U.S. Open Sectional Qualifier 'great opportunity' for Blue Raiders

Cochran, Narramore continue quest today

MEMPHIS, Tenn. - Middle Tennessee sophomore golfers [Rick Cochran](#) and [Chas Narramore](#) agree that a great opportunity lies ahead when they play in the U.S. Open Sectional Qualifier in Memphis Monday.

And their philosophy is the opportunity is a great one whether or not they are one of the 15 players in the 115-player field to advance into this year's 107th U.S. Open at the Oakmont Country Club in Oakmont, Pa.

Play will take place at the Colonial and Chickasaw Country Club Courses. There are 15 Sectional Qualifiers and the number of players to advance from each is based on size and quality of the playing field. Each Sectional is 36 holes in one day.

"At this age we are trying to learn how to play the game like the pros and playing in these types of tournaments helps you get to that point," Narramore said. "It's a great field with a bunch of pros so just to be in that field is important, whether you advance or not."

There is also the attitude that suggests when opportunity knocks one should answer, and Cochran and Narramore realize that only 36 holes stand between them and the dream of a lifetime. Well, 36 holes and a field full of Professional Golf Association players attempting to reach the same destination.

Players such as John Daley, Steve Elinkington, Bob Estes, Jeff Maggert, Bob May, Larry Mize, and Kirk Triplett, among others. In fact, Cochran will play in the same group as Triplett Monday morning.

"I told my dad (Rick) that I'm going to walk up to the first hole, extend my hand and say, 'Hello Mr. Triplett, how are you doing? Playing for second today?'," Cochran said jokingly. "Really, it is a great opportunity but at the same time I'm trying hard not to think about this being an Open Sectional qualifier a lot. Every time I do I get wrapped up in the moment because there are so many great golfers there. You always watch these guys playing golf on the tour and now I have a chance to play with them. You can't ignore it, it's there. You just have to not get star struck.

"It's a win-win situation. If I play well and get in the Open, then I'm in, but if I'm not then I'm learning from playing with these guys. No matter what happens I will learn from playing with Kirk Triplett."

Fifteen of the 105 players in the Memphis Sectional qualifier will advance. Cochran and Narramore are two of six amateurs in a field that includes 90 professionals seeking to qualify for one of professional golf's four majors.

Although the task will be daunting, Middle Tennessee golf coach Johnny Moore said he would not be shocked if one or both somehow emerged from the pack. Moore once qualified for the U.S. Senior Open.

"It's a wonderful opportunity for both of these young men and it's something they will never forget, just where they are now," Moore said. "They are going to be out there Monday playing with guys who have won on the Tour several times over, and you try not to get caught up in it, but it's hard early, especially for those young guys. If they can get into playing early Monday and just focus on their game and what they are trying to do, Chas and Rick are both solid players. I wouldn't be surprised at all if they played well enough to advance, but they know it's not going to be easy."
