The two clubs have played weekend series in three of the last four years and met on the diamond in seven of the last nine years ... The Gamecocks have won 2-of-3 in the series the past two years ... JSU is head coach Steve Peterson's alma mater.

#### Peterson Picks Up Win No. 700

Middle Tennessee skipper Steve Peterson picked up his 700th career victory Saturday in a 9-2 victory over Southeastern Louisiana. Peterson has compiled a career mark of 701-525-2 overall mark as a head coach. He has accumulated a 548-429-2 record in 17-plus seasons at Middle Tennessee and posted a 153-96 record as head coach at Roane State CC in six seasons. Peterson is the winningest coach in Middle Tennessee history, ahead of former skipper and athletic director John Stanford (1974-87, 402-272-4). Peterson is two wins from 550 at Middle Tennessee and just 21 contests from coaching his 1,000th game as Blue Raider skipper.

#### Jaggers Bat on Fire

Senior Nate Jaggers suffered through a subpar season in 2004, but the third baseman has started his final campaign on a torrid pace at the plate. The Louisville, Ky., native leads the Blue Raiders with a .425 batting average (17-for-40) with three home runs. 15 RBIs and 12 runs scored. all team highs. He has also added four doubles and struck out only six times in more than 40 plate appearances. Jaggers was 11-for-23 (.478) over his last five games with a pair of homers, nine RBIs and seven runs scored. Jaggers was 3-for-4 with four RBIs and three runs scored against Belmont on March 2 and added two more multihit outings last weekend against Southeastern Louisiana. He belted a three-run homer in the win over Belmont and added a two-run shot on Sunday against SLU. The Pleasure Ridge Park HS product also had two hits and scored twice at Memphis on Tuesday. Jaggers has a pair of three-hit games during the streak, the 20th and 21st games of his career with at least three hits. Jaggers produced 11 such outings as a freshman and five as a sophomore, but just three last season during a subpar year. He already has two in 2005. The third baseman has also hit safely in all nine outings this season and 13 straight dating to the end of 2004.

#### Anderson Shines Again on the Mound

Redshirt sophomore Josh Anderson was outstanding again Tuesday at Memphis, allowing just an unearned run in three innings of work to pick up his first career save. Anderson has not allowed an earned run in five

appearances this season covering 8.2 innings, striking out four with opponents batting just .188. The lefthander got a win with 3.2 innings of relief against lowa on February 26, just his third collegiate appearance. He has given up only six hits and walked just one and is a big part of the bullpen's 3.41 ERA this season.

#### Scott Strong Again on the Mound

Redshirt sophomore Matt Scott rebounded with a strong outing Saturday against Southeastern Louisiana, allowing two runs on just four hits in eight innings to get his second win of the season. Scott got a win in the opening series against Ball State with six good innings of work, but was knocked around the yard against lowa in his second start. The LaVergne HS product stands 2-0 with a 4.41 ERA, striking out 10 in 16.1 innings of work so far this season. The Blue Raiders are 3-0 in his starts and 2-3 in all other games.

#### McNamee Picking up Where He Left Off

Senior Eric McNamee led the Blue Raiders with 26 multihit games last season and has picked up where he left off through the first three weeks of the 2005 campaign. McNamee has five multi-hit contests already this season, including three straight two-hit games over the weekend against Southeastern Louisiana, going 6-for-11 against the Lions. The Columbia State CC transfer has 11 hits in the last six games, including a 3-for-5 effort against lowa on February 26. He posted 10 three-hit contests in 2004 and one four-hit game (at Memphis, 4/28/04).

#### Archer Awakens at the Plate

Senior Josh Archer has been a slow starter throughout his Blue Raider career, but his 0-for-11 start this season was even more frustrating for the Paris, Tenn., native. The first baseman has come out of his slump in the last five games, collecting six hits in 14 at-bats, including a double and solo homer to help Middle Tennessee to a 4-1 record. The Henry County HS product collected his first hit at Belmont on March 2 and went 2-for-3 with two RBIs in Saturday's 9-2 victory over Southeastern Louisiana. He came off the bench on Sunday against SLU to hit a solo homer in the seventh, his first round-tripper of the season and 27th of his career

#### McKenry Finds Hitting Stroke

After collecting just two hits in his first 16 at-bats this season, sophomore catcher Michael McKenry found a hitting groove over the weekend against Southeastern Louisiana. The Knoxville, Tenn., native collected five hits in nine atbats (.556) versus the Lions, scoring four times and driving in four runs. His only two hits prior to the SLU series was a pair of solo home runs in the season-opener against Ball State. McKenry got a single in his first at-bat against SLU and delivered a game-winning two-run homer in the eighth in the series opener. He was also 2-for-3 with two runs scored on Saturday and came off the bench to double and score a run on Sunday. McKenry raised his season average from .125 to .280 and added two more hits at Memphis on Tuesday to the current .310 clip.

#### Bullpen Again Performing Well

Starting pitching in 2004 was Middle Tennessee's calling card, but the bullpen held up its end of the bargain, posting a 13-6 record with a 4.30 ERA and 14 saves. With starters at a minimum in 2005, the bullpen has stepped up nicely with a 3-0 mark and 3.41 ERA with two saves. Josh Anderson is 1-0 with one save and has not allowed an earned run in 8.2 innings, while Aaron Wallus has two wins and a 2.70 ERA in 6.2 innings of work.

#### Notes from Southeastern Louisiana/Memphis

Saturday's win over Southeastern Louisiana was the 700th career victory for head coach Steve Peterson. Peterson has 548 wins at Middle Tennessee after picking up 153 as head coach at Roane State CC ... Sunday's loss to SLU ended a five-game winning streak against the Lions dating to last season. The Blue Raiders swept SLU last season in Hammond ... Senior Eric McNamee's leadoff single Tuesday at Memphis extended his hitting streak to six games ... Senior Nate Jaggers extended his hitting streak to nine games this season and 13 overall dating to the end of 2004 ... Redshirt sophomore Josh Anderson tossed three innings, allowing an unearned run. The Rockvale, Tenn., native has tossed 8.2 innings in five appearances this season, allowing no earned runs ... Sophomore Adam Warren collected a career-high three hits in the contest ... The Blue Raiders have won four straight against the Tigers overall and six of the last eight on the road in the series.

#### **Tidbits**

The Blue Raiders scored double-digit runs in 13 games in 2004. The squad has already scored in double figures in five contests in 2005 ... Middle Tennessee has recorded double-digit hits in six straight outings and seven times in nine games this season ... Nate Jaggers not only has a high batting average, but is coming through when it counts. Jaggers is 11-for-22 (.500) with runners on base and 8for-16 (.500) with runners in scoring position. He also has five two-out RBIs to lead the club ... Marcus Taylor is the only other player on the squad with more than 10 at-bats with runners in scoring position, batting .545 (6-for-11) through the first nine games.

#### Streaks

Senior Nate Jaggers has hit safely in all nine games this season, the only Blue Raider to accomplish the feat. Jaggers leads the squad in batting average, runs and RBIs and is tied for the home run lead heading into Friday's contest against Jacksonville State. Dating to last season

the third baseman has hit safely in 13 straight games, batting .396 (21-for-53) during the stretch. Senior Eric McNamee has hit in six consecutive outings and Josh Archer in five, while Chase Eakes and Michael McKenry carry four-game hitting streaks into Friday's outing versus the Gamecocks.

#### Last Time Against the Gamecocks

Middle Tennessee has lost 2-of-3 the past two seasons to Jacksonville State after winning seven straight games in the series from 1999-01. The Gamecocks, under head coach Jim Case, won twice in Murfreesboro in 2003 and twice more in Jacksonville last season. Friday's game last year was a little unlucky for starter Chris Mobley, who allowed a wind-blown two-run homer in the fifth in a 2-1 loss. Brett Carroll went 4-for-5 with two doubles and Marcus Taylor drove in three runs to back up John Williams on the mound in Saturday's 8-2 victory. On Sunday JSU squeaked out a 5-3 victory to win the series.

#### Blue Raiders Add Six Fall Signees

Middle Tennessee inked six players to national letters-ofintent during the early signing period, the largest fall class for the Blue Raiders in 15 years. The six include: righthander Brett Smalley from Hixson HS in Hixson, Tenn.; infielder Myles Ervin from Notre Dame HS in Chattanooga, Tenn.; righthander Allan Woodward from Maple Woods CC and Columbia, Mo.; Brandon Brokaw from Fort Zumwalt South HS in St. Peters, Mo.; Dillon Heath from Davidson Academy in Nashville, Tenn.; and Brett Reilley from Olney Central JC and Fort Wayne, Ind. Ervin plays for former Blue Raider George Oleksik at Notre Dame, while Woodward enrolled in January and will be a member of this season's pitching staff.

## **Steve Peterson**

### Head Coach ● Jacksonville State/1973 ● 18th Season ● 548-429-2 (.560), 701-525-2 (.571) overall



There are many adjectives to describe the job Steve Peterson has done as Middle Tennessee's highly successful baseball coach since 1988. Coach, fundraiser, teacher, recruiter and architect are just a few, but if you are looking for one word to sum his contribu-

tions as the Blue Raiders' longtime skipper, try winner.

Peterson begins his 18th season heading the Blue Raider program as the school's all-time winningest coach with 542 victories and a stockpile of conference championships and NCAA Tournament berths to his credit, demonstrating the consistency with which the driven skipper has guided the club.

Middle Tennessee has been a model program on Peterson's watch and the proof is in the success the Blue Raiders have achieved. The veteran coach has led Middle Tennessee to 10 regular-season conference championships, eight conference tournament titles and seven NCAA Regional berths, including two at-large selections in the past four years. Peterson guided the Blue Raiders to seven consecutive championships – either regular-season or tournament – during one stretch, proving Middle Tennessee doesn't rebuild, it reloads.

Peterson, who enters the 2005 season with a sterling 542-426-2 mark, has produced 10 seasons with 30 or more wins, including a school-record 42 victories in 1990. He also has three campaigns of at least 40 wins, including last season's 40-22 club.

The constant manner in which Middle Tennessee has enjoyed success during Peterson's tenure is a direct reflection on recruiting and developing talent and the proof was never more evident than in 2001 – the Blue Raiders' first season as a member of the Sun Belt Conference after years of success in the Ohio Valley.

Asked how the move into the Sun Belt, rated one of the nation's Top 5 baseball leagues at the time and consistently a Top 10 conference, would change his recruiting philosophy, Peterson quickly responded, "none at all." The 2001 Blue Raiders then went out and shared the Sun Belt championship with South Alabama during their first year in the high-profile league and the majority of the chief contributors were the same performers who led Middle Tennessee to the 2000 Ohio Valley Conference championship.

The move to a higher-rated conference has not hurt Middle Tennessee's status. If anything, it has helped. In its first four years in the Sun Belt, Peterson's teams have won two regular-season championships, a tournament championship and earned three NCAA Regional berths, including two at-large selections for the first time in school history. The 2001 squad earned national acclaim for its pitching and hitting and the season concluded with pitcher Dewon Brazelton being selected as the No. 3 overall pick of the Tampa Bay Devil Rays in the Major League Baseball First-Year Amateur Player Draft. Brazelton was one of six players from the team to earn a spot on a professional baseball roster that season.

A program cannot enjoy consistent success without quality players and Peterson, a three-time Coach of the Year, has not only made a habit of making sure Middle

Tennessee has its share of quality performers, but he's won by constantly signing prep players and developing them at the college level. The proof is in the fact Peterson has coached a Sun Belt Player of the Year and six OVC Players of the Year, a Sun Belt Pitcher of the Year and an OVC Pitcher of the Year, a First-Team All-American, four Third-Team All-Americans, four Freshman All-Americans, and 35 first-team All-Conference performers.

Players who have honed their skills under Peterson also have had an outstanding rate of continuing their careers at the professional level. Professional baseball has seen 46 former Peterson performers earning the chance to play at the game's highest level, with four making their way to the Major Leagues.

If that's not enough, Peterson's recruits have established most of the offensive records held at Middle Tennessee and three players he has developed have hit .400 or better in a season, along with the school's single-season and career home run record holders. His 1997 squad established the all-time record for batting average with a .323 clip.

Peterson's players not only have been solid on the field at the collegiate level and continued their careers professionally, but a large majority have taken the skills and fundamentals learned at Middle Tennessee and are earning a living as coaches at various levels. Twenty-five former Blue Raiders are currently coaching at the high school, college or professional levels.

Peterson's peers have recognized his achievements and contributions to the game by bestowing several honors on him. He was named the Tennessee Baseball Coaches Association College Coach of the Year in 1992 and again in 2000. He was also inducted into the Rutherford County Old Timers Baseball Hall of Fame in 2003. Fellow coaches have named Peterson Coach of the Year on three occasions – twice in the Ohio Valley and again in 2004, his first such honor in the Sun Belt.

Peterson's outgoing and personable personality has made him a hit with fans, boosters, players and recruits, alike. Baseball enthusiasts throughout the Middle Tennessee community clearly appreciate his hard-nosed and aggressive style of play, as fans continue to flock to Reese Smith Field at a record pace. The Blue Raiders established a single-game attendance record in 2001 at Reese Smith Field with a crowd of 2,733 against South Alabama. The team went on to set the single-season attendance mark with 26.218 coming through the gates at Reese Smith Field. The 2004 squad saw 15 crowds of 1,000 or more during the season. Those numbers were surpassed in 2004 when the team set a single-game attendance record of 3,020 against Vanderbilt, as well as setting a new single-season attendance mark of 30,319, ranking 46th nationally in attendance for the season. Fifteen contests drew more than 1,000 patrons during the record-setting campaign.

Not only has Peterson been a winner on the field, but he's been a successful fundraiser during his career as well. Events such as the annual Chuck Taylor Golf Tournament, the Groundhog Day Luncheon and the Grand Slam Fish Fry in the fall have become mainstays on calendars of Blue Raider baseball supporters across middle Tennessee and have served to raise thousands of dollars

for the improvement of Blue Raider baseball.

Peterson spearheaded the efforts to pay for the construction of the Stephen B. Smith Clubhouse and Indoor Training Facility, which opened its doors in 1998. One look inside the facility shows the time and effort spent toward this endeavor. It has become known as one of the finest collegiate clubhouses and training facilities in the country.

Reese Smith Field also has benefited from Peterson's fundraising abilities. He has helped transform the park into a fan-friendly area by expanding the seating area, putting up a new information center just inside the gate, and expanding the restroom and concession facilities.

Peterson guided efforts during the summer of 2001 to expand the dugouts at Reese Smith Field. He also is currently spearheading an effort that would totally renovate the stadium. The plans would call for a significant remodeling of the concession stand, improve and expanded restroom facilities and a modern press box that would accommodate radio and television, along with print media.

While Peterson has spent 18 seasons leading the Middle Tennessee baseball program, his tenure with the program is much longer. He took two separate tours with the Blue Raiders as an assistant coach under John Stanford prior to becoming the team's head coach. During his runs between 1976-78 and 1985-87, the Blue Raiders won two OVC titles and four southern division crowns.

During the interim, Peterson served as the head coach at Roane State Community College in Harriman, Tenn. During his tenure from 1979-84, Peterson's teams won a Tennessee state title in 1981 and he was twice named TJCAA Coach of the Year (1981, '84). While at Roane State, Peterson put together a sparkling record of 153-96, a .614 winning percentage.

A native of Huntsville, Ala., Peterson stood out as a catcher under the legendary Rudy Abbott at Jacksonville State. He earned his bachelor's from Jacksonville State in 1983 and later earned a master's from Middle Tennessee in 1977.

Peterson is married to the former Rita Albert and the couple has three children, Jill, Jenny and John, and one grandchild, Hayden Wright. Away from the diamond, Peterson enjoys fishing for smallmouth bass.
