WINNING STREAK REACHES SCHOOL-RECORD 16 GAMES: Middle Tennessee's victory Sunday over Western Division-leading Louisiana-Lafayette set a new standard for Blue Raider basketball with a school-record 16th consecutive win, breaking the previous mark set from January 12-March 4, 1987. Only eight other times in school history before the season had a Blue Raider team won 10 games or more in a row. The current 16-game streak is tied with Stanford for the third longest nationally behind North Carolina (23) and Duke (22).

RAIDERS NOT TENTATIVE ON 3-POINT ATTEMPTS: Middle Tennessee has used the 3-point shot this season as a major weapon in the offense with the help of four primary shooters, three of whom shoot better than 40 percent from behind the arc. The Blue Raiders take 25.0 trifectas per game and average 9.18 makes per contest, best in the Sun Belt and first nationally heading into Wednesday's game against Denver. The squad has nine outings with 10 or more 3-pointers made, including

16 against Louisiana-Monroe on December 17 and 17 versus North Dakota State on January 2. The Blue Raiders also broke the school record for 3-pointer attempts in a game with 48 on January 28 against Louisiana-Lafayette, just four short of the NCAA record. Freshman Brandi Brown has eight games this season with four or more 3-pointers, including seven versus North Dakota State, and another freshman, Jackie Pickel, has posted five games with three or more trifectas. Brown shoots 41 percent (54-for-131) from behind the arc, while sophomore Johnna Abney makes 41 percent (39-for-95). Freshman Chelsia Lymon hits 44 percent (28-for-64), while Pickel comes in at 31 percent (32-for-104). The Blue Raiders shoot 37 percent as a team, ranking 26th in the nation this week. Brown, Abney, Lymon and Pickel account for 72 percent (394) of the attempts and 76 percent of the makes (153) for the team this season.

HORTON MAKING BIG DIFFERENCE IN POST: Senior Krystle Horton has been one of the key factors in Middle Tennessee's current 16-game winning streak, especially in the rebounding department. The Murfreesboro, Tenn., native has averaged 6.8 boards per contest during the 16 games as well as 8.8 points. She posted a 10 rebound performance on December 4 against Austin Peay and has tallied back-to-back double figure rebounding games in the last two

outings. Last Wednesday at North Texas Horton grabbed 10 boards and then this past Sunday versus Louisiana-Lafayette, she tied her career-high with 12 rebounds and added 13 points. Horton has raised her season rebound average to 5.9, third on the team and 16th in the Sun Belt heading into Wednesday's game versus Denver.

GIVENS JUST KEEPS ON ROLLING: Senior Chrissy Givens has served as the main offensive catalyst for Middle Tennessee over the last two seasons, but never more so than over the last seven games where she is averaging 25.9 points per outing. Givens injured her right knee early in the second half against Troy on January 6 and did not return to that game, but since then the Monroe, La., native has been lighting up the scoreboard. Givens torched Florida International for a then season-high 32 points with eight assists and netted 23 at Florida Atlantic two nights later. At New Orleans she scored 17 points with a school-record 11 steals in just 22 minutes of action. She followed that with 27 points against Arkansas State and then a season-high 33 at Arkansas-Little Rock. Givens totaled 26 points last Wednesday at North Texas and had 23 points and eight rebounds this past Sunday versus Louisiana-Lafayette. Givens ranks fourth nationally in scoring this week with 22.2 points per game and is also 18th in the country in steals (3.1) and 54th in both assists per game (4.7) and FG percentage (.515).

HORTON MAKES 100TH START: Senior Krystle Horton started her 100th career game in the win over Louisiana-Lafayette on Sunday to move into a tie for eighth place on the all-time list with former teammate Tia Stovall (2003-06). With three more starts Horton will tie Tawanya Mucker (1986-89) for seventh place. It was also the Murfreesboro native's 117th career game played, which ties her with Cortney Neeley (1996-99) for fourth place all-time. Natalie Sneed (1995-98) and Jonelda Buck (1996-99) both played in 118 career games are tied for second.

BLUE RAIDERS SET SCHOOL RECORD FOR 3-POINTERS: Middle Tennessee attempted a school-record 48 3-pointers in the win over Louisiana-Lafayette on Sunday, while connecting on 12. The 48 attempts were just four shy of the NCAA record of 52 attempts set by Cal Poly in 1999 and Alabama in 1995. The Blue Raiders broke the previous school record of 39 versus Fairleigh Dickinson on December 30, 1995.

Overall, the Blue Raiders have won 30 of their last 31 home conference games and head coach Rick Insell is a perfect 15-0 at the Glass House against SBC competition.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE: Krystle Horton continued her solid all-around play against Louisiana-Lafayette, as she recorded the 12th double-double of her career. The Murfreesboro, Tenn., native had 13 points and equaled her career-high with 12 rebounds to key the Blue Raiders' win over the Ragin' Cajuns. The senior also nailed her first 3-pointer of the season and the fourth of her career when she connected late in the second half. Horton has three double-figure rebounding games this season, including each of the last two outings. As a team this season, Middle Tennessee has recorded seven double-doubles (Chrissy Givens – 4, Amber Holt – 2). A complete listing of career double-doubles appears on page 3 of these notes.

ONE SHY FOR 15: Middle Tennessee enters Wednesday's game against Denver seeking its 15th 20-win season in school history. The Blue Raiders currently stand 19-3 overall and need one more win to secure the program's fourth straight 20-win campaign, an unprecedented streak in school history. The Blue Raiders had never had more than two consecutive 20-win seasons before the current steak began in 2004.

INSELL'S SUCCESS: Head coach Rick Insell enjoyed unprecedented success at Shelbyville Central High School in Shelbyville, Tenn., before becoming the seventh head coach in Middle Tennessee history before the 2005-06 season. Insell posted a 20-11 mark last year

their OVC games, the third longest streak in program history. The 1987-88 squad owns the top mark at 12 games, while the 1995-96 club's 11-game winning streak ranks second to start conference play.

RAIDERS EQUAL BEST START IN SCHOOL HISTORY: Middle Tennessee's 19-3 overall record this season equals the best start in school history after 22 games. The 1995-96 team began the year 19-3 after 22 contests, one of two previous teams in school history to begin a season with 19 victories in the first 22 games of the year (1976-77 was the other). This season's Blue Raiders have played three teams who were ranked in the Top 10 in the nation at the time of the game and currently have an RPI between Nos. 13 and 17 and a strength of schedule between Nos. 38 and 44 using five different websites

DEFENSE CONTINUES TO BE THE KEY: Middle Tennessee's full court pressure has played havoc with many opponents this season, causing all but one opponent into more than 20 turnovers this season. The Blue Raiders have forced opponents into 593 turnovers this season, and average of 26.95 per game this season. On 11 occasions this season, opponents have committed 29 or more turnovers, including 31 by Minnesota, 29 from Old Dominion, 34 by Western Kentucky and a season-high 40 at New Orleans on January 13. Middle Tennessee has converted opponent turnovers into 675 points, an average of 30.7 points per game. A game-by-game breakdown of opponent turnovers and points off turnovers appears at the top of page 3 in these notes.

DOWNTOWN BRANDI BROWN: Freshman Brandi Brown has led a trio of freshmen contributors this season off the bench, with Brown averaging 9.0 points per game in just over 17 minutes of action a night. The Jamestown, Tenn., native shoots 41 percent (54-for-131) from 3-point range, ranking 27th nationally in 3-pt. FG percentage and 36th in the nation in 3-pointers made per game. Eight times this season Brown has hit at least four 3-pointers in a game, including four against Arkansas State and four versus Louisiana-Lafayette this past Sunday. In the last nine games, Brown is 33-for-77 from behind the arc (.429) and has averaged 11.3 points per game in Sun Belt play. Brown has 10 double-figure scoring games this season, including seven of the 11 SBC outings. Brown attempted a career-high 14 3-pointers in Sunday's game against the Ragin' Cajuns, which ties for fifth most in a single-game in Middle Tennessee history. The other two freshmen - Chelsia Lymon and Jackie Pickel - combine with Brown to average 19.4 points per game, all off the bench. The Blue Raiders have outscored the opponents' bench in 13 of the 22 contests so far this season, going 12-1 in those outings.

ORR STARRING FOR BLUE RAIDER D: Junior Starr Orr has led the Middle Tennessee defensive efforts over the last eight games, though the stat sheet doesn't always show her great play. The Danville, Ala., native has registered 23 steals in the eight outings and grabbed 39 rebounds to go with 39 points. Her biggest accomplishment came against Arkansas State on January 18 when Orr hounded ASU point guard Rudy Sims into nine turnovers, part of a 37-turnover effort for the Blue Raider defense. Orr has started all but the first two games of the season for Middle Tennessee, and the squad is 19-1 in those contests, with the only loss at fourth-ranked Tennessee on November 26.

ens has gained national attention for her scoring prowess as a Blue Raider, but the Monroe, La., native is far from one-dimensional. Last season Givens led the Blue Raiders in points (21.5), rebounds (7.0), assists (4.8) and steals (3.2) and has continued to be a stat-sheet stuffer in 2006-07. She has scored in double figures in every game and leads the club as well as ranking 4th (January 28) in the nation in scoring (22.2 points per game). Givens also grabs 6.0 rebounds per outing and hands out 4.7 assists per contest this season. She continues her ascent in the career steals category at Middle Tennessee as well, ranking third all-time with 257 and averaging 3.1 per game this year. The 257 steals also ties Givens for ninth place on the all-time list in the Sun Belt Conference with Western Kentucky's Tiffany Porter-Talbert (257, 2003-06). South Alabama's Kaola Harris (269, 1984-87) is next on the list. Givens has scored 20-plus points 13 times this season and 17 or more points in 18 of the 22 games. She has recorded six assists in a game nine times this season, including seven vs. No. 1 Maryland and at Minnesota, eight at Florida International and six against Arkansas State. One more thing - she also averages 35.1 minutes per game and has played all 40 in nine contests this season. Givens was named the Preseason Sun Belt

Player of the Year by coaches and the media during the SBC Media Days in October and was a Preseason Honorable Mention All-America selection by Street & Smith's magazine in October.

BLUE RAIDERS DROP ONE SPOT IN AP POLL, HOLD FIRM IN COACHES POLL: Middle Tennessee dropped one spot to No. 20 in the Associated Press released Monday but held steady at No. 19 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll released on Tuesday this week. The Blue Raiders broke into the AP poll for the first time in school history four weeks ago and have been in the coaches poll for five straight weeks. The Blue Raiders had previously appeared in the coaches poll just three times in school history, all at No. 25: March 12, 1985, December 20, 1988 and December 27, 1988. TIDBITS: Middle Tennessee committed a season-low eight turnovers in the game at Arkansas-Little Rock on January 20. The previous low was nine at eighth-ranked Georgia ... Middle Tennessee upped its record to 37-3 over the last two seasons and 19-0 under Insell when leading at the half ... The Blue Raiders have won their 11 Sun Belt games this season by an average margin of 27.5 points per game ... Middle Tennessee made a team season-high 38 field goals at South Alabama, the most in a contest this season by any Sun Belt Conference team. The Blue Raiders are also tops in the Sun Belt this season in points in a game (103 vs. Louisiana-Monroe), 3-pt. FG made (17 vs. North Dakota State), 3-pt. FG attempts (48 vs. Louisiana-Lafayette), assists (26 vs. Louisiana-Monroe) and steals (28 at New Orleans) ... The 61 first half points by the Blue Raiders against Louisiana-Monroe on December 17 was not a school record. That distinction belongs to the 1994-95 team that poured in 68 during the first half against Fairleigh Dickinson.

ALL-TIME TIDBITS: Middle Tennessee stands 201-93 (.684) all-time in the month of January, including 39-20 (.661) in this decade. The Blue Raiders were 6-2 in the month of January last season in coach Rick Insell's first year at the helm of the program and are a perfect 9-0 in January this year after victories over North Dakota State, Troy, Florida International, Florida Atlantic, New Orleans, Arkansas State, Arkansas-Little Rock, North Texas and Louisiana-Lafayette

SCOUTING DENVER: Denver enters Wednesday's game 12-8 overall, 7-4 in the Sun Belt after a 73-68 defeat at home to Western Kentucky on Saturday. The Pioneers are led by Tyesha Lowery, who averages 12.6 points per game, while Sara Benham scored 10.7 per outing. Alisha Godette, a transfer from Arizona State, leads the club with 5.5 rebounds per contest. Denver averages 62.0 points per game and shoots just 39 percent from the field, including 30 percent from 3-point range. But Pioneers opponents hit just 37 percent from the floor.

SERIES RECORD VERSUS DENVER: Middle Tennessee stands 5-3 all-time versus Denver with five consecutive victories in the series. All eight of the games have been played since Middle Tennessee joined the Sun Belt before the 2000-01 season. The Blue Raiders dropped the first three contests against the Pioneers, two on the road and the other at the 2002 SBC Championships in New Orleans. Since then Middle Tennessee has won five straight, including three at home, one in Denver and the other at the 2004 SBC Championships in Bowling Green. This will mark the third straight game in the series played in Murfreesboro.

SEASON NOTES

GIVENS VOTED PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior Chrissy Givens was voted the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Week on January 15 after averaging 30.0 points in two victories and helping the Blue Raiders extend their winning streak to 14 games. It is the third SBC Player of the Week honor for Givens this season and the fourth by a Blue Raider. Givens averaged 30.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 4.5 assists per game in Middle Tennessee victories over Arkansas State and at Arkansas-Little Rock. The senior netted 27 points with six assists and five steals in an 82-54 victory over then Western Division leader Arkansas State on January 18. She was 9-for-16 from the field and 9-of-10 at the foul line. In a 75-62 triumph at UALR, Givens scored a season-high 33 points on 13-of-22 shooting and added six rebounds.

GIVENS, TEAM SET STEALS RECORD: Senior Chrissy Givens set an individual record and the Blue Raiders broke the team mark for steals in a game last Saturday at New Orleans. Givens recorded 11 thefts, all in the first half, besting the previous mark of nine held by both Givens (Eastern Kentucky, 11/25/05) and Sherry Tucker (Austin Peay, 2/20/95). Givens came within three steals of tying the NCAA record. As a team, Middle Tennessee broke the single-game school mark for steals in a game as well with 28, besting the old mark of 27 set against San Jose State on 12/19/91. In the last four games, Middle Tennessee has 83 steals, or 20.8 per game.

GIVENS ADDS ANOTHER DOUBLE-DOUBLE: Middle Tennessee senior Chrissy Givens recorded her 10th career double-double at New Orleans, posting 17 points and a school-record 11 steals. The Monroe, La., native had all 11 steals in the first half and played just 22 minutes in the contest. It was her fourth double-double this season and the first in her career with double-figure points and steals. Givens posted her ninth career double-double and third this season with 13 points and 11 rebounds on January 6 against Troy in just 26 minutes of action. She posted 23 points and 13 rebounds in the November 18 victory over Maine and had 22 points and 11 boards in a victory at Tennessee Tech on November 29. A full listing of all career double-doubles for current Middle Tennessee players appears on page 3 of these notes.

DECEMBER A MONTH TO REMEMBER: Middle Tennessee posted a 6-0 month of December this season, posting a monumental victory for the program along the way. The Blue Raiders had previously enjoyed only one other undefeated month of December, going 4-0 under head coach Pat Jones in the program's second year of varsity play in 1976-77. Middle Tennessee's win at eighthranked Georgia on December 7 was the first-ever triumph over a Top 10-ranked opponent and the program's first road win over a ranked foe. It was the first victory against Georgia in 12 tries in the history of the program and only the fourth regular season triumph over a ranked foe in the program's 31 years of varsity basketball (November 24, 1995, No. 20/23 Ole Miss, 88-86; December 3, 1988, NR/24 Clemson, 69-64). Middle Tennessee's only other victories against ranked competition both came in the NCAA Tournament, versus No. 12/11 North Carolina (March 21, 2004, 67-62 in South Bend, Ind.) and against No. 21/22 North Carolina State (March 19, 2005, 60-58 in Dallas, Texas).

HOLT COMES UP BIG AGAINST ODU: Junior Amber Holt posted another eye-opening performance against a quality opponent in an 86-71 victory over Old Dominion on December 19, tallying a game-high 27 points with eight rebounds in 40 minutes of action. Holt was 8-for-17 from the field, including 5-of-8 in the second half, and made 10-of-12 free throws in the contest. The Duluth, Ga., native has played her best in some of Middle Tennessee's biggest games this season, scoring 28 points in her first-ever game as a Blue Raider against top-ranked Maryland in the season opener and netting 21 points in the victory at No. 8 Georgia, including 15 in the second half.

HOLT RECORDS PAIR OF DOUBLE-DOUBLES: Junior Amber Holt has been one of the main cogs in the Middle Tennessee success this season, recording a pair of double-doubles and leading the Blue Raiders in either points and/or rebounds in 10 of the 18 games. Holt was the first to accomplish the double-double feat this season with 19 points and 10 rebounds against South Dakota State on November 13, just her second game as a Blue Raider. The Duluth, Ga., native then had 26 points and 10 boards versus Chattanooga on November 24. Senior Chrissy Givens has added four double-doubles this season as well. In the last two years the Blue Raiders have posted seven double-doubles as a team in each campaign and had 14 in 2003-04.

GIVENS EARNS SECOND PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR THIS SEASON: Middle Tennessee's Chrissy Givens was voted the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Week on December 12 after helping the Blue Raiders defeat then eighth-ranked Georgia. Givens netted 25 points on 10-of-18 shooting, grabbed five rebounds and handed

Givens Named to Preseason Naismith List

Middle Tennessee senior Chrissy Givens was one of 50 players named to the Naismith Trophy Preseason List announced December 11. The award is presented by Cingular Wireless and the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The Naismith Trophy is the most prestigious national award presented annually to the men's and women's college basketball players of the year. The Top 50 list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, comprised of leading basketball journalists, coaches and administrators from around the country. The board based its preseason criteria on player performances from last season and expectations for the 2006-07 season. In January, the Board of Selectors will narrow its preseason list to the Top 30 players in the nation. Those players, and others who distinguish themselves throughout the season, will be eligible for the final ballot in March. out three assists in 40 minutes of action in a 70-62 victory over Georgia on December 7 in Athens. The victory was the first over a Top 10-ranked opponent in program history and the first road win over a ranked foe in school history. Givens scored 13 points in the first half and 12 more in the second, as the Blue Raiders were behind for just over a minute in the second half en route to the victory. Givens has poured in 14 points against top-ranked Maryland, 26 at No. 4 Tennessee and 25 against Georgia in Middle Tennessee's three contests this season against ranked opponents, all in the Top 10. It is the third SBC Player of the Week honor this season for Middle Tennessee, with junior Amber Holt garnering the honor on November 14 and Givens earning the accolade on November 21.

HITTING THE CENTURY MARK: Middle Tennessee recorded its 25th 100-point game in school history and its first since 1996 in the 103-59 win over Louisiana-Monroe on December 17. The last time the Blue Raiders topped the 100-point mark was on February 19, 1996, in a 108-75 win over Morehead State. Middle Tennessee is now a perfect 25-0 when scoring 100 or more points in a game. The Blue Raiders are 16-0 when scoring 100 against a conference opponent.

WIN AT GEORGIA RANKS AS ALL-TIME BEST: Middle Tennessee's victory at Georgia on December 7 was perhaps the biggest in school history as far as the numbers go. It was the Blue Raiders first-ever triumph over a Top 10-ranked opponent and the program's first road win over a ranked foe. It was the first victory against Georgia in 12 tries in the history of the program and only the third regular season triumph over a ranked foe in the program's 31 years of varsity basketball (November 24, 1995, 20/23 Ole Miss, 88-86; December 3, 1988, NR/24 Clemson, 69-64). Middle Tennessee's only other victories against ranked competition both came in the NCAA Tournament, versus 12th-ranked North Carolina (March 21, 2004, 67-62 in South Bend, Ind.) and against 21st-ranked N.C. State (March 19, 2005, 60-58 in Dallas, Texas).

HOLT RETURNS HOME VICTORIOUS: Junior Amber Holt returned to her home state and played one of her best games of the season at Georgia on December 7, netting 21 points, including 15 in the second half, along with four rebounds, three assists and four steals. She also helped limit Georgia All-American Tasha Humphrey to only seven points and six shots in the contest. It was Holt's fourth 20-plus point game of the season and second against a ranked opponent after netting 28 versus top-ranked Maryland in the season opener.

GIVENS VOTED PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Middle Tennessee senior Chrissy Givens was voted the Sun Belt Player of the Week on November 21 after helping the Blue Raiders to back-to-back victories and claiming the Most Valuable Player award at the Subway Classic in Minneapolis, Minn. Givens was named MVP after the Blue Raiders posted wins over Maine and host Minnesota to win the four-team tournament. Givens posted 23 points against Maine and 25 versus Minnesota. The Monroe, La., native also tallied 20 rebounds, 13 assists and six steals in the two contests. She was 9-of-14 from the field in the first half against Minnesota for 18 points, as Middle Tennessee built a 14-point halftime edge. The loss for Minnesota was just the second nonconference home loss for UM under fifth-year head coach Pam Borton. The other loss came in December 2004 to topranked LSU. Givens won the SBC POW award three times last season and joined teammate Amber Holt as

the SBC Player of the Week after Holt garnered the accolade on November 14.

GIVENS, ORR MAKE ALL-TOURNAMENT: Senior Chrissy Givens and junior Starr Orr were both named to the All-Tournament team at the Subway Classic in Minneapolis, Minn., and Givens was awarded the Most Valuable Player trophy as well in the four-team tournament November 18-19. Givens posted games with 23 and 25 points in wins over Maine and host Minnesota, respectively, and tallied 20 rebounds, 13 assists and six steals in the two contests. Orr was all over the floor in both outings, netting 12 points versus Maine and a career-high 14 against Minnesota as well as grabbing 15 rebounds with 11 assists and four steals in the two games. It marks the first time Middle Tennessee has won two games in a tournament besides the conference championships since December 21-22, 2000, at the UCF Classic in Orlando, Fla., and just the 15th time in 52 in-season tournaments in the history of the program that the Blue Raiders won a pair games.

NEWCOMER HOLT VOTED PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Middle Tennessee junior Amber Holt was voted the Sun Belt Player of the Week on Nov. 14 after leading the Blue Raiders in a pair of contests. Holt averaged 23.5 points and 9.0 rebounds in Middle Tennessee's two games, versus No. 1 Maryland and South Dakota State. She also added three assists, two blocks and five steals in the two outings. Against the defending national champion Terrapins, Holt tallied 28 points on 11-of-24 shooting with eight rebounds. Her 15 first-half points kept the Blue Raiders in the contest when the Terrapins threatened to run away with the game. Against SDSU, Holt scored 19 points and added 10 boards for her first career double-double. She was 14-of-16 at the foul line as well in the two games. The Duluth, Ga., native became the 15th Middle Tennessee player to earn POW honors since joining the Sun Belt and the sixth different Blue Raider to garner the ac-

BLUE RAIDERS SET ATTENDANCE RECORD: Middle Tennessee set a new single-game record with a crowd of 10,010 for the season-opening contest versus No. 1-ranked Maryland at Murphy Center on Friday, November 10. The attendance shattered the old mark of 4,813 set March 7, 2006, versus Western Kentucky in the championship game of the Sun Belt Tournament. Middle Tennessee averaged 2,699 for 16 home dates during the 2005-06 season and led the nation in attendance increase last year with a more than 300 percent increase. The attendance mark of 10,010 is the 15th most to ever see a basketball game in the 11,500-seat Murphy Center and the third most to ever attend a women's basketball contest in Sun Belt Conference history.

The State Farm Wade Trophy Committee decided unanimously on January 16 to add Baylor's Bernice Mosby, Duke's Abbey Waner, Middle Tennessee's Chrissy Givens and Cal-Berkley's Ashley Walker to the State Farm 2006-07 Wade Watch List. The four will be added to the list of 25 players who were selected during the preseason. The four players have been added due to their consistent play through midseason. Baylor's Mosby leads the Bears, averaging 18.7 points and 9.3 rebounds per game. Duke's Waner averages 14.3 points per game at midseason, leading the top-ranked Blue Devils. The sophomore joins senior teammates, Allison Bales and Lindsey Harding, on the State Farm Wade Watch List. Givens joins the list averaging 22.1 points per game. Her scoring ranks first on the team and second in the Sun Belt Conference. Cal's Walker is having a sensational sophomore season, averaging 17.8 points and 8.6 rebounds per game. WOMEN SIGN THREE TO LETTERS-OF-INTENT: Middle Tennessee women's basketball coach Rick Insell announced the signing of T'Qwana Pendergrast, Emily Queen and Anne Marie Lanning to national letters-of-intent on Thursday, November 9, during the fall signing period. Pendergrast (Nashville) and Lanning (Murfreesboro) both hail from the Midstate, while Queen resides in Ashland, Ky.

Pendergrast attended Maplewood High School in Nashville and is a sophomore at Motlow State Community College in Tullahoma, Tenn., this season, where she is a First Team NJCAA Preseason All-America honoree. She averaged 20.1 points, 11.0 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 1.7 steals as a freshman at Motlow in helping the Lady Bucks to a 25-4 overall mark last season. Motlow finished 2005-06 ranked 18th nationally.

Queen has earned Second Team All-State honors as a sophomore and junior at Rose Hill Christian, helping her team to a state runner-up finish in 2006. She garnered Sweet Sixteen All-Tournament and All "A" State Tournament honors last season and was voted All-District, All-Region and All-Area each of the last two seasons. The 6-foot-2 all-everything has scored 2,311 points and grabbed 1,194 rebounds in her three seasons, including single-game school records of 46 points, 7-of-11 3-pointers and 26 rebounds. She even posted one game with a quadruple double of 26 points, 11 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals. One more accolade for Queen - her team was the first girls small school in history to make the finals of the Kentucky State Tournament, where they lost to Lexington Catholic.

Lanning was named the *Daily News Journal* and District 7-AAA Player of the Year in 2005 at Riverdale High School in Murfreesboro. She was garnered All-District, All-Region and All-State accolades the past two years as well as Honorable Mention All-America from *Street & Smith's*. Lanning averaged 18.5 points, 2.2 assists and 1.9 steals last season, shooting 63.8 percent from the field, 34.4 percent from 3-point range and 84.7 percent from the free throw line.

GIVENS PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR: Senior Chrissy Givens was voted the Sun Belt Preseason Player of the Year by the league coaches and media at the conference media days at the end of October. The Monroe, La., native was also voted to the Preseason All- Sun Belt First Team. The honor comes after the 5-11 guard was voted Sun Belt Player of the Year for the 2005-06 season. She was also voted Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Year and Sun Belt Championships Most Outstanding Player. She is just the second player in Sun Belt Conference history to win all three awards in the same season. Givens' preseason honor is the second time in school history a Blue Raider women's basketball player was awarded the Preseason POY honor. In 2004 former Middle Tennessee standout Patrice Holmes was voted Sun Belt Preseason Player of the Year.

BLUE RAIDERS TOPS IN THE EAST: For the second time since joining the Sun Belt, Middle Tennessee has been tabbed to finish first in the Sun Belt preseason poll in the Eastern Division. The Blue Raiders received 74 points and nine first-place votes to take the top spot in the Eastern Division in a poll of the league's coaches prior to SBC Media Days. Middle Tennessee was also picked to finish first in 2004.

HORTON SECOND TEAM: Krystle Horton was voted to the Preseason All-Sun Belt Second Team in a poll of the

Each year the University of Wisconsin media relations office has compiled an unofficial attendance mark for women's basketball programs around the country. LAST TIME OUT FOR MIDDLE TENNESSEE

Cold start, hot finish Lady Raider shooters find the range after halftime By MONTE HALE JR. hale@dnj.com

MURFREESBORO, Tenn. -- It looked like MTSU might die by the 3-pointer against Louisiana-Lafayette Sunday afternoon.

However, after a horrific shooting performance in the first half, the No. 19-ranked Lady Raiders erupted with a second-half scoring frenzy that propelled them to a 84-57 victory before a crowd of 5,228 at Murphy Center.

MTSU missed its first nine 3-point attempts and made only 3-of-23 in the first half. However, the Lady Raiders made 9-of-25 in the second half. The Lady Raiders set a school record with 48 3-point attempts.

"Yes, we did address it at the half," MTSU coach Rick Insell said of his club shooting 3-of-23 from 3-point range in the opening half. "Our best two shooters (Johnna Abney and Brandi Brown) were 1-of-11.

"We forced a couple, but we're going to keep shooting them. That's part of our game."

MTSU won its 16th consecutive game, which set a school record, and improved to 19-3 overall and 11-0 in the Sun Belt Conference. UL-Lafayette dropped to 17-6 and 0.2

"It's a great win," Insell said. "I think we've been a little tired, but hopefully we're over that. We're just glad to be back at home."

Leading just 33-29 at halftime, the Lady Raiders opened the second half with an 18-5 run to take a 51-34 lead with 15:23 remaining.

"Coach gave us an earful at halftime and we knew it was coming," said MTSU senior guard Chrissy Givens, who led the Lady Raiders with 23 points and eight rebounds. "We weren't playing our game, but we came out in the second half and Krystle (Horton) got a big steal and got us going."

Horton stole the ball from UL-Lafayette's Yolanda Jones on the Ragin' Cajuns' first possession of the second half and drove in for a layup to give MTSU a six-point cushion.

Freshman guard Chelsia Lymon hit consecutive 3-pointers, while Abney hit one and Brown two on three straight possessions to give the Lady Raiders a 57-34 lead with 13:10 left.

"Our plan was to make them shoot from the perimeter," said UL-Lafayette coach J. Kelley Hall. "We knew they're capable of making them, but we felt if they hit 10 or 11 we could still win. We've given up 11 and won this year. We felt like we should have had a lead at halftime.

"However, it was the other things. We had 29 turnovers, which is not like us, but you've got to give Middle [Tennessee] credit. They dictated the tempo and made us play too fast."

MTSU held UL-Lafayette to 39 percent shooting and scored 30 points off the 29 Ragin' Cajuns floor mistakes.

Horton was also a key factor defensively, holding Jones to only 10 points — eight below her average.

"We knew she was a good player and we were well prepared," Horton said. "We knew she was capable of taking one on five, but we did a good job on her."

Horton had a double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds. She also had three assists and three steals.

"Thirteen points and 12 rebounds ... I'll take that every night," added Insell.

Brown added 15 points in only 14 minutes of play, while Lymon had nine points and Amber Holt eight.

POSTGAME NOTES

HORTON MAKES 100TH START: Senior Krystle Horton started her 100th career game in the win over Louisiana-Lafayette to move into a tie for eighth place on the all-time list with Tia Stovall (2003-06). With three more starts she will tie Tawanya Mucker for seventh place. It was also the Murfreesboro native's 117th career game played, which ties her with Cortney Neeley for fourth place all-time.

STATUS QUO: Known for her all-around play, senior Chrissy Givens did not let anyone down on Sunday against Louisiana-Lafayette, as she filled the stat sheet once again. The Monroe, La., native notched her fourth straight 20-point game after tallying 23 points, eight rebounds, four assists and three steals in 32 minutes. Givens, who recorded the 33rd 20-point game of her career, also went over the 100 assist mark for the third straight year.

BLUE RAIDERS SET SCHOOL RECORD: Middle Tennessee attempted a school record 48 3-pointers in the win over Louisiana-Lafayette, while connecting on 12. The 48 attempts was just four shy of the NCAA record of 52 attempts set by Cal Poly in 1999 and Alabama in 1995.

STREAK REACHES 16: The Blue Raiders ran their winning streak to a school-record 16 in a row with Sunday's win over Western Division-leading Louisiana-Lafayette. The current streak is tied with Stanford for the third longest nationally behind North Carolina (22) and Duke (21).

26 AND COUNTING: Middle Tennessee's home dominance of Sun Belt foes continued against Louisiana-Lafayette, as the Blue Raiders won their 26th game in a row versus league foes at Murphy Center. The last time Middle Tennessee dropped a conference home game was February 5, 2004, in double overtime against Western Kentucky. Overall, the Blue Raiders have won 30 of their last 31 home conference games and head coach Rick Insell is a perfect 15-0 at the Glass House against SBC competition.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE: Krystle Horton continued her solid all-around play against Louisiana-Lafayette, as she recorded the 12th double-double of her career. The Murfreesboro, Tenn., native had 13 points and equaled her career-high with 12 rebounds to key the Blue Raiders' win over the Ragin' Cajuns. The senior also nailed her first 3-pointer of the season and the fourth of her career when she connected late in the second half.

ONE SHY FOR 15: Middle Tennessee will enter Wednesday night's game against Denver seeking its 15th 20-win season in school history. The Blue Raiders currently stand 19-3 overall and need one more win to secure the program's fourth straight 20-win campaign.

QUICK HITTERS: Krystle Horton made her first 3-pointer of the season and just the fourth of her career ... Brandi Brown attempted a career-high 14 3-pointers which ties for fifth on the single-game list ... Both Krystle Horton and Chrissy Givens recorded their 71st double-figure scoring games against UL to tie for eighth on the all-time list ... Middle Tennessee recorded its 11th game of scoring 80 or more points and is 11-0 in those games ... Middle Tennessee is now a perfect 11-0 all-time against UL ... Middle Tennessee has now won its 11 SBC games by an average margin of 27.5 points per contest ... The Blue Raiders shot just 37.3 percent from the field against UL, the worst shooting performance this season for the Blue Raiders since the second game of the year against South Dakota State (.308) ... The Blue Raiders have forced an average of 33.7 turnovers (101) in their last three home games combined ... Seven different players hit a 3-pointer for the Blue Raiders against UL ... Chelsia Lymon equaled her career-high with three made 3-pointers.

Head Coach Rick Insell



Rick Insell made a huge splash is first year at the helm of the Middle Tennessee women's basketball program, guiding the Middle Tennessee program to its third consecutive Sun Belt Championship and doing so in front of a

record-setting home crowd in the finals of the SBC Tournament.

Insell can now drop the title former high school coach and add his name to the list of Middle Tennessee coaches with conference titles. He directed one of the most thrilling comebacks in Sun Belt Tournament history, leading Middle Tennessee to an 84-73 win over Western Kentucky after being down by as many as 14 points in the first half.

Insell's first season at the helm of his alma mater also included a Top 10 recruiting class for the 2006-07 season and an unprecedented third consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Insell also developed one of the most prolific scorers for a single-season in school history in Chrissy Givens, who registered 667 points, the second most in a season on the all-time scoring list. It also makes Givens one of just five players to score 600 or more points in a season as a Blue Raider.

The 2005-06 campaign also saw another first in program history as three players - Givens, Tia Stovall and Krystle Horton - all joined the 1,000-point club. This marks the first time in school history three current players all were represented on the prestigious list, and the Blue Raiders were one of only four teams in the 2006 NCAA Tournament to boast such an honor

Insell's biggest influence may have come at the turnstiles, where the Blue Raiders averaged 2,699 fans per outing in 2005-06, a 300 percent increase over the previous season and the largest increase in the NCAA for 2005-06.

Middle Tennessee notched one of its biggest wins of the season when the Blue Raiders shocked Big 10 powerhouse Penn State, 79-65, in the UAB Blaze Tournament in December.

A 1977 graduate of Middle Tennessee, Insell built a high school girls basketball dynasty at nearby Shelbyville Central High School, where he guided the Golden Eaglettes to a record 10 TSSAA Class AAA state championships and two USA Today national championships (1989, 1991) as he compiled a sparkling 775-148 worksheet during his 28-year tenure. Insell was named USA Today National High School Coach of the Year in 1989 and 1991 and he also was been named Converse National High

- Appeared on *Dateline* on December 26, 2004. The program produced a one-hour segment on Insell, focusing on him and his Shelbyville Eaglettes. The program was shown internationally.
- March 22, 2003 Rick Insell was inducted into the Tennessee Secondary School Athletic Association Hall of Fame.
- Insell and the Eaglettes received a special invitation to the Oval Office by President George H. Bush for academic and athletic achievement.
- In 1989, ESPN did a feature story on the Shelbyville Eaglettes that aired nationally several times. The story won the National Television Journalism Award later that year. It was the first of several stories ESPN did on Insell and his team.
- In 1992, Rick Insell was named Head Coach of the Girls High School All-American Game and from 1992-96 was a member of the All-American Selection Committee. He became the chairman of the All-American Selection Committee in 1996 and began serving as an advisor in 1999.
- Insell was named to the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors as High School Representative in 2001.

School Coach of the Year on two occasions (1990, 1992). Insell called the women's basketball position at Middle Tennessee his "dream job".

"Dreams do come true," Insell said after Director of Athletics Chris Massaro announced his hiring on May 18, 2005. "It's something you think about. I'm a coach and it's all I've ever done, from elementary to junior high to junior pro, AAU and high school. To be able to come on board at Middle Tennessee, a Division I school, that's a dream come true, not only for me, but for all of the high school coaches and junior high coaches across the country and it says if you stay in there long enough and dream big enough, one day it will eventually happen."

Insell said Middle Tennessee will be a pressing basketball team on defense and force the issue, and he added that the Blue Raiders would back down from no one on the recruiting trail.

"We are going after the best players in the state of Tennessee every year," Insell said. "If Tennessee or Vanderbilt is after them, then Middle Tennessee is going to be after them, too. We will recruit alongside of them. We are not going to be intimidated, nor will we back down because they are in the Southeastern Conference. We are Division I and they are Division I. We are going to use all of our contacts."

A name synonymous with high school girls basketball in Tennessee, Insell's teams hold the Tennessee state records for consecutive wins with 110, consecutive state titles with four (1989-1992), most state championships for a coach with 10 (1986, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1995, 2000, 2001, 2003 and 2004), and his 1990 Golden Eaglette squad was named the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame Team of the Year, the first high school team so honored.

Under Insell's guidance, Shelbyville Central High School won 23 district championships, 16 regional championships and appeared in the Class AAA state championship game a remarkable 15 times, winning 10. Insell developed six Tennessee Class AAA Miss Basketball Award recipients, 15 high school All-Americans and 57 of his players received either athletic or academic scholarships to continue their careers at the collegiate level.

While Insell built a basketball dynasty at Shelbyville during his time there, he also made sure his players got the job done in the classroom, as evidenced by his teams receiving the TSSAA Distinguished Award for Academic Success from 1989-2000, an award based on team GPA. The lowest cumulative GPA at Shelbyville from 1989-00 was 3.4 and the highest was 3.98.

Additionally, Insell's Shelbyville team received a special invitation to the Oval Office by President George Bush for academic and athletic achievement and his teams also have been honored in the United States Senate and House of Representatives, the Tennessee State House and Senate and by two Tennessee Governors.

Insell is married to Debbie and the couple have three sons, Tom, Kyle and Matt.

MTSU proved Friday night that it, too, has closed the gap in terms of competing with the top teams in the nation.

However, MTSU also found out why Maryland is the defending national champion as it overcame a five-point deficit with 5:14 remaining and stormed back to defeat the Blue Raiders 80-76 before a women's record crowd of 10,010 at Murphy Center.

"You can see why their national champions," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "They did the same thing in the finals last year against Duke. They've got great players, but we've got great players. They didn't luck into winning the national championship.

MTSU led the Terrapins 72-67 with 5:14 left in the game after freshman guard Chelsia Lymon scored on a three-point play. However, after a Maryland timeout, it reeled off a 13-4 run to close the game and hold on to its preseason No. 1 national ranking.

"I want to thank Middle Tennessee," said Maryland coach Brenda Frese. "They made us a better basketball team tonight. It was tremendous, it was one of the better college basketball games I've ever been a part of. Middle Tennessee is going to be very, very good. They obviously showed it and they've got to be excited about what's

The Blue Raiders trailed 76-74 with less than a mintue left, but Amber Holt's jumper was off the mark. On Maryland's next possession, All-American Crystal Langhorne scored on an offensive putback to with 25 seconds left to seal the victory.

Holt made a sterling debut, scoring 28 points and pulling down eight rebounds, and freshman point guard Chelsia Lymon — the Gatorade player of the year in Kentucky last year — scored 13 points in only nine minutes of play.

Maryland was led by Coleman with 19 points and 14 rebounds, while Langhorne had 16 points and 11 rebounds.

While the Blue Raiders pushed Maryland to the limit, it didn't look like it that way early. Coming out of the final media timeout in the fi rst half with 2:55 remaining, MTSU trailed 36-23. Maryland had hit 15 of its first 21 shots for a sizzling 71-percent clip, while MTSU had made only 9 of its first 27 attempts.

However, after Maryland took its biggest lead of the half at 38-23, MTSU scored the final 10 points to close within 38-33 at intermission. Holt scored six in a row and Givens drove in the length of the floor in just six seconds and hit a layup to pull the Blue Raiders within

Maryland shot 61 percent from the fi eld and outrebounded MTSU 37-29. The Blue Raiders shot 42 percent and forced 23 Terrapin turnovers.

After playing No. 1 ranked Maryland to within four points Friday night and garnering 12 votes in the Top 25 poll Monday, MTSU did indeed get a dose of reality.

"They came in here and kicked our butts," said MTSU senior guard Chrissy Givens. "We took Maryland to four points and maybe we thought we were too good, but they kicked our butts. They did it here two years ago

MTSU struggled offensively throughout, but tied the score at 52-52 with 6:52 left when Givens scored and converted a 3-point

However, MTSU was outscored 20-9 down the stretch as it was unable to run its half-court offense.

MTSU shot only 32 percent from the field, while the Jackrabbits shot 56 percent and outrebounded the Blue Raiders 37-29.

MTSU was led by junior Amber Holt's 19 points, while Givens had 17. However, the duo combined to go just 12-of-41 from the

South Dakota State hit 17-of-20 free throws after getting into the 1-and-1 with 10:39 left in the game. The Jackrabbits also hit 8-of-14 from behind the 3-point arc.

"There was no pressure for us to win this game," said SDSU coach Aaron Johnston. "We tried a basic offense. We kept it simple and told the kids about being strong and trying to drive.

"We talked about trying to pick up some fouls in the second half. If they are going to put that much pressure on us we've got to turn that pressure on them and get to the free throw line."

MTSU led 12-7 with 14:01 left in the first half but went more than four minutes without a point and found itself trailing 19-12.

The Blue Raiders scored eight unanswered points during one stretch to take a 24-22 lead, but SDSU closed the final four minutes of the half with a 5-2 run to take a 27-26 halftime lead.

MTSU shot just 32 percent in the first half (10-of-31), while the Jackrabbits hit 11-of-24 (46 percent).

SDSU had 13 first-halt turnovers, but MTSU could only turn them into six points.

Foul problems at the post also hurt MTSU as senior Krystle Horton picked up her second personal in less than three minutes, while sophomore Lakira Boyd was whistled for her second with 13:48 remaining before halftime.

Chrissy Givens and Amber Holt both scored 23 points and Starr Orr added 12 in only her 10th career start, leading Middle Tennessee to an 87-60 victory over Maine Saturday in the Subway Classic.

Givens recorded her sixth career double-double, grabbing 13 rebounds and adding six assists and three steals. Holt tallied 18 of her 23 points in the first half when the Blue Raiders opened the lead to as many as 26 points.

Orr did exactly what she was inserted in the lineup to do, score and rebound (seven), and the Danville, Ala., native also had five assists in 27 minutes of action.

The Blue Raiders started the game with a 12-3 run and never looked back in the first half, taking a 47-26 advantage at the break. Holt posted 18 points and Givens 13 in the opening half, but it was a staunch defense and improved rebounding that were the biggest differences, limiting Maine to just 38 percent shooting (6-for-16) and a 30-9 rebounding margin for Middle Tennessee.

The Blackbears (1-1) had just six field goals in the first period, including a stretch of more than 10 minutes without a bucket. Middle Tennessee worked through foul problems in the opening 20 minutes as well, with 17 fouls whistled on the Blue Raiders allowing Maine to shoot 22 free throws

Middle Tennessee led 20-12 after a Maine 3-point play from Abby Greene with 10:48 to play in the first half. The Blue Raiders then scored 23 of the next 28 points in the contest over a six-minute stretch, with Holt contributing nine points and Givens six during the

In the second half the Blue Raiders led by as many as 23 and the lead was never less than 16. Middle Tennessee knocked down seven 3-pointers in the second half and 12 for the game, as well as outrebounding the Blackbears Maine, 48-24, for the game.

"We shot the ball better in the first half and really hit the boards hard, one of things we've been working on in practice," head coach Rick Insell said. "We came out with more focus, especially early. We turned up the heat in practice and these young ladies responded

"Our depth was really a factor as well. We got in some foul trouble in the first half, but this year we're able to bring Chelsia [Lymon], Jackie [Pickel], LaCondra [Mason] and LaToya [Brown] off the bench at the quard spots and even Brandi [Brown] if we need her."

Holt added seven rebounds in the win and was 6-of-12 from the floor and 9-for-12 from the foul line.

Chrissy Givens scored 18 first-half points and helped Middle Tennessee build a 25-point lead early in the second half en route to a 79-61 victory over host Minnesota in the championship game of the Subway Classic Sunday at Williams Arena.

Givens, voted the tournament's most valuable player, was almost unstoppable in the first half, going 9-of-14 from the field, leading the Blue Raiders to a 14-point halftime lead.

Givens and teammate Starr Orr were both selected to the Subway Classic All-Tournament team.

Freshman Chelsia Lymon came off the bench in the opening minutes of the second half and provided an offensive spark, knocking down a pair of 3-pointers and a lay-up to help extend the lead to 57-34. Orr followed with eight consecutive points of her own, including another pair of trifectas, stretching the Middle Tennessee advantage to 65-38.

Minnesota made a run during the half when Middle Tennessee went without a bucket for more than six minutes, but the Golden Gophers never got closer than 14 after the break.

Givens led all scorers with 25 points while adding seven rebounds and seven assists in 40 minutes of action. Orr, in one of her best games as a Blue Raider, added 14 points, eight rebounds, six assists, and three steals.

Senior Krystle Horton scored the first three baskets of the game for the Blue Raiders and Johnna Abney knocked down a pair of 3-pointers, as Middle Tennessee quieted the crowd of 5,639 en route to an early 12-6 lead. Givens scored the next eight on a host of short jumpers and lay-ups for a 20-12 MT advantage with 7:51 to go in the

All of this was in the midst of an 18-4 run over a seven-minute stretch that put the Blue Raiders ahead, 34-14. The Blue Raiders built the lead by out-hustling the Golden Gophers, with one series of plays seeing Amber Holt make a steal but miss a break-away lay-

Not to be discouraged, Holt came racing back down the floor, made another steal falling out of bounds, saved the ball to Orr, who executed a 2-on-1 with Givens for another lay-up. The Blue Raiders built a 32-14 advantage at that point and led 38-24 at the halftime break even after a cheap lay-up at the buzzer by Minnesota's Kelly Roysland.

Givens had 18 in the first half and the Blue Raiders forced 18 Minnesota turnovers in the first 20 minutes and also limited the Golden Gophers to just 35 percent shooting from the floor while shooting 58 percent themselves.

It was a pick your poison night for Chattanooga at Murphy Center Friday.

Whether the Lady Mocs employed a man-to-man defense or a zone, it didn't matter, as MTSU broke down both en route to a 98-69 victory before a crowd of 2.524

MTSU (3-2) shot 52 percent and hit 12 3-pointers, equaling a season high, as it won its third straight game and snapped a two-game losing streak at Murphy Center.

The 98 points were the most scored by MTSU under secondyear coach Rick Insell, whose team lost 76-66 at Chattanooga last season

"We're playing a little better offensively," Insell said, 'but I wasn't as pleased with our defense tonight. We did a better job as the game went on, but not good enough if we're going to get to where we want to be."

The duo of senior guard Chrissy Givens and junior forward Amber Holt were devastating, as they combined for 55 points and 17 rebounds. Givens finished with 29 points and seven rebounds, while Holt had 26 points and 10 boards.

The offensive onslaught was a welcomed sight after the Blue Raiders had hit 30 percent their first two home games against Maryland and South Dakota State.

Coming out of the eight-minute timeout trailing 24-21, Chattanooga went to a zone defense, which played right into MTSU's hands.

Freshman guard Jackie Pickel hit back-to-back 3-pointers, which spearheaded a 14-4 run that gave MTSU a 38-25 lead with 4:33 left before halfilme.

Chattanooga pulled to within seven in less than a minute, but the Blue Raiders closed the half with a 12-7 run to take a 50-38 halftime lead at intermission.

Pickel finished with a season-high 15 points, hitting 5-of-7 from 3point range. Five different MTSU players hit at least one 3-pointer.

Both teams were plagued with foul problems in the first half, with Chattanooga being whistled for 13 and MTSU with 12.

Chattanooga's leading scorer, Alex Anderson (18 ppg), played only four minutes after picking up her second foul, while starters Brooke Hand and Kristen Spann each had three fouls.

MTSU sophomore guard Johnna Abney picked up three fouls in the first half, while Givens, Holt and Starr Orr each had two.

Givens scored MTSU's first eight points of the second half, and Abney followed with a 3-pointer to give the Blue Raiders a 61-44 advantage with 17:09 left.

MTSU outrebounded the Lady Mocs 40-28 and forced 21 turn-

MTSU was its own worst enemy Sunday, but the No. 4-ranked Tennessee Lady Vols had a lot to do with it.

Tennessee's stifling, trapping defense and impressive offensive talent was simply too much for MTSU, which suffered an 88-64 whipping before a crowd of 12,363 at Thompson Boling Arena.

MTSU dropped to 3-3, while Tennessee improved to 5-0.

"Tennessee is outstanding," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "We played hard, we didn't quit, but they just happen to be six inches taller than us at every position."

Leading just 16-15 with 11:57 remaining in the first half, Tennessee increased the intensity with its half-court trapping defense, which rendered MTSU helpless and helped the Lady Vols pull away for the easy victory.

Tennessee held MTSU scoreless for more than five minutes in the first half before Chrissy Givens hit two free throws at the 6:35 mark

However, the Lady Raiders stayed within striking distance, trailing only 26-19 before Tennessee closed the final 5:45 of the first half with a 23-8 run to take a 49-27 lead at intermission.

Tennessee shot a sizzling 64 percent in the first half, made 6-of-9 form 3-point range and created too many mismatch problems for the Lady Raiders.

MTSU committed 15 first-half turnovers that led to 20 Lady Vol points. The Lady Raiders had just five turnovers in the second half.

"Like coach said, they had girls six inches taller than us and they were able to shoot right over us," Givens said. "But we missed a couple of screens, I didn't get around a couple of screens and they made their 3-point shots. We weren't counting on that. I think rebounding hurt us and we needed to cut those second-chance points in both."

Givens led MTSU with 26 points, but got little offensive support. Junior forward Amber Holt, the Lady Raiders' second-leading scorer, didn't get her first points until 15:33 left in the game. She finished with eight

Lady Raider freshman Brandi Brown scored 12 points — all on 3-pointers — and MTSU hit a season-high 13 treys.

MTSU shot 45 percent overall and hit 8-of-15 from 3-point range in the second half and 50 percent overall.

"We didn't quit," Insel said. "They're a great basketball team. We're a good basketball team, although it might not have looked like it tonight. But we'll get better because of this game."

Tennessee was led by Sidney Spencer and Candace Parker with 16 points each. The Vols outrebounded MTSU 38-22 and were led by Parker's nine boards.

Tennessee Tech had the fight and grit, but athleticism and talent finally won out for MTSU's Lady Raiders Wednesday night.

Despite struggling for much of the first half, MTSU overcame the sloppy play and pulled away to defeat the Golden Eagles, 68-50, at Hooper Eblen Center.

"We didn't get off to a good start, but (Tennessee Tech) made some plays and that's a credit to them," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "I thought we settled down, though, and did what we needed to do. They played hard and we played hard, and it was a good

MTSU (4-3) was lethargic early and fell behind 16-10 to the pesky Golden Eagles, who didn't surrender the lead until 5:58 left before halftime.

The Lady Raiders used a 20-3 run to take a 30-19 lead and held a 32-23 halftime advantage

MTSU senior guard Chrissy Givens missed three shots to open the game and was pulled from the lineup. However, she responded upon her return by leading the Lady Raiders with 22 points, 11 rebounds and five assists.

"I'm a leader and I don't need to start a game like that," Givens said. "I know (Insell) was mad and I knew I was coming out. "When I came back in, I just tried to deflect balls, play defense and we all kind of gravitated to each other."

MTSU junior guard Starr Orr, recently inserted into the starting lineup, helped spark the first-half run with seven straight points on a short jumper, a steal and a layup and a 3-pointer.

"I haven't been playing too good lately," Orr said, "and coach told me I needed to step it up. When I got those steals, it got me going and then we started playing better. Our problem was we just couldn't knock our shots down early in the game. Once we hit a few, we got on a good roll."

MTSU hit just 37 percent from the field in the first half, but got into a better rhythm offensively in the second when it hit 11 of its first

Tennessee Tech stayed within 10 points until the 10-minute mark when the Lady Raiders used a 14-5 spurt to go ahead 62-43 with 6:59 remaining.

"I think our defensive tenacity got to them," Insell said. "They weren't really able to get into their sets much. I thought we stayed after them and wore them down."

Tennessee Tech shot just 39 percent in the second half and finished with 20 turnovers. The Lady Raiders outrebounded the Golden Eagles, 38-27.

Orr had 12 points, while junior Amber Holt and freshman Brandi Brown netted 10 apiece. MTSU hit 7-of-16 from 3-point range.

Tennessee Tech was led by Kendall Cavin with 15 points and Marissa Hensley with 11.

With Givens on the bench with three fouls at the halfway point of the first half, MTSU (5-3) not only maintained a double-digit lead, but extended it en route to hammering Austin Peay (2-6) 80-49 before a crowd of 3,204 at Murphy Center.

"We had a lead so there wasn't a lot of pressure on us," Insell said. "When you've got someone like Amber Holt who can step up, it also takes pressure off you.

"But overall we did a good job executing offensively and defensively tonight.

After Givens was whistled for her third foul with 10:32 left before intermission, she sat on the bench the remainder of the half and watched the Lady Raiders build an 18-8 advantage into a 40-18 halftime lead

"I was very comfortable sitting on the bench," Givens said. "Amber Holt picked it up, and our defense kept picking it up.

"[Austin Peay] beat our butts last year and it was like a vengeance. Once we got them down, we wanted to keep them down."

MTSU's relentless defense forced 19 first-half turnovers that led to 21 points, and Austin Peay continuously panicked when trying to break the press and when it did manage to set up in the half

We wanted to bring our practice to the game," said Holt, who had 19 points, nine rebounds and five steals. "We did that and they kept turning it over and turning it over."

The Lady Raiders picked up in the second half where the left off in the first, forcing four straight turnovers and building a 58-22 advantage with 13:50 left. MTSU led by as many as 36 points.

"It was an overall team victory," Insell said. "Last year we had an 18-point lead twice against them and lost the game. I think that is a lesson that has carried over, even into this year."

Rick Insell had a good feeling when MTSU's Lady Raiders left Murfreesboro Wednesday. Turns out he had a good reason to feel so confident

Senior guard Chrissy Givens scored 25 points and junior forward Amber Holt had 21 to lead MTSU to a stunning 70-62 victory over No. 8 Georgia Thursday night at Stegeman Coliseum.

"I felt when we got on the charter bus headed to Athens that we were going to win," Insell said. "I've never been in a game that I didn't think I could win, but I really felt if we came out and got after them, we had a chance to get a victory. This one is big. This one will go a long way in helping our program. It's going to help our RPI, too."

MTSU (6-3) forced Georgia (7-1) into 22 turnovers in beating the Lady Bulldogs for the first time in 12 tries. It was the Lady Raiders' first win in three games against Top 10 teams this year, including an 88-64 loss to No. 4 Tennessee on Nov. 26 and an 80-76 loss to No. 1 Maryland in the season opener.

"Middle Tennessee is a difficult team for us to match up with," Landers said. "They are essentially playing guards inside, and that creates some difficult matchups for us. Holt was a point guard in junior college, and she was playing the four (power forward)."

Cori Chambers led Georgia with 23 points, and Angel Robinson came off the bench to score 10.

Chambers hit a 3-point basket 28 seconds into the second half to put Georgia ahead 34-33, but it was the last time Georgia led.

The Lady Raiders mounted a 12-4 run to take a 49-40 lead with 11:24 to play after Holt hit a layup. Tasha Humphrey completed a 3-point play with 6:36 to go to bring Georgia to within 54-52, but that was as close as Georgia got.

Holt answered with four baskets in two minutes to spark MTSU to a 63-54 lead with 4:28 left. Georgia got to 67-62 when Robinson put in a follow-up, but the Lady Bulldogs didn't score again.

Georgia bolted to an 11-5 lead, led by three baskets from Chambers. But Holt sandwiched a couple of baskets around a Givens layup to tie it 11-11 with 14:07 to go in the half, and the game remained tight until the break.

MTSU forced Georgia into 12 first-half turnovers in building a 33-31 halftime lead. Georgia stayed in the game because of a 23-14 edge in rebounding and MTSU's 40 percent shooting. However, MTSU shot 50 percent in the second half.

Mason, a sophomore guard, scored nine points off the bench all on 3-pointers — in just 10 minutes of play. The Lady Raiders had just nine turnovers.

"We had some kids who just played their hearts out tonight," Insell said. "They cut the lead to two points, but we weren't fazed a bit and came right back down and scored. The look in (Georgia's) face was as if they couldn't believe it. What a team victory."

Chrissy Givens tied her season-high with 29 points to lead four double-figure scorers and Middle Tennessee overcame a sluggish start to both halves, forcing 29 turnovers in a 93-58 victory over South Alabama Thursday night at Mitchell Center.

South Alabama (5-5, 0-1 Sun Belt) began the game with a 13-4 run and started the second half with 12 straight points, but the Blue Raiders' defense was the big difference in the game, as the pressure forced 20 first-half turnovers by the Lady Jags and 29 in all.

Middle Tennessee (7-3, 1-0) freshman Brandi Brown finished with a career-high 17 points, hitting 5-of-8 from 3-point range, and Amber Holt added 16 points, as the Blue Raiders won the fourth straight in the series, including three in a row in Mobile. Senior Krystle Horton also scored 10 points, all in the second half, and added a team-high seven rebounds.

"The score is really not indicative of the game. We came out sluggish in both halves but I thought our 1-2-2 press bothered them and that was a big difference," head coach Rick Insell said. "We shot the ball well and what a night for Brandi Brown to come out and play well. She hit some three's and loosened up things for us."

Givens netted 17 of her 29 in the first half and had seven assists, four rebounds and four steals in 36 minutes of action. She tied her career-high with 14 made field goals. The Blue Raiders were 19-of-34 in both halves from the floor and turned the ball over just 12 times in the contest.

The Blue Raiders got off to a rough start and fell behind 13-4 in the first six minutes of the contest, but recovered with a 16-0 run over five minutes for a 20-13 edge. Givens and Holt both scored six points and Chelsia Lymon had four during the run.

The Blue Raiders turned up the pressure on defense after falling behind. South Alabama committed 10 turnovers during the Blue Raiders' run back into the game and had 20 first-half turnovers in all. Middle Tennessee outscored USA, 44-10, over the final 14 minutes of the half for a 48-23 lead at the break.

In the second half South Alabama tallied 12 consecutive points in less than four minutes until Givens hit a runner in the lane that drew a foul to end the run. Brown then hit her fourth 3-pointer of the contest and Starr Orr had two buckets, including one of the team's 10 3-pointers.

"I was relaxed tonight, ready to play and more focused," Brown said. "I was looking for my shot more, more offensive-minded, and I know [Coach Insell] would rather us take the shot than pass it up."

Johnna Abney started the scoring barrage and most everyone else joined in Sunday when MTSU ripped Louisiana-Monroe, 103-59, before a crowd of 2,317 at Murphy Center.

The sophomore point guard hit four straight 3-pointers in the first six minutes of the game, igniting a 61-point first half in which the Lady Raiders shot 67 percent (20-of-30) and made 8-of-11 3-pointers.

"My job is to get us into our offense, but if I'm open I'm going to shoot or I'll get in trouble," said Abney. "I had my shot and was open, so I just took them."

MTSU improved to 8-3 overall and 2-0 in the Sun Belt Conference, while ULM fell to 10-3 and 0-2.

MTSU's defense was relentless against the Warhawks, who could only get off 15 first-half shots and turned the ball over 20 times

The 103 points was the most MTSU has scored this season and the most it has tallied since beating Morehead State 108-75 in

MTSU didn't let up in the second half, building as big as a 50-point lead.

The Lady Raiders forced 27 turnovers, but didn't press in the second half.

"Defense is our main thing," Givens said. "Every night we go out trying to get better and do better. We're not there yet and we're not perfect, but we're reading each other and that could be dangerous."

Added Martin: "I am very disappointed in how we played. We didn't handle their press at hall. We're a pressing team and we should be able to handle it."

The 16 3-pointers made were the most this season and just two shy of a team record. Eight different Lady Raiders made at least one 3-pointer, while Abney and freshman Jackie Pickel hit four apiece. The Lady Raiders shot a sizzling 58 percent and made 59 percent (16-of-27) from 3-point range.

"Our girls played their game and that's what I'm proud of," Insell said. "We didn't worry about the score. We just went out and executed offensively and defensively."

Givens' 19 points led MTSÚ, while junior Amber Holt had 14 and Abney and Pickel 12 apiece. ULM was led by LaJeanna Howard with 16 points.

The Lady Raiders added another notch in that belt with an 86-71 victory over Old Dominion Tuesday night in front of 3,227 at the Murphy Center.

The win was the sixth in a row for MTSU and fourth this season — along with victories over Georgia, Minnesota and Louisiana-Monroe — over a former Final Four team.

MTSU overcame a rocky start to take control of what had been a back-and-forth game. Freshman Jackie Pickel came off the bench to knock down her first three 3-point attempts, and senior Krystle Horton had her best game of the season as the Lady Raiders improved to 9-3.

Horton scored a season-high 23 points, including 12 in the first half, as the senior from Riverdale almost single-handedly kept MTSU in the ballgame over the first 10 minutes.

The Lady Raiders shot just 32 percent in the first 20 minutes of the game, including hitting just eight of their first 28 attempts from the field. But on the strength of 13 first-half free throws and a five-point scoring flurry by Givens in the final minute, MTSU held a one-point lead (39-38) at intermission.

Old Dominion committed 16 first-half fouls and shot just five free throws in the first half.

MTSU gave itself some room early in the second with a 6-0 run to take a 45-38 lead. But ODU fought back, eventually tying the game at 51-51 on Tish Lyons' layup before taking a 54-53 lead on a 3-pointer by T.J. Jordan with 12:49 remaining in the game.

Two free throws by Lady Monarch point-guard Jazzmin Walters — who led the Lady Monarchs with 13 points — put ODU up 59-57 with just over eight-and-a-half minutes left.

Then the Jackie Pickel show started.

The 5-10 freshman from Cleveland connected on her first three attempts from long-range over a 2:40 span to turn a two-point deficit into a four-point lead with 5:56 remaining.

"That first shot is always huge," said Pickel, who knocked down four treys in Sunday's win over Louisiana-Monroe. "When I get in there and hit the first shot, it does a lot for my confidence, and tonight it really helped."

Pickel's long-range shooting sparked a 10-1 Blue Raider run over the next two-and-a-half minutes, which all but put the game away. Junior Amber Holt scored eight of her game-high 27 points in the final three minutes, including hitting 4-of-6 free throws.

The apparent blowout in the making didn't materialize, but MTSU's Lady Raiders nevertheless took round one in a battle of Sun Belt Conference heavyweights Wednesday night.

Paced by four players in double figures, MTSU built a big lead early, staved off a Western Kentucky rally and eventually subdued the Lady Toppers 76-62 before a crowd of 3,627 at Murphy Center.

"I thought overall it was the worst game we've played," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "We didn't shoot well. I don't know if it was the Christmas break, but I also think Western Kentucky had a lot to

MTSU, ranked 26th nationally in the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN coaches poll, improved to 10-3 overall and 3-0 in the Sun Belt Conference. Western Kentucky dropped to 6-4 and 2-1.

MTSU looked as if it was going to run way from the Lady Toppers as it led 46-29 with 15:07 remaining. However, Western Kentucky scored nine unanswered points and held the Lady Raiders scoreless for more than four minutes.

"It was a hard game and I think we both got tired," said MTSU senior forward Krystle Horton, who had 14 points. "With it being a conference game, you know it's going to be a game of runs. We kept our composure when they made their runs."

MTSU got the lead back to 16 points, 54-38, with 9:28 left, but Western Kentucky refused to wilt and had a chance to get the lead under 10 before the Lady Raiders used a 12-4 flurry to go up 70-54 with 3:12 left. Senior Chrissy Givens led the Lady Raiders with 19 points, while junior Amber Holt and sophomore Johnna Abney had 16 and 13, respectively.

Western Kentucky's defense disrupted MTSU's offense in the first half. The Lady Raiders had to hit their final four shots just to reach a 43-percent shooting clip.

However, MTSU's defense totally took the Lady Toppers out of their offense as they had 22 turnovers in the first half and managed only 10 shots in the first 13 minutes of play. Western Kentucky finished with 34 turnovers.

MTSU raced out to a 10-0 lead, holding Western Kentucky scoreless until the 15:57 mark of the first half.

The Lady Raiders built a 14-point lead, 26-12, with 5:17 left before intermission before Western Kentucky used a 8-0 spurt to pull within 26-20 at the 2:57 mark.

"We we're playing the score instead of the game," Insell said. "I'm glad we got the win, but we've got a lot of work to do."

MTSU then scored seven straight, highlighted by Abney's fourth 3-pointer of the half. Freshman guard Jackie Pickel drained a long 3-pointer with seven second left to give MTSU a 36-22 halftime

Western Kentucky was led by junior post Crystal Kelly with 20 points and 16 rebounds

North Dakota State will certainly attest to the fact after the freshmen combined for 13 3-pointers and 43 points in No. 25 MTSU's 93-63 victory at Murphy Center Tuesday night.

It was almost comical as the duo continued to hit 3-pointers as if they were having a contest amongst themselves

Brown hit seven treys, Pickel nailed six, and the Lady Raiders hit a season-high 17 from beyond the bonus arc.

MTSU improved to 11-3 and won its eighth consecutive game. North Dakota State dropped to 6-6.

Just hours after earning its first national ranking in more than 18 years, MTSU didn't exactly look the part early against North Dakota

However, a flurry of 3-point shots midway through the first half all but rendered the Bison helpless and spearheaded the Lady Raiders to the 30-point blowout.

Leading just 16-10 with 13:30 remaining in the first half, MTSU went on a 16-2 run, which included back-to-back 3-pointers from Pickel.

Brown also hit two 3-pointers in the opening half, while freshman Chelsia Lymon nailed one as the Lady Raiders built a 47-26 halftime lead.

"We've got some pretty good shooters," said Insell. "We're not going to shoot like that every night. If we do, we'll be in the Final Four. I'm not real satisfied with our defense, and we'll come back (this morning) and work on that.

"We executed our offense in the second half, but we've still got a tendency to play the scoreboard and not the game, and we had too many defensive breakdowns."

MTSU made its debut Tuesday in the USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll for the first time since December 1988 when it was coached by Lewis Bivens.

The ranking might have served as motivation for North Dakota State, but it was hardly a major distraction for MTSU, which lost to the Bison a year ago.

"Being No. 25 really doesn't suit us," said senior guard Chrissy Givens. "That's not what we're aiming for. ... It's an honor, but we've got a lot more we want to accomplish."

The Lady Raiders, who led by as many as 36 points in the second half, placed four players in double figures.

MTSU easily won the game, but the overriding concern is the status of senior guard Chrissy Givens.

A complete hush came over a Murphy Center crowd of 3,780 with 12:59 remaining Saturday night when Givens fell to floor, grabbed her left knee and to be helped off the floor. She returned to the bench with less than three minutes remaining with an icenack on

Givens' injury certainly put a damper on MTSU's ninth straight a 90-55 triumph over Sun Belt Conference foe Troy.

"She's having an MRI (Saturday night) and we'll know more then," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "I've coached a lot of great players, some that were on TV today, and she's as good as there is on and off the court. We're hoping for the best."

Added Givens: "I can put all of my weight on it. ... I was driving for a loose ball and caught by foot on the hardwood, and it bent and didn't allow me to bend it."

MTSU, ranked No. 25 in the USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll, improved to 12-3 overall and 4-0 in the Sun Belt Conference. Troy slipped to 8-7 and 1-4. The last time MTSU won nine straight games was during the 1999-2000 season.

MTSU was hardly sharp offensively against Troy in the first half. However, one constant remained for MTSU and it was intense defensive pressure that forced 35 Troy turnovers — a season high and totally disrupted the Trojans offensive attack.

"Defense is our main thing," said MTSU sophomore guard Johnna Abney. "We were putting pressure on and off the ball and we can do that I think we'll cause a lot of problems for teams.

MTSU shot just 33 percent in the first half, but Troy had 22 turnovers that led to 27 Lady Raider points.

The Trojans didn't reach double figures until inside the six-minute mark as they repeatedly turned the ball over against MTSU's press and in the half-court.

MTSU's two leading scorers, Givens and junior Amber Holt, scored just five and two points, respectively in the first 20 minutes. However, the Lady Raiders got 21 points off the bench.

MTSU used runs of 21-6 and 10-5 to build its biggest lead, 39-13, with 1:58 remaining before halftime, and it held a 41-19 advantage at intermission.

"We stress defense so much that even if we're off shooting, we shouldn't never take a not off on defense," said Givens, who had 13 points and 11 rebounds for the ninth double-double of her career.

Freshman Brandi Brown led MTSU with 19 points, including making five 3-pointers, while freshman Jackie Pickel netted 13 points and junior Amber Holt 10. Troy ws led by Kyle Morrisey's 22 points.

Chrissy Givens scored a season-high 32 points and Amber Holt added 19, as 21st-ranked Middle Tennessee shot better than 70 percent from the field for most of the second half, running away with an 86-52 victory over Florida International Tuesday night at Pharmed Arena.

The win runs Middle Tennessee's winning streak to 10 games this season, tying for the sixth longest in school history and the longest winning streak since a 10-game stretch in 1999-00.

Middle Tennessee (13-3, 5-0 Sun Belt) led 38-22 at the half and hit 19 of its first 25 shots after intermission, taking a 40-point lead at 84-44 with 4:57 left in the game. Freshman Brandi Brown also contributed 16 points, 13 in the first half.

Givens took over in the second half, scoring 25 of her 32 points, including 12 of the first 17. The senior drove the lane continually in the second half, making lay-ups and short jumpers. Givens also dished out eight assists with four rebounds and six steals in 34 min-

"I felt alright after the first practice when I was able to dribble [on Sunday] and I was cutting fine," Givens said. "I felt good the more I practiced and played [this week] and I felt like because it was a road game, I needed to come out and be more aggressive and score and to the things I needed to do. The shots fell tonight and we played real well defensively."

Middle Tennessee's Krystle Horton added eight points and eight rebounds and the Blue Raiders outrebounded a much taller FIU, 37-29, in the game. Middle Tennessee scored 38 points off 29 FIU turnovers in the game, while the Blue Raiders turned the ball over just 13 times, recorded 20 assists and made 18 steals.

"I thought Chelsia [Lymon] and Starr [Orr] were the difference up front and Krystle Horton down low with the rebounds and hardnosed battling those players did for us tonight," head coach Rick Insell said. "The player Chelsia was guarding (FIU point guard Iva Ciolar) had 10 turnovers.

"Everybody that played tonight was able to contribute and that's what a team's all about. We've got to be able to play 10-12 players and give some others rest playing these road games. It was a great win and we played well."

Brown hit a trio of 3-pointers early in the first half and totaled 13 points in the first 20 minutes, as the Blue Raiders raced out to a 38-22 halftime lead. Brown entered the game just three minutes in and made her first basket before hitting nine consecutive points, all on trifectas, giving Middle Tennessee a 17-10 edge with 12:07 left in the half.

The Blue Raiders were ahead 38-18 after a Givens lay-up with 3:30 before the break, but did not score again, including Givens missing two free throws with 0.4 seconds remaining.

Chrissy Givens scored 19 of her 23 points in the first half, Amber Holl scored 14 points and Krystle Horton added 12 in a 78-48 victory over Florida Atlantic at FAU Arena Thursday night. The victory is the 11th straight for the Blue Raiders, who improve to 14-3 this season and 6-0 in Sun Belt action.

The Blue Raider defense was on full display in the first half, forcing 20 FAU turnovers and converting those into 18 points. Givens was 9-of-10 from the field in the opening 20 minutes, scoring 19 points, while Holt and Horton both had eight.

The Owls were just 5-of-22 in the first half from the field, shooting 18 percent, and had only one field goal over the final 11:22 before intermission. Middle Tennessee outscored the home team, 29-7, during the final 11 minutes of the half.

"We were going more to score in first half [against their pressure]," Horton said. "It's a long road trip and it's good to get another win. It's unusual to be on this long a trip, but it's good for us to maintain concentration on what we're doing, executing and staying healthy. It also gets us ready for the [Sun Belt] tournament."

In the second half the game turned very physical, with the two teams combining for 19 fouls. Freshman Chelsia Lymon scored seven of her eight points after the break and Holt netted six.

Middle Tennessee shot just 31 percent in the second half but hit the offensive glass for 20 rebounds in the contest. The Blue Raiders also forced 35 turnovers in the game by the Owls, tying a season high for an opponent.

FAU was led by Brittney Crenshaw's 10 points off the bench. The Owls shot just 34 percent from the field in the contest.

"We played hard in the first half and forced them into turnovers," head coach Rick Insell said. "In the second half we didn't focus as well and it was really a poorly played game from our side. We're thankful to get a win and get out of here without anyone getting hurt."

Rest is certainly merited for the road-wearied MTSU women's basketball team.

The No. 21-ranked Lady Raiders capped off a three-game road swing in five days Saturday morning by whipping New Orleans 78-50 to run their winning streak to 12 games.

MTSU defeated Florida International 86-52 Tuesday, Florida Atlantic 78-48 Thursday and quickly put away New Orleans Saturday when it led 46-17 at halftime and by as many as 47 points in the second half.

"I'm really proud of this basketball team," said MTSU coach Rick Insell said. "I don't know of too many basketball teams in the country that could have done what we did in conference play this week.

"I'm most pleased that we won (Saturday), played a lot of people and we got out of this trip with nobody hurt."

MTSU forced a season-high 40 turnovers against New Orleans, and senior guard Chrissy Givens had a school-record 11 steals — just three shy of the NCAA record — in only 22 minutes of play.

"Our pressure defense was key again," Insell said. "We forced a bunch of turnovers and our kids were just all over the place.

"Chrissy and Amber (Holt) were great again, and Starr Orr was everywhere. She was everywhere in every game we played this week. She was getting rebounds, forcing turnovers, getting steals, knocking down jumpers and hitting 3-pointers."

Givens' 17 points led MTSU, while Holt had 14, freshman Brandi Brown 12 and Orr 10. The Lady Raiders hit 10-of-25 3-pointers.

"We're definitely tired," said Orr, who also had six rebounds, four steals and three assists against UNO. "(Insell) told us we just had to come back and play hard and that's what we did.

"It all has come together for us. Chrissy and Amber are playing great, Krystle (Horton) has been great, I'm coming around, (point guards) Johnna (Abney) and Chelsia (Lymon) are running the team great, and everybody that comes in knows their role. We've got good chemistry. It was a hard week mentally and physically, but we won all three games."

MTSU forced 104 turnovers in the three-game road trip, and opponents have turned the ball over 486 times (27 per game) this season.

"We've got some athletic young ladies with great lateral quickness," Insell said. "There aren't a lot of teams in the country that have what we've got, and we're doing a good job taking advantage of it right now.

"I just have to give our kids all the credit in the world. They're very tired, physically and mentally, but that showed how resilient they are this week."

MTSU won its 13th straight game to improve to 16-3 overall and 8-0 in the Sun Belt, while Arkansas State dropped to 13-6 and 7-2. The Lady Raiders' winning streak is the third longest in the nation behind undefeated Duke and North Carolina.

MTSU led just 39-32 at halftime, but Givens scored 10 of her team's first 16 points in the second half to ignite a 19-11 run that gave the Lady Raiders a 58-43 lead with 11:25 left.

"(Coach Insell) really chewed my butt at halftime. He really chewed it," Givens said. "He was right, too. Our team plays like I do, and I'm like a coach on the floor and I needed to get with it."

Arkansas State got no closer than 13 points, while MTSU's biggest lead was 80-50 in the final minute.

"We just need to play defense, rebound and stay focused," said MTSU junior forward Amber Holt, who had 19 points and seven rebounds, "We had a great crowd and we want to win for them, too,"

MTSU missed a golden opportunity to put the game away in the first half when it forced 20 Arkansas State turnovers

However, the Lady Raiders shot just 37 percent from the field and struggled from the perimeter (6-of-18 3-pointers). Meanwhile, when Arkansas State did beat MTSU's press and operate in the halfcourt setting, it sizzled. The Indians hit 11-of-16 (69 percent) and canned 4-of-5 3-pointers.

"We just didn't play well in the first half like we can," Insell said. "We got caught up in the crowd and not the game. But we came out in the second half and played like we can. We shot the ball better and kept getting turnovers."

MTSU jumped out to an 18-9 lead seven minutes in, but saw the Indians storm back to tie the score, 23-23, with 6:09 left when Ashley Anderson scored inside.

The Lady Raiders grabbed their biggest first-half lead, 39-29, with 57 seconds left before ASU's Rudy Sims hit a 3-pointer to cut the margin to 39-32 at intermission.

MTSU freshman Brandi Brown added 12 points, all on 3-pointers. Arkansas State was led by senior post Adrianne Davie's 16

With her fan club on the opposing bench, MTSU's Chrissy Givens couldn't resist putting on a show.

After scoring a season-high 33 points in the No. 20 Lady Raiders' 75-62 win over Arkansas-Little Rock, Givens was asked to speak to the Trojans. She entered the opposing locker room to a standing ovation moments after cutting UALR's throats in a Sun Belt showdown

Givens was MTSU's brightest star during an otherwise dim per-

The usual sharp-shooting Lady Raiders (17-3, 9-0) made just 26 percent from 3-point range, narrowly missing their season low of 24 percent. But Givens carried the scoring load through the team's offensive struggles.

Givens carried the Lady Raiders through some critical dry

When UALR (12-8, 5-5) went on a 23-13 run midway through the second half, she scored nine of MTSU's points to hold off the hard-charging Trojans. She added eight more points in the final 5:08 amid a pivotal Lady Raiders' run

Despite some offensive lulls, the Lady Raiders led for more than 36 minutes of the game.

Holt had 13 points, and Horton added 10 points on 5-of-5 shoot-

MTSU's backcourt made only 3-of-13 from beyond the arc, and the team shot 20 percent from 3-point range in the second half. But sophomore Johnna Abney's trey with 5:22 remaining both revived the Lady Raiders and snapped an 0-for-7 skid beyond the arc. MTSU followed Abney's 3-pointer by forcing back-to-back turnovers and going on a 9-1 run to clinch the road win.

"Coach always tells us that it doesn't matter if we're missing them, just to keep shooting and we'll make our next one," Abney said. "We feed off those 3-pointers, and we did that here, too. We got some 2s and made some steals and got it going again to finish the game."

MTSU took advantage of a pair of fast starts. The Lady Raiders jumped out to a 32-15 lead in the first half, then started the second half with a 10-3 spurt. UALR outscored MTSU 44-33 in the remainder of the game.

The Lady Raiders extended their winning streak to 14 games. the third longest in the country and only one win shy of tying the school record. A 9-0 Sun Belt record is also the team's best conference start since 1988.

"It was a tough win against a good team," Insell said. "We got some key turnovers in key spots, and that helped us get a 13-point win. That's the bottom line.

Freshman Anshel Cooper led UALR with 20 points on 8-of-11 shooting. Kim Sitzmann added 18 points, but committed seven turn-

Middle Tennessee (18-3, 10-0 Sun Belt) led by just one at the half after some sloppy play in the opening 20 minutes. The Blue Raiders rode the guick start and better defensive pressure after halftime, outscoring the Mean Green, 29-10, in the first 12 minutes of the

The Blue Raiders opened the lead to as many as 20 points after the break, but UNT made a 10-0 run, cutting the Middle Tennessee lead to 12, but a 3-pointer from the corner by Starr Orr with 3:30 remaining sealed the victory

Chrissy Givens led all scorers with 26 points, but the Blue Raiders shot just 40 percent from the floor in the game. Amber Holt added 16 points in the win for Middle Tennessee, their ninth road victory of the season and 10th away from home this year. Krystle Horton grabbed 10 rebounds and scored four points.

Despite a very shaky opening 20 minutes, the Blue Raiders led 32-31 at the break after failing to score for the final 3:36 of the half. Givens scored 15 before intermission but picked up her third foul on a charging call with 4:15 remaining in the break.

North Texas (5-13, 2-6 SBC) handled the Middle Tennessee full-court press fairly well in the half and Amber Jackson was an All-American, scoring 15 of the Mean Green's 31 points. Middle Tennessee used a three-quarters court and half-court trap in the second half, forcing 12 turnovers after intermission.

"[North Texas] is very athletic. They have lateral quickness and [Amber] Jackson is just deadly. She just did a great job," head coach Rick Insell said. "Right off the bat we let her get off.

"Then we got Chrissy Givens in foul trouble but I felt like we'd be alright. But they came out and really stuck it to us. They did a great job. They were prepared. They shut down some of the things we like to do and they did that because they were so athletic."

It looked like MTSU might die by the 3-pointer against Louisiana-Lafayette Sunday afternoon.

However, after a horrific shooting performance in the first half, the No. 19-ranked Lady Raiders erupted with a second-half scoring frenzy that propelled them to a 84-57 victory before a crowd of 5,228 at Murphy Center.

MTSU missed its first nine 3-point attempts and made only 3of-23 in the first half. However, the Lady Raiders made 9-of-25 in the second half. The Lady Raiders set a school record with 48 3-point

MTSU won its 16th consecutive game, which set a school record, and improved to 19-3 overall and 11-0 in the Sun Belt Conference. UL-Lafayette dropped to 17-6 and 9-3.

"It's a great win," Insell said. "I think we've been a little tired, but hopefully we're over that. We're just glad to be back at home."

Leading just 33-29 at halftime, the Lady Raiders opened the second half with an 18-5 run to take a 51-34 lead with 15:23 remaining.

Horton stole the ball from UL-Lafayette's Yolanda Jones on the Ragin' Cajuns' first possession of the second half and drove in for a layup to give MTSU a six-point cushion.

Freshman guard Chelsia Lymon hit consecutive 3-pointers, while Abney hit one and Brown two on three straight possessions to give the Lady Raiders a 57-34 lead with 13:10 left.

"Our plan was to make them shoot from the perimeter," said UL-Lafayette coach J. Kelley Hall. "We knew they're capable of making them, but we felt if they hit 10 or 11 we could still win. We've given up 11 and won this year. We felt like we should have had a lead at halftime."

MTSU held UL-Lafayette to 39 percent shooting and scored 30 points off the 29 Raqin' Cajuns floor mistakes.

Horton was also a key factor defensively, holding Jones to only 10 points — eight below her average.

"We knew she was a good player and we were well prepared," Horton said. "We knew she was capable of taking one on five, but we did a good job on her."

Horton had a double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds. She also had three assists and three steals.

"Thirteen points and 12 rebounds ... I'll take that every night," added Insell.

Brown added 15 points in only 14 minutes of play, while Lymon had nine points and Amber Holt eight.
