Series History

Memphis leads the all-time series, 22-15, including wins in 10 straight and 14 of 16. The Tigers won last year's meeting 83-50 at the FedEx Forum. Saturday's contest is only the third meeting between the teams in the last 21 years. This will be the second of a three-year contract between the teams with Memphis playing Middle Tennessee at the Gaylord Entertainment Center

in Nashville during the 2007-08 season.

Noteworthy

- Middle Tennessee ranks first in the Sun Belt in scoring defense (64.2) and is third in field-goal percentage defense (.429).
- Of the nine players who have seen action this season, seven are either freshmen or sophomores.
- Kyle Young ranks first in the SBC in field goal percentage with a 61.7 mark (37-of-60).
- Sophomore point guard Kevin Kanaskie has led the Blue Raiders in assists in all 10 games and is averaging 5.6 for the season, which is second in the SBC. He had a career-high eight assists vs. Tennessee State.
- Middle Tennessee will be facing its third Top 25 team against Memphis, marking the first time in program history it has played as many in a regular season.

Closer look at Memphis

Memphis is 8-3 on the season and is coming off a 79-71 setback at Arizona. The Tigers have won six of their last eight with the only setbacks being at Arizona and at Tennessee. Memphis' only other loss was against Georgia Tech on a neutral court. Memphis is 6-0 at the FedEx Forum this season. The Tigers have four players averaging double figures and a fifth who contributes 9.5 points per game. Sophomore Chris Douglas-Roberts leads Memphis with 15.8 points per game and has scored 21 or more three times this season. The sophomore scored a season-high 28 points against Austin Peay and also had a 26-point performance against Georgia Tech.

Winning in-state battles

Middle Tennessee has enjoyed tremendous success against in-state opponents under Head Coach Kermit Davis, and it will look to continue the trend against Memphis. The Blue Raiders are 17-8 (.680) overall against teams from the Volunteer State since Davis was hired in 2002, including winning nine of the last 12.

Three ranked opponents in same season a first

Middle Tennessee will face its third Top 25 team of the season when it plays at Memphis Saturday, marking the first time in the program's 84-year history that it will have played three ranked teams in the same season. Memphis is currently ranked No. 18. Tennessee was ranked No. 24 when the Blue Raiders played them in the season opener. Alabama was ranked No. 10 nationally when Middle Tennessee faced the Crimson Tide in the Paradise Jam Tournament.

Blue Raiders have Bluff City connections

Saturday's game against Memphis will be a homecoming of sorts for three members of the Blue Raider program. Sophomore guard Nigel Johnson, freshman Desmond Yates, and assistant coach Thomas Johnson all have strong ties to the Memphis area. Johnson prepped at Wooddale High School in Memphis, where he played for Thomas Johnson - no relation. Nigel Johnson helped lead the team to three straight 20-win seasons and was named to the 2005 Best of the Preps/All-Metro Class AAA team by The Commercial Appeal. Coach Johnson led the Wooddale program for four seasons before joining the Blue Raider staff this year. Two years prior to his arrival the team was winless. Yates played at Fayette-Ware High School in Somerville, Tenn., where he was a four-time All-Region selection.

Youth movement in effect at Middle Tennessee

Of the nine players who have seen action for Middle Tennessee this season, seven are either freshmen or sophomores. Sophomores Calvin O'Neil, Kevin Kanaskie, Nigel Johnson and freshman Desmond Yates have have combined for 30 starts for the Blue Raiders. Sophomore Theryn Hudson has been a strong reserve in the paint. Freshman guard Darren Avery has seen action in all 10 games while Dino Hair, another freshmen, has seen action in seven games.

Kanaskie emerging as team MVP in early going

Kevin Kanaskie has been solid running the point for Middle Tennessee through the first 10 games of the season; however, his all-around play has made the sophomore the team's most valuable player and a serious all-league consieration at the outset of the 2006-07 campaign. Kanaskie leads the Blue Raiders with 12.7 points per game and his 14 steals are second most on the squad. Factor in his 5.6 assists per game and Kanaskie is responsible for 23.9 of Middle Tennessee's 62.3 points per game - which is 38.3 percent of the team's offense. His seven double-figure scoring games this season are the most by a Blue

Raider and he has scored 17 or more in three of the last four games. He keyed Middle Tennessee's win against Indiana State by scoring 15 of his 17 points in the second half while establishing career highs for points (17), field goals made (6), and 3-point field goals made (3), and he tallied a career-high eight assists in the win against Tennessee State. Kanaskie established a new career high for points with 20 against Louisiana-Monroe, and followed that with 17 against Austin Peay and established a new career high for 3-point field goals made with four.

Kanaskie holding strong at point

Middle Tennessee sophomore point guard Kevin Kanaskie's play down the stretch last season was a key in the team's strong finish. The State College, Pa., native has picked up where he left off in terms of running the team. Kanaskie has led the team in assists in all 10 games played and is averaging 5.6 helpers per game, which ranks second in the Sun Belt. He is fourth in the SBC in assist/turnover ratio (1.70). Kanaskie dished out a career-high eight assists against Tennessee State.

Vogelsberg out 6-8 weeks

SBC Championships

Middle Tennessee received bad news prior to the start of the season when it was determined Adam Vogelsberg had suffered a broken bone in his right foot during a practice (Nov. 4) and will miss six-to-eight weeks. Vogelsberg is a preseason All-Sun Belt Conference selection and the Blue Raiders' top returning scorer from last season when he averaged 12.4 points per game. The senior guard from Home, Kansas also was All-Sun Belt in 2005-06. He was recently released from wearing a protective boot he had sported since surgery; however, there remains no definite time frame as to when Vogelsberg will return. He will dress for the Memphis game but is not expected to see action.

Kermit Davis File



In his fifth season at Middle Tennessee, Kermit Davis has established himself as one of the most successful men's basketball coaches in program history, and he's done so while rebuilding a program that had fallen on hard times. Prior to Davis'

hiring in April, 2002, Middle Tennessee had endured losing seasons in three of the four previous years - and was one season removed from a 5-22 campaign, the worst in school history. The Blue Raiders have registered four straight winning seasons under Davis, making him only one of two of the 19 Middle Tennessee men's basketball coaches to start his Blue Raider career with four straight winning campaigns. The other was Bruce Stewart. The Blue Raiders' game against Indiana State (11/30/06) was Davis' 125th at Middle Tennessee. Davis' record after 125 games at Middle Tennessee is 71-54, making him the second-winningest coach in program history after 125 games. Davis is fifth on the all-time Middle Tennessee wins list with 72.

Davis among leaders

Kermit Davis joined Bruce Stewart as the only head coaches in program history to begin their Blue Raider careers with four straight winning seasons in 2005-06. Davis moved into sixth on the all-time wins list at Middle Tennessee with 62 after the Blue Raiders beat Louisiana-Lafayette (01/28/06). He moved past Ed Diddle, Jr., (56) for seventh on the list with Middle Tennessee's 87-75 win at Belmont (12/10/05). Davis moved into fifth on the career wins list against Tennessee State (12/04/06) with 72 career victories. He is four wins shy of tying Charles Greer for fourth on the all-time Blue Raider list. Jimmy Earle is the program's all-time winningest coach with 164 wins. Davis also is third in winning percentage (.563) among Blue Raider men's basketball coaches with a minimum of 50 games coached, trailing only Jimmy Earle (.614), and Bruce Stewart (.648).

Davis produces second-best wins mark after 125 games

Kermit Davis earned a win in his 125th game leading the Blue Raider program to give him a 71-54 mark. That record is the second-most wins for a Blue Raider coach in his first 125 games. Bruce Stewart won 83 of the first 125 games he coached at Middle Tennessee to top the list, while Jimmy Earle's 69 wins after 125 games is third most.

Letting wins slip away

An inability to protect the lead in the second half of three games have cost the Blue Raiders an opportunity to be 7-3 to start the season with a 1-0 mark in Sun Belt play. In three of its six losses this season, Middle Tennessee has owned the lead late in the second half. Middle Tennessee squandered a 10-point lead with five minutes remaining against Toledo and lost in overtime when a free throw would have sealed the win at the end of regulation. The Blue Raiders were also beaten on a last-second shot by Louisiana-Monroe, and they owned a 12-point lead with seven minutes remaining against Austin Peay before losing in overtime after missing an open layup that would have won the game at the end of regulation. Turnovers have been the turning point in each setback. The team averaged 9.3 turnovers in the second half in the three losses.

Five straight winning seasons would be rare

Middle Tennessee is looking to accomplish a rather feat as it seeks a fifth consecutive winning season under Head Coach Kermit Davis in 2006-07. The Blue Raiders' current streak of four consecutive winning seasons is tied for fourth longest in the program's 84 years of men's basketball. The longest stretch of consecutive winning seasons is six, which was turned in by Jimmy Earle's teams from 1973-79. The current Blue Raiders are attempting to match Bruce Stewart's teams from 1984-89 for the second longest streak of consecutive winning seasons with five. The only other stretch of at least four consecutive seasons with winning records was 1922-26, and the Blue Raiders only played four games during the 1924-25 season. The 2006-07 Blue Raiders are attempting to accomplish five straight winning seasons for the first time since 1984-89 — a span of 22 years. Davis, in his fifth season, is one of only two coaches in program history to begin his career with four straight winning seasons. The other was Bruce Stewart.

Defense, rebounding key during recent run

Middle Tennessee fifth-year coach Kermit Davis has built the program on the strong principles of defense and rebounding and that formula has keyed the team winning three of its last five. The Blue Raiders are out-rebounding the opposition by 7.4 during this stretch as opposed to plus-2.4 margin overall this season. Opponents also are finding quality shots difficult to come by against the Blue Raider defense, which is limiting opponents to 42 percent shooting from the field and 31 percent from 3-point range during the past five games. The combination of strong rebounding and rugged defense has enabled the Blue Raiders to limit opponents to an average of 60.4 points per game during the four-game span, 4.8 points per game fewer than the season average. Overall, the Blue Raiders are first in the Sun Belt in scoring defense (64.2 ppg), and third in field goal percentage defense (42.9 percent).

Blue Raiders get defensive

Middle Tennessee has held seven of its 10 opponents to 65 points or fewer this season and the Blue Raiders are 4-2 in those contests. The only setbacks came at Austin Peay (64-63 in OT), against College of Charleston (64-56).

Practice pays off for Young

Extra work on free throws before and after practice has paid dividends for senior forward Kyle Young, who is a career 43 percent shooter from the charity stripe. Young established career highs for makes and attempts from the line with a 7-of-8 performance against Austin Peay and he has connected on 9-of-10 over the last two games. He made seven straight during one stretch before suffering his only miss against Austin Peay. For the season, Young is shooting 57 percent from the line (17-of-30), which is his best percentage for a single-season as a Blue Raider.

Yates growing up quickly

Middle Tennessee freshman Desmond Yates is making a nice transition into Division I basket-ball after sitting out the 2005-06 season. Yates is averaging 9.8 points per game and shooting 51 percent from the field; however, his progression early in the season is consistent with the Blue Raiders' winning three of their last five. Yates is averaging a team-best 17 points, 4.3 rebounds, shooting 53 percent (26-49) from the field, 50 percent (6-12) from 3-point range, and 71 percent (10-14) at the free-throw line during this stretch. The Somerville, Tenn., native poured in 23 points against Belmont.

Outshooting foes has been key once again

Outshooting the opposition does not guarantee victory for Middle Tennessee but it is a trend that comes as close to perfection as any under fifth-year coach Kermit Davis. The Blue Raiders are 4-1 this season and 59-4 overall under Davis when the shooting percentage is higher. Middle Tennessee had won 29 straight when outshooting the opposition before suffering a 75-69 overtime setback to Toledo earlier this season despite shooting 58 percent from the field. Overall, Middle Tennessee has won 32 of the last 34 games played when it has a higher shooting percentage than the opposition.

Blue Raiders starting to find their mark

Middle Tennessee players have started to heat up from the field after a slow start to the season. The Blue Raiders are shooting 47 percent from the field, including 39 percent from 3-point range during their last five games, including efforts of 50 percent or higher in three of the previous four games. The Blue Raiders shot 55 percent from the field in the opening half against Tennessee State That followed a 68-percent outburst against Indiana State in the second half of the preceeding game.



Coming out strong in the second half

Strong second-half play has sparked Middle Tennessee to victories in three of its last five games. The Blue Raiders trailed at the half against Belmont and Indiana State; however, they outscored the opposition by a combined nine points in each game and dominated on the defensive end to register consecutive wins. The Blue Raiders owned a one-point halftime lead against Tennessee State but outscored the Tigers by 10 in the final 20 minutes to pull away. The Blue Raiders are averaging 38.5 points in the second half in their last four games, while shooting 54 percent (52-96) from the field. They are also shooting 43 percent (12-28) from 3-point range in the second half of the previous four games.

Blue registers first double double of season

Senior forward Tim Blue became the first Blue Raider to record a double double this season with 14 points and a game-high 11 rebounds in Middle Tennessee's 65-58 win against Indiana State. It marked the first double double for a Blue Raider since Blue accomplished the feat with 20 points and 11 rebounds against South Dakota State (02/13/06). The 11 rebounds tie a career high.

Blue returning to form following surgery

Tim Blue showed signs of promise for the future with his strong play at the end of the 2005-06 season – his first as a Blue Raider; however, the senior forward suffered an off-season knee injury and required surgery. The lingering effects of the surgery slowed Blue at the outset of the 2006-07 season but the Palm Beach, Fla., native seems to be finding his rhythm and returning to form. In his last five games, Blue is averaging 12.2 points and 6.6 rebounds, while shooting 48 percent from the field. The greatest indicator of Blue getting closer to 100 percent is his minutes played. He is averaging 28.4 minutes in the last five contests.

Playing from the inside out

Middle Tennessee has featured a balanced offensive attack under Head Coach Kermit Davis but with senior guard Adam Vogelsberg out with an injury and a young corps of perimeter players still becoming acclimated to Division I basketball the Blue Raiders have enjoyed their greatest success going inside at the start of the 2006-07 season. They are averaging 22.3 points per game inside the paint, which is 36 percent of the team's 495 points scored. The Blue Raiders have scored 22 points or more inside the paint in five of six games. They scored 42 of their 69 points in the paint against Toledo.. Coincidentally, the Blue Raiders are shooting less 3-pointers thus far in 2006 as they are averaging 12.5 attempts per game as a team. By comparison, the Blue Raiders averaged right at 20 treys per game in 2005-06. They have not hit more than five treys as a team in a game to this point. Vogelsberg's worth to the team is evidenced by the fact he hit five or more 3-pointers in a game seven times last season and had four or more in a game 13 times.

Shooting touch nothing new for Young

Kyle Young, who tied the Paradise Jam record for shooting percentage in three games (72.7 percent), leads the Sun Belt in field goal percentage through 10 games with a 61.7 percentage (37-of-60). Young entered the 2006-07 season fifth on the career field goal percentage list at Middle Tennessee with a mark of 56.8 and has seen that rise to 57.6 percent (254-of-441), which is currently third on the career list at Middle Tennessee. Young shot 65.2 percent from the field in 2005-06, which was third on the single-season list at Middle Tennessee. The only player in school history ever to shoot higher than Young in a single season is Warren Kidd. The career mark for field goal percentage is held by Kidd, who shot 66.4 percent.

Young ties record in 'Paradise'

Middle Tennessee senior forward Kyle Young proved to be one of the most accurate shooters ever to play in the Paradise Jam Tournament during the team's stay at St. Thomas, Virgin Islands. Young was 16-of-22 from the field for a 72.7 field-goal percentage, which equaled the Paradise Jam Tournament record for best field-goal percentage by an individual in a minimum of three games. Young tied the mark set by Eastern Kentucky's Alonzo Hird (16-of-22) during the 2005 event. Young was 4-of-5 from the field against then No. 10 Alabama, 5-of-7 against Toledo, and 7-of-10 against College of Charleston.

Young closing in on Top 10 in starts, games played

Kyle Young has been a fixture in the Middle Tennessee lineup throughout his Blue Raider career and his consistency and durability have him on the verge of the program's career Top 10 list for games played and games started. Young has played in 97 career games, which is 10 shy of LeRoy Coleman (1976-80), who is 10th on the list with 107. Young has started 73 games and is three starts shy of tying former standout Ty Baynham (1985-88) for 10th on the career list in that category.

Young blocking opponents' path

With one block against Belmont, Kyle Young has three on the season and 47 for his career, which ties Buck Hailey for seventh on the career list. Mantia Callender is sixth with 49. Young is three blocked shots shy of becoming just the sixth player in the Blue Raiders' 84-year history to register 50 or more blocks in a career.

Starters carrying load for Blue Raiders

Players either out due to injury or nursing nagging injuries, coupled with a young bench, has made depth an issue for the Blue Raiders in the early going. As a result, the Blue Raider starters have carried the load. Middle Tennessee's starters have been responsible for 78 percent of the team's scoring, 65 percent of the rebounding, and 72 percent of the minutes played through the first nine games. Blue Raider starters are averaging 47.5 points per game while the bench has supplied 14.4. Starters are averaging 20.8 rebounds a game while the reserves have combined to average 11.8 caroms.

Yates provides offensive spark in comeback win

Blue Raider freshman Desmond Yates provided an offensive spark when he scored a career-high 23 points in Middle Tennessee's 64-57 comeback win against Belmont (11/27/06). The small forward proved to be an impact player when the team needed him most, scoring 18 of his 23 points in the final 27 minutes to help the Blue Raiders overcome a 27-11 deficit with 7:03 remaining. The 23 points were the most by a Blue Raiders since Adam Vogelsberg scored 25 against South Dakota State (02/13/06). Not only were the 23 points a career-high for Yates, but he also set personal bests for field goals made (9), field goals attempted (16), rebounds (6), and minutes (35).

Johnson ties Paradise Jam steals record

Middle Tennessee sophomore guard Nigel Johnson tied a Paradise Jam single-game record when he recorded five steals against Toledo (11/18/06). The five steals equals the mark shared by Jonathan Modica (Arkansas), Jason McLeish (Eastern Kentucky), and Michael Ross (Eastern Michigan). Johnson's five steals are the most in a game by a Blue Raider since Bryan Smithson swiped five against Austin Peay (12/23/03).

Holy Toledo!!! Blue Raiders light it up vs. Rockets

Middle Tennessee had one of the best shooting performances for a half in school history in its game against Toledo in the second game of the Paradise Jam Tournament. The Blue Raiders blistered the nets for a 72.7 percent shooting clip (16-22) in the first half. The mark is the third-best in school history for a half and it marked the best first-half shooting performance in school history. Middle Tennessee finished the game shooting 58.3 percent (28-48).

Did you know?

Middle Tennessee has hit at least one 3-pointer in 315 consecutive games. The last time the Blue Raiders failed to hit a shot from beyond the arc was Jan. 20, 1996 at Morehead State.

80 Key Number

Middle Tennessee has been almost unbeatable when scoring 80 or more points under Head Coach Kermit Davis. Overall, the Blue Raiders are 17-1 when scoring 80 or more under Davis. The lone setback was an 85-83 overtime loss at Western Kentucky, Feb. 24, 2005.


