Willbanks (1984-86, 1,236 pts) as well as Horton, who has 1,243 points during her career after a six-point outing against UTC. Givens also moved into eighth place on the career steals list with four thefts against the Lady Mocs and has 203 all-time. She needs five more steals to pass Jennifer McFall (1982-85, 205) and Cortney Neeley (1996-99, 207) for sixth. Givens stands 10th on the career FG attempts chart at Middle Tennessee with 1,042, just ahead of former teammate Tia Stovall (2003-06, 1,011). A full listing of the career records appears on Page 13 of these notes.

GIVENS THE ULTIMATE STAT-SHEET STUFFER: Senior Chrissy Givens led Middle Tennessee in points, rebounds, assists and steals last season and currently ranks first in three of the four categories so far in 2006-07, ranking second only in rebounds. Givens tallied a season-high 29 points in Friday's win over Chattanooga, grabbing seven rebounds with five assists and four steals. She was 11-for-23 from the field, a season-high in FG attempts, and was 5-of-6 from the foul line, both seasonhighs. For the season Givens is averaging a team-leading 43 percent from the field (45-for-104) and 78 percent at the foul line (14-for-18) and leads the squad with 28 assists and 15 steals. Her only issue has been from behind the 3-point line, where the Monroe, La., native has greatly struggled, shooting just 18 percent (4for-22) after hitting 34 percent last season.

TIDBITS: Middle Tennessee's 98 points were the most under second-year head coach Rick Insell and the most since the Blue Raiders scored 99 against Eastern Illinois on January 9, 1999, a span of 235 games ... As a team Middle Tennessee set season-highs in the game with 35 field goals made and 16 steals, tied a season-high with 12 3-pointers made and shot a season-best 39 percent (12-for-31) from 3-point range ... Johnna Abney tied her season-high for the third time with three assists, second only

Freshman Brandi Brown contributed a pair of 3-pointers in the game as the Blue Raiders hit a dozen trifectas in the contest. Brown tied her season-high with six points ... With the win the Blue Raiders improved to 24-16 all-time against Chattanooga, including 13-7 at Murphy Center. Middle Tennessee has won six-in-a-row in the series at home and five-out-of-six overall in the series.

GIVENS VOTED PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Middle Tennessee senior Chrissy Givens was voted the Sun Belt Women's Basketball Player of the Week on November 21 after helping the Blue Raiders to back-to-back victories and claiming the MVP award at the Subway Classic in Minneapolis, Minn. Givens was named to the Most Valuable Player at the Subway Classic after the Blue Raiders posted wins over Maine and host Minnesota to win the four-team tournament. Givens posted 23 points against Maine and 25 versus Minnesota. The Monroe, La., native also tallied 20 rebounds, 13 assists and six steals in the two contests. She was 9-of-14 from the field in the first half against Minnesota for 18 points, as Middle Tennessee built a 14-point halftime edge. The loss for Minnesota ended an 11-game nonconference winning streak at Williams Arena and was just the second nonconference loss for UM at home under fifth-year head coach Pam Borton. in December 2004 to top-ranked LSU. Givens won the award three times last season and joins teammate Amber Holt as the SBC Player of the Week after Holt garnered the accolade on November 14.

RECEIVING VOTES: The ESPN/USA Today preseason women's college basketball poll was released on October 31 and Middle Tennessee received two votes. The Blue Raiders joined Western Kentucky as the only teams from the Sun Belt Conference to receive votes. In this week's ESPN/USA Today poll (November 21), Middle Tennessee received one vote, but picked up nine votes in this week's AP poll to rank 40th in the nation.

GIVENS. ORR MAKE ALL-TOURNAMENT: Senior Chrissy Givens and junior Starr Orr were both named to the All-Tournament team at the Subway Classic in Minneapolis, Minn., and Givens was awarded the Most Valuable Player trophy as well in the four-team tournament November 18-19. Givens posted games with 23 and 25 points in wins over Maine and host Minnesota, respectively, and tallied 20 rebounds, 13 assists and six steals in the two contests. Orr was all over the floor in both outings, netting 12 points versus Maine and a career-high 14 against Minnesota as well as grabbing 15 rebounds with 11 assists and four steals in the two games. It marks the first time Middle Tennessee has won two games in a tournament besides the conference championships since December 21-22, 2000, at the UCF Classic in Orlando, Fla., and just the 15th time in 52 in-season tournaments in the history of the program that the Blue Raiders won a pair games.

Middle Tennessee turned up the pressure last weekend against Maine and Minnesota. Maine committed 20 turnovers in Saturday's 87-60

DEFENSIVE INTENSITY A MAJOR FACTOR:

Blue Raiders victory and the squad forced the relatively young Golden Gophers into 31 turn-overs in Sunday's 79-61 triumph, including 18 in the first half. Opponents have committed 119 turnovers in five games so far this season, an average of 23.8 per outing, while the Blue Raiders are turning the ball over just 14.3 times per contest. For 30 minutes against Minnesota, Middle Tennessee played as intense and aggressive as possible, forcing the bulk of the

mistakes by Minnesota with 12 of the turnovers coming on steals. The Blue Raiders have 52 thefts in the five outings, an average of 10.4 per game. The squad also drew seven charges in the victory over Minnesota and has 15 charges thus far this season.

ORR NETS CAREER-HIGH: Junior Starr Orr had the best back-to-back games of her career last weekend at Minnesota after head coach Rick Insell inserted her into the starting lineup. The Danville, Ala., native had never posted back-to-back double-figure scoring games until putting up 12 points versus Maine and then a career-high 14 against Minnesota. It was also just the 10th and 11th career starts for Orr, who came to Middle Tennessee with impressive stats at the high school ranks that included more the 4,000 points. But Orr's biggest contribution in the team's two victories at the Subway Classic came in other areas, where she grabbed 15 rebounds, handed out 11 assists and made four steals in the two games. Twelve of her 15 rebounds came on the offensive glass, helping the Blue Raiders to 43 offensive boards in the two outings.

SQUAD GETS HOT AT THE RIGHT TIME:

Middle Tennessee shot the ball poorly from the field in the first two games of the season, versus top-ranked Maryland and South Dakota State, after ranking 23rd nationally last season in field goal percentage at .450. But the Blue Raiders have scalded the nets at better than 50 percent in the last two contests, shooting 54 percent versus Minnesota in the championship game of the Subway Classic last Sunday and 52 percent in Friday's triumph over Chattanooga. Middle Tennessee raised its season field goal percentage to 43 percent as a team after making 68-of-128 in the last two outings combined.

TIDBITS VERSUS MAINE, MINNESOTA:

The Blue Raiders totaled 48 rebounds versus Maine, the team's most since grabbing 49 rebounds against Arkansas-Little Rock on February 15, 2003, a span of 104 games ... With the victory over Maine, Middle Tennessee is 11-4 in neutral-site games in the last three-plus seasons, including wins over Wisconsin, Penn State, North Carolina and N.C. State and six victories in the Sun Belt Championships ... The Blue Raiders win over Minnesota ended an

SCOUTING THE LADY VOLS: Tennessee enters Sunday's contest 4-0 after a 77-60 victory Friday over 11th-ranked Stanford at home. The Lady Vols also have wins at No. 11 Arizona State and at home against Chattanooga and 20th-rated UCLA. All-American Candace Parker leads Tennessee with 21.8 points and 7.0 rebounds per contest, while Sidney Spencer averages 13.3 points and Alexis Hornbuckle tosses in 11.3 points per contest. UT has nine players averaging double-figure minutes and has won its four games by an average margin of 19.8 points per outing. The Lady Vols shoot an astounding 54 percent from the field, including 45 percent from 3-point range, as well as 78 percent at the foul line, and are averaging 86.2 points per game as a team this season.

SERIES HISTORY WITH TENNESSEE: Tennessee leads the all-time series with the Blue Raiders, 7-0. The teams have not met since March 14, 1984, a 70-52 first-round NCAA Tournament victory for UT in Knoxville. The only other contest played in Knoxville was an 87-63 UT triumph in December of 1978. Three of the meetings have come at neutral sites and two have been played at Murphy Center in the series.

and added 10 boards for her first career double-double. She averaged 39.0 minutes of action in the two contests and was 14-of-16 at the line as well. The Duluth, Ga., native became the 15th Middle Tennessee player to earn POW honors since joining the Sun Belt and the sixth different Blue Raider to garner the honor.

VINNY JOHNSON (THE MICROWAVE) ANY-ONE??: Freshman Chelsia Lymon has pro-

vided a major offensive spark off the bench in the early-going this season, scoring in double figures twice and adding nine points in another contest. Lymon totaled 13 points on 5-for-7 shooting and added a steal in just nine minutes of action against top-ranked Maryland on November 10. Eight of her nine minutes of playing time came in the second half when she took all of her shots, including hitting a pair of 3-pointers. Her first trifecta pulled the Blue Raiders within a point four minutes into the second period and Lymon scored six of her team's points during a 10-2 run late in the period that gave the Blue Raiders a five-point lead with five minutes to play in the contest. Included in the run was her second 3-pointer and a 360-spin move that also drew a foul. She was one of the lone bright spots for the Blue Raiders against South Dakota State, netting 10 points with three assists in 20 minutes of action, connecting on 3-of-5 attempts from behind the 3-point arc. Last Sunday at Minnesota, the Georgetown, Ky., native hit eight straight points early in the second half when the Blue Raiders extended their lead to as many as 29 points over the Golden Gophers. Lymon nailed a pair of three-pointers and a lay-up before later adding a free throw and then missing another charity toss that would have given her a third double-figure outing. She is averaging 8.0 points per game so far this season despite averaging only 13.6 minutes of playing time.

DEPTH NOT AN ISSUE: Middle Tennessee's full-court pressing style of play can sometimes become an issue for many teams. Last season the Blue Raiders played coach Rick Insell's preferred style of play despite using just eight players for most of the season. In all five regular season games thus far this season, the Blue Raiders have substituted freely, with at least 10 players seeing action in all five contests. Four newcomers are included in the 10 and four underclassmen as well. Eight of the 10 players are averaging double-figure minutes.

GIVENS A JACK OF ALL TRADES: Senior Chrissy Givens led Middle Tennessee in points, rebounds, assists and steals as a junior and has continued her consistent and all-around play through the first five games this season. In the season opener versus No. 1 Maryland, the Monroe, La., native totaled 14 points, four rebounds, seven assists and three steals, playing all 40 minutes. Givens hit double figures in scoring for the 50th time of her career and played all 40 minutes for the 17th time as a Blue Raider. On November 13 against South Dakota State, she netted 17 points with six boards, three assists and three steals, again playing all 40 minutes. Givens was at her best so far this season in two games at the Subway Classic in Minneapolis, Minn., last weekend, scoring 48 points in two contests with 20 rebounds, 13 assists and six steals in the two outings. Included was a second game with seven assists (vs. Minnesota) and a 23-point, 13-rebound contest against Maine, the sixth double-double of her career. She backed that up with 29 points, seven boards, five assists and four steals versus Chattanooga on Friday and leads the team in points, assists and steals this season while ranking second in rebounds. Givens was named the Preseason Sun Belt Player of the Year by coaches and the media during the SBC Media Days in Lafayette, La., and was a Preseason Honorable Mention All-America selection by Street & Smith's magazine in October.

BLUE RAIDERS SET ATTENDANCE RE-CORD: Middle Tennessee set a new singlegame record with a crowd of 10,010 for the season-opening contest versus No. 1-ranked Maryland at Murphy Center on Friday, November 10. The attendance shattered the old mark of 4,813 set March 7, 2006, versus Western Kentucky in the championship game of the Sun Belt Tournament. Middle Tennessee averaged 2,699 for 16 home dates during the 2005-06 season and led the nation in attendance increase last year with a more than 300 percent increase. The attendance mark of 10,010 is the 15th most to ever see a basketball game in the 11,500-seat Murphy Center and the third most to ever attend a women's basketball contest in Sun Belt Conference history (Western Kentucky holds the record with 12,951 on February 23, 1986, vs. Old Dominion; Arkansas State vs. Arkansas, March 24, 2005, 10,892).

aged 20.1 points, 11.0 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 1.7 steals as a freshman at Motlow in helping the Lady Bucks to a 25-4 overall mark last season. Motlow finished 2005-06 ranked 18th nationally.

Queen has earned Second Team All-State honors as a sophomore and junior at Rose Hill Christian, helping her team to a state runner-up finish in 2006. She garnered Sweet Sixteen All-Tournament and All "A" State Tournament honors last season as well and was voted All-District, All-Region and All-Area each of the last two seasons. The 6-foot-2 all-everything has scored 2,311 points and grabbed 1,194 rebounds in her three seasons, including single-game school records of 46 points, 7-of-11 3-pointers and 26 rebounds. She even posted one game with a quadruple double of 26 points, 11 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals. One more accolade for Queen - her team was the first girls small school in history to make the finals of the Kentucky State Tournament, where they lost to Lexington Catholic.

Lanning was named the Daily News Journal and District 7-AAA Player of the Year in 2005 at Riverdale High School in Murfreesboro. She was garnered All-District, All-Region and All-State accolades the past two years as well as Honorable Mention All-America from Street & Smith's. Lanning averaged 18.5 points, 2.2 assists and 1.9 steals last season, shooting 63.8 percent from the field, 34.4 percent from 3-point range and 84.7 percent from the free throw line.

GIVENS PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR: Senior Chrissy Givens was voted the Sun Belt Preseason Player of the Year by the

league coaches and media at the conference media days at the end of October. The Monroe, La., native was also voted to the Preseason All-Sun Belt First Team. The honor is in conjunction with the 5-11 guard being voted Sun Belt Player of the Year for the 2005-06 season. She was also voted Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Year and Sun Belt Tournament Most Outstanding Player. She is just the second player in Sun Belt Conference history to win all three awards in the same season. Givens' preseason honor is the second time in school history a Blue Raider women's basketball player was awarded the Preseason POY honor. In 2004 former Middle Tennessee standout Patrice Holmes was voted Sun Belt Preseason Player of the Year.

BLUE RAIDERS TOPS IN THE EAST: For the second time since joining the Sun Belt, Middle Tennessee has been tabbed to finish first in the Sun Belt preseason poll in the Eastern Division. The Blue Raiders received 74 points and nine

first-place votes to take the top spot in the Eastern Division in a poll of the league's coaches prior to SBC Media Days. Middle Tennessee was also picked to finish first in 2004.

HORTON SECOND TEAM: Krystle Horton was voted to the Preseason All-Sun Belt Second Team in a poll of the league's coaches and media prior to the Sun Belt Media Days in October. It marks the third straight season Horton has been named to a Preseason All-SBC squad. The senior forward was a Third-Team selection to close out the season in 2005-06, averaging 11.9 points per game and ranking second in the Sun Belt in field goal percentage at 51.2 percent.

GIVENS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERI-

CAN: Senior Chrissy Givens was named a Preseason Honorable Mention All-America by Street & Smith's magazine in October after leading Middle Tennessee in points, rebounds, assists and steals in 2005-06. It is the second time in school history a Blue Raider player was named a Preseason All-American, with former standout Jonelda Buck garnering the accolade before the 1998-99 season.

INSELL'S SUCCESS: Head coach Rick Insell enjoyed unprecedented success at Shelbyville Central High School in Shelbyville, Tenn., before becoming the seventh head coach in Middle Tennessee history before the 2005-06 season. Insell posted a 20-11 mark last year and led the Blue Raiders to their third straight Sun Belt Tournament title and third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. The 20 wins in his first campaign mark only the second Blue Raider coach to win 20 contests in his rookie season (Lewis Bivens, 22-8, 1988) and just the 14th 20-win season in Blue Raider history.

Coming out of the eight-minute timeout trailing 24-21, Chattanooga went to a zone defense, which played right into MTSU's hands. Freshman guard Jackie Pickel hit back-to-back 3-pointers, which spearheaded a 14-4 run that gave MTSU a 38-25 lead with 4:33 left before halftime.

Chattanooga pulled to within seven in less than a minute, but the Blue Raiders closed the half with a 12-7 run to take a 50-38 halftime lead at intermission.

Pickel finished with a season-high 15 points, hitting 5-of-7 from 3-point range. Five different MTSU players hit at least one 3-pointer.

"(Coach Insell) had told me all week to be ready," Pickel said. "I had been struggling with my shot, but he gives us so much confidence, and it's even better when you hit your first shot."

Both teams were plagued with foul problems in the first half, with Chattanooga being whistled for 13 and MTSU with 12. Chattanooga's leading scorer, Alex Anderson (18 ppg), played only four minutes after picking up her second foul, while starters Brooke Hand and Kristen Spann each had three fouls.

MTSU sophomore guard Johnna Abney picked up three fouls in the first half, while Givens, Holt and Starr Orr each had two.

Givens scored MTSU's first eight points of the second half, and Abney followed with a 3-pointer to give the squad a 61-44 advantage with 17:09 left. MTSU

outrebounded the Lady Mocs 40-28 and forced 21 turnovers.

The Lady Mocs were led by Anderson with 16 points and Shanara Hollinquest with 13.

POSTGAME NOTES

PICKEL GOING DOWNTOWN: Freshman Jackie Pickel was recruited for her long-range shooting out of Bradley Central High School, but she had struggled so far this season with her shot, making just 2-of-13 (.154) heading into Friday's contest. Pickel found her stroke during the week and found the open areas in the Chattanooga zone defense on Friday, knocking down 5-of-7 3-point attempts for a career-high 15 points. The Blue Raiders tied their season-high with 12 made 3-pointers and are shooting 35 percent (43-for-122) from the behind the arc this season


TAKING ADVANTAGE OF FREE CHANCES: Middle Tennessee continues to excel at the foul line this season, hitting 80 percent (16-for-20) in Friday's win over Chattanooga. Junior Amber Holt is the catalyst at the charity stripe, making 8-of-10 versus the Lady Mocs and 33-for-40 (.825) this season at the line. As a team the Blue Raiders are making 79 percent from the free throw line, going 66-of-84. HOLT WITH ANOTHER DOUBLE-DOUBLE: Junior Amber Holt recorded her second double-double of the season with 26 points and 10 rebounds versus Chattanooga, a workmanlike effort for the first-year Blue Raider. Holt finished 9-for-13 from the field and 8-of-10 at the foul line. It marked her third 20-plus point effort in five outings this season and tied her career-high in rebounds, set versus South Dakota State on November 13. For the season the Duluth, Ga., native is shooting 43 percent (35-for-81) from the field and an outstanding 83 percent (33-for-40) at the foul line. Holt is second on the club in scoring at 21.2 points per outing and first in rebounding at 8.2 boards per game.

GIVENS MOVES UP CAREER SCORING LIST: Senior Chrissy Givens passed two players on the all-time scoring list with her 29 points versus Chattanooga, including current teammate Krystle Horton. Givens moved into 12th place all-time at Middle Tennessee with 1,255 points, passing Kay Willbanks (1984-86, 1,236 pts) as well as Horton, who has 1,243 points during her career after a six-point outing against UTC. Givens also moved into eighth place on the career steals list with four thefts against the Lady Mocs and has 203 all-time. She needs five more steals to pass Jennifer McFall (1982-85, 205) and Cortney Neeley (1996-99, 207) for sixth. Givens stands 10th on the career FG attempts chart at Middle Tennessee with 1,042, just ahead of former teammate Tia Stovall (2003-06, 1,011). A full listing of the career records appears on Page 12 of these notes.

GIVENS THE ULTIMATE STAT-SHEET STUFFER: Senior Chrissy Givens led Middle Tennessee in points, rebounds, assists and steals last season and currently ranks first in three of the four categories so far in 2006-07, ranking second only in rebounds. Givens tallied a season-high 29 points in Friday's win over Chattanooga, grabbing seven rebounds with five assists and four steals. She was 11-for-23 from the field, a season-high in FG attempts, and was 5-of-6 from the foul line, both season-highs. For the season Givens is averaging a team-leading 43 percent from the field (45-for-104) and 78 percent at the foul line (14-for-18) and leads the squad with 28 assists and 15 steals. Her only issue has been from behind the 3-point line, where the Monroe, La., native has greatly struggled, shooting just 18 percent (4-for-22) after hitting 34 percent last season.

TIDBITS: Middle Tennessee's 98 points were the most under second-year head coach Rick Insell and the most since the Blue Raiders scored 99 against Eastern Illinois on January 9, 1999, a span of 235 games ... As a team Middle Tennessee set season-highs in the game with 35 field goals made and 16 steals, tied a season-high with 12 3-pointers made and shot a season-best 39 percent (12-for-31) from 3-point range ... Johnna Abney tied her season-high for the third time with three assists, second only to five from Chrissy Givens in the contest ... Senior Krystle Horton recorded a season-high five rebounds in the victory ... Freshman Brandi Brown contributed a pair of 3-pointers in the game as the Blue Raiders hit a dozen trifectas in the contest. Brown tied her season-high with six points ... With the win the Blue Raiders improved to 24-16 all-time against Chattanooga, including 13-7 at Murphy Center. Middle Tennessee has won six-in-a-row in the series at home and five-out-of-six overall in the series.

Head Coach Rick Insell



Rick Insell made a huge splash is first year at the helm of the Middle Tennessee women's basketball program, guiding the Middle Tennessee program to its third consecutive Sun Belt Championship and doing so in front of a

record-setting home crowd in the finals of the SBC Tournament.

Insell can now drop the title former high school coach and add his name to the list of Middle Tennessee coaches with conference titles. He directed one of the most thrilling comebacks in Sun Belt Tournament history, leading Middle Tennessee to an 84-73 win over Western Kentucky after being down by as many as 14 points in the first half.

Insell's first season at the helm of his alma mater also included a Top 10 recruiting class for the 2006-07 season and an unprecedented third consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Insell also developed one of the most prolific scorers for a single-season in school history in Chrissy Givens, who registered 667 points, the second most in a season on the all-time scoring list. It also makes Givens one of just five players to score 600 or more points in a season as a Blue Raider.

The 2005-06 campaign also saw another first in program history as three players - Givens, Tia Stovall and Krystle Horton - all joined the 1,000-point club. This marks the first time in school history three current players all were represented on the prestigious list, and the Blue Raiders were one of only four teams in the 2006 NCAA Tournament to boast such an honor

Insell's biggest influence may have come at the turnstiles, where the Blue Raiders averaged 2,699 fans per outing in 2005-06, a 300 percent increase over the previous season and the largest increase in the NCAA for 2005-06.

Middle Tennessee notched one of its biggest wins of the season when the Blue Raiders shocked Big 10 powerhouse Penn State, 79-65, in the UAB Blaze Tournament in December.

A 1977 graduate of Middle Tennessee, Insell built a high school girls basketball dynasty at nearby Shelbyville Central High School, where he guided the Golden Eaglettes to a record 10 TSSAA Class AAA state championships and two USA Today national championships (1989, 1991) as he compiled a sparkling 775-148 worksheet during his 28-year tenure. Insell was named USA Today National High School Coach of the Year in 1989 and 1991 and he also was been named Converse National High

- Appeared on *Dateline* on December 26, 2004. The program produced a one-hour segment on Insell, focusing on him and his Shelbyville Eaglettes. The program was shown internationally.

- Insell was named to the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors as High School Representative in 2001.

School Coach of the Year on two occasions (1990, 1992). Insell called the women's basketball position at Middle Tennessee his "dream job".

"Dreams do come true," Insell said after Director of Athletics Chris Massaro announced his hiring on May 18, 2005. "It's something you think about. I'm a coach and it's all I've ever done, from elementary to junior high to junior pro, AAU and high school. To be able to come on board at Middle Tennessee, a Division I school, that's a dream come true, not only for me, but for all of the high school coaches and junior high coaches across the country and it says if you stay in there long enough and dream big enough, one day it will eventually happen."

Insell said Middle Tennessee will be a pressing basketball team on defense and force the issue, and he added that the Blue Raiders would back down from no one on the recruiting trail.

"We are going after the best players in the state of Tennessee every year," Insell said. "If Tennessee or Vanderbilt is after them, then Middle Tennessee is going to be after them, too. We will recruit alongside of them. We are not going to be intimidated, nor will we back down because they are in the Southeastern Conference. We are Division I and they are Division I. We are going to use all of our contacts."

A name synonymous with high school girls basketball in Tennessee, Insell's teams hold the Tennessee state records for consecutive wins with 110, consecutive state titles with four (1989-1992), most state championships for a coach with 10 (1986, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1995, 2000, 2001, 2003 and 2004), and his 1990 Golden Eaglette squad was named the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame Team of the Year, the first high school team so honored.

Under Insell's guidance, Shelbyville Central High School won 23 district championships, 16 regional championships and appeared in the Class AAA state championship game a remarkable 15 times, winning 10. Insell developed six Tennessee Class AAA Miss Basketball Award recipients, 15 high school All-Americans and 57 of his players received either athletic or academic scholarships to continue their careers at the collegiate level.

While Insell built a basketball dynasty at Shelbyville during his time there, he also made sure his players got the job done in the classroom, as evidenced by his teams receiving the TSSAA Distinguished Award for Academic Success from 1989-2000, an award based on team GPA. The lowest cumulative GPA at Shelbyville from 1989-00 was 3.4 and the highest was 3.98.

Additionally, Insell's Shelbyville team received a special invitation to the Oval Office by President George Bush for academic and athletic achievement and his teams also have been honored in the United States Senate and House of Representatives, the Tennessee State House and Senate and by two Tennessee Governors.

Insell is married to Debbie and the couple have three sons, Tom, Kyle and Matt.

Women's college basketball has seen the gap narrow between the have's and have not's.

MTSU proved Friday night that it, too, has closed the gap in terms of competing with the top teams in the nation.

However, MTSU also found out why Maryland is the defending national champion as it overcame a five-point deficit with 5:14 remaining and stormed back to defeat the Blue Raiders 80-76 before a women's record crowd of 10,010 at Murphy Center.

"You can see why their national champions," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "They did the same thing in the finals last year against Duke. They've got great players, but we've got great players. They didn't luck into winning the national championship."

MTSU led the Terrapins 72-67 with 5:14 left in the game after freshman guard Chelsia Lymon scored on a three-point play. However, after a Maryland timeout, it reeled off a 13-4 run to close the game and hold on to its preseason No. 1 national ranking.

"I want to thank Middle Tennessee," said Maryland coach Brenda Frese. "They made us a better basketball team tonight. It was tremendous, it was one of the better college basketball games I've ever been a part of. Middle Tennessee is going to be very, very good. They obviously showed it and they've got to be excited about what's ahead."

The Blue Raiders trailed 76-74 with less than a mintue left, but Amber Holt's jumper was off the mark. On Maryland's next possession, All-American Crystal Langhorne scored on an offensive putback to with 25 seconds left to seal the victory.

Holt made a sterling debut, scoring 28 points and pulling down eight rebounds, and freshman point guard Chelsia Lymon — the Gatorade player of the year in Kentucky last year — scored 13 points in only nine minutes of play.

Maryland was led by Coleman with 19 points and 14 rebounds, while Langhorne had 16 points and 11 rebounds.

While the Blue Raiders pushed Maryland to the limit, it didn't look like it that way early. Coming out of the final media timeout in the first half with 2:55 remaining, MTSU trailed 36-23. Maryland had hit 15 of its first 21 shots for a sizzling 71-percent clip, while MTSU had made only 9 of its first 27 attempts.

However, after Maryland took its biggest lead of the half at 38-23, MTSU scored the final 10 points to close within 38-33 at intermission. Holt scored six in a row and Givens drove in the length of the floor in just six seconds and hit a layup to pull the Blue Raiders within

Maryland shot 61 percent from the fi eld and outrebounded MTSU 37-29. The Blue Raiders shot 42 percent and forced 23 Terrapin turnovers.

After playing No. 1 ranked Maryland to within four points Friday night and garnering 12 votes in the Top 25 poll Monday, MTSU did indeed get a dose of reality.

"They came in here and kicked our butts," said MTSU senior guard Chrissy Givens. "We took Maryland to four points and maybe we thought we were too good, but they kicked our butts. They did it here two years and "

MTSU struggled offensively throughout, but tied the score at 52-52 with 6:52 left when Givens scored and converted a 3-point play

However, MTSU was outscored 20-9 down the stretch as it was unable to run its half-court offense.

MTSU shot only 32 percent from the field, while the Jackrabbits shot 56 percent and outrebounded the Blue Raiders 37-29.

MTSU was led by junior Amber Holt's 19 points, while Givens had 17. However, the duo combined to go just 12-of-41 from the field.

South Dakota State hit 17-of-20 free throws after getting into the 1-and-1 with 10:39 left in the game. The Jackrabbits also hit 8-of-14 from behind the 3-point arc.

"There was no pressure for us to win this game," said SDSU coach Aaron Johnston. "We tried a basic offense. We kept it simple and told the kids about being strong and trying to drive.

"We talked about trying to pick up some fouls in the second half. If they are going to put that much pressure on us we've got to turn that pressure on them and get to the free throw line."

MTSU led 12-7 with 14:01 left in the first half but went more than four minutes without a point and found itself trailing 19-12.

The Blue Raiders scored eight unanswered points during one stretch to take a 24-22 lead, but SDSU closed the final four minutes of the half with a 5-2 run to take a 27-26 halftime lead.

MTSU shot just 32 percent in the first half (10-of-31), while the Jackrabbits hit 11-of-24 (46 percent).

SDSU had 13 first-halt turnovers, but MTSU could only turn them into six points.

Foul problems at the post also hurt MTSU as senior Krystle Horton picked up her second personal in less than three minutes, while sophomore Lakira Boyd was whistled for her second with 13:48 remaining before halftime.

Chrissy Givens and Amber Holt both scored 23 points and Starr Orr added 12 in only her 10th career start, leading Middle Tennessee to an 87-60 victory over Maine Saturday in the Subway Classic.

Givens recorded her sixth career double-double, grabbing 13 rebounds and adding six assists and three steals. Holt tallied 18 of her 23 points in the first half when the Blue Raiders opened the lead to as many as 26 points.

Orr did exactly what she was inserted in the lineup to do, score and rebound (seven), and the Danville, Ala., native also had five assists in 27 minutes of action.

The Blue Raiders started the game with a 12-3 run and never looked back in the first half, taking a 47-26 advantage at the break. Holt posted 18 points and Givens 13 in the opening half, but it was a staunch defense and improved rebounding that were the biggest differences, limiting Maine to just 38 percent shooting (6-for-16) and a 30-9 rebounding margin for Middle Tennessee.

The Blackbears (1-1) had just six field goals in the first period, including a stretch of more than 10 minutes without a bucket. Middle Tennessee worked through foul problems in the opening 20 minutes as well, with 17 fouls whistled on the Blue Raiders allowing Maine to short 22 free throws

Middle Tennessee led 20-12 after a Maine 3-point play from Abby Greene with 10:48 to play in the first half. The Blue Raiders then scored 23 of the next 28 points in the contest over a six-minute stretch, with Holt contributing nine points and Givens six during the rin

In the second half the Blue Raiders led by as many as 23 and the lead was never less than 16. Middle Tennessee knocked down seven 3-pointers in the second half and 12 for the game, as well as outrebounding the Blackbears Maine, 48-24, for the game.

"We shot the ball better in the first half and really hit the boards hard, one of things we've been working on in practice," head coach Rick Insell said. "We came out with more focus, especially early. We turned up the heat in practice and these young ladies responded upoll."

"Our depth was really a factor as well. We got in some foul trouble in the first half, but this year we're able to bring Chelsia [Lymon], Jackie [Pickel], LaCondra [Mason] and LaToya [Brown] off the bench at the quard spots and even Brandi [Brown] if we need her."

Holt added seven rebounds in the win and was 6-of-12 from the floor and 9-for-12 from the foul line.

Chrissy Givens scored 18 first-half points and helped Middle Tennessee build a 25-point lead early in the second half en route to a 79-61 victory over host Minnesota in the championship game of the Subway Classic Sunday at Williams Arena.

Givens, voted the tournament's most valuable player, was almost unstoppable in the first half, going 9-of-14 from the field, leading the Blue Raiders to a 14-point halftime lead.

Givens and teammate Starr Orr were both selected to the Subway Classic All-Tournament team.

Freshman Chelsia Lymon came off the bench in the opening minutes of the second half and provided an offensive spark, knocking down a pair of 3-pointers and a lay-up to help extend the lead to 57-34. Orr followed with eight consecutive points of her own, including another pair of trifectas, stretching the Middle Tennessee advantage to 65-38.

Minnesota made a run during the half when Middle Tennessee went without a bucket for more than six minutes, but the Golden Gophers never got closer than 14 after the break.

Givens led all scorers with 25 points while adding seven rebounds and seven assists in 40 minutes of action. Orr, in one of her best games as a Blue Raider, added 14 points, eight rebounds, six assists, and three steals.

Senior Krystle Horton scored the first three baskets of the game for the Blue Raiders and Johnna Abney knocked down a pair of 3-pointers, as Middle Tennessee quieted the crowd of 5,639 en route to an early 12-6 lead. Givens scored the next eight on a host of short jumpers and lay-ups for a 20-12 MT advantage with 7:51 to go in the half

All of this was in the midst of an 18-4 run over a seven-minute stretch that put the Blue Raiders ahead, 34-14. The Blue Raiders built the lead by out-hustling the Golden Gophers, with one series of plays seeing Amber Holt make a steal but miss a break-away lay-

Not to be discouraged, Holt came racing back down the floor, made another steal falling out of bounds, saved the ball to Orr, who executed a 2-on-1 with Givens for another lay-up. The Blue Raiders built a 32-14 advantage at that point and led 38-24 at the halftime break even after a cheap lay-up at the buzzer by Minnesota's Kelly Roysland.

Givens had 18 in the first half and the Blue Raiders forced 18 Minnesota turnovers in the first 20 minutes and also limited the Golden Gophers to just 35 percent shooting from the floor while shooting 58 percent themselves.

It was a pick your poison night for Chattanooga at Murphy Center Friday.

Whether the Lady Mocs employed a man-to-man defense or a zone, it didn't matter, as MTSU broke down both en route to a 98-69 victory before a crowd of 2.524.

MTSU (3-2) shot 52 percent and hit 12 3-pointers, equaling a season high, as it won its third straight game and snapped a two-game losing streak at Murphy Center.

The 98 points were the most scored by MTSU under secondyear coach Rick Insell, whose team lost 76-66 at Chattanooga last season

"We're playing a little better offensively," Insell said, 'but I wasn't as pleased with our defense tonight. We did a better job as the game went on, but not good enough if we're going to get to where we want to be."

The duo of senior guard Chrissy Givens and junior forward Amber Holt were devastating, as they combined for 55 points and 17 rebounds. Givens finished with 29 points and seven rebounds, while Holt had 26 points and 10 boards.

The offensive onslaught was a welcomed sight after the Blue Raiders had hit 30 percent their first two home games against Maryland and South Dakota State.

Coming out of the eight-minute timeout trailing 24-21, Chattanooga went to a zone defense, which played right into MTSU's hands.

Freshman guard Jackie Pickel hit back-to-back 3-pointers, which spearheaded a 14-4 run that gave MTSU a 38-25 lead with 4:33 left before halftime.

Chattanooga pulled to within seven in less than a minute, but the Blue Raiders closed the half with a 12-7 run to take a 50-38 halftime lead at intermission.

Pickel finished with a season-high 15 points, hitting 5-of-7 from 3-point range. Five different MTSU players hit at least one 3-pointer.

Both teams were plagued with foul problems in the first half, with Chattanooga being whistled for 13 and MTSU with 12.

Chattanooga's leading scorer, Alex Anderson (18 ppg), played only four minutes after picking up her second foul, while starters Brooke Hand and Kristen Spann each had three fouls.

MTSU sophomore guard Johnna Abney picked up three fouls in the first half, while Givens, Holt and Starr Orr each had two.

Givens scored MTSU's first eight points of the second half, and Abney followed with a 3-pointer to give the Blue Raiders a 61-44 advantage with 17:09 left.

MTSU outrebounded the Lady Mocs 40-28 and forced 21 turnovers
