BROWN STAYS HOT FROM DOWNTOWN: Freshman Brandi Brown continued her hot shooting from 3-point range with five more trifectas against Troy on Saturday and a team-leading 19 points in the game. Brown has made a dozen 3-pointers in the last two games after netting seven versus North Dakota State on January 2. The Jamestown, Tenn., native is shooting 45 percent from behind the arc this season and has four games with at least four made 3-pointers, including four at No. 4 Tennessee and five at South Alabama. She has scored in double figures six times in 2006-07, including three of the four Sun Belt outings, and is averaging 12.3 points per game versus SBC foes, making 13-of-26 3-point field goals in those contests. For the season Brown is third on the squad with 8.2 per points in all games.

OTHERS ALSO HITTING TRIFECTAS: Brandi Brown is not the only Blue Raider knocking down 3-pointers and certainly not the only freshman. Sophomore Johnna Abney is hitting 48 percent (31-for-64) of her 3-point attempts and has taken just one shot this season from inside the 3-point line. Abney has hit 13 trifectas over the last five games after making a trio of 3-pointers against Troy on Saturday. Freshman Jackie Pickel has also become a major offensive weapon with her long-range shooting, and long-range is definitely the correct terminology. Pickel is not afraid to shoot from 4-5 or even 6 feet behind the 3-point line and has become especially deadly over the last five outings, hitting 16 3-pointers, including six versus North Dakota State on January 2. For the season the Cleveland, Tenn., native is hitting 40 percent (25-for-62) from behind the arc, the exact same percentage as the Blue Raiders make as a team.

ANOTHER 3-POINT NOTE: Middle Tennessee ranks first in the Sun Belt and sixth in the nation (Dec. 31) in 3-point FG made this season, attempting 352 in 15 contests, or 23.5 per game, with the Blue Raiders making 142 of those attempts, or 9.47 per outing. Florida International is second in the SBC in, hitting 74 3-pointers in 14 games, or 5.29 per contest. Four Middle Tennessee regulars hit better than 40 percent of their 3-point attempts, including sophomore Johnna Abney (.484, 31-for-64), freshman Brandi Brown (.446, 33-for-74), freshman Chelsia Lymon (.429, 18-for-42) and freshman Jackie Pickel (.403, 25-for-62). The four have accounted for 68 percent of the team's attempts (242) and 75 percent of the squad's makes (107).

THE DOUBLE-DOUBLE TWINS: Senior Chrissy Givens and junior Amber Holt have led Middle Tennessee in scoring and/or rebounding in every contest this season, and the duo has combined for five double-doubles in 2006-07. Givens posted her ninth career double-double and third this season with 13 points and 11 rebounds Saturday against Troy. She

posted 23 points and 13 rebounds in the November 18 victory over Maine and then had 22 points and 11 boards in a victory triumph at Tennessee Tech on November 29. Holt was the first to accomplish the feat this season with 19 points and 10 rebounds against South Dakota State on November 13, just her second game as a Blue Raider. The Duluth, Ga., native then had 26 points and 10 boards versus Chattanooga on November 24. In the last two seasons the Blue Raiders have posted seven double-doubles as a team in each campaign and had 14 in 2003-04.

BLUE RAIDERS MAKE AP TOP 25 DEBUT: Middle Tennessee broke into the Associated Press Top 25 on Monday at No. 21, its first-ever ranking in the national AP poll. The Blue Raiders have been in the Others Receiving Votes for seven of the nine previous polls this season and in the Top 30 in the voting over the last month since defeating then eighth-ranked Georgia on December 7. Middle Tennessee was ranked 25th nationally in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll last week (January 2), just the fourth time in school history the Blue Raiders were ranked in the Top 25, all at No. 25: March 12, 1985, December 20, 1988 and December 27, 1988. SENIOR HORTON FINDS NICHE: Senior Krystle Horton has found her niche in the Blue Raider offense over the last six games and a rebounding edge in the last eight outings, becoming a major factor on both ends of the floor during the team's current nine-game winning streak. Horton netted 14 points in the victory over Western Kentucky on December 27 and has scored in double figures in three of the last six contests, averaging 11.8 points in those six outings. She tallied 23 points versus Old Dominion on December 19, her best offensive output since netting 24 against Arkansas State during last year's Sun Belt Championships and just her fourth 20-plus point effort over the last two seasons. In the rebounding department, the Murfreesboro, Tenn., native is averaging 6.4 boards per contest over the last eight games, including grabbing 10 rebounds against Austin Peay on December 4 and nine at Georgia on December 7. For the season Horton ranks

fourth on the club in points (7.9) and fourth in rebounds (5.2). Horton ranks 13th all-time at Middle Tennessee in scoring with 1,330 points heading into Tuesday's contest at Florida International. A full listing of career records appears on page 15 of these notes.

WIN STREAK ON SHORT LIST OF SUPERLATIVES: Middle Tennessee's current nine-game winning streak puts the team on a short list of squads with a streak of nine games of longer in the 31-year history of the program. Only 11 other times in the history of the program have Blue Raider squads won nine games or more in a row. The 2004-05 unit put together a pair of seven-game winning streaks during its 24-9 campaign and the longest winning streak in the last decade is 10 games by the 1999-00 squad. DIFFERENT OFFENSIVE OPTIONS EVERY GAME: Middle Tennessee has been led offensively all season by senior Chrissy Givens and junior Amber Holt, who combine for 38.2 points per game. Add in the improved play of senior Krystle Horton, who is averaging 11.8 points per contest over the last six games, and the Blue Raider offense is well on its way. But head coach Rick Insell has also found another scoring option in almost every game

this season besides Givens and Holt, giving the unit balance and also making it very difficult for opposing coaches. In all but three contests this season, at least three players posted double figure scoring outputs, including seven games with four players in double digits and one outing with five players scoring more than 10 points. The latest addition atop the scoring column has been freshman Brandi Brown, who led the Blue Raiders with 25 points against North Dakota State on January 2 and 19 versus Troy on Saturday. Brown also netted 12 points at fourth-ranked Tennessee and 17 at South Alabama. Freshman Jackie Pickel has also become a major asset, scoring nine or more points in four of the last five contests, including 18 against North Dakota State and 13 versus Troy. This season Middle Tennessee has 22 double-figure scoring games from players other than Givens and Holt. A full listing appears on page 11 of these notes.

OPPONENT TURNOVERS TURN INTO POINTS: Middle Tennessee has forced opponents into more than 20 turnovers in all but one game this season and continued the trend Saturday against Troy, with the Blue Raiders forcing a season-high 35 turnovers by the Trojans. Middle Tennessee converted those miscues into 46 points. For the season Middle Tennessee has forced opponents into 382 turnovers, or 25.5 per game, and has converted those miscues into 436 points, or 29.1 per contest. Middle Tennessee is averaging just 13.9 turnovers per game this season as a team, including a season-low nine at No. 8 Georgia, 12 at South Alabama and 11 versus Louisiana-Monroe.

ROAD WARRIORS: Middle Tennessee played six of its first 10 games this season away from home, including 6-of-8 at one stretch. Middle Tennessee improved to 5-1 away from home this season with its victory over South Alabama on December 14, with the only blemish at No. 4 Tennessee on November 26. The Blue Raiders won

just five games away from Murphy Center all of 2005-06. Middle Tennessee has not played away from home since the South Alabama, just ending a five-game homestand.

BLUE RAIDERS FIND LITTLE SUCCESS IN MIAMI: Middle Tennessee is 6-6 in the overall series with Florida International, with all 12 meetings taking place since the Blue Raiders joined the Sun Belt, but the squad has enjoyed little success at Pharmed Arena in Miami, posting a 1-5 mark. The Blue Raiders lost in 2001-03, picked up their only victory on March 1, 2004, and have dropped the last two to the Golden Panthers on the road.

Lasma Jakobson is second on the club at 13.5 points and first in rebounds with 11.1 per game. FIU has alternated wins and losses in the last four games.

(December 31) in the nation in scoring (20.5 points per game). Givens also grabs 6.4 rebounds per outing and hands out 5.0 assists per contest this season. She continues her ascent in the career steals category at Middle Tennessee as well, ranking fourth all-time with 224 and averaging 2.4 per game this year. Givens has scored 20-plus points seven times this season and 17 or more points in 12 of the 15 games this season. She has recorded seven assists in a game five times this season, including versus top-ranked Maryland, at Minnesota, at South Alabama, versus Louisiana-Monroe and against North Dakota State. One more thing – she also averages more than 35.9 minutes per game and has played all 40 in eight contests and 36 or more minutes in 11 of the 15 games. Givens was named the Preseason Sun Belt Player of the Year by coaches and the media during the SBC Media Days in October and was a Preseason Honorable Mention All-America selection by Street & Smith's magazine in October.

DECEMBER A MONTH TO REMEMBER: Middle Tennessee posted a 6-0 month of December, extending its overall winning streak to seven games as well as posting a monumental victory for the program. The Blue Raiders had previously enjoyed only one other undefeated month of December, going 4-0 under head coach Pat Jones in the program's second year of varsity play in 1976-77. Middle Tennessee's win at eighth-ranked Georgia was the first-ever triumph over a Top 10-ranked opponent and the program's first road win over a ranked foe. It was the first victory against Georgia in 12 tries in the history of the program and only the third regular season triumph over a ranked foe in the program's 31 years of varsity basketball (November 24, 1995, No. 20/23 Ole Miss, 88-86; December 3, 1988, NR/24 Clemson, 69-64). Middle Tennessee's only other victories against ranked competition both came in the NCAA Tournament, versus No. 12/11 North Carolina (March 21, 2004, 67-62 in South Bend, Ind.) and against No. 21/22 North Carolina State (March 19, 2005, 60-58 in Dallas, Texas).

HOLT COMES UP BIG AGAINST ODU: Junior Amber Holt posted another eye-opening performance against a quality opponent in an 86-71 victory over Old Dominion on December 19, tallying a game-high 27 points with eight rebounds in 40 minutes of action. Holt was 8-for-17 from the field, including 5-of-8 in the second half, and made 10-of-12 free throws in the contest. The Duluth, Ga., native has played her best in some of Middle Tennessee's biggest games this season, scoring 28 points in her first-ever game as a Blue Raider against top-ranked Maryland in the season opener and netting 21 points in the victory at No. 8 Georgia, including 15 in the second half. Holt ranks second on the club with 17.7 points per game and leads the club in rebounds (6.6) and steals (4.1). She also ranks first on the Blue Raiders in drawing charges this season, including four in the win over Old Dominion.

SEASON TIDBITS: Middle Tennessee made a team season-high 38 field goals at South Alabama on December 14, the most in a contest this season by any Sun Belt Conference team. The Blue Raiders are also tops in the Sun Belt this season in points in a game (103 vs. Louisiana-Monroe), 3-pt. FG made (17 vs. North Dakota State), 3-pt. FG attempts (34 vs. Maine) and assists (26 vs. Louisiana-Monroe) ... The Blue Raiders are 12-0 this season and 30-3 under head coach Rick Insell when leading at the half ... Despite a schedule that has seen the Blue Raiders play three Top 10-ranked teams to begin the season, their 12-3 record is the best start to a campaign since the 1994-95 team began the year 17-1 ... The 61 first half points by the Blue Raiders against Louisiana-Monroe on

December 17 was not a school record. That distinction belongs to the 1994-95 team that poured in 68 during the first half against Fairleigh Dickinson.

GIVENS CLIMBS CAREER RECORDS: Senior Chrissy Givens has continued her assault on the career record books at Middle Tennessee this season, ranking in the Top 10 in five statistical categories. Givens ranks ninth all-time in points with 1,454 points, passing Sherry Tucker (1,452, 1992-95) after her 13-point effort against Troy. Givens needs just 11 points to pass Stephanie Capley (1,464, 1988-91) and Sharon McClanahan (1,464, 1976-79) for seventh place on the all-time list. Givens has five games this season with at least seven assists and ranks eighth on the career list with 357 helpers, passing Janet Ross (355, 1984-87) after recording three assists Satur-

day against Troy. Givens needs 14 assists to pass Julie Morrison (370, 1990-93) for seventh on the career list. The Monroe, La., native is ranked fourth on the all-time steals list (224) and needs 23 more steals to surpass former teammate Keisha McClinic (246, 2001-04). Her 224 steals ranks 16th all-time in Sun Belt history and just two behind Erica Bobo of North Texas (226, 2002-06). Givens also ranks in the Top 10 in both field goals made (9th, 562) and field goal attempts (10th, 1,190). A full listing of career records appears on page 15 of these notes.

HORTON ALL ALONE IN 10TH: Senior Krystle Horton made her 93rd career start Saturday against Troy, passing Sherry Smith for 10th place on the all-time list at Middle Tennessee. Horton, who has 12 starts this season, could move into the Top 5 at Middle Tennessee if the Blue Raiders make a strong push in postseason play. Horton also ranks 13th on the all-time scoring list with 1,330 points and is just 11 rebounds from moving past Robin Hendrix (620, 1981-82) and into 15th place on the all-time list. The Murfreesboro, Tenn., native is also 10th in FG made (551), 11th in FG attempts (1,038) and fourth in FG percentage (.534). Her 68 double figure scoring games is tied for 10th with former teammate Tia Stovall.

GIVENS EARNS SECOND PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR THIS SEASON: Middle Tennessee's Chrissy Givens was voted the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Week on December 12 after helping the Blue Raiders defeat then eighth-ranked Georgia. Givens netted 25 points on 10-of-18 shooting, grabbed five rebounds and handed out three assists in 40 minutes of action in a 70-62 victory over Georgia on December 7 in Athens. The victory was the first over a Top 10-ranked opponent in program history and the first road win over a ranked foe in school history. Givens scored 13 points in the first half and 12 more in the second, as the Blue Raiders were behind for just over a minute in the second half en route to the victory. Givens has poured in 14 points versus No. 1 Maryland, 26 at No. 4 Tennessee and 25 against Georgia in Middle Tennessee's three contests this season against ranked opponents, all in the Top 10. It is the third SBC Player of the Week honor this season for Middle Tennessee, with junior Amber Holt garnering the honor on November 14 and Givens earning the accolade on November 21.

HITTING THE CENTURY MARK: Middle Tennessee recorded its 25th 100-point game in school history and its first since 1996 in the 103-59 win over Louisiana-Monroe on December 17. The last time the Blue Raiders topped the 100-point mark was on February 19, 1996, in a 108-75 win over Morehead State. Middle Tennessee is now a perfect 25-0 when scoring 100 or more points in a game. The Blue Raiders are 16-0 when scoring 100 against a conference opponent.

WIN AT GEORGIA RANKS AS ALL-TIME BEST: Middle Tennessee's victory at Georgia on December 7 was perhaps the biggest in school history as far as the numbers go. It was the Blue Raiders first-ever triumph over a Top 10-ranked opponent and the program's first road win over a ranked foe. It was the first victory against Georgia in 12 tries in the history of the program and only the second regular season triumph over a ranked foe in the program's 31 years of varsity basketball (November 24 1995, No. 20 Ole Miss, 88-86). Middle Tennessee's only other victories against ranked competition both came in the NCAA Tournament, versus 12th-ranked North Carolina (March 21, 2004, 67-62 in South Bend, Ind.) and against 21st-ranked N.C. State (March 19, 2005, 60-58 in Dallas, Texas).

HOLT RETURNS HOME VICTORIOUS: Junior Amber

Holt returned to her home state and played one of her best games of the season at Georgia on December 7, netting 21 points, including 15 in the second half, along with four rebounds, three assists and four steals. She also helped limit Georgia All-American Tasha Humphrey to only seven points and six shots in the contest. It was Holt's fourth 20-plus point game of the season and second against a ranked opponent after netting 28 versus top-ranked Maryland in the season opener.

GIVENS VOTED PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Middle Tennessee senior Chrissy Givens was voted the Sun Belt Women's Basketball Player of the Week on November 21 after helping the Blue Raiders to back-to-back victories and claiming the MVP award at the Subway Classic in Minneapolis, Minn. Givens was named the Most Valuable Player after the Blue Raiders posted wins over Maine and host Minnesota to win the four-team tournament. Givens posted 23 points against Maine and 25 versus Minnesota. The Monroe, La., native also tallied 20 rebounds, 13 assists and six steals in the two contests. She was 9-of-14 from the field in the first half against Minnesota for 18 points, as Middle Tennessee built a 14-point half-time edge. The loss for Minnesota ended an 11-game nonconference winning streak at Williams Arena and was just the second nonconference home loss for UM under fifth-year head coach Pam Borton. The other loss came in December 2004 to top-ranked LSU. Givens won the SBC POW award three times last season and joined teammate Amber Holt as the SBC Player of the Week after Holt garnered the accolade on November 14.

GIVENS, ORR MAKE ALL-TOURNAMENT: Senior Chrissy Givens and junior Starr Orr were both named to the All-Tournament team at the Subway Classic in Minneapolis, Minn., and Givens was awarded the Most Valuable Player trophy as well in the four-team tournament November 18-19. Givens posted games with 23 and 25 points in wins over Maine and host Minnesota, respectively, and tallied 20 rebounds, 13 assists and six steals in the two contests. Orr was all over the floor in both outings, netting 12 points versus Maine and a career-high 14 against Minnesota as well as grabbing 15 rebounds with 11 assists and four steals in the two games. It marks the first time Middle Tennessee has won two games in a tournament besides the conference championships since December 21-22, 2000, at the UCF Classic in Orlando, Fla., and just the 15th time in 52 in-season tournaments in the history of the program that the Blue Raiders won a pair games.

NEWCOMER HOLT VOTED PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Middle Tennessee junior Amber Holt was voted the Sun Belt Player of the Week on Tuesday, November 14, after leading the Blue Raiders in a pair of contests. Holt averaged 23.5 points and 9.0 rebounds in Middle Tennessee's two games, versus No. 1 Maryland and South Dakota State. She also added three assists, two blocks and five steals in the two outings. Against the defending national champion Terrapins, Holt tallied 28 points on 11-of-24 shooting with eight rebounds. Her 15 first-half points kept the Blue Raiders in the contest when the Terrapins threatened to run away with the game. Against SDSU, Holt scored 19 points and added 10 boards for her first career double-double. She was 14-of-16 at the foul line as well in the two games. The Duluth, Ga., native became the 15th Middle Tennessee player to earn POW honors since joining the Sun Belt and the sixth different Blue Raider to garner the accolade.

BLUE RAIDERS SET ATTENDANCE RECORD: Middle Tennessee set a new single-game record with a crowd of 10,010 for the season-opening contest versus No. 1-

ranked Maryland at Murphy Center on Friday, November 10. The attendance shattered the old mark of 4,813 set March 7, 2006, versus Western Kentucky in the championship game of the Sun Belt Tournament. Middle Tennessee averaged 2,699 for 16 home dates during the 2005-06 season and led the nation in attendance increase last year with a more than 300 percent increase. The attendance mark of 10,010 is the 15th most to ever see a basketball game in the 11,500-seat Murphy Center and the third most to ever attend a women's basketball contest in Sun Belt Conference history (Western Kentucky holds the record with 12,951 on February 23, 1986, vs. Old Dominion; Arkansas State vs. Arkansas, March 24, 2005, 10,892).

WOMEN SIGN THREE TO LETTERS-OF-INTENT:

Middle Tennessee women's basketball coach Rick Insell announced the signing of T'Qwana Pendergrast, Emily Queen and Anne Marie Lanning to national letters-of-intent on Thursday, November 9, during the fall signing period. Pendergrast (Nashville) and Lanning (Murfreesboro) both hail from the Midstate, while Queen resides in Ashland, Ky.

Pendergrast attended Maplewood High School in Nashville and will be a sophomore at Motlow State Community College in Tullahoma, Tenn., this season, where she is a First Team NJCAA Preseason All-America honoree. She averaged 20.1 points, 11.0 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 1.7 steals as a freshman at Motlow in helping the Lady Bucks to a 25-4 overall mark last season. Motlow finished 2005-06 ranked 18th nationally.

Queen has earned Second Team All-State honors as a sophomore and junior at Rose Hill Christian, helping her team to a state runner-up finish in 2006. She garnered Sweet Sixteen All-Tournament and All "A" State Tournament honors last season as well and was voted All-District, All-Region and All-Area each of the last two seasons. The 6-foot-2 all-everything has scored 2,311 points and grabbed 1,194 rebounds in her three seasons, including single-game school records of 46 points, 7-of-11 3-pointers and 26 rebounds. She even posted one game with a quadruple double of 26 points, 11 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals. One more accolade for Queen - her team was the first girls small school in history to make the finals of the Kentucky State Tournament, where they lost to Lexington Catholic.

Lanning was named the *Daily News Journal* and District 7-AAA Player of the Year in 2005 at Riverdale High School in Murfreesboro. She was garnered All-District, All-Region and All-State accolades the past two years as well as Honorable Mention All-America from Street & Smith's. Lanning averaged 18.5 points, 2.2 assists and 1.9 steals last season, shooting 63.8 percent from the field, 34.4 percent from 3-point range and 84.7 percent from the free throw line.

Middle Tennessee senior Chrissy Givens was one of 50 players named to the Naismith Trophy Preseason List announced December 11. GIVENS PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR: Senior Chrissy Givens was voted the Sun Belt Preseason Player of the Year by the league coaches and media at the conference media days at the end of October. The Monroe, La., native was also voted to the Preseason All-Sun Belt First Team. The honor is in conjunction with the 5-11 guard being voted Sun Belt Player of the Year for the 2005-06 season. She was also voted Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Year and Sun Belt Tournament Most Outstanding Player. She is just the second player in Sun Belt Conference history to win all three awards in the same season. Givens' preseason honor is the second time in school history a Blue Raider women's basketball player was awarded the Preseason POY honor. In 2004 former Middle Tennessee standout Patrice Holmes was voted Sun Belt Preseason Player of the Year.

BLUE RAIDERS TOPS IN THE EAST: For the second time since joining the Sun Belt, Middle Tennessee has been tabbed to finish first in the Sun Belt preseason poll in the Eastern Division. The Blue Raiders received 74 points and nine first-place votes to take the top spot in the Eastern Division in a poll of the league's coaches prior to SBC Media Days. Middle Tennessee was also picked to finish first in 2004.

HORTON SECOND TEAM: Krystle Horton was voted to the Preseason All-Sun Belt Second Team in a poll of the league's coaches and media prior to the Sun Belt Media Days in October. It marks the third straight season Horton has been named to a Preseason All-SBC squad. The senior forward was a Third-Team selection to close out the season in 2005-06, averaging 11.9 points per game and ranking second in the Sun Belt in field goal percentage at 51.2 percent.

GIVENS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN: Senior Chrissy Givens was named a Preseason Honorable Mention All-America by *Street & Smith's* magazine in October after leading Middle Tennessee in points, rebounds, assists and steals in 2005-06. It is the second time in school history a Blue Raider player was named a Preseason All-American, with former standout Jonelda Buck garnering the accolade before the 1998-99 season.

INSELL'S SUCCESS: Head coach Rick Insell enjoyed unprecedented success at Shelbyville Central High School in Shelbyville, Tenn., before becoming the seventh head coach in Middle Tennessee history before the 2005-06 season. Insell posted a 20-11 mark last year and led the Blue Raiders to their third straight Sun Belt Tournament title and third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. The 20 wins in his first campaign mark only the second Blue Raider coach to win 20 contests in his rookie season (Lewis Bivens, 22-8, 1988) and just the 14th 20-win season in Blue Raider history.

LAST TIME OUT FOR MIDDLE TENNESSEE

Lady Raiders Win, but Givens Hurt

MURFREESBORO, Tenn. -- MTSU easily won the game, but the overriding concern is the status of senior guard Chrissy Givens.

A complete hush came over a Murphy Center crowd of 3,780 with 12:59 remaining Saturday night when Givens fell to the floor, grabbed her left knee and had to be helped off the floor. She returned to the bench with less than three minutes remaining with an icepack on her knee.

Givens' injury certainly put a damper on MTSU's ninth straight win — a 90-55 triumph over Sun Belt Conference foe Troy.

"She's having an MRI (Saturday night) and we'll know more then," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "I've coached a lot of great players, some that were on TV today, and she's as good as there is on and off the court. We're hoping for the best."

Added Givens: "I can put all of my weight on it. ... I was diving for a loose ball and caught my foot on the hardwood, and it bent and didn't allow me to bend it."

MTSU, ranked No. 25 in the USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll, improved to 12-3 overall and 4-0 in the Sun Belt

Conference. Troy slipped to 8-7 and 1-4. The last time MTSU won nine straight games was during the 1999-2000 season.

After hitting 17 3-pointers against North Dakota State Tuesday night, coach Insell acknowledged, "we're not going to shoot the ball like that every night."

Correct in his assessment, MTSU was hardly sharp offensively against Troy in the first half.

However, one constant remained for MTSU and it was intense defensive pressure that forced 35 Troy turnovers — a season high — and totally disrupted the Trojans offensive attack.

"Defense is our main thing," said MTSU sophomore guard Johnna Abney. "We were putting pressure on and off the ball and when we can do that, I think we'll cause a lot of problems for teams."

MTSU shot just 33 percent in the first half, but Troy had 22 turnovers that led to 27 Lady Raider points.

The Trojans didn't reach double figures until inside the six-minute mark as they repeatedly turned the ball over against MTSU's press and in the half-court.

MTSU's two leading scorers, Givens and junior Amber Holt, scored just five and two points, respectively, in the first 20 minutes. However, the Lady Raiders got 21 points off the bench.

"I thought we were a little sluggish early offensively," Insell said. "The shots weren't falling and we missed some chippies that we normally make."

"... One thing we do have this year that we didn't last is depth."

MTSU used runs of 21-6 and 10-5 to build its biggest lead, 39-13, with 1:58 remaining before halftime, and it held a 41-19 advantage at intermission.

"We stress defense so much that even if we're off shooting, we should never take a night off on defense," said Givens, who had 13 points and 11 rebounds for the ninth double-double of her career.

Freshman Brandi Brown led MTSU with 19 points, including making five 3-pointers, while freshman Jackie Pickel netted 13 points and Holt 10. Troy was led by Kylie Morrissey's 22 points.

MTSU plays at Florida International Tuesday when it opens a three-game road swing against the Panthers, Florida Atlantic and New Orleans.

POSTGAME NOTES

24 IN A ROW: With tonight's win over Troy, Middle Tennessee ran its streak of consecutive wins at home against Sun Belt competition to 24. The last time the Blue Raiders lost a conference game at home was February 5, 2004, in double overtime against Western Kentucky. Overall, MT has won 28 of its last 29 home conference games and head coach Rick Insell is a perfect 13-0 at home versus league foes.

GIVENS PASSES ROSS: Senior Chrissy Givens dished out three assists in the win over Troy to surpass Janet Ross for eighth place on the all-time assists list at Middle Tennessee. Givens now has 357 career assists and needs just 14 more to overtake Julie Morrison for seventh.

GIVENS POSTS THIRD DOUBLE-DOUBLE OF SEASON: Senior Chrissy Givens posted her third double-double of the season and ninth of her career with 13 points and 11 rebounds in just 26 minutes of action. Givens also posted double-doubles this season against Maine (23 pts., 13 reb.) and Tennessee Tech (22 pts., 11 reb.).


BROWN STAYS HOT: Freshman Brandi Brown continued her torrid shooting from 3-point range, hitting 5-for-10 from behind the arc and finishing with a team-high 19 points. The Jamestown, Tenn., native has 12 trifectas in the last two contests and four games this season with four or more 3-pointers. For the season Brown is shooting 45 percent from 3-point range this season.

STREAK REACHES NINE: Tonight's win over Troy extended the Blue Raiders winning streak to nine games. That matches the eighth longest streak in school history but remains six back of the all-time record of 15 set in 1987. The Blue Raiders will go for number 10 this Tuesday at Florida International.

QUICK HITTERS: MT is now 2-0 since being ranked in the Top 25 ... The Blue Raiders remain perfect in the series against Troy (4-0) following tonight's victory ... Head Coach Rick Insell is now 22-3 at Murphy Center ... The Blue Raiders 12-3 start is their best since the 1995-96 squad began 17-1 ... Middle Tennessee hit 12 3-pointers in the game, its seventh game this season with double-digit 3-pointers and fourth in the last six outings.

Head Coach Rick Insell



Rick Insell made a huge splash in his first year at the helm of the Middle Tennessee women's basketball program, guiding the Middle Tennessee program to its third consecutive Sun Belt Championship and doing so in front of a record-setting home crowd in the finals of the SBC Tournament.

Insell can now drop the title former high school coach and add his name to the list of Middle Tennessee coaches with conference titles. He directed one of the most thrilling comebacks in Sun Belt Tournament history, leading Middle Tennessee to an 84-73 win over Western Kentucky after being down by as many as 14 points in the first half.

Insell's first season at the helm of his alma mater also included a Top 10 recruiting class for the 2006-07 season and an unprecedented third consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Insell also developed one of the most prolific scorers for a single-season in school history in Chrissy Givens, who registered 667 points, the second most in a season on the all-time scoring list. It also makes Givens one of just five players to score 600 or more points in a season as a Blue Raider.

The 2005-06 campaign also saw another first in program history as three players - Givens, Tia Stovall and Krystle Horton - all joined the 1,000-point club. This marks the first time in school history three current players all were represented on the prestigious list, and the Blue Raiders were one of only four teams in the 2006 NCAA Tournament to boast such an honor.

Insell's biggest influence may have come at the turnstiles, where the Blue Raiders averaged 2,699 fans per outing in 2005-06, a 300 percent increase over the previous season and the largest increase in the NCAA for 2005-06.

Middle Tennessee notched one of its biggest wins of the season when the Blue Raiders shocked Big 10 powerhouse Penn State, 79-65, in the UAB Blaze Tournament in December.

A 1977 graduate of Middle Tennessee, Insell built a high school girls basketball dynasty at nearby Shelbyville Central High School, where he guided the Golden Eaglettes to a record 10 TSSAA Class AAA state championships and two USA Today national championships (1989, 1991) as he compiled a sparkling 775-148 worksheet during his 28-year tenure. Insell was named USA Today National High School Coach of the Year in 1989 and 1991 and he also was named Converse National High

School Coach of the Year on two occasions (1990, 1992). Insell called the women's basketball position at Middle Tennessee his "dream job".

"Dreams do come true," Insell said after Director of Athletics Chris Massaro announced his hiring on May 18, 2005. "It's something you think about. I'm a coach and it's all I've ever done, from elementary to junior high to junior pro, AAU and high school. To be able to come on board at Middle Tennessee, a Division I school, that's a dream come true, not only for me, but for all of the high school coaches and junior high coaches across the country and it says if you stay in there long enough and dream big enough, one day it will eventually happen."

Insell said Middle Tennessee will be a pressing basketball team on defense and force the issue, and he added that the Blue Raiders would back down from no one on the recruiting trail.

"We are going after the best players in the state of Tennessee every year," Insell said. "If Tennessee or Vanderbilt is after them, then Middle Tennessee is going to be after them, too. We will recruit alongside of them. We are not going to be intimidated, nor will we back down because they are in the Southeastern Conference. We are Division I and they are Division I. We are going to use all of our contacts."

A name synonymous with high school girls basketball in Tennessee, Insell's teams hold the Tennessee state records for consecutive wins with 110, consecutive state titles with four (1989-1992), most state championships for a coach with 10 (1986, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1995, 2000, 2001, 2003 and 2004), and his 1990 Golden Eaglette squad was named the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame Team of the Year, the first high school team so honored.

Under Insell's guidance, Shelbyville Central High School won 23 district championships, 16 regional championships and appeared in the Class AAA state championship game a remarkable 15 times, winning 10. Insell developed six Tennessee Class AAA Miss Basketball Award recipients, 15 high school All-Americans and 57 of his players received either athletic or academic scholarships to continue their careers at the collegiate level.

While Insell built a basketball dynasty at Shelbyville during his time there, he also made sure his players got the job done in the classroom, as evidenced by his teams receiving the TSSAA Distinguished Award for Academic Success from 1989-2000, an award based on team GPA. The lowest cumulative GPA at Shelbyville from 1989-00 was 3.4 and the highest was 3.98.

Additionally, Insell's Shelbyville team received a special invitation to the Oval Office by President George Bush for academic and athletic achievement and his teams also have been honored in the United States Senate and House of Representatives, the Tennessee State House and Senate and by two Tennessee Governors.

Women's college basketball has seen the gap narrow between the have's and have not's.

MTSU proved Friday night that it, too, has closed the gap in terms of competing with the top teams in the nation.

However, MTSU also found out why Maryland is the defending national champion as it overcame a five-point deficit with 5:14 remaining and stormed back to defeat the Blue Raiders 80-76 before a women's record crowd of 10,010 at Murphy Center.

"You can see why their national champions," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "They did the same thing in the finals last year against Duke. They've got great players, but we've got great players. They didn't luck into winning the national championship."

MTSU led the Terrapins 72-67 with 5:14 left in the game after freshman guard Chelsia Lymon scored on a three-point play. However, after a Maryland timeout, it reeled off a 13-4 run to close the game and hold on to its preseason No. 1 national ranking.

"I want to thank Middle Tennessee," said Maryland coach Brenda Frese. "They made us a better basketball team tonight. It was tremendous, it was one of the better college basketball games I've ever been a part of. Middle Tennessee is going to be very, very good. They obviously showed it and they've got to be excited about what's ahead."

The Blue Raiders trailed 76-74 with less than a minute left, but Amber Holt's jumper was off the mark. On Maryland's next possession, All-American Crystal Langhorne scored on an offensive put-back to with 25 seconds left to seal the victory.

Holt made a sterling debut, scoring 28 points and pulling down eight rebounds, and freshman point guard Chelsia Lymon — the Gatorade player of the year in Kentucky last year — scored 13 points in only nine minutes of play.

Maryland was led by Coleman with 19 points and 14 rebounds, while Langhorne had 16 points and 11 rebounds.

While the Blue Raiders pushed Maryland to the limit, it didn't look like it that way early. Coming out of the final media timeout in the first half with 2:55 remaining, MTSU trailed 36-23. Maryland had hit 15 of its first 21 shots for a sizzling 71-percent clip, while MTSU had made only 9 of its first 27 attempts.

However, after Maryland took its biggest lead of the half at 38-23, MTSU scored the final 10 points to close within 38-33 at intermission. Holt scored six in a row and Givens drove in the length of the floor in just six seconds and hit a layup to pull the Blue Raiders within five.

Maryland shot 61 percent from the field and outrebounded MTSU 37-29. The Blue Raiders shot 42 percent and forced 23 Terrapin turnovers.

There was no sugarcoating MTSU's 72-61 home loss to South Dakota State Monday night at Murphy Center.

"They came out, it was their first game and they stuck it to us," said second-year MTSU coach Rick Insell.

After playing No. 1 ranked Maryland to within four points Friday night and garnering 12 votes in the Top 25 poll Monday, MTSU did indeed get a dose of reality.

"They came in here and kicked our butts," said MTSU senior guard Chrissy Givens. "We took Maryland to four points and maybe we thought we were too good, but they kicked our butts. They did it here two years ago."

MTSU struggled offensively throughout, but tied the score at 52-52 with 6:52 left when Givens scored and converted a 3-point play.

However, MTSU was outscored 20-9 down the stretch as it was unable to run its half-court offense.

MTSU shot only 32 percent from the field, while the Jackrabbits shot 56 percent and outrebounded the Blue Raiders 37-29.

MTSU was led by junior Amber Holt's 19 points, while Givens had 17. However, the duo combined to go just 12-of-41 from the field.

South Dakota State hit 17-of-20 free throws after getting into the 1-and-1 with 10:39 left in the game. The Jackrabbits also hit 8-of-14 from behind the 3-point arc.

"There was no pressure for us to win this game," said SDSU coach Aaron Johnston. "We tried a basic offense. We kept it simple and told the kids about being strong and trying to drive."

"We talked about trying to pick up some fouls in the second half. If they are going to put that much pressure on us we've got to turn that pressure on them and get to the free throw line."

MTSU led 12-7 with 14:01 left in the first half but went more than four minutes without a point and found itself trailing 19-12.

The Blue Raiders scored eight unanswered points during one stretch to take a 24-22 lead, but SDSU closed the final four minutes of the half with a 5-2 run to take a 27-26 halftime lead.

MTSU shot just 32 percent in the first half (10-of-31), while the Jackrabbits hit 11-of-24 (46 percent).

SDSU had 13 first-half turnovers, but MTSU could only turn them into six points.

Foul problems at the post also hurt MTSU as senior Krystle Horton picked up her second personal in less than three minutes, while sophomore Lakira Boyd was whistled for her second with 13:48 remaining before halftime.

Chrissy Givens scored 18 first-half points and helped Middle Tennessee build a 25-point lead early in the second half en route to a 79-61 victory over host Minnesota in the championship game of the Subway Classic Sunday at Williams Arena.

Givens, voted the tournament's most valuable player, was almost unstoppable in the first half, going 9-of-14 from the field, leading the Blue Raiders to a 14-point halftime lead.

Givens and teammate Starr Orr were both selected to the Subway Classic All-Tournament team.

Freshman Chelsia Lymon came off the bench in the opening minutes of the second half and provided an offensive spark, knocking down a pair of 3-pointers and a lay-up to help extend the lead to 57-34. Orr followed with eight consecutive points of her own, including another pair of trifectas, stretching the Middle Tennessee advantage to 65-38.

Minnesota made a run during the half when Middle Tennessee went without a bucket for more than six minutes, but the Golden Gophers never got closer than 14 after the break.

Givens led all scorers with 25 points while adding seven rebounds and seven assists in 40 minutes of action. Orr, in one of her best games as a Blue Raider, added 14 points, eight rebounds, six assists, and three steals.

Senior Krystle Horton scored the first three baskets of the game for the Blue Raiders and Johnna Abney knocked down a pair of 3-pointers, as Middle Tennessee quieted the crowd of 5,639 en route to an early 12-6 lead. Givens scored the next eight on a host of short jumpers and lay-ups for a 20-12 MT advantage with 7:51 to go in the half.

All of this was in the midst of an 18-4 run over a seven-minute stretch that put the Blue Raiders ahead, 34-14. The Blue Raiders built the lead by out-hustling the Golden Gophers, with one series of plays seeing Amber Holt make a steal but miss a break-away lay-up.

Not to be discouraged, Holt came racing back down the floor, made another steal falling out of bounds, saved the ball to Orr, who executed a 2-on-1 with Givens for another lay-up. The Blue Raiders built a 32-14 advantage at that point and led 38-24 at the halftime break even after a cheap lay-up at the buzzer by Minnesota's Kelly Roysland.

Givens had 18 in the first half and the Blue Raiders forced 18 Minnesota turnovers in the first 20 minutes and also limited the Golden Gophers to just 35 percent shooting from the floor while shooting 58 percent themselves.

MTSU (3-2) shot 52 percent and hit 12 3-pointers, equaling a season high, as it won its third straight game and snapped a two-game losing streak at Murphy Center.

The 98 points were the most scored by MTSU under second-year coach Rick Insell, whose team lost 76-66 at Chattanooga last season.

"We're playing a little better offensively," Insell said, "but I wasn't as pleased with our defense tonight. We did a better job as the game went on, but not good enough if we're going to get to where we want to be."

The duo of senior guard Chrissy Givens and junior forward Amber Holt were devastating, as they combined for 55 points and 17 rebounds. Givens finished with 29 points and seven rebounds, while Holt had 26 points and 10 boards.

The offensive onslaught was a welcomed sight after the Blue Raiders had hit 30 percent their first two home games against Maryland and South Dakota State.

Coming out of the eight-minute timeout trailing 24-21, Chattanooga went to a zone defense, which played right into MTSU's hands.

Freshman guard Jackie Pickel hit back-to-back 3-pointers, which spearheaded a 14-4 run that gave MTSU a 38-25 lead with 4:33 left before halftime.

Chattanooga pulled to within seven in less than a minute, but the Blue Raiders closed the half with a 12-7 run to take a 50-38 halftime lead at intermission.

Pickel finished with a season-high 15 points, hitting 5-of-7 from 3-point range. Five different MTSU players hit at least one 3-pointer.

Both teams were plagued with foul problems in the first half, with Chattanooga being whistled for 13 and MTSU with 12.

Chattanooga's leading scorer, Alex Anderson (18 ppg), played only four minutes after picking up her second foul, while starters Brooke Hand and Kristen Spann each had three fouls.

MTSU sophomore guard Johnna Abney picked up three fouls in the first half, while Givens, Holt and Starr Orr each had two.

Givens scored MTSU's first eight points of the second half, and Abney followed with a 3-pointer to give the Blue Raiders a 61-44 advantage with 17:09 left.

MTSU outrebounded the Lady Mocs 40-28 and forced 21 turnovers.

Tennessee Tech had the fight and grit, but athleticism and talent finally won out for MTSU's Lady Raiders Wednesday night.

Despite struggling for much of the first half, MTSU overcame the sloppy play and pulled away to defeat the Golden Eagles, 68-50, at Hooper Eblen Center.

"We didn't get off to a good start, but (Tennessee Tech) made some plays and that's a credit to them," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "I thought we settled down, though, and did what we needed to do. They played hard and we played hard, and it was a good ballgame."

MTSU (4-3) was lethargic early and fell behind 16-10 to the pesky Golden Eagles, who didn't surrender the lead until 5:58 left before halftime.

The Lady Raiders used a 20-3 run to take a 30-19 lead and held a 32-23 halftime advantage.

MTSU senior guard Chrissy Givens missed three shots to open the game and was pulled from the lineup. However, she responded upon her return by leading the Lady Raiders with 22 points, 11 rebounds and five assists.

"I'm a leader and I don't need to start a game like that," Givens said. "I know (Insell) was mad and I knew I was coming out. When I came back in, I just tried to deflect balls, play defense and we all kind of gravitated to each other."

MTSU junior guard Starr Orr, recently inserted into the starting lineup, helped spark the first-half run with seven straight points on a short jumper, a steal and a layup and a 3-pointer.

"I haven't been playing too good lately," Orr said, "and coach told me I needed to step it up. When I got those steals, it got me going and then we started playing better. Our problem was we just couldn't knock our shots down early in the game. Once we hit a few, we got on a good roll."

MTSU hit just 37 percent from the field in the first half, but got into a better rhythm offensively in the second when it hit 11 of its first 18 shots.

Tennessee Tech stayed within 10 points until the 10-minute mark when the Lady Raiders used a 14-5 spurt to go ahead 62-43 with 6:59 remaining.

"I think our defensive tenacity got to them," Insell said. "They weren't really able to get into their sets much. I thought we stayed after them and wore them down."

Tennessee Tech shot just 39 percent in the second half and finished with 20 turnovers. The Lady Raiders outrebounded the Golden Eagles, 38-27.

Orr had 12 points, while junior Amber Holt and freshman Brandi Brown netted 10 apiece. MTSU hit 7-of-16 from 3-point range.

Tennessee Tech was led by Kendall Cavin with 15 points and Marissa Hensley with 11.

MTSU isn't ready to see senior guard Chrissy Givens leave, but the Lady Raiders did find out how they can play without her.

With Givens on the bench with three fouls at the halfway point of the first half, MTSU (5-3) not only maintained a double-digit lead, but extended it en route to hammering Austin Peay (2-6) 80-49 before a crowd of 3,204 at Murphy Center.

"We had a lead so there wasn't a lot of pressure on us," Insell said. "When you've got someone like Amber Holt who can step up, it also takes pressure off you."

"But overall we did a good job executing offensively and defensively tonight."

After Givens was whistled for her third foul with 10:32 left before intermission, she sat on the bench the remainder of the half and watched the Lady Raiders build an 18-8 advantage into a 40-18 halftime lead.

"I was very comfortable sitting on the bench," Givens said. "Amber Holt picked it up, and our defense kept picking it up."

"[Austin Peay] beat our butts last year and it was like a vengeance. Once we got them down, we wanted to keep them down."

MTSU's relentless defense forced 19 first-half turnovers that led to 21 points, and Austin Peay continuously panicked when trying to break the press and when it did manage to set up in the half court.

"We wanted to bring our practice to the game," said Holt, who had 19 points, nine rebounds and five steals. "We did that and they kept turning it over and turning it over."

The Lady Raiders picked up in the second half where the left off in the first, forcing four straight turnovers and building a 58-22 advantage with 13:50 left. MTSU led by as many as 36 points.

"It was an overall team victory," Insell said. "Last year we had an 18-point lead twice against them and lost the game. I think that is a lesson that has carried over, even into this year."

Despite playing just 18 minutes, Givens scored 19 points and dished out four assists. Senior forward Krystle Horton had eight points and a team-high 10 rebounds.

Junior forward Starr Orr continued her solid play with nine points and four rebounds, while freshman forward Brandi Brown added seven points.

MTSU shot 52 percent and outrebounded the Lady Governors 35-20.

Austin Peay, which shot 50 percent, was led by Breana Link's 18 points. However, the Lady Govs had a whopping 31 turnovers.

Chrissy Givens tied her season-high with 29 points to lead four double-figure scorers and Middle Tennessee overcame a sluggish start to both halves, forcing 29 turnovers in a 93-58 victory over South Alabama Thursday night at Mitchell Center.

South Alabama (5-5, 0-1 Sun Belt) began the game with a 13-4 run and started the second half with 12 straight points, but the Blue Raiders' defense was the big difference in the game, as the pressure forced 20 first-half turnovers by the Lady Jags and 29 in all.

Middle Tennessee (7-3, 1-0) freshman Brandi Brown finished with a career-high 17 points, hitting 5-of-8 from 3-point range, and Amber Holt added 16 points, as the Blue Raiders won the fourth straight in the series, including three in a row in Mobile. Senior Krystle Horton also scored 10 points, all in the second half, and added a team-high seven rebounds.

"The score is really not indicative of the game. We came out sluggish in both halves but I thought our 1-2-2 press bothered them and that was a big difference," head coach Rick Insell said. "We shot the ball well and what a night for Brandi Brown to come out and play well. She hit some three's and loosened up things for us."

Givens netted 17 of her 29 in the first half and had seven assists, four rebounds and four steals in 36 minutes of action. She tied her career-high with 14 made field goals. The Blue Raiders were 19-of-34 in both halves from the floor and turned the ball over just 12 times in the contest.

The Blue Raiders got off to a rough start and fell behind 13-4 in the first six minutes of the contest, but recovered with a 16-0 run over five minutes for a 20-13 edge. Givens and Holt both scored six points and Chelsia Lymon had four during the run.

The Blue Raiders turned up the pressure on defense after falling behind. South Alabama committed 10 turnovers during the Blue Raiders' run back into the game and had 20 first-half turnovers in all. Middle Tennessee outscored USA, 44-10, over the final 14 minutes of the half for a 48-23 lead at the break.

In the second half South Alabama tallied 12 consecutive points in less than four minutes until Givens hit a runner in the lane that drew a foul to end the run. Brown then hit her fourth 3-pointer of the contest and Starr Orr had two buckets, including one of the team's 10 3-pointers.

Johnna Abney started the scoring barrage and most everyone else joined in Sunday when MTSU ripped Louisiana-Monroe, 103-59, before a crowd of 2,317 at Murphy Center.

The sophomore point guard hit four straight 3-pointers in the first six minutes of the game, igniting a 61-point first half in which the Lady Raiders shot 67 percent (20-of-30) and made 8-of-11 3-pointers.

"My job is to get us into our offense, but if I'm open I'm going to shoot or I'll get in trouble," said Abney. "I had my shot and was open, so I just took them."

MTSU improved to 8-3 overall and 2-0 in the Sun Belt Conference, while ULM fell to 10-3 and 0-2.

MTSU's defense was relentless against the Warhawks, who could only get off 15 first-half shots and turned the ball over 20 times.

The 103 points was the most MTSU has scored this season and the most it has tallied since beating Morehead State 108-75 in 1996.

MTSU didn't let up in the second half, building as big as a 50-point lead.

The Lady Raiders forced 27 turnovers, but didn't press in the second half.

"Defense is our main thing," Givens said. "Every night we go out trying to get better and do better. We're not there yet and we're not perfect, but we're reading each other and that could be dangerous."

Added Martin: "I am very disappointed in how we played. We didn't handle their press at all. We're a pressing team and we should be able to handle it."

The 16 3-pointers made were the most this season and just two shy of a team record. Eight different Lady Raiders made at least one 3-pointer, while Abney and freshman Jackie Pickel hit four apiece. The Lady Raiders shot a sizzling 58 percent and made 59 percent (16-of-27) from 3-point range.

"Our girls played their game and that's what I'm proud of," Insell said. "We didn't worry about the score. We just went out and executed offensively and defensively."

Givens' 19 points led MTSU, while junior Amber Holt had 14 and Abney and Pickel 12 apiece. ULM was led by LaJenna Howard with 16 points.

The apparent blowout in the making didn't materialize, but MTSU's Lady Raiders nevertheless took round one in a battle of Sun Belt Conference heavyweights Wednesday night.

Paced by four players in double figures, MTSU built a big lead early, staved off a Western Kentucky rally and eventually subdued the Lady Toppers 76-62 before a crowd of 3,627 at Murphy Center.

"I thought overall it was the worst game we've played," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "We didn't shoot well. I don't know if it was the Christmas break, but I also think Western Kentucky had a lot to do with it."

MTSU, ranked 26th nationally in the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN coaches poll, improved to 10-3 overall and 3-0 in the Sun Belt Conference. Western Kentucky dropped to 6-4 and 2-1.

MTSU looked as if it was going to run away from the Lady Toppers as it led 46-29 with 15:07 remaining. However, Western Kentucky scored nine unanswered points and held the Lady Raiders scoreless for more than four minutes.

"It was a hard game and I think we both got tired," said MTSU senior forward Krystle Horton, who had 14 points. "With it being a conference game, you know it's going to be a game of runs. We kept our composure when they made their runs."

MTSU got the lead back to 16 points, 54-38, with 9:28 left, but Western Kentucky refused to wilt and had a chance to get the lead under 10 before the Lady Raiders used a 12-4 flurry to go up 70-54 with 3:12 left. Senior Chrissy Givens led the Lady Raiders with 19 points, while junior Amber Holt and sophomore Johnna Abney had 16 and 13, respectively.

Western Kentucky's defense disrupted MTSU's offense in the first half. The Lady Raiders had to hit their final four shots just to reach a 43-percent shooting clip.

However, MTSU's defense totally took the Lady Toppers out of their offense as they had 22 turnovers in the first half and managed only 10 shots in the first 13 minutes of play. Western Kentucky finished with 34 turnovers.

MTSU raced out to a 10-0 lead, holding Western Kentucky scoreless until the 15:57 mark of the first half.

The Lady Raiders built a 14-point lead, 26-12, with 5:17 left before intermission before Western Kentucky used a 8-0 spurt to pull within 26-20 at the 2:57 mark.

"We're playing the score instead of the game," Insell said. "I'm glad we got the win, but we've got a lot of work to do."

MTSU then scored seven straight, highlighted by Abney's fourth 3-pointer of the half. Freshman guard Jackie Pickel drained a long 3-pointer with seven seconds left to give MTSU a 36-22 halftime lead.

Western Kentucky was led by junior post Crystal Kelly with 20 points and 16 rebounds.

Brandi Brown and Jackie Pickel were labeled as shooters with no conscience when they signed with MTSU.

North Dakota State will certainly attest to the fact after the freshmen combined for 13 3-pointers and 43 points in No. 25 MTSU's 93-63 victory at Murphy Center Tuesday night.

It was almost comical as the duo continued to hit 3-pointers as if they were having a contest amongst themselves.

Brown hit seven treys, Pickel nailed six, and the Lady Raiders hit a season-high 17 from beyond the bonus arc.

MTSU improved to 11-3 and won its eighth consecutive game. North Dakota State dropped to 6-6.

Just hours after earning its first national ranking in more than 18 years, MTSU didn't exactly look the part early against North Dakota State.

However, a flurry of 3-point shots midway through the first half all but rendered the Bison helpless and spearheaded the Lady Raiders to the 30-point blowout.

Leading just 16-10 with 13:30 remaining in the first half, MTSU went on a 16-2 run, which included back-to-back 3-pointers from Pickel.

Brown also hit two 3-pointers in the opening half, while freshman Chelsia Lymon nailed one as the Lady Raiders built a 47-26 halftime lead.

"We've got some pretty good shooters," said Insell. "We're not going to shoot like that every night. If we do, we'll be in the Final Four. I'm not real satisfied with our defense, and we'll come back (this morning) and work on that."

"We executed our offense in the second half, but we've still got a tendency to play the scoreboard and not the game, and we had too many defensive breakdowns."

MTSU made its debut Tuesday in the USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll for the first time since December 1988 when it was coached by Lewis Bivens.

The ranking might have served as motivation for North Dakota State, but it was hardly a major distraction for MTSU, which lost to the Bison a year ago.

"Being No. 25 really doesn't suit us," said senior guard Chrissy Givens. "That's not what we're aiming for. ... It's an honor, but we've got a lot more we want to accomplish."

The Lady Raiders, who led by as many as 36 points in the second half, placed four players in double figures.

Brown scored a career-high 25 points, Pickel netted a career-high 18, junior Amber Holt had 18 and Givens chipped in 10 points and seven assists.
