Middle Tennessee Vs. New Mexico State

Middle Tennessee and New Mexico State have met six previous times on the hardwood with the Aggies owning a 5-1 advantage. The Blue Raiders' only win in the series came in Las Cruces, N.M., in Head Coach Kermit Davis' first season (2003-04). Five of the six meetings have pitted the teams as Sun Belt Conference members; however, Thursday's contest against New Mexico State is Middle Tennessee's final regular-season game against the Aggies as a conference member. New Mexico State joins the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) next season.

Last Meeting Against The Aggies

Mike Dean's 22 points were not enough as New Mexico State shot 61 percent from the field on its way to an 81-76 win in Murfreesboro, Tenn. The

game was a high-scoring contest throughout with New Mexico State taking a 42-38 lead into the half on the strength of 62 percent shooting from the field, including a scorching 60 percent from 3-point range.

Scouting New Mexico State

New Mexico State is playing its second game since legendary coach Lou Henson announced his retirement Saturday (01/22/05). The Aggies beat Florida International, 71-66 (01/24/05), for their first Sun Belt win of the season. New Mexico State is 1-4 in conference play but has suffered a series of narrow setbacks. The Aggies have a trio of players averaging double figures, led by Mike Mitchell's 13.8 points and 4.4 rebounds per game. Duane John averages 12.9 points and 5.6 boards.

Dean Out Indefinitely With Toe Injury

Senior guard Mike Dean has been ruled out indefinitely while he recovers from a toe injury that caused him to miss the New Orleans game. Dean suffered the injury early in the season and re-aggravated it in the first half against Arkansas State (01/13/05). He played through the injury against Arkansas-Little Rock and South Alabama before being taken out of the lineup for the New Orleans game. Dean did not practice this week and is expected to miss a minimum of two more games. Dean is the team's leading scorer at 15.6 points per game.

Young Plays Well In Setback

Middle Tennessee sophomore forward Kyle Young came off the bench for just the fourth time this season and gave the Blue Raiders a huge spark against South Alabama. In 22 minutes of action, Young made 5-of-7 shots from the field for 10 points to go along with a season-high eight rebounds. The Lewisburg, Tenn., native also equaled his personal-best with two steals. In his previous six games combined, Young had just 10 points and nine rebounds.

Blue Raiders Enjoy Sun Belt Success

After struggling in their first two years as a member of the Sun Belt, the Blue Raiders have found success in the league during the previous two years under third-year Head Coach Kermit Davis. In fact, Middle Tennessee has the third most league wins of SBC members during the past two seasons (including SBC Tournament). With its 70-68 win at Arkansas State (1/13/05), Middle Tennessee notched its 22nd SBC win under Davis in two-plus seasons. The Blue Raiders had won only seven SBC games in the two seasons prior to Davis' hiring. Tennessee's turn-around in the Sun Belt has been its ability to win on the road in league play. Middle Tennessee has not lost consecutive road conference games during the previous two-plus seasons under Head Coach Kermit Davis. The Blue Raiders were the only SBC East team with a winning road record (5-3) in 2003-04. Prior to Davis' hiring, Middle Tennessee was just 2-17 on the road in SBC games but the Blue Raiders have the second-most road wins of any league member during his two-plus seasons. most wins prior to the start of league play in the program's 91-year history. It also marked the earliest date (Jan. 5) the Blue Raiders had reached 10 wins in school history. Overall, Middle Tennessee's 10 non-conference wins this season are the most since the 1990-91 Blue Raiders won 13 non-league games.

MT Enjoying Turn-Around Under Davis

Middle Tennessee had endured losing seasons in three of the four seasons prior to the hiring of Kermit Davis before the 2002-03 campaign but the program has enjoyed immediate success under the third-year coach's guidance. Middle Tennessee enjoyed consecutive winning seasons for the first time since the 1996-97, 1997-98 seasons in Davis' first two campaigns. Davis earned his 40th win at Middle Tennessee in his 69th game when the Blue Raiders beat Delaware, 73-69 in overtime, in the San Juan Shootout. Making the achievement more impressive is Middle Tennessee had just 46 wins combined in the four full seasons preceding Davis' hiring prior to the 2002-03 season. Overall, Davis has won 58 percent (45-33) of his 78 games at Middle Tennessee. Demonstrating a complete reversal of fortunes, the Blue Raiders were 31-47 during the 78-game stretch prior to Davis' hiring.

Dean Making Move On Career Charts

Mike Dean is No. 8 on the all-time 3-point goals made list at Middle Tennessee with 95 and needs six more to move into a tie for No. 7 with Tim Gaither (101 from 1993-96); however, no Blue Raider has reached 80 treys faster than Dean, who needed only 31 games to reach the mark. The

next fastest to 80 was Freddie Martinez, who did it in 38 games. Dean also became the fastest player in program history to reach 90 3-pointers when he connected on his first attempt against Arkansas-Little Rock (1/10/05) in his 37th career game.

Dean Struggling From The Field Of Late

Senior guard Mike Dean, who has suffered with nagging injuries this season, has struggled with his shot of late. Dean has made just 11-of-43 shots (25.5 percent) in the last three games and he's just 3-for-16 from behind the arc during the same stretch. Middle Tennessee is 1-2 in those games. Dean's shooting woes is believed to be directly related to the toe injury that has sidelined him indefinitely. He missed the New Orleans game (01/22/05) and did not practice with the team during the week.

Cuffee Is A Rebounding Machine

Senior Michael Cuffee has led Middle Tennessee in rebounding in 12 of the first 119 games this season, including a career-high 14 caroms against Tennessee Wesleyan. The Philadelphia, Pa., native has produced double-figure rebounding games five times. Cuffee is leading the Blue Raiders in rebounding with 7.6 per game, which is good for fifth in the Sun Belt. Cuffee has been a beast on the offensive glass. His 61 offensive rebounds are third in the Sun Belt. Cuffee is averaging 8.6 rebounds in conference action and has pulled double figure rebounds in three of the previous four games.

Career Night For Cuffee, Cuyler

Middle Tennessee guards Michael Cuffee and Fats Cuyler turned in career performances in Middle Tennessee's 70-68 win against Arkansas State (1/13/05). The duo combined for 41 of the team's points. Cuffee established a career high with 24 points and shot 7-of-10 for the second half to distance Middle Tennessee, while Cuyler carried the load in the first half. The junior guard established career highs in points (17) and 3-point field goals made (5) - all in the first 20 minutes. In fact, Cuyler was more than half of the Blue Raider offense in the first 20 minutes with 17 of the team's 32 points.

Young Stepping Up On Boards

Sophomore Kyle Young responded to being challenged to become more of a presence in the rebounding department by recording consecutive games of eight rebounds for the first time in his career against South Alabama and New Orleans.

Cuffee Tops In Consecutive Starts

Senior Michael Cuffee has the longest streak of consecutive starts at Middle Tennessee with 41. Cuffee has earned starts in 44 of the 45 games he has played at Middle Tennessee.

Morrison Gets Consecutive Double Doubles

Middle Tennessee junior newcomer Marcus Morrison became the first Blue Raider to register back-to-back double doubles (vs. Tenn. Wesleyan and Tennessee State) since William Pippen did it during the 2002-03 season - a span of 52 games. Morrison scored 15 points and pulled 10 rebounds against Tennessee Wesleyan and followed the performance with a 16-point, 11-rebound effort against Tennessee State. Pippen recorded his back-to-back double doubles against Western Kentucky (1/4/03) and Arkansas State (1/9/03). Michael Cuffee matched Morrison's performance by producing consecutive double doubles against Arkansas State (24 points, 10 rebounds) and Arkansas-Little Rock (15 points, 10 rebounds).

Cuffee, Morrison Combine For Rare Feat

Middle Tennessee went 201 games without having two players combine for a double-double in the same game before senior Michael Cuffee (11 pts., 14 reb.) and junior Marcus Morrison (15 points, 10 reb.) each enjoyed a double-double in the team's 81-46 win against Tennessee Wesleyan. It marked the first time a Blue Raider player recorded a double-double since Kyle Young (10 pts., 11 reb) did it against Tennessee Wesleyan (12/13/03). Aylton Tesch (10 pts., 11 reb.) and Mantia Callender (13 pts., 11 reb) were the last Blue Raider tandem to enjoy a double-double in the same game, a 67-48 win against Tennessee Tech, on Dec. 6, 1997.

Cuffee, Morrison Double Up ... Again

After going 201 games without having two players combine for a double double in the same game, the Blue Raiders have had two players accomplish the feat twice in a span of 11 games this season and it just happens to be the same two players. Michael Cuffee (24 pts., 10 reb.) and Marcus Morrison (10 pts., 11 reb.) recorded double doubles against Arkansas State (1/13/05). They also accomplished the feat against Tennessee Wesleyan. For the season, Cuffee and Morrison lead Middle Tennessee with three double doubles.

Bench Play Key For Blue Raiders

Head Coach Kermit Davis' assumption that a deep and productive bench would be a key to Middle Tennessee's success in 2004-05 has been on the mark. Blue Raider reserves have accounted for 27 percent of the team's scoring this season and outscored the opponent's bench, 357-266. Middle Tennessee has received 24 or more points from its bench eight times this season and is 8-0 in those games. Overall, the Blue Raiders are 9-2 this season when outscoring the opponent's bench with the only losses coming against Auburn and South Alabama. A key to the bench production of late has been the play of Marcus Morrison, Bryan Smithson and Alex Weekes. Smithson has 37 career starts in 46 games at Middle Tennessee, while Weekes earned nine starts as a freshman in 2004-05. Morrison is third on the team in scoring, second in rebounding and has started nine games this season so, in essence, Davis has been able to utilize the equivalent of eight starters in the rotation of his top eight players.

Big Conference Opening Triumph

Middle Tennessee's 85-50 win over Arkansas-Little Rock marked the largest margin of victory for the Blue Raiders in Sun Belt Conference play. The Blue Raiders defeated the Trojans by 35 points to best the previous mark of 34 established against North Texas on Jan. 6, 2001 at Murphy Center. It also ranks as the largest margin of victory in conference play since the Blue Raiders downed Morehead State in OVC action by 40 points on Jan. 23, 1989 at Murphy Center.

Finding Ways To Win The Close Games

The Blue Raiders have kept fans on the edge of their seat this season with 10 of the first 18 games being decided by five points or less. Middle Tennessee has been at its best with the game on the line, though, putting together a 7-3 mark in games decided by five points or less. The only losses Middle Tennessee has suffered in games decided by five points or less were against Rice (67-62), Auburn (79-74), and South Alabama (59-56), while beating Tennessee State (96-94), Toledo (70-65), Delaware (73-69 OT), Austin Peay (74-70), VCU (59-55), IP-Fort Wayne (66-61) and Arkansas State (70-68).

Blue Raiders Share San Juan Shootout Title

Middle Tennessee went 2-1 in the San Juan Shootout to earn a share of the championship in the round-robin format. The Blue Raiders posted wins against Toledo (70-65) and Delaware (73-69, overtime), while losing to Auburn (79-73). Toledo beat Auburn to create a three-way tie at 2-1. The tournament share marked the second time Middle Tennessee either shared or won a holiday tournament. The only other title was in 1962 when the Blue Raiders won the Hatter Invitational in DeLand, Fla.

Cuffee Earns All-Tournament In San Juan

Michael Cuffee's strong and consistent performance in the San Juan Shootout not only helped Middle Tennessee to a 2-1 mark, but it also earned the Philadelphia, Pa., native All-Tournament honors. Cuffee averaged 13.7 points, 8.7 rebounds, 1.0 steal per game, shot 59 percent and averaged 37.7 minutes in the three games. Cuffee had 13 points and seven rebounds in Middle Tennessee's 70-65 win against Toledo, then posted his second double double of the season with 12 points and 13 rebounds in a 79-74 loss against Auburn. He led the Blue Raiders in scoring (16) and rebounds (6), while playing 42 of 45 minutes in a 73-69 overtime win against Delaware.

Chairmen Of The Boards

Middle Tennessee has been dominant on the boards so far this season, including a whopping 54 rebounds in its win against Tennessee Wesleyan, while allowing just 33. The 54 boards are the most ever recorded by a Kermit Davis-coached team at Middle Tennessee and also marked the first time the squad has pulled more than 50 boards since ripping down 52 against Tennessee Tech on Feb. 12, 2000.

Thomas Starts With A Bang

Senior center Steve Thomas started his Blue Raider career in fine fashion in the San Juan Shootout. Thomas sat out 18 months after transferring from Georgia in August, 2003, before becoming eligible for the San Juan Shootout. The

6-foot-9 center averaged 10.7 points, 5.3 rebounds and right at 22 minutes per game. Thomas scored four points and pulled down six rebounds in his debut against Toledo before turning in his strongest performance of the three games, a sparkling 17-point, five-rebound effort against Toledo. Thomas followed his tournament performance with 10 points and five rebounds against Villanova.

Lake To Miss Remainder of 2004-05 Season

Middle Tennessee Head Coach Kermit Davis has announced freshman forward Brian Lake will pursue a medical redshirt and miss the remainder of the 2004-05 season after suffering a stress fracture in his left tibia. Lake had seen action in six games and averaged 3.7 points and 3.2 rebounds.

Davis Inks Four During Early Signing

Middle Tennessee Head Coach Kermit Davis announced the signing of four players to national letters-of-intent during the NCAA Early Signing Period, which concluded Nov. 17. The Blue Raiders signed four prep standouts during the week-long period, including Darren Avery, a 6-foot-3 guard from Corinth, Miss., Deno Hair, a 6-foot-8 power forward from Picayune, Miss., Uriah Hethington, a 6-foot-9 center from Cairo, Ga., and Kevin Kanaskie, a 6-foot-2 point guard from State College, Pa. Avery is the No. 6-rated prep prospect in Mississippi and averaged 14.4 points, 4.4 rebounds and 1.8 assists, while shooting 52 percent from the field and 30 percent from 3-point range as a junior. Hair averaged 12 points, eight rebounds, three blocks and three steals as a junior at Picayune Memorial High School as a junior. He has been named to the Mississippi "Dandy Dozen," which includes the 12 best prep players in the state. Hethington averaged 12 points and 10 rebounds for Cairo High School and is listed as a "Dandy Dozen" by the *Atlanta-Journal Constitution* in Georgia. Kanaskie brings tremendous skills to the Blue Raider program and is a point guard with a knack for making others better.

Blue Raiders To Play In ESPN Bracket Buster

Middle Tennessee will play in the third annual ESPN Bracket Buster, Feb. 19, 2005. The Blue Raiders were awarded a home game in the men's college basketball event against an opponent to be named at a later date. Fellow Sun Belt members Arkansas-Little Rock, New Orleans and Western Kentucky join the Blue Raiders in the 64-team, 13-conference field. Pairings for the contests will be announced Feb. 3, 2005. A total of 11 of the 32 games will be televised, including six games on ESPN or ESPN2, and the other five games will be televised on ESPN's Full Court and on regional and local syndication. The remaining 21 games will not be televised. The evaluation and pairings of teams for the 11-game ESPN television package will be made by the staff of

ESPN, in consultation with conference commissioners of participating leagues. The Sun Belt is 3-1 in the Bracket Buster during the previous two years. In addition to four representatives from the Sun Belt, the Horizon League, Mid-American, Missouri Valley, Western Athletic, America East, Big Sky, Big West, Colonial Athletic, Metro Atlantic, Mid-Continent, Ohio Valley and Southern Conference have members participating in 2005.

Middle Tennessee Picked To Win SBC East

Middle Tennessee has been picked as the pre-season favorite to win the Sun Belt's East Division in a preseason poll of league coaches. It marks the first time the Blue Raiders have been picked first since joining the Sun Belt in 2001. Middle Tennessee received eight of a possible 11 first-place votes and 51 total points to finish ahead of defending East Division champion Arkansas-Little Rock (3 first-place votes, 44 points). Louisiana-Lafayette was a unanimous pick to win the West Division.

Anniversary Of MT Championship Teams

This season marks the 30-year anniversary of Middle Tennessee's first conference championship and NCAA Tournament team in 1974-75, as well as the 20-year anniversary of the 1984-85 championship squad that reached the NCAA Tournament. The 1974-75 Blue Raiders, under the direction of Head Coach Jimmy Earle, won the Ohio Valley Conference regular-season and tournament titles and became the first Middle Tennessee basketball team to participate in the NCAA Tournament. The 1974-75 squad posted a 23-5 overall record and lost to Oregon State, 78-67, in the NCAA Tournament. The 1984-85 Blue Raiders won the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament title and automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament under first-year coach Bruce Stewart. The squad fashioned a 17-14 overall mark and lost to North Carolina, 76-57, in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Blue Raiders Looking For A '3-Peat'

Middle Tennessee enters the 2004-05 basketball season in search of three straight winning seasons for the first time since the 1995-96 through 1998-99 seasons. In fact, the back-to-back winning seasons produced during the past two years under Head Coach Kermit Davis marked the first time Middle Tennessee had enjoyed consecutive winning seasons since the 1996-97, 1997-98 seasons.

Davis Enjoys Success Vs. In-State Foes

With its 74-70 win at Austin Peay (12/30/04), Middle Tennessee improved to 5-0 against opponents from Tennessee in 2004-05 and has posted a 10-4 mark against in-state opponents under Kermit Davis, including a 8-2 ledger against teams from the Volunteer State the past two years.

Davis TV, Radio Shows Begin In January

The Kermit Davis Television Show airs three times weekly. The show will air on Monday at 6:30 a.m., on CSS and at 7 p.m. on CSN, Channel 49. The show also can be seen Saturday at 10:30 a.m., on ESPN2. Coach Davis' weekly radio show, "Kermit Davis Live," takes place at Corky's Barbecue in Murfreesboro from 7-8 p.m., and can be heard on WBOZ 104.9 FM and WMOT 89.5 FM. The show will air on Tuesday night on March 1 due to a Monday game.

Toughness, accountability, intensity, defense, and hard work were intangibles on which Kermit Davis said he would build the Middle Tennessee program when he was hired as the 19th men's head basketball coach in

April, 2002. It didn't take long for Davis' blueprint for success to unfold, as the successful coach has been able to restore pride and set the Blue Raiders on a successful course in his first two seasons at Middle Tennessee.

Prior to Davis' arrival, Middle Tennessee had endured losing seasons in three of the previous four years, but the energetic and highly-successful Davis quickly changed the fortunes and began a Blue Raider revival. He has produced a 33-26 mark in his first two seasons, including a 29-18 record since the start of Sun Belt play in January, 2003. Not bad for a program that had enjoyed just one conference tournament win in the two years prior to his arrival.

The Blue Raider Nation would have to be patient, Davis warned; because winning programs aren't built overnight. It takes time, solid recruiting classes, and the installation of a philosophy to ultimately reach long-term



goals. But in two short years under Davis, Middle Tennessee has been in the Sun Belt championship hunt into the final week of each season. The Blue Raiders reached the Sun Belt Tournament title game in 2003, their first appearance in a conference tournament championship since 1989; and they missed the chance to make it two league title games in as many years when they dropped a 70-66 decision to Louisiana-Lafayette in 2004 in the semifinals.

In his first season as the Blue Raiders' head coach, Davis inherited a group of players who had never enjoyed success as members of the Sun Belt. The 2002-03 Blue Raiders were picked fourth (of five) teams in the Sun Belt's East Division, and eighth of 11 teams overall. Heading into the final week of the regular-season, Middle Tennessee remained in the championship hunt. For his efforts, Davis was named the Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year, marking the second time in five years as a Division I head coach he had been so honored.

While Davis' first team surprised many by reaching the finals of the Sun Belt Tournament and putting together the most wins for a Blue Raider squad (16) since the 1997-98 campaign, his second Blue Raider team had to be even more surprising.

Middle Tennessee entered the 2003-04 season with only one returning starter and four letterwinners from Davis' initial Blue Raider team, but the proven winner

molded his squad into a championship contender by mid-season. The Blue Raiders increased their number of wins and had fans coming through the turnstiles in record numbers with an exciting style of play.

Davis' players not only have been winners on the court, but they have been successful in the classroom, as well. Nine of the 12 seniors in the Middle Tennessee program since Davis' hiring have received their degree. The other three are either playing professionally or are in NBA camps.

Like all successful coaches, Davis has been victorious by recruiting players who fit the personality of the team and take ownership of their squad. The previous two recruiting classes have been ranked No. 1 in the Sun Belt by *Hoop Scoop* magazine, and each has been rated among the Top 25 in the nation, including a No. 11 signing

class in 2004.

Prior to being named the head coach at Middle Tennessee, Davis spent five seasons as the associate head coach at LSU under head coach John Brady. After two seasons of putting the pieces together, the Tigers captured the SEC title in 2000 and went on to an appearance in the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16. The Tigers returned to the postseason in 2002 with a trip to the National Invitational Tournament. In the three years immediately preceding Davis' arrival in Murfreesboro, LSU averaged 20-plus wins per

season.

Before LSU, Davis spent one season as the head coach at the University of Idaho; however, his stint with the Vandals was his second tour of duty in Moscow. He also served as the school's head coach from 1989-90. During his three years as the head coach at Idaho, Davis compiled a 63-29 record, the best three-year total in the program's history. Davis posted two of the best single-season tallies in school history during his first two seasons at Idaho as well, turning in 25-6 marks in both of those seasons (1988-89, 1989-90).

His Idaho squad won the Big Sky championship in 1989 and went on to capture the league's tournament crown and a berth into the NCAA Tournament, as well. For his efforts, Davis was named Big Sky Coach of the Year. History repeated itself in 1990 when Davis once again led the Vandals to the Big Sky title in both the regular season and tournament, garnering yet

another NCAA Tournament berth. In fact, Davis himself made history when he became the Vandals' head coach in 1988. Upon his hiring, Davis was the youngest Division I head coach in the nation at age 28.

It was not the first time Davis had been the youngest head coach in the country. When he was hired as the head coach at Southwest Mississippi Junior College in 1984, he became the youngest junior college coach in the nation at age 24. His youth served him well at Southwest Mississippi, as he put together a 39-20 record in two seasons. His 1986 squad won 22 games, posting the school's first 20-win season in 17 years.

His success at the junior college level landed him a spot on Tim Floyd's staff at Idaho, where Davis served as an assistant for two years prior to being named the program's head coach.

After spending two seasons as the head coach at Idaho, Davis went on to become the

head coach at Texas A&M for the 1990-91 campaign. From Texas A&M, Davis moved on to serve as associate head coach at Chipola Junior College for two seasons before ascending to the top spot for the 1993-94 campaign. During his season as the team's head coach, Chipola finished the season ranked No. 4 in the national polls and posted a 27-5 record, giving the team the second-most wins in school history.

From Chipola, Davis moved on to serve as associate head coach at Utah State from 1995-96. At Utah State, Davis coached under current Southern Mississippi coach Larry Eustachy, and the pair combined to win the Big West title in 1995.

Davis' rapid ascent up the coaching ladder is no coincidence. He has been around the game his entire life, growing up watching one of the preeminent coaches in the country operate on a daily basis. Kermit Davis, Sr., was one of the most respected college coaches in the nation, and the younger Davis spent many hours around his dad in the gym and even on the bench during games.
