Series History

Memphis leads the all-time series 21-15, including wins in nine straight and 13 of 15; however, Wednesday's contest is the first meeting between the in-state rivals since Dec. 8, 1990, and only the second in the past 20 years. Middle Tennessee coach Kermit Davis has never faced Memphis.

Noteworthy

● Middle Tennessee is 14-5 against in-state opponents under Head Coach Kermit Davis.

● Memphis is the second Top 10 team Middle Tennessee has faced this season. The Blue Raiders lost to then No. 10 Louisville, 76-68, Dec. 20.

● Kyle Young was 5-for-6 against Tennessee State and has hit 11 of his last 12 from the field to raise his Sun Belt-leading field goal percentage to 73 percent (52-71).

● Middle Tennessee concludes its three-game road trip when it opens Sun Belt Conference play at Western Kentucky Saturday. Tipoff is set for 7 p.m.

Scouting Memphis

No. 4 Memphis is coming off a 69-58 loss to No. 15 Texas on Monday. The Tigers, who entered the week ranked No. 4 in both national polls, only other loss was to Duke in the championship game of the Preseason NIT. Memphis is averaging 86.2 points per game and has four players averaging double figures, led by Rodney Carney's 16.7 points per game. Memphis, which shoots 47 percent from the field and 38 percent from 3-point range, is in a stretch of playing three games in six days.

Taking A Closer Look At Middle Tennessee

Middle Tennessee is in the midst of a three-game road swing that began with a 67-57 win at Tennessee State Saturday. The Blue Raiders open Sun Belt Conference play at Western Kentucky Saturday at 7 p.m. Middle Tennessee is led in scoring by Fats Cuyler at 14.2 ppg., while Adam Vogelsberg (12.6) and Kyle Young (10.6) also average double figures. Young also leads the team in rebounding with 6.1 per game. Memphis, which entered the week ranked No. 4 in both national polls, represents the second Top 10 team the Blue Raiders have faced. Middle Tennessee lost, 76-68, to then No. 10 Louisville, Dec. 20. Five players are averaging double figures during the last five games, in which the squad is averaging 76.8 points per game.

In With The New?

Middle Tennessee beat Tennessee State, 67-57, to end 2005 on a positive note Saturday in Nashville; however, the first game of the new year has been challenging in recent years. Middle Tennessee ended a five-game losing streak in the first game played in a new year when it beat Virginia Commonwealth on New Year's Day in 2005. Middle Tennessee is 4-6 in the last 10 games it has played at the outset of a new year.

Looking For 3-Point Stroke

Middle Tennessee established a new school record for 3-point field goal percentage (.650) on the strength of 13-of-20 shooting from beyond the arc in its win against Florida Atlantic (12/21/05), but the Blue Raiders have been as accurate from deep range in the two games since. Middle Tennessee is 8-of-38 for a 21 percent clip from 3-point range, including 2-of-15 against Tennessee State (12/31/05).

Home Attendance Continues To Rise

Middle Tennessee has realized an increase in home attendance in each of Kermit Davis' first three seasons and the Blue Raiders are once again on pace to increase the average in 2005-06. Middle Tennessee is averaging 4,116 through its first four home games. That number is second for home attendance among Sun Belt men's basketball teams and is 67 percent above the league home average of 2,775 per game.

No Rest For The Raiders ... Or Tigers

Basketball players across the nation generally do not get lengthy breaks during the holidays due to tournaments and non-conference games and the situation is holding true for players at Memphis and Middle Tennessee players during this break. The Blue Raiders are in the midst

of playing four games during an 11-day span, including three straight on the road. Holiday season hasn't meant a break for Memphis, either, as the game against Middle Tennessee Wednesday will be the third in six days for the Tigers.

Morrison Gaining 'Mo'mentum

Middle Tennessee senior swingman Marcus Morrison's nickname is 'Mo,' which has been appropriate in recent weeks because the St. Petersburg, Fla., native is gaining momentum and beginning to live up to his preseason All-Sun Belt selection. Morrison has produced two double doubles in the last three games, and he's been a solid all-around contributor during the past five games. Morrison is averaging 12.2 points and a team-high 6.8 rebounds during the past five games, while shooting 44 percent from 3-point range. Morrison was among the team's most accurate 3-point marksmen during the 2004-05 season.

Blue Raider Offense Hitting Stride

Several offensive weapons have emerged for Middle Tennessee during the past five games and the team's ability to share the ball and get everyone involved has keyed a strong surge during that span. The Blue Raiders are averaging 76.8 points and 36.0 rebounds (with a margin of plus 5.4), while shooting 49 percent (134-274) from the field. They also have taken advantage of opportunities at the free-throw line during this five-game stretch, knocking down 75 percent (78-104) of their attempts. The Blue Raiders have five players averaging double figures during the five-game span. Fats Cuyler leads the way with 15.6, followed by Marcus Morrison (12.2), Adam Vogelsberg (11.4), Kyle Young (10.2), and Tim Blue (10.0). The Blue Raiders have assists on 63 percent of their made baskets during the past five games.



Kermit Davis File



In just three years at Middle Tennessee, Kermit Davis has established himself as one of the most successful men's basketball coaches in program history, and he's done so while rebuilding

a program that had fallen on hard times. Prior to Davis' hiring in April, 2002, Middle Tennessee had endured losing seasons in three of the four previous years - and was one season removed from a 5-22 campaign, the worst in school history. The Blue Raiders have registered three straight winning seasons under Davis, making him only one of two of the 19 Middle Tennessee men's basketball coaches to start his Blue Raider career with three straight winning campaigns. The other was Bruce Stewart. Middle Tennessee's 52 wins in Davis' first three seasons represent the third most victories for a Blue Raider coach after his first three seasons.

Davis Among Leaders

Kermit Davis joined Bruce Stewart as the only head coaches in program history to begin their Blue Raider careers with three straight winning seasons in 2004-05. Davis already is seventh on the all-time wins list at Middle Tennessee with 58. He tied Ed Diddle, Jr., (56) for seventh on the list with Middle Tennessee's 87-75 win at Belmont (12/10/05). Davis is three wins behind David Farrar (61) for sixth on the all-time wins list. Stan Simpson is fifth on the all-time wins list with 71 victories. Jimmy Earle is the program's all-time winningest coach with 164 wins. Davis also is third in winning percentage (.580) among Blue Raider men's basketball coaches with a minimum of 50 games coached, trailing only Jimmy Earle (.614), and Bruce Stewart (.648). Middle Tennessee's 81-71 win against Chattanooga, Nov. 29, was Davis' 125th career Division I win.

Davis Among Winningest Coaches After First 100

Kermit Davis coached in his 100th game at Middle Tennessee against (12/28/05). Davis, in his fourth season leading the Blue Raiders, has a 58-42 record through his first 100 games, the second most wins of any Middle Tennessee coach through his first 100 games. Bruce Stewart tops the list, having won 67 of the first 100 games he coached at Middle Tennessee. Stan Simpson won 57 of his first 100 for third on the list.

Unselfish Play, Sharing Basketball Paying Off

During the preseason, Middle Tennessee coach Kermit Davis said one of the most pleasing aspects of his 2005-06 squad was its unselfishness, calling it the best "passing team" he has had. The numbers through the first 11 games of the season support those statements as Middle Tennessee players have supplied assists on 57 percent of the team's 287 field goals. The Blue Raiders have had 15 or more assists six times this season and they have registered double figures in assists in 10 straight games. Bud Howard leads the team with a 3.7 assist average, while Fats Cuyler averages 3.1.

Outshooting Opponent Key Blue Raider Trend

Outshooting the opposition does not guarantee victory for Middle Tennessee but it is a trend that comes about as close to perfection as any under fourth-year coach Kermit Davis. The Blue Raiders are 6-0 this season and 50-2 all-time under Davis when outshooting the opposition. Middle Tennessee also is 4-2 this season and 48-6 under Davis when shooting 50 percent or better. Middle Tennessee also has played well with the lead with Davis at the helm. The Blue Raiders are 5-2 this season and 48-6 under Davis when leading at the half, and they are 5-0 in 2005-06 and 51-6 under the veteran coach when leading in the last five minutes.

Winning In-State Battles

Middle Tennessee has enjoyed tremendous success against in-state opponents under Head Coach Kermit Davis, and it will look to continue the trend against Memphis Wednesday. The Blue Raiders are 14-5 overall against teams from the Volunteer State since Davis was hired in 2002, including winning nine of the last 10. Middle Tennessee is 11-2 at home against in-state foes during that stretch.

Enjoying Non-Conference Success

Middle Tennessee set a school record for consecutive home wins against non-conference opponents with 19 straight when it beat Freed-Hardeman 92-48 (12/18/05). The previous record was held by Coach Jimmy Earle's Blue Raiders, who won 18 straight during a stretch between 1973-76. There have been seven such streaks of 10 wins or more. The Blue Raiders are 20-4 overall in non-conference games at Murphy Center under Head Coach Kermit Davis.

Home Sweet Home?

Middle Tennessee, which has played five of the last seven away from home, has enjoyed just four home games in the team's first 11 contests. The Blue Raiders are in the midst of their second three-game road swing of the season at Memphis Wednesday, before traveling to Western Kentucky Saturday. The Blue Raiders will not play back-to-back home games until Jan. 12-14 when they open the home portion of the Sun Belt slate against Arkansas State and Arkansas-Little Rock, respectively. The only other time a Blue Raider team has not played consecutive home games deeper into a season was 1983-84, when Stan Simpson's squad had to wait until Jan. 17-19. Middle Tennessee also will not play three straight home games during the regular season - a first in school history (dating to 1956).

Vogelsberg Named Minardi All-Tournament

Adam Vogelsberg's outstanding play in Middle Tennessee's two games against No. 10 Louisville and Florida Atlantic earned him a spot on the five-person Billy Minardi Classic All-Tournament team. Vogelsberg was perfect from the free-throw line, going 15-for-15, in the two games. The junior guard nailed all 11 attempts in a 76-68 setback against Louisville, becoming only the 10th player in school history to shoot 100 percent from the stripe with a minimum of 11 attempts. Vogelsberg led Middle Tennessee with 14 points against Louisville. He hit all four attempts in the team's 90-76 win against Florida Atlantic in the consolation game. Vogelsberg was as dynamic in the consolation game, establishing career highs for points (19), 3-point field goals made (5), and tying his career high with four assists. He was 5-of-7 shooting from beyond the arc. He also played a career-best 34 minutes in the Florida Atlantic game and put up career-best numbers despite developing a stomach virus prior to the game.

Who Says Nothing Comes Free?

Adam Vogelsberg has been almost automatic for Middle Tennessee from the free-throw line this season. The junior guard from Home, Kansas, is shooting 91 percent (52-of-57) from the charity stripe and had a streak of 25 straight charity tosses made snapped against Tennessee State. It marks the second streak of 15 or more makes for Vogelsberg this season. Vogelsberg is currently on pace to become the only player in Blue Raider history to shoot 90 percent or better from

the line for a single season. The single-season record for free-throw percentage is 89 percent (83-of-93) by Lee Nosse during the 1999-2000 season. Vogelsberg knocked down all 11 attempts against Louisville to become only the 10th player in school history to shoot 100 percent from the charity stripe with a minimum of 11 attempts.

Young Off To Best Start Of Career

Middle Tennessee 6-foot-10 post Kyle Young has established himself as a strong inside presence in the early going and established career highs for points (19), field goals made (9) and field goals attempted (13) in an 87-75 win at Belmont (12/10/05). Young, a native of Lewisburg, Tenn., recorded his third career double double and second of the season with a career-high 12 rebounds and 10 points against No. 10 Louisville. He is shooting a Sun Belt-leading 73 percent (52-of-71) through the first 11 games and his 6.1 rebounding average is best on the squad. He's also averaging 10.6 points per game, which is almost triple his career scoring average (4.1) entering the 2005-06 season. After registering six career double-digit scoring games in the previous two seasons combined, Young already has seven double-digit scoring games this season. Young, who has pulled 100-plus rebounds in each of his first two seasons, has been particularly strong on the offensive glass with a team-best 27 caroms.

Young Closing In On Top Shot Blockers

Kyle Young tied his career high with three blocked shots in the season opener against Utah State. He has accumulated 35 for his career which ties him for 13th with Fernando Ortiz on the all-time list at Middle Tennessee.

3-Point Shooting Barrage Keys Record Win

Middle Tennessee (6-3) established a new school record for 3-point field goal percentage (.650) on the strength of 13-of-20 shooting from beyond the arc against Florida Atlantic in the consolation game of the Billy Minardi Classic. The display bested the previous record of 64.7 percent against Tennessee Martin and Arkansas State. The 13 treys made tied for fifth most in program history. It was a game in which several career marks were set for Blue Raiders, including a breakout performance from redshirt freshman Brian Lake, who established career highs for points (17), field goals made (6), field goal attempts (9), 3-point field goals made (3), and 3-point field goal attempts (4). He also set a career high with three assists against Louisville. Fats Cuyler and Adam Vogelsberg also enjoyed career performances against Florida Atlantic. Cuyler tied his career high for points (23), field goals made (9), 3-point field goals made (5) and assists (8), while Vogelsberg established career highs for points (19) and 3-point field goals (5), while tying his career high with four assists. The dangerous tandem of Cuyler and Vogelsberg combined to shoot 10-of-15 from 3-point range.

Seeking Four Straight

The Blue Raiders are seeking four straight winning seasons for the first time since the 1986-89 seasons - a span of 16 years. The Blue Raiders won 16 games in 2002-03 - Davis' first season - increased the win total to 17 in 2003-04, and won 19 in 2004-05.

Cuyler Providing Offensive Punch

Senior guard Fats Cuyler has emerged as a consistent offensive threat in 2005-06. After producing seven career double-figure scoring games all of the 2004-05 season, Cuyler already has eight in the team's first 11 games this season. The Leesburg, Fla., native is averaging a team-best 14.2 points per game and he has hit at least one 3-pointer in 22 consecutive games. Cuyler established career highs for points (23) and 3-point field goals made (9) against Freed-Hardeman (12/18/05), and matched both career highs in the win against Florida Atlantic. He also tied his career high of eight assists against Florida Atlantic. The versatile and well-conditioned senior guard has been amongst the Blue Raiders' most durable players since the start of the 2004-05 season, logging 30 or more minutes in 19 career games.

Preseason Sun Belt Poll

The Sun Belt Conference holds its annual basketball media day in October in Murfreesboro, Tenn., and Middle Tennessee was picked to finish third in the East Division.
