiders' legs are churning, but a victory

isn't coming any closer.

After earning its first season-opening win since 2001, the Blue Raiders (1-2, 0-1 in the Sun Belt Conference) have now dropped two in a row, each by seven points, with a 24-17 loss to Louisiana-Lafayette (2-2, 1-0) amid 25,083 fans at Cajun Field.

"You can't win a game when you keep shooting yourself in the foot," said MTSU head coach Andy McCollum. "For whatever reason, we made too many mistakes and at the wrong times. We just didn't execute well."

MTSU fell into a one-game hole in the Sun Belt race with a pivotal trip to North Texas looming.

"We have all the players and the coaches to win football games here. We just aren't doing it," said MTSU linebacker Marcel Horne. "We have to turn this around quick."

For the second straight week, the Blue Raiders turned an early lead into a third-quarter letdown.

MTSU penalties and miscues shortened the field for the Ragin' Cajuns' offense in the second half, allowing the home team to steal a game seemingly in the Blue Raiders' grasp.

With the score tied at 14 at halftime, MTSU once again came out of the locker room out of sync. The Blue Raiders were shut out in the third quarter for the third straight game this season and piled onto its offensive problems with 62 penalty yards in the third quarter.

"We had so many yards of penalties in that third quarter, and I don't know why," McCollum said. "We had first-and-10, and then first-and-20 and first-and-25. You're thinking that you've got to give yourself a chance to win the game, but we kept digging a hole with stupid mistakes and we have to correct that."

When the MTSU defense did overcome its own offensive woes, more problems accumulated.

The Cajuns broke the 14-14 tie in the third quarter when their punt hit the back of an MTSU blocker, and ULL recovered the free ball at the Blue Raiders' 15-yard line.

MTSU again held ULL to minimal gains, but a personal foul (illegal hands to the face) on the Cajuns' field goal attempt gave the home team new life.

ULL's Xavier Campbell caught a sevenyard touchdown pass from Jerry Babb on the next play.

ULL's Sean Comiskey added a 38-yard field goal in the fourth quarter, and MTSU answered with kicker Colby Smith's 37-yarder to bring the score to 24-17.

The Blue Raiders had two offensive opportunities late to send the game into overtime, but each ended with a turnover.

MTSU running back Eugene Gross fumbled with 5:19 left in the fourth quarter, and quarterback Clint Marks tossed a long interception to the 1-yard line with 39 seconds remaining in the game.

It was the lone mistake for Marks, who again finished the game with impressive numbers. The sophomore finished with 35-of-46

Receiver Cleannord Saintil had a career-high nine receptions, and Kerry Wright added eight catches, but was blanketed by ULL defenders most of the night.

"It seemed like we had things going in the right direction, and we thought we had some things fixed going into this game, but apparently we don't," Marks said. "We were put in a position, but we didn't do what you're supposed to do to win, especially when we came out in third quarter."

The Blue Raiders' frustrations didn't suddenly appear in the pivotal third quarter.

On the first play of the game, senior cornerback Danny Tolbert stepped in front of an errant pass and headed toward the end zone with a certain interception.

Instead, the football glanced right off Tolbert's chest, and the Blue Raiders allowed ULL to march 66 yards for a Dwight Lindon 5-yard scoring run.

"You're looking for a break and looking for somebody to make a play, and it can't come much easier," McCollum said. "It's right there for the taking, and you get a guy right in the perfect position to go up 7-0 right off the bat.

"What do you do? (The Cajuns) get that chance, and they make a play. We didn't."

MTSU tied the game at 7 when Pierre Ingram hauled in a 15-yard pass from Marks in the first quarter, the receiver's first score of his career. Ingram later blocked a field goal to deny ULL's chance to take the lead.

Gross capped a 63-yard scoring drive with a oneyard touchdown run to put the Blue Raiders up 14-7.

However, MTSU squandered the chance to take a touchdown-lead into halftime, allowing the Cajuns to go 79 yards in 2:17 to score a touchdown at the end of the second quarter. B.J. Crist caught the 10-yard game-tying pass from Babb with 25 seconds left in the first half.

Overall, MTSU finished with 13 penalties for 111 yards, while ULL had just 32 penalty yards on five fouls.

Three-time defending Sun Belt champion North Texas (1-4, 1-0 in the Sun Belt Conference) extended its conference winning streak to 19 games, while the Blue Raiders (1-3, 0-2) stretched their trend of squandering

early leads to four games (one in an eventual win).

Meanwhile, North Texas continued its dominance over MTSU in close games, as the Mean Green have beaten the Blue Raiders by a total of 27 points in their four-game series sweep.

The Blue Raiders' letdown came in the second quarter when they were outscored 24-0 in front of 15,913 fans eager for a ray of hope at Fouts Field.

"I just don't think we played very well defensively to tell you the truth," said MTSU coach Andy McCollum. "In the second quarter, we give up big plays, and at times, you had guys in position to make the plays and they didn't.

"Then I thought in the second half, (North Texas) had too many third-down conversions when our defense had chances to get off the field. I think we just had more opportunities to play better on that side of the ball than we showed."

Trailing 14-0, North Texas put up 24 unanswered points during a 12-minute span to take a 24-14 halftime lead that MTSU could never quite erase.

The Blue Raiders clawed back behind sophomore running back Eugene Gross, who ran for a season-high 113 rushing yards on 20 carries.

However, it was senior receiver Kerry Wright who pulled MTSU within three points with a 7-yard touchdown catch from quarterback Clint Marks in the third quarter to cut the lead to 24-21. It was MTSU's first third-quarter score of the season.

"It was the second quarter instead of the third quarter this time that did us in," said Marks, who was sacked five times on the night. "But it doesn't matter when it happened because it's

stili a ioss."

Despite their second-quarter slump, the Blue Raiders still had ample opportunities to take back the lead.

However, the MTSU defense could not slow down the ticking of the game clock or North Texas' balanced offensive attack.

North Texas freshman Jamario Thomas rushed for 179 yards and two touchdowns on 36 carries, and quarterback Scott Hall completed 17-of-23 passes for 285 yards and one touchdown.

North Texas receiver Johnny Quinn finished with 153 yards on six catches, including key receptions of 15 and 11 yards to extend the Mean Green's final offensive possession.

Kicker Nick Bazaldua capped that drive with an 18-yard field goal that put the game mostly out of reach for the Blue Raiders, trailing 30-21 with 4:12 remaining.

4-yard line, but Marks tossed an interception in the end zone on a pass intended for Wright with 49 seconds left. It marked the second straight week that Marks threw an interception on MTSU's final offensive play of the game.

MTSU was impressive to start game, rumbling through scoring drives of 75 and 53 yards on its first two possessions, respectively.

Gross rushed for 54 yards on nine carries in the Blue Raiders' first two drives, including a 15-yard touchdown to put MTSU ahead 14-0 late in the first quarter.

North Texas then cut the lead in half with a steady seven-play, 70-yard drive, capped by Thomas' 6-yard scoring scamper.

Following Bazaldua's 39-yard field goal, the Mean Green wasted no time stealing the lead - scoring touchdowns on drives of two and three plays, respectively.

Hall hit Quinn on back-to-back passing plays for 49 and 31 yards, as the latter reached the end zone to put North Texas up 17-14 with 5:54 left in the second quarter.

About four minutes later, Thomas scored on a 25yard touchdown run shortly after Quinn pulled down another 40-yard reception.

"I'm very proud of our players because we didn't get off to a very good start," said North Texas coach Darrell Dickey. "Our players have been here before, and they know how to circle the wagons, and they did that."

MTSU suffered its third straight loss with a home game against Arkansas State coming Oct. 9 at 2 p.m.



Tenn.. - For the fans that littered Floyd Stadium, one statement was made and another was forcefully denied Saturday.

"We wanted to make a statement that we're still here to play and to show everybody that this team does not quit," said MTSU (2-3, 1-2) senior defensive lineman Thomas Johnson after the Blue Raiders' 45-17 home win over Arkansas State (1-5, 1-1).

For MTSU, it was a bold win amid 13,250 fans, the largest victory for the Blue Raiders since a 54-6 triumph over ASU in 2001.

The numbers also reflected the lopsided contest.

Clint Marks set four career highs with 30-of-34 passing (88.2 percent) for 447 yards and four touchdowns. He also set a school record with 461 yards of total offense.

Meanwhile, senior receiver Kerry Wright played through a bruised sternum to record an equally impressive performance, hauling in nine receptions for 178 yards and three scores, which tied his own single-game school mark.

Overall, it was the one near flawless day the Blue Raider offense had searched for through the three-game losing streak they snapped Saturday.

"This was it," said Marks, whose 88.2 completion percentage ranks second all-time at MTSU. "We haven't played 60 good minutes all year, but this was it. This is what we've been waiting for."

MTSU did not commit a turnover, but forced five ASU giveaways (three interceptions, two fumbles). The Blue Raiders also produced 551 total yards, gained 27 first downs and scored on all four trips to the red zone — running a well-oiled attack for four quarters of uninterrupted rhythm.

"This team wanted to win and come home and prove itself," said MTSU coach Andy McCollum. "We know what kind of team we

have, and it showed (Saturday).

"This team played with an attitude, and I think the crowd got into it and our kids fed off that. But our guys thrived with the crowd behind them, and there were some licks being paid. Anyone near that sideline knows that was one physical game."

Touting a 17-10 halftime lead, MTSU scored three unanswered touchdowns in the third quarter, including an 80-yard strike from Marks to Wright on the first play after the intermission.

"We were thinking about a time to use that play all week, and (the ASU defender) bit on my slant, and the rest is history," Wright said.

On the play after Wright's score, freshman Bradley Robinson picked off an ASU pass, the first interception of his career.

Four plays later, Wright hauled in a fiveyard scoring catch, and Cleannord Saintil capped the third quarter with a 22-yard touchdown catch to put MTSU comfortably ahead 38.10 *We had a lot of guys catching balls and most impor-

tantly we didn't make mistakes," Saintil said. "We stayed on course to pull away and we wanted Arkansas State to know that we had every intention of putting them away."

Robinson made another interception and freshman Damon Nickson also picked off ASU quarterback Nick Noce in the second half to end Indians' scoring threats.

By the time the game was out of reach, Noce had been blasted from the game by Dennis Burke's hit in the fourth quarter.

ASU made a late score, but MTSU still answered back despite running a conservative offense to milk the clock.

MTSU running back DeMarco McNair scored on a 10-yard rush on the first carry of his career, following a fumble recovery by teammate Keon Raymond.

"The defense is supposed to get turnovers and we are supposed to capitalize on offense, and we did that," Wright said.

ASU got on the board to begin the game, marching 82 yards on 15 plays. Shermar Bracey ran for a two-yard touchdown to give the Indians a 7-0 lead.

However, ASU's execution was hindered by the Blue Raiders' pressure the rest of game.

The MTSU defense had eight tackles for loss and two sacks, allowing just three points in the remaining 52 minutes of the game.

Regardless of its play, it seemed

MTSU could do little to stop a motivated Florida squad that had its back to the wall.

The Blue Raiders hoped for a flawless effort and a slumping opponent, but they got neither in a 52-16 loss to the Gators amid 80,018 fans at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium.

"We were hoping to play a team that wasn't ready, and instead we came up against a team that was very ready," said MTSU coach Andy McCollum. "I think our kids played their butts off, but we ran into one good football team that was ready to play."

The Blue Raiders (2-4) fell victim to a Gators' (4-2) squad facing plenty of criticism from its home base. But to say the least, No. 22 Florida's frustrations were shed away with each blow it landed on MTSU.

The Blue Raiders survived the opening rounds but were worn by a constant and consistent pounding from multiple weapons.

The Gators piled up 501 total yards of offense, including 360 through the air.

Florida quarterback Chris Leak completed 17-of-22 passes for 316 yards and three touchdowns. Running backs DeShawn Wynn and Ciatrick Fason added four combined touchdowns on the ground as the Gators overwhelmed a young MTSU defense.

"We know we have to be mistake-free because (Florida) is one of the best teams in the country," McCollum said. "Their offensive line is one of the best in the country. Their quarterback is one of the best in the country, and the same goes for their tailbacks and receivers.

"I just wish we could've got off the field more, held them on some third downs and put a few more scores together. We needed to hang on longer, but we didn't, and that's the disappointing thing."

Sophomore Colby Smith, who made three field goals on the day, kicked a 39-yarder to cap MTSU's first possession.

But the Blue Raiders could not keep up with Florida's offensive pace, and the Gators scored 21 unanswered points in the remainder of the first half.

With a pair of big plays later on, Florida aimed right for the Blue Raiders' jugular vein and hit it in a timely fashion when the need was greatest.

Twice the Gators followed up key defensive stops with long touchdown passes on the ensuing play.

In the second quarter, Andre Caldwell put an early stake in MTSU's chest with a 62-yard touchdown catch from Leak that put the Gators comfortably ahead 24-3.

It marked the third score for Florida in a span of 4:28 after the Blue Raiders had matched the Gators with a 3-3 tie.

"We went over that play over and over in practice," said freshman cornerback Bradley Robinson. "We just had some missed assignments. We had too many of them, and

by Adam Sparks, Daily News Journal they made us pay for them."

Later, Florida's Chad

Jackson beat the Blue Raiders for a 33-yard touchdown reception from Leak on the Gators' first offensive snap of the second half.

The pivotal score followed MTSU's three-and-out sequence to start the third quarter, which included a sack and a lengthy punt return to setup Florida's favorable field position.

By then, the lead had swelled to 38-13, and Florida soon tacked on two more touchdowns with drives of 66 and 54 yards to end the third quarter.

MTSU found the end zone just once on the day with a 37-yard touchdown pass from Clint Marks to Kerry Wright.

"That was just a situation where we saw that they had been biting some short stuff, and we took advantage with deep ball over the top," Wright said. "It worked that time, but they played us pretty well and kept us contained for most of the rest of the game."

Marks completed 25-of-37 passing with 223 yards, two interceptions and the lone touchdown. However, he was also sacked six times.

Wright finished with his third 100-yard receiving performance of the season, reeling in nine catches for 112 yards. Tailback Eugene Gross accounted for 91 total yards, including 53 rushing and 38 receiving.

True freshman Roy Polite was the bright spot in an otherwise lackluster defensive performance for the Blue Raiders, hauling in his first career interception.





about its intentions the remainder of this season.

The Blue Raiders pounded Idaho 34-14 amid an estimated crowd of 13,931 at Floyd Stadium who watched the game in a steady drizzle of rain.

Incidentally, the forecast grew a little brighter on MTSU's season, winning its second straight home game in convincing fashion.

"It's great to be at home, and we're making sure we take care of business at our house," said MTSU coach Andy McCollum. "Next week is Utah State here again, and we want to keep on rolling."

The Blue Raiders put together one its more balanced offensive attacks, and built perhaps their toughest and most complete defensive effort of the season.

MTSU (3-4) held the run-heavy Vandals (2-6, 1-1) to just 87 rushing yards and 323 total yards, both season lows for Blue Raider opponents.

Meanwhile, MTSU's defensive stands allowed the home team to put up 27 unanswered points to pull away and improve to 2-2 in Sun Belt play.

"We knew we had to shut the run down and put the pads on them, and we would win the game," said MTSU defensive lineman Devarick Scandrett. "We shot ourselves in the foot early, but then we came back and showed that we can be a strong defense for this team."

That strength, led by Scandrett, turned the tides of the game after a first quarter of miscues for the Blue Raiders.

A pair of MTSU defensive penalties kept each of Idaho's two scoring drives alive in the first quarter.

The Vandals' Luke Smith-Anderson made a 20yard touchdown reception soon after an MTSU substitution violation on fourth down.

Jayson Bird then scored on a 5-yard run to put

Idaho ahead 14-7 after a personal foul on MTSU's Thomas Johnson after a failed third-down play.

From there, the Blue Raiders owned the game.

"When we get to clicking on defense, we can be a good group," Johnson said. "We just had to get over the stupid penalties, settle down and come at them harder than they came at us."

Physically, MTSU brought more to the game than Idaho on both sides of the ball.

MTSU rushed for a season-high 165 yards, led by Terry Jackson's career-high 77 yards and his first career TD on nine carries. Lee Baker added another rushing score, as both backs ran in relief of sophomore Eugene Gross, who reinjured his right ankle.

"We think we've got capable backs if Eugene goes down, and Lee and me showed what we can do," Jackson said. "We got a few long runs and some short ones, and kept the chains moving."

Jackson's 52-yard scamper, the Blue Raiders' longest run of the season, set up his own 1-yard score that put MTSU up 24-14 The Blue Raiders added two more scores in the rout - a 14-yard pass from Clint Marks to Pedro Holiday and a career-long 42-yard field goal by Colby Smith.

By the time the late kick pulled MTSU ahead by 20, the Vandals were demoralized amid a pounding Blue Raiders defensive front.

Idaho was held to just 23 rushing yards in the second half and were dropped for nine losses in the game.

Redshirt freshman Erik Walden led MTSU with 2.5 tackles for loss and two sacks in his first career start.

Offensively, MTSU produced 368 total yards. Sophomore quarterback Clint Marks completed 18-of-26 passes for 194 yards and one touchdown despite one early interception.

Chris Henry caught five passes for 69 yards, and Kerry Wright added 54 yards on four receptions.

Baker's 1-yard touchdown capped a 70-yard drive early in the second quarter.

Marks then finished off a 56-yard drive with a 5-yard option keeper for a score.

MTSU followed the two quick touchdowns with a forced turnover when Keon Raymond recovered a mishandled pooch kickoff.

Smith made a 29-yard field goal four plays later, and the Blue Raiders never looked back after capturing a 17-14 halftime lead.

"We were able to get the turnovers and capitalize off them," McCollum said. "I thought it was a complete team win because we were able to do some things defensively in the second half, we got things out of our kicking game, and the offense was efficient."

means they use, the Blue Raiders keep rolling.

Saturday, MTSU opted for the defensive route, shutting out Utah State 21-0 in front of 14,208 for homecoming at Floyd Stadium.

It marked the first shutout for the MTSU defense since 2000 and only the second in the Division I-A era. Meanwhile, the high-powered Utah State squad hadn't been blanked on the scoreboard in five years.

The win also had season-long significance for the Blue Raiders, as they improved to 4-4 to reach the .500 mark at the latest point in the year since 2001. MTSU also continued its climb in the Sun Belt with a 3-2 league mark.

"That was the best overall performance a defense has had since I've been here," said sixthyear MTSU coach Andy McCollum. "That was just a dominating effort, and that (Utah State) team

"That's the same team that put up 45 points on us last year, and our guys shut them down."

The Aggies were held to only 156 total yards (126 passing, 30 rushing) and didn't even make a first down until the second quarter.

In addition, Utah State (2-5, 1-2) averaged less than three yards per play and never penetrated the Blue Raiders' 20-yard line.

Meanwhile, the shutout was made possible by a combination of a relentless defensive front and a stingy secondary.

MTSU recorded a season-high seven sacks - the second most in school history - and 12 tackles for loss.

Freshmen Antoine Owens and Erik Walden led MTSU with two sacks apiece.

"We knew they wanted to pass it a lot, and we were determined to not let them do that," Owens said. "We came at them hard up front, and a lot of those were coverage sacks because that secondary shut down anything that we let

MTSU's defensive dominance was evident from the outset, as Aggies quarterback Travis Cox was sacked five times in the first half.

Meanwhile, the Blue Raider offense controlled possession to grind the reality of the shutout into the Aggies' psyche.

The Blue Raiders marched 95 yards in 12 plays to pull away 21-0 early in the fourth quarter when Kerry Wright hauled in a 42-yard over-the-head catch RUSHING: Utah State-Forbes, Chris 9between two defenders for a touchdown pass from Clint Marks.

The spectacular grab was the second scoring reception on the day for Wright, who finished with nine catches for

"It was supposed to be a post route, but it was thrown a little outside," Wright said. "I made an adjustment, and they didn't. There were two of them, but they didn't try for the ball like I did, I quess."

MTSU put up a quiet 403 yards of total offense, including three long scoring drives that milked the time away from the Aggies' comeback hopes.

"We wanted to keep playing and try to score for that defense because they came to play," Marks said. "They probably stole our thunder today, but that's fine.

"It was the best defensive game I've seen since I've been here. It was all about the defense in this game. We just tried to put up some points for them."

Marks completed 22-of-32 passes for 317 yards and two touchdowns.

Setting up MTSU's first score, Marks hit consecutive completions to Stephen Chicola and Chris Henry for 23 and 26 yards, respectively.

The latter stretched to the 1-yard line, where tailback Eugene Gross dove in for a touchdown on the next play.

Wright also snatched a short slant from Marks and scampered 58 yards to pay dirt to put MTSU up 14-0 heading into halftime.

"Pretty soon everybody's going to come just to watch (the defense)," said Wright, who also had a 40-yard punt return. "That defense stole the spotlight, but it was well-deserved. You couldn't have a better day than they had."

The win extended MTSU's home winning streak to three and its homecoming winning streak to five. The Blue Raiders have also won 16-of-17 homecoming games.



LAS CRUCES, N.M. - MTSU's hopes for a winning

season slid as steeply as the mountain peaks that surrounded Aggie Memorial Stadium.

The Blue Raiders were pummeled 44-10 in a disheartening debacle to New Mexico State in the worst Sun Belt loss ever for MTSU.

The Blue Raiders also relinquished second place in the conference and fell to 4-5 on the season, 3-3 in league play, in front of 18,435 in the Aggies' home finale.

"We were absolutely whipped in every phase of the game, and there's nothing I can say positive about this football team after this game," said MTSU coach Andy McCollum.

The loss snapped MTSU's three-game conference winning streak and dropped the Blue Raiders to 0-3 on the road in Sun Belt play.

"We've played so well at home the last few weeks, but we go on the road and get our butts whooped," said MTSU sophomore quarterback Clint Marks. "It doesn't make sense. We're at home and we play great, then we come here and we're terrible. I don't know why we play so bad on the road."

The MTSU offense appeared its most stagnant of the season, and the defense was steadily overwhelmed by a well-rounded Aggies' (4-5, 3-2) attack.

The Blue Raiders committed four turnovers and gained a season-low 151 total yards, including minus-28 vards in a disastrous second half.

"I can't call out anybody who played well," McCollum said. "Our receivers have played great all year. But (Saturday) night, they dropped balls, they didn't block anybody, and they couldn't catch a pass.

"There was nothing that we did well in this game." Trailing 17-10 at halftime, MTSU gave up 27 unanswered points to the Aggies in a flurry of miscues and gained just one first down on offense in the second half.

Marks threw an interception on the second snap of

the third quarter, and NMSU's Ryan Guardia made a 22-yard field goal six plays later.

A long line of three-and-out series followed for the Blue Raiders' offense, but NMSU's charge never relented.

The Aggies bulldozed MTSU for three touchdown drives over a 12-minute span in the second half and capped the slaughter with Guardia's 25-yard field goal.

MTSU's tragic second-half slide included two quarterback changes, two interceptions, three sacks and a botched shotgun snap to nobody while backup quarterback Josh Harris was still calling out signals behind his offensive tackle.

On the other side of the ball, the MTSU defense allowed 606 yards of Aggies' offense.

Turnovers backed up the Blue Raiders' defense, but there was still no answer for the Aggies' offensive weapons.

"It's not the offense's fault. It's everybody's fault, and everybody has to take the blame for this one," said senior linebacker Alvin Fite. "The offense couldn't get anything going, but then we couldn't stop a whole lot either.

"The worst part of it is that it was a lot of

, **Daily News Journal** simple stuff that was getting us beat."

NMSU led just 17-10 at halftime despite compiling 316 total yards in the first half.

"To play as bad as we did in the first half, we felt real good going into halftime," McCollum said. "We had penalties and poor decisions in the first half, but it's still 17-10. So we were still in good shape, but we couldn't do anything right when we came out for the second half.

"But we still had a few positive things in the first half, but we couldn't build on any of them."

Colby Smith's 41-yard field goal capped a quick 19-yard drive to start the game's scoring.

The Aggies then missed a 40-yard field goal, but came back with a 60-yard touchdown drive that ended with a bit of trickery.

Backup quarterback Paul Dombrowski made a reverse pitch to receiver Kenneth Buckley, who passed to a wide-open Travis Samuel for an 18-yard score.

Marks was intercepted on MTSU's next play when a pass sailed through Pierre Ingram's hands.

The Aggies took advantage, increasing their lead to 14-3 on a 32-yard touchdown pass from Buck Pierce to Jared Quick.

The Blue Raiders stalled on their ensuing drive with a failed fourth-down try, but got a second chance when NMSU fumbled its snap two plays later.

MTSU answered with a 49-yard drive, sparked by Chris Henry's 38-yard reception and capped by Nick McAfee's eight yard touchdown catch from Marks.

"There was so little that we did well (Saturday) that I don't even remember anything good to speak of," said Marks, who finished 14-of-28 passing for 124 yards in his most disappointing performance of the year. Kerry Wright had a season low of two receptions for three yards.

Meanwhile, seven MTSU rushers combined to produce only 18 yards on the ground.

Coming out of the same intermission, the Blue Raiders

caught the same fire that fueled their game-opening barrage, scoring on four consecutive possessions to start the second half.

MTSU marched 95 yards to open the third quarter, as Wright's 37-yard touchdown catch from Marks capped the drive.

"Thinking back, I can't believe that was a 95-yard drive," said Marks, who finished 26-of-36 passing for 241 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions.

"When you get a big boost like that, sometimes you don't consider how big it was. But after that drive, we just rode the momentum and tried to finish it off with some more productive drives."

The Blue Raiders also went on drives of 33, 62 and 57 yards, with the latter ending on a 27-yard scoring run by Cleannord Saintil on a reverse.

The other two second-half scores came off Colby Smith's right leg, as the sophomore nailed field goals of 39 and 26 yards. Smith also drilled a 31-yarder as the final touch on the Blue Raiders' favorable start to the game.

Jackson had a 45-yard run on the first snap of the game, and Wright soon followed with a 15-yard scoring reception from Marks.

The ensuing kickoff, a sky kick by Paul Wheeler, was misplayed by the Indians and recovered by MTSU.

Three plays later, Baker punched in an eight-yard touchdown run to put MTSU ahead 14-0 before the Indians ever ran an offensive play.

MTSU linebacker Dennis Burke returned an interception to the UL-Monroe two-vard line in the second quarter, but the Blue Raiders stalled and settled for Smith's first field goal.

The Indians' offense took advantage of the defensive stop, scoring 14-0 unanswered points before the Blue Raiders booted the Indians from Floyd Stadium with a disappointing loss to take home.

UL-Monroe quarterback Steven Jyles passed for 291 yards and rushed for 52 yards. However, he was sacked a season-high four times and intercepted twice.

"With the way we've been banged up, I was proud of how our seniors took hold of this team and led it this week," said MTSU head coach Andy McCollum after the Senior Day victory. "I was proud about is that with all the guys we had out for this one, we still had older guys leading and young guys stepping up to fight

Saturday marked the fourth straight home win for the Blue Raiders (5-5, 4-3), keeping their hopes of a winning season intact for the season finale at Troy (4-6,

Meanwhile, it was a spirited end for eight varsity seniors at Floyd Stadium, as MTSU improved to 6-1 in

home finales in the Division I-A era. "I think in the back of our minds, we all kind of realized that this game would stick with us, win or lose," said senior linebacker Alvin Fite. "I think it said a lot about these young guys that they played their hearts out for us.

"It was a game we can be proud of as seniors for a long time."

Pride was the leading factor for MTSU's most notable senior.

Receiver Kerry Wright followed up his worst game of the year with a performance that confirmed his greatness in school history. Wright had eight catches for 126 yards and two touchdowns, setting two receiving school records. He broke his own single-season scoring mark with his 10th touchdown grab on 2004. Wright also tied Kendall Newson and Herbert Owenby for the career touchdown receptions record.

Meanwhile, sophomore Clint Marks broke MTSU's all-time single-season passing yardage mark with 2,618 on the year, surpassing Wes Counts' 1999 effort.

"None of those records mean anything to those two," McCollum said. "The only record they were inter-

ested in was putting us to 4-1 at home and that sets a good foundation for this team. "Those are two team players that never let records enter their mind. They'll think about it two weeks from now, but not now."

While Wright and Marks assaulted the record book through the air, the Blue Raiders' ground game may have made the difference in the physically-played Sun Belt showdown.

MTSU gained a season-high 213 rushing yards, despite playing without injured starting tailback Eugene Gross. Terry Jackson (10 carries, 82 yards) and Lee Baker (12 carries, 88 yards, one TD) each responded with their own career-high performances.

"We're a good offensive team and we have been most of the year, but you're only as good as what you're running game can do," Baker said. "With Eugene out, I think the Oline and Terry and me put it on ourselves to take some of the pressure off Clint and the receivers because they've been coming

With missed offensive opportunities, MTSU squandered an early 17-3 lead to allow UL-Monroe to tie the game at 17 going into halftime.


