Middle Tennessee is 8-2 in home openers during the past decade, and the Blue Raiders have won five of their previous six openers at Murphy Center. Middle Tennessee is 29-4 in home openers at the "Glass House." The Blue Raiders are 2-1 in home openers under Head Coach Kermit Davis, having won two straight. Middle Tennessee is 52-30 all-time in **season openers** and 2-1 under Davis. The Blue Raiders have won four of their previous five season openers.

Scouting Utah State

Utah State opened the season with a 72-67 overtime win at Oral Roberts in its season opener Saturday. The Aggies, a member of the Western Athletic Conference (WAC), have won at least 20 games in each of the last six seasons. They also have appeared in postseason play six straight years, including four NCAA Tournament appearances. The Aggies are led by senior forward Nate Harris, a two-time first-team all-Big West selection. Sophomore guard Jaycee Carroll was the Big West Freshman of the Year in 2005 after leading the league in 3-point shooting at 47.6 percent. Carroll became the first freshman ever to be named MVP of the conference's postseason tournament. This is the first meeting between Utah State and Middle Tennessee. Familiar Faces Few For Blue Raiders

Middle Tennessee will have eight newcomers on its travel roster for the 2005-06 season. Four of the newcomers are true freshmen, while four are transfers. The unit is the youngest in coach Kermit Davis' first four years at Middle Tennessee. The freshmen newcomers include Darren Avery, Theryn Hudson, Kevin Kanaskie, and Calvin O'Neil. The junior newcomers are, Marques Dawson, Bud Howard, Adam Vogelsberg, and Tim Blue, who transferred from Indian River Junior College in 2004 and sat out the 2004-05 season.

Blue Raiders Will Be Road Tested Early

The 2005-06 Blue Raiders will be the youngest Kermit Davis has put on the court at Middle Tennessee and the squad will tackle the toughest schedule during Davis' tenure. Making matters more difficult, Middle Tennessee will play nine of its first 13 games away from home. Included in the grueling early-season slate are road dates at Memphis, Louisville, Utah State, and Portland State, as well as regional rivalries against Tennessee State and Belmont in Nashville.

Blue Raiders Tough Playing With Lead

Middle Tennessee has enjoyed tremendous success under Head Coach Kermit Davis when it holds the lead at the half, and the Blue Raiders have been almost as tough to beat with the lead in late-game situations under the veteran coach. Middle Tennessee was 15-0 in 2004-05 when leading at the half and they are 43-4 under Davis in such situations. The Blue Raiders were 18-1 in 2004-05 when leading in the final five minutes, and they are 46-6 all-time under Davis in the same late-game situations.

Davis Among Blue Raider Coaching Leaders

By turning in winning seasons in each of his first three years at Middle Tennessee, Kermit Davis became only the second head coach in program history to accomplish the feat. The other was Bruce Stewart. Davis' success also earned him a contract extension through the 2010 season. Davis already is eighth on the all-time wins list at Middle Tennessee with 52. He trails Ed Diddle, Jr., (56) for seventh on the list, and David Farrar (61) for sixth entering the 2005-06 campaign. Stan Simpson is fifth on the all-time wins list with 71 victories. Jimmy Earle is the program's all-time winningest coach with 164 wins.



Kermit Davis File



In just three years at Middle Tennessee, Kermit Davis has established himself as one of the most successful men's basketball coaches in program history, and he's done so while rebuilding a program that had fallen on hard times.

Prior to Davis' hiring in April, 2002, Middle Tennessee had endured losing seasons in three of the four previous years - and was one season removed from a 5-22 campaign, the worst in school history. The Blue Raiders have registered three straight winning seasons under Davis, making him only one of two of the 19 Middle Tennessee men's basketball coaches to accomplish the feat. The other was Bruce Stewart. Middle Tennessee's 52 wins in Davis' first three seasons represent the third most victories for a Blue Raider coach after his first three seasons.
