

- Middle Tennessee started the season with a record crowd of 10,010 against defending national champion Maryland, more than doubling the previous record of 4,813 set in 2006. It was the 10th largest crowd to ever watch a basketball game at Murphy Center and was one of the Top 50 attended women's basketball games in the nation during the 2006-07 season.
- The Blue Raiders ranked 26th in the nation in attendance with 4,157 per game in 2006-07. Middle Tennessee ranked first in the nation in attendance increase in 2005-06, finishing the year averaging 2,699 per contest, and ranked sixth nationally in attendance increase this season.
- Middle Tennessee appeared in Associated Press Top 25 for first time in school history. The Blue Raiders finished the year ranked 17th in the Associated Press poll and 23rd in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. The club also ended the season ranked 13th in the nation in RPI and 37th in strength of schedule
- Middle Tennessee posted 27 consecutive victories from November 29-March 17, then the nation's longest winning streak. The winning streak was the third longest in the nation this year behind only North Carolina and Duke. The streak was also the longest in school history, besting the previous mark of 15 set in 1982-83.



Chrissy Givens averaged 22.6 points and 6.2 rebounds per game and was named the Sun Belt Player of the Year in 2006-07, her second straight SBC Player of the Year award.

- The Blue Raiders have won 30 consecutive Sun Belt Conference games at home and posted school records for conference marks with an 18-0 regular season record and a 21-0 mark against Sun Belt competition in 2006-07.
- The Blue Raiders defeated then eighthranked Georgia in Athens in December, the highest ranked opponent Middle Tennessee has ever beaten in school history and the first road win over a ranked foe in program history.
- Senior Chrissy Givens ended her career as the most decorated athlete in program history, including these honors during the 2006-07 season: Preseason All-American by Street & Smith's magazine; Wooden Award nominee, Wade Trophy candidate and Naismith Award nominee for National Player of the Year; Preseason Sun Belt Player of the Year; First Team All-Sun Belt; Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year; Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Year; Sun Belt Tournament Most Outstanding Player; ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American of the Year; Set single-season records for points (768), FG made (301) and FG attempts (589); Set Sun Belt Tournament scoring record with 85 points; Single-game school record with 11 steals; Subway Classic All-Tournament and Tournament MVP; Ranked 4th in the nation in scoring (22.6) as well as 15th in steals (3.0), 61st in FG percentage (.511) and 65th in assists (4.5); 3-Time Sun Belt Player of the Week; First Middle Tennessee player drafted by WNBA - 31st overall by Phoenix Mercury.
- Senior Chrissy Givens was voted Second Team All-American by the Associated Press and to the United States Basketball Writers Association All-America team, becoming the first All-American in program history.
- Junior Amber Holt was voted First Team All-Sun Belt and SBC Newcomer of the Year. She finished 82nd nationally in scoring (16.7 points per game) and was also 33rd in the country in steals (2.71 per contest). Holt was invited to the USA Basketball Trials for the 2007 Pan American Games, making the cut of the final 15 players for the team.
- Head Coach Rick Insell was voted Sun Belt Coach of the Year, the first coach of the year award for women's basketball at Middle Tennessee in 20 years.
- The Blue Raiders ended the year in the Top 10 nationally in five different categories, includ-

ing steals (2nd), scoring offense (4th), 3-point field goals per game (4th), scoring margin (5th) and winning percentage (6th).

- Middle Tennessee eclipsed the school record for victories in a season, posting a 30-4 overall record, besting the previous mark of 26 set by the 1982-83 squad. This year's team also tied the record for consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances with four, tying a mark set from 1983-86, and collected the program's fourth consecutive 20-win campaign, also a school record. The four straight conference tournament titles also ties a school record set from 1983-86.
- Insell's two-year mark of 50-15 is the best back-to-back seasons in program history, bettering the mark of 48-17 posted during 2003-04 and 2004-05.
- Head Coach Rick Insell was elected to the National High School Hall of Fame in February 2007 and will be inducted with a class of 12 in July 2007. Insell is one of only six Tennesseeans, including just the fourth coach, elected to the National High School Hall of Fame.
- Janaury 17, 2007 Rick Insell and Middle Tennessee were featured in a two-page spread in *USA Today* about the program's rise to national prominence and success during his brief tenure.
- Middle Tennessee entered the NCAA Tournament as a No. 5 seed, tying the 1985 squad for the highest seed in school history. The Blue Raiders lost as a No. 5 seed at Western Kentucky, 90-83, in 1985, at a time when the NCAA field consisted of only 32 teams. Since the field expanded to 64 teams in 1994, Middle Tennessee has never been seeded higher than 12th, earning two No. 12's (2005, 2006), two No. 13's (1996, 2004) and one No. 15 (1998).
- Middle Tennessee senior Chrissy Givens has been voted the ESPN The Magazine Division I Academic All-American of the Year, as announced by CoSIDA on February 28. Givens was a First Team Academic All-America selection after garnering Second Team honors in 2006. The Monroe, La., native graduated in three years from Middle Tennessee with a bachelor's in Criminal Justice and a 3.89 gradepoint-average. She is currently working on her master's in Sociology. She is just the second First Team All-American in school history, joining Melanie Manley (softball) in 1999. Givens

was named the All-American of the Year by a group of 120 voters comprised of the CoSIDA Board of Directors as well as the Academic All-America national committee members. • Middle Tennessee ended the 2006-07 season 17-2 away from Murphy Center, breaking the school record previously held by the 1982-83 squad (16-4). Middle Tennessee tied the school record this season with 13 road victories, including triumphs at Minnesota, Georgia, Western Kentucky and Louisiana-Lafayette. The only loss on the road for Middle Tennessee in 2006-07 regular season came November 26 at then fourth-ranked Tennessee.

Women's college basketball has seen the gap narrow between the have's and have not's.

MTSU proved Friday night that it, too, has closed the gap in terms of competing with the top teams in the nation.

However, MTSU also found out why Maryland is the defending national champion as it overcame a five-point deficit with 5:14 remaining and stormed back to defeat the Blue Raiders 80-76 before a women's record crowd of 10,010 at Murphy Center.

"You can see why their national champions," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "They did the same thing in the finals last year against Duke. They've got great players, but we've got great players. They didn't luck into winning the national championship."

MTSU led the Terrapins 72-67 with 5:14 left in the game after freshman guard Chelsia Lymon scored on a three-point play. However, after a Maryland timeout, it reeled off a 13-4 run to close the game and hold on to its preseason No. 1 national ranking.

"I want to thank Middle Tennessee," said Maryland coach Brenda Frese. "They made us a better basketball team tonight. It was tremendous, it was one of the better college basketball games I've ever been a part of. Middle Tennessee is going to be very, very good. They obviously showed it and they've got to be excited about what's ahead."

The Blue Raiders trailed 76-74 with less than a mintue left, but Amber Holt's jumper was off the mark. On Maryland's next possession, All-American Crystal Langhorne scored on an offensive putback to with 25 seconds left to seal the victory.

Holt made a sterling debut, scoring 28 points and pulling down eight rebounds, and freshman point guard Chelsia Lymon — the Gatorade player of the year in Kentucky last year — scored 13 points in only nine minutes of play.

Maryland was led by Coleman with 19 points and 14 rebounds, while Langhorne had 16 points and 11 rebounds.

While the Blue Raiders pushed Maryland to the limit, it didn't look like it that way early. Coming out of the final media timeout in the fi rst half with 2:55 remaining, MTSU trailed 36-23. Maryland had hit 15 of its first 21 shots for a sizzling 71-percent clip, while MTSU had made only 9 of its fi rst 27 attempts.

However, after Maryland took its biggest lead of the half at 38-23, MTSU scored the final 10 points to close within 38-33 at intermission. Holt scored six in a row and Givens drove in the length of the floor in just six seconds and hit a layup to pull the Blue Raiders within five.

There was no sugarcoating MTSU's 72-61 home loss to South Dakota State Monday night at Murphy Center.

"They came out, it was their first game and they stuck it to us," said second-year MTSU coach Rick Insell.

After playing No. 1 ranked Maryland to within four points Friday night and gamering 12 votes in the Top 25 poll Monday, MTSU did indeed get a dose of reality.

"They came in here and kicked our butts," said MTSU senior guard Chrissy Givens. "We took Maryland to four points and maybe we thought we were too good, but they kicked our butts. They did it here two years ago."

MTSU struggled offensively throughout, but tied the score at 52-52 with 6:52 left when Givens scored and converted a 3-point play

However, MTSU was outscored 20-9 down the stretch as it was unable to run its half-court offense.

MTSU shot only 32 percent from the field, while the Jackrabbits shot 56 percent and outrebounded the Blue Raiders 37-29.

MTSU was led by junior Amber Holt's 19 points, while Givens had 17. However, the duo combined to go just 12-of-41 from the field

South Dakota State hit 17-of-20 free throws after getting into the 1-and-1 with 10:39 left in the game. The Jackrabbits also hit 8-of-14 from behind the 3-point arc.

"There was no pressure for us to win this game," said SDSU coach Aaron Johnston. "We tried a basic offense. We kept it simple and told the kids about being strong and trying to drive.

"We talked about trying to pick up some fouls in the second half. If they are going to put that much pressure on us we've got to turn that pressure on them and get to the free throw line."

MTSU led 12-7 with 14:01 left in the first half but went more than four minutes without a point and found itself trailing 19-12.

The Blue Raiders scored eight unanswered points during one stretch to take a 24-22 lead, but SDSU closed the final four minutes of the half with a 5-2 run to take a 27-26 halftime lead.

MTSU shot just 32 percent in the first half (10-of-31), while the Jackrabbits hit 11-of-24 (46 percent).

SDSU had 13 first-halt turnovers, but MTSU could only turn them into six points.

Chrissy Givens and Amber Holt both scored 23 points and Starr Orr added 12 in only her 10th career start, leading Middle Tennessee to an 87-60 victory over Maine Saturday in the Subway Clastic

Givens recorded her sixth career double-double, grabbing 13 rebounds and adding six assists and three steals. Holt tallied 18 of her 23 points in the first half when the Blue Raiders opened the lead to as many as 26 points.

Orr did exactly what she was inserted in the lineup to do, score and rebound (seven), and the Danville, Ala., native also had five assists in 27 minutes of action.

The Blue Raiders started the game with a 12-3 run and never looked back in the first half, taking a 47-26 advantage at the break. Holt posted 18 points and Givens 13 in the opening half, but it was a staunch defense and improved rebounding that were the biggest differences, limiting Maine to just 38 percent shooting (6-for-16) and a 30-9 rebounding margin for Middle Tennessee.

The Blackbears (1-1) had just six field goals in the first period, including a stretch of more than 10 minutes without a bucket. Middle Tennessee worked through foul problems in the opening 20 minutes as well, with 17 fouls whistled on the Blue Raiders allowing Maine to shoot 22 free throws.

Middle Tennessee led 20-12 after a Maine 3-point play from Abby Greene with 10:48 to play in the first half. The Blue Raiders then scored 23 of the next 28 points in the contest over a six-minute stretch, with Holt contributing nine points and Givens six during the

In the second half the Blue Raiders led by as many as 23 and the lead was never less than 16. Middle Tennessee knocked down seven 3-pointers in the second half and 12 for the game, as well as outrebounding the Blackbears Maine, 48-24, for the game.

"We shot the ball better in the first half and really hit the boards hard, one of the things we've been working on in practice," head coach Rick Insell said. "We came out with more focus, especially early. We turned up the heat in practice and we responded well.

"Our depth was really a factor as well. We got in some foul trouble in the first half, but this year we're able to bring Chelsia [Lymon], Jackie [Pickel], LaCondra [Mason] and LaToya [Brown] off the bench and even Brandi [Brown] if we need her."

Holt added seven rebounds in the win and was 6-of-12 from the floor and 9-for-12 from the foul line.

Chrissy Givens scored 18 first-half points and helped Middle Tennessee build a 25-point lead early in the second half en route to a 79-61 victory over host Minnesota in the championship game of the Subway Classic Sunday at Williams Arena.

Subway Classic Championship Game

Givens, voted the tournament's most valuable player, was almost unstoppable in the first half, going 9-of-14 from the field, leading the Blue Raiders to a 14-point halftime lead.

Givens and teammate Starr Orr were both selected to the Subway Classic All-Tournament team.

Freshman Chelsia Lymon came off the bench in the opening minutes of the second half and provided an offensive spark, knocking down a pair of 3-pointers and a lay-up to help extend the lead to 57-34. Orr followed with eight consecutive points of her own, including another pair of trifectas, stretching the Middle Tennessee advantage to 65-38.

Minnesota made a run during the half when Middle Tennessee went without a bucket for more than six minutes, but the Golden Gophers never got closer than 14 after the break.

Givens led all scorers with 25 points while adding seven rebounds and seven assists in 40 minutes of action. Orr, in one of her best games as a Blue Raider, added 14 points, eight rebounds, six assists, and three steals.

Senior Krystle Horton scored the first three baskets of the game for the Blue Raiders and Johnna Abney knocked down a pair of 3-pointers, as Middle Tennessee quieted the crowd of 5,639 en route to an early 12-6 lead. Givens scored the next eight on a host of short jumpers and lay-ups for a 20-12 MT advantage with 7:51 to go in the half.

All of this was in the midst of an 18-4 run over a seven-minute stretch that put the Blue Raiders ahead, 34-14. The Blue Raiders built the lead by out-hustling the Golden Gophers, with one series of plays seeing Amber Holt make a steal but miss a break-away

Not to be discouraged, Holt came racing back down the floor, made another steal falling out of bounds, saved the ball to Orr, who executed a 2-on-1 with Givens for another lay-up. The Blue Raiders built a 32-14 advantage at that point and led 38-24 at the halftime break even after a cheap lay-up at the buzzer by Minnesota's Kelly Roysland.

Givens had 18 in the first half and the Blue Raiders forced 18 Minnesota turnovers in the first 20 minutes and also limited the Golden Gophers to just 35 percent shooting from the floor while shooting 58 percent themselves.

It was a pick your poison night for Chattanooga at Murphy Center Friday.

Whether the Lady Mocs employed a man-to-man defense or a zone, it didn't matter, as MTSU broke down both en route to a 98-69 victory before a crowd of 2,524.

MTSU (3-2) shot 52 percent and hit 12 3-pointers, equaling a season high, as it won its third straight game and snapped a two-game losing streak at Murphy Center.

The 98 points were the most scored by MTSU under secondyear coach Rick Insell, whose team lost 76-66 at Chattanooga last

"We're playing a little better offensively," Insell said, "but I wasn't as pleased with our defense tonight. We did a better job as the game went on, but not good enough if we're going to get to where we want by a "

The duo of senior guard Chrissy Givens and junior forward Amber Holt were devastating, as they combined for 55 points and 17 rebounds. Givens finished with 29 points and seven rebounds, while Holt had 26 points and 10 boards.

The offensive onslaught was a welcomed sight after the Blue Raiders had hit 30 percent their first two home games against Maryland and South Dakota State.

Coming out of the eight-minute timeout trailing 24-21, Chattanooga went to a zone defense, which played right into MTSU's hands. Freshman guard Jackie Pickel hit back-to-back 3-pointers, which spearheaded a 14-4 run that gave MTSU a 38-25 lead with 4:33 left before halftime.

Chattanooga pulled to within seven in less than a minute, but the Blue Raiders closed the half with a 12-7 run to take a 50-38 halftime lead at intermission. Pickel finished with a season-high 15 points, hitting 5-of-7 from 3-point range. Five different MTSU players hit at least one 3-pointer.

Both teams were plagued with foul problems in the first half, with Chattanooga being whistled for 13 and MTSU with 12.

Chattanooga's leading scorer, Alex Anderson (18 ppg), played only four minutes after picking up her second foul, while starters Brooke Hand and Kristen Spann each had three fouls.

Givens scored MTSU's first eight points of the second half, and Abney followed with a 3-pointer to give the Blue Raiders a 61-44 advantage with 17:09 left. MTSU outrebounded the Lady Mocs 40-28 and forced 21 turnovers.

MTSU was its own worst enemy Sunday, but the No. 4-ranked Tennessee Lady Vols had a lot to do with it.

Tennessee's stifling, trapping defense and impressive offensive talent was simply too much for MTSU, which suffered an 88-64 whipping before a crowd of 12,363 at Thompson Boling Arena.

MTSU dropped to 3-3, while Tennessee improved to 5-0.

"Tennessee is outstanding," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "We played hard, we didn't quit, but they just happen to be six inches taller than us at every position."

Leading just 16-15 with 11:57 remaining in the first half, Tennessee increased the intensity with its half-court trapping defense, which rendered MTSU helpless and helped the Lady Vols pull away for the easy victory.

Tennessee held MTSU scoreless for more than five minutes in the first half before Chrissy Givens hit two free throws at the 6:35 mark.

However, the Lady Raiders stayed within striking distance, trailing only 26-19 before Tennessee closed the final 5:45 of the first half with a 23-8 run to take a 49-27 lead at intermission.

Tennessee shot a sizzling 64 percent in the first half, made 6-of-9 form 3-point range and created too many mismatch problems for the Lady Raiders.

MTSU committed 15 first-half turnovers that led to 20 Lady Vol points. The Lady Raiders had just five miscues in the second half.

"Like coach said, they had girls six inches taller than us and they were able to shoot right over us," Givens said. "But we missed a couple of screens, I didn't get around a couple of screens and they made their 3-point shots. We weren't counting on that. I think rebounding hurt us and we needed to cut those second-chance points in half."

Givens led MTSU with 26 points, but got little offensive support. Junior forward Amber Holt, the Lady Raiders' second-leading scorer, didn't get her first points until 15:33 left in the game. She finished with eight

Lady Raider freshman Brandi Brown scored 12 points — all on 3-pointers — and MTSU hit a season-high 13 treys.

MTSU shot 45 percent overall and hit 8-of-15 from 3-point range in the second half and 50 percent overall.

Tennessee was led by Sidney Spencer and Candace Parker with 16 points each. The Vols outrebounded MTSU 38-22 and were led by Parker's nine boards.

Tennessee Tech had the fight and grit, but athleticism and talent finally won out for MTSU's Lady Raiders Wednesday night.

Despite struggling for much of the first half, MTSU overcame the sloppy play and pulled away to defeat the Golden Eagles, 68-50, at Hooper Eblen Center.

"We didn't get off to a good start, but (Tennessee Tech) made some plays and that's a credit to them," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "I thought we settled down, though, and did what we needed to do. They played hard and we played hard, and it was a good

MTSU (4-3) was lethargic early and fell behind 16-10 to the pesky Golden Eagles, who didn't surrender the lead until 5:58 left before halftime. The Lady Raiders used a 20-3 run to take a 30-19 lead and held a 32-23 halftime advantage.

MTSU senior quard Chrissy Givens missed three shots to open the game and was pulled from the lineup. However, she responded upon her return by leading the Lady Raiders with 22 points, 11 rebounds and five assists.

"I'm a leader and I don't need to start a game like that," Givens said. "I know (Insell) was mad and I knew I was coming out. "When I came back in, I just tried to deflect balls, play defense and we all kind of gravitated to each other."

MTSU junior guard Starr Orr, recently inserted into the starting lineup, helped spark the first-half run with seven straight points on a short jumper, a steal and a layup and a 3-pointer.

"I haven't been playing too good lately," Orr said, "and coach told me I needed to step it up. When I got those steals, it got me going and then we started playing better. Our problem was we just couldn't knock our shots down early in the game. Once we hit a few, we got on a good roll."

MTSU hit just 37 percent from the field in the first half, but got into a better rhythm offensively in the second when it hit 11 of its first 18 shots. Tennessee Tech stayed within 10 points until the 10minute mark when the Lady Raiders used a 14-5 spurt to go ahead 62-43 with 6:59 remaining.

"I think our defensive tenacity got to them," Insell said. "They weren't really able to get into their sets much. I thought we stayed after them and wore them down."

Tennessee Tech shot just 39 percent in the second half and finished with 20 turnovers. The Lady Raiders outrebounded the Golden Eagles, 38-27. Orr had 12 points, while junior Amber Holt and freshman Brandi Brown netted 10 apiece. MTSU hit 7-of-16 from 3-point range. Tennessee Tech was led by Kendall Cavin with 15 points and Marissa Hensley with 11.

With Givens on the bench with three fouls at the halfway point of the first half, MTSU (5-3) not only maintained a double-digit lead, but extended it en route to hammering Austin Peay (2-6) 80-49 before a crowd of 3,204 at Murphy Center.

"We had a lead so there wasn't a lot of pressure on us," Insell said. "When you've got someone like Amber Holt who can step up, it also takes pressure off you.

"But overall we did a good job executing offensively and defensively toniaht.

After Givens was whistled for her third foul with 10:32 left before intermission, she sat on the bench the remainder of the half and watched the Lady Raiders build an 18-8 advantage into a 40-18 halftime lead

MTSU's relentless defense forced 19 first-half turnovers that led to 21 points, and Austin Peay continuously panicked when trying to break the press and when it did manage to set up in the half

"We wanted to bring our practice to the game," said Holt, who had 19 points, nine rebounds and five steals. "We did that and they kept turning it over and turning it over."

The Lady Raiders picked up in the second half where the left off in the first, forcing four straight turnovers and building a 58-22 advantage with 13:50 left. MTSU led by as many as 36 points.

"It was an overall team victory," Insell said. "Last year we had an 18-point lead twice against them and lost the game. I think that is a lesson that has carried over, even into this year."

Senior guard Chrissy Givens scored 25 points and junior forward Amber Holt had 21 to lead MTSU to a stunning 70-62 victory over No. 8 Georgia Thursday night at Stegeman Coliseum.

"I felt when we got on the charter bus headed to Athens that we were going to win," Insell said. "I've never been in a game that I didn't think I could win, but I really felt if we came out and got after them, we had a chance to get a victory. This one is big. This one will go a long way in helping our program. It's going to help our RPI,

MTSU (6-3) forced Georgia (7-1) into 22 turnovers in beating the Lady Bulldogs for the first time in 12 tries. It was the Lady Raiders' first win in three games against Top 10 teams this year, including an 88-64 loss to No. 4 Tennessee on Nov. 26 and an 80-76 loss to No. 1 Maryland in the season opener.

"Middle Tennessee is a difficult team for us to match up with," Landers said. "They are essentially playing guards inside, and that creates some difficult matchups for us. Holt was a point guard in junior college, and she was playing the four (power forward)."

Cori Chambers led Georgia with 23 points, and Angel Robinson came off the bench to score 10.

Chambers hit a 3-point basket 28 seconds into the second half to put Georgia ahead 34-33, but it was the last time Georgia led.

The Lady Raiders mounted a 12-4 run to take a 49-40 lead with 11:24 to play after Holt hit a layup. Tasha Humphrey completed a 3-point play with 6:36 to go to bring Georgia to within 54-52, but that was as close as Georgia got.

Holt answered with four baskets in two minutes to spark MTSU to a 63-54 lead with 4:28 left. Georgia got to 67-62 when Robinson put in a follow-up, but the Lady Bulldogs didn't score again.

Georgia bolted to an 11-5 lead, led by three baskets from Chambers. But Holt sandwiched a couple of baskets around a Givens layup to tie it 11-11 with 14:07 to go in the half, and the game remained tight until the break.

MTSU forced Georgia into 12 first-half turnovers in building a 33-31 halftime lead. The Lady Raiders had just nine turnovers.

"We had some kids who just played their hearts out tonight," Insell said. "They cut the lead to two points, but we weren't fazed a bit and came right back down and scored. The look in (Georgia's) face was as if they couldn't believe it. What a team victory."

Chrissy Givens tied her season-high with 29 points to lead four double-figure scorers and Middle Tennessee overcame a sluggish start to both halves, forcing 29 turnovers in a 93-58 victory over South Alabama Thursday night at Mitchell Center.

South Alabama

South Alabama (5-5, 0-1 Sun Belt) began the game with a 13-4 run and started the second half with 12 straight points, but the Blue Raiders' defense was the big difference in the game, as the pressure forced 20 first-half turnovers by the Lady Jags and 29 in

Middle Tennessee (7-3, 1-0) freshman Brandi Brown finished with a career-high 17 points, hitting 5-of-8 from 3-point range, and Amber Holt added 16 points, as the Blue Raiders won the fourth straight in the series, including three in a row in Mobile. Senior Krystle Horton also scored 10 points, all in the second half, and added a team-high seven rebounds.

"The score is really not indicative of the game. We came out sluggish in both halves but I thought our 1-2-2 press bothered them and that was a big difference," head coach Rick Insell said. "We shot the ball well and what a night for Brandi Brown to come out and play well. She hit some three's and loosened up things for us."

Givens netted 17 of her 29 in the first half and had seven assists, four rebounds and four steals in 36 minutes of action. She tied her career-high with 14 made field goals. The Blue Raiders were 19-of-34 in both halves from the floor and turned the ball over just 12 times in the contest.

The Blue Raiders got off to a rough start and fell behind 13-4 in the first six minutes of the contest, but recovered with a 16-0 run over five minutes for a 20-13 edge. Givens and Holt both scored six points and Chelsia Lymon had four during the run.

The Blue Raiders turned up the pressure on defense after falling behind. South Alabama committed 10 turnovers during the Blue Raiders' run back into the game and had 20 first-half turnovers in all. Middle Tennessee outscored USA, 44-10, over the final 14 minutes of the half for a 48-23 lead at the break.

In the second half South Alabama tallied 12 consecutive points in less than four minutes until Givens hit a runner in the lane that drew a foul to end the run. Brown then hit her fourth 3-pointer of the contest and Starr Orr had two buckets, including one of the team's 10 3-pointers.

Johnna Abney started the scoring barrage and most everyone else joined in Sunday when MTSU ripped Louisiana-Monroe, 103-59, before a crowd of 2,317 at Murphy Center.

The sophomore point guard hit four straight 3-pointers in the first six minutes of the game, igniting a 61-point first half in which the Lady Raiders shot 67 percent (20-of-30) and made 8-of-11 3-

"My job is to get us into our offense, but if I'm open I'm going to shoot or I'll get in trouble," said Abney. "I had my shot and was open, so I just took them."

MTSU improved to 8-3 overall and 2-0 in the Sun Belt Conference, while ULM fell to 10-3 and 0-2.

MTSU's defense was relentless against the Warhawks, who could only get off 15 first-half shots and turned the ball over 20

The 103 points was the most MTSU has scored this season and the most it has tallied since beating Morehead State 108-75 in

MTSU didn't let up in the second half, building as big as a 50-point lead.

The Lady Raiders forced 27 turnovers, but didn't press in the second half.

"Defense is our main thing," Givens said. "Every night we go out trying to get better and do better. We're not there yet and we're not perfect, but we're reading each other and that could be danger-

The 16 3-pointers made were the most this season and just two shy of a team record. Eight different Lady Raiders made at least one 3-pointer, while Abney and freshman Jackie Pickel hit four apiece. The Lady Raiders shot a sizzling 58 percent and made 59 percent (16-of-27) from 3-point range.

"Our girls played their game and that's what I'm proud of," Insell said. "We didn't worry about the score. We just went out and executed offensively and defensively."

Givens' 19 points led MTSU, while junior Amber Holt had 14 and Abney and Pickel 12 apiece. ULM was led by LaJeanna Howard with 16 points.

The Lady Raiders added another notch in that belt with an 86-71 victory over Old Dominion Tuesday night in front of 3,227 at the Murphy Center.

The win was the sixth in a row for MTSU and fourth this season — along with victories over Georgia, Minnesota and Louisiana-Monroe — over a former Final Four team.

MTSU overcame a rocky start to take control of what had been a back-and-forth game. Freshman Jackie Pickel came off the bench to knock down her first three 3-point attempts, and senior Krystle Horton had her best game of the season as the Lady Raiders improved to 9-3.

Horton scored a season-high 23 points, including 12 in the first half, as the senior from Riverdale almost single-handedly kept MTSU in the ballgame over the first 10 minutes.

The Lady Raiders shot just 32 percent in the first 20 minutes of the game, including hitting just eight of their first 28 attempts from the field. But on the strength of 13 first-half free throws and a five-point scoring flurry by Givens in the final minute, MTSU held a one-point lead (39-38) at intermission.

Old Dominion committed 16 first-half fouls and shot just five free throws in the first half.

MTSU gave itself some room early in the second with a 6-0 run to take a 45-38 lead. But ODU fought back, eventually tying the game at 51-51 on Tish Lyons' layup before taking a 54-53 lead on a 3-pointer by T.J. Jordan with 12:49 remaining in the game.

Two free throws by Lady Monarch point-guard Jazzmin Walters — who led the Lady Monarchs with 13 points — put ODU up 59-57 with just over eight-and-a-half minutes left.

Then the Jackie Pickel show started.

The 5-10 freshman from Cleveland connected on her first three attempts from long-range over a 2:40 span to turn a two-point deficit into a four-point lead with 5:56 remaining

"That first shot is always huge," said Pickel, who knocked down four treys in Sunday's win over Louisiana-Monroe. "When I get in there and hit the first shot, it does a lot for my confidence, and tonight it really helped.

Pickel's long-range shooting sparked a 10-1 Blue Raider run over the next two-and-a-half minutes, which all but put the game away. Junior Amber Holt scored eight of her game-high 27 points in the final three minutes, including hitting 4-of-6 free throws.

Paced by four players in double figures, MTSU built a big lead early, staved off a Western Kentucky rally and eventually subdued the Lady Toppers 76-62 before a crowd of 3,627 at Murphy Cen-

"I thought overall it was the worst game we've played," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "We didn't shoot well. I don't know if it was the Christmas break, but I also think Western Kentucky had a lot to

MTSU, ranked 26th nationally in the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN coaches poll, improved to 10-3 overall and 3-0 in the Sun Belt Conference. Western Kentucky dropped to 6-4 and

MTSU looked as if it was going to run way from the Lady Toppers as it led 46-29 with 15:07 remaining. However, Western Kentucky scored nine unanswered points and held the Lady Raiders scoreless for more than four minutes.

MTSU got the lead back to 16 points, 54-38, with 9:28 left, but Western Kentucky refused to wilt and had a chance to get the lead under 10 before the Lady Raiders used a 12-4 flurry to go up 70-54 with 3:12 left. Senior Chrissy Givens led the Lady Raiders with 19 points, while junior Amber Holt and sophomore Johnna Abney had 16 and 13, respectively.

Western Kentucky's defense disrupted MTSU's offense in the first half. The Lady Raiders had to hit their final four shots just to reach a 43-percent shooting clip.

However, MTSU's defense totally took the Lady Toppers out of their offense as they had 22 turnovers in the first half and managed only 10 shots in the first 13 minutes of play. Western Kentucky finished with 34 turnovers

MTSU raced out to a 10-0 lead, holding Western Kentucky scoreless until the 15:57 mark of the first half.

The Lady Raiders built a 14-point lead, 26-12, with 5:17 left before intermission before Western Kentucky used a 8-0 spurt to pull within 26-20 at the 2:57 mark.

"We we're playing the score instead of the game," Insell said. "I'm glad we got the win, but we've got a lot of work to do."

MTSU then scored seven straight, highlighted by Abney's fourth 3-pointer of the half. Freshman guard Jackie Pickel drained a long 3-pointer with seven second left to give MTSU a 36-22 halftime lead. Western Kentucky was led by junior post Crystal Kelly with 20 points and 16 rebounds.

North Dakota State will certainly attest to the fact after the freshmen combined for 13 3-pointers and 43 points in No. 25 MT-SU's 93-63 victory at Murphy Center Tuesday night

It was almost comical as the duo continued to hit 3-pointers as if they were having a contest amongst themselves

Brown hit seven treys, Pickel nailed six, and the Lady Raiders hit a season-high 17 from beyond the bonus arc.

MTSU improved to 11-3 and won its eighth consecutive game North Dakota State dropped to 6-6.

Just hours after earning its first national ranking in more than 18 years, MTSU didn't exactly look the part early against North Da-

However, a flurry of 3-point shots midway through the first half all but rendered the Bison helpless and spearheaded the Lady Raiders to the 30-point blowout.

Leading just 16-10 with 13:30 remaining in the first half, MTSU went on a 16-2 run, which included back-to-back 3-pointers from

Brown also hit two 3-pointers in the opening half, while freshman Chelsia Lymon nailed one as the Lady Raiders built a 47-26

"We executed our offense in the second half, but we've still got a tendency to play the scoreboard and not the game, and we had too many defensive breakdowns."

MTSU made its debut Tuesday in the USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll for the first time since December 1988 when it was coached by Lewis Bivens

The ranking might have served as motivation for North Dakota State, but it was hardly a major distraction for MTSU, which lost to the Bison a year ago.

"Being No. 25 really doesn't suit us," said senior guard Chrissy Givens. "That's not what we're aiming for. ... It's an honor, but we've got a lot more we want to accomplish."

MTSU easily won the game, but the overriding concern is the status of senior guard Chrissy Givens.

A complete hush came over a Murphy Center crowd of 3,780 with 12:59 remaining Saturday night when Givens fell to floor, grabbed her left knee and to be helped off the floor. She returned to the bench with less than three minutes remaining with an icepack on her knee. Givens' injury certainly put a damper on MTSU's ninth straight win — a 90-55 triumph over Sun Belt Conference foe Troy.

"She's having an MRI (Saturday night) and we'll know more then," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "I've coached a lot of great players, some that were on TV today, and she's as good as there is on and off the court. We're hoping for the best."

Added Givens: "I can put all of my weight on it. ... I was driving for a loose ball and caught by foot on the hardwood, and it bent and didn't allow me to bend it.'

MTSU, ranked No. 25 in the USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll, improved to 12-3 overall and 4-0 in the Sun Belt Conference. Troy slipped to 8-7 and 1-4. The last time MTSU won nine straight games was during the 1999-2000 season.

MTSU was hardly sharp offensively against Troy in the first half. However, one constant remained for MTSU and it was intense defensive pressure that forced 35 Troy turnovers — a season high and totally disrupted the Trojans offensive attack.

"Defense is our main thing," said MTSU sophomore guard Johnna Abney. "We were putting pressure on and off the ball and we can do that I think we'll cause a lot of problems for teams."

MTSU shot just 33 percent in the first half, but Troy had 22 turnovers that led to 27 Lady Raider points. The Trojans didn't reach double figures until inside the six-minute mark as they repeatedly turned the ball over against MTSU's press and in the half-court.

MTSU's two leading scorers, Givens and junior Amber Holt, scored just five and two points, respectively in the first 20 minutes. However, the Lady Raiders got 21 points off the bench. MTSU used runs of 21-6 and 10-5 to build its biggest lead, 39-13, with 1:58 remaining before halftime, and it held a 41-19 advantage at inter-

"We stress defense so much that even if we're off shooting, we shouldn't never take a not off on defense," said Givens, who had 13 points and 11 rebounds for the ninth double-double of her career.

Freshman Brandi Brown led MTSU with 19 points, including making five 3-pointers, while freshman Jackie Pickel netted 13 points and junior Amber Holt 10. Troy ws led by Kyle Morrisey's 22

Chrissy Givens scored a season-high 32 points and Amber Holt added 19, as 21st-ranked Middle Tennessee shot better than 70 percent from the field for most of the second half, running away with an 86-52 victory over Florida International Tuesday night at Pharmed Arena.

The win runs Middle Tennessee's winning streak to 10 games this season, tying for the sixth longest in school history and the longest winning streak since a 10-game stretch in 1999-00.

Middle Tennessee (13-3, 5-0 Sun Belt) led 38-22 at the half and hit 19 of its first 25 shots after intermission, taking a 40-point lead at 84-44 with 4:57 left in the game. Freshman Brandi Brown also contributed 16 points, 13 in the first half.

Givens took over in the second half, scoring 25 of her 32 points, including 12 of the first 17. The senior drove the lane continually in the second half, making lay-ups and short jumpers. Givens also dished out eight assists with four rebounds and six steals in 34 minutes.

"I felt alright after the first practice when I was able to dribble [on Sunday] and I was cutting fine," Givens said. "I felt good the more I practiced and played [this week] and I felt like because it was a road game, I needed to come out and be more aggressive and score and do the things I needed to do. The shots fell tonight and we played real well defensively."

Middle Tennessee's Krystle Horton added eight points and eight rebounds and the Blue Raiders outrebounded a much taller FIU, 37-29, in the game. Middle Tennessee scored 38 points off 29 FIU turnovers in the game, while the Blue Raiders turned the ball over just 13 times, recorded 20 assists and made 18 steals.

"I thought Chelsia [Lymon] and Starr [Orr] were the difference up front and Krystle Horton down low with the rebounds and hardnosed battling those players did for us tonight," head coach Rick Insell said. "The player Chelsia was guarding (FIU point guard Iva Ciglar) had 10 turnovers."

Brown hit a trio of 3-pointers early in the first half and totaled 13 points in the first 20 minutes, as the Blue Raiders raced out to a 38-22 halftime lead. Brown entered the game just three minutes in and made her first basket before hitting nine consecutive points, all on trifectas, giving Middle Tennessee a 17-10 edge with 12:07 left in the half

The Blue Raiders were ahead 38-18 after a Givens lay-up with 3:30 before the break, but did not score again, including Givens missing two free throws with 0.4 seconds remaining.

Chrissy Givens scored 19 of her 23 points in the first half, Amber Holt scored 14 points and Krystle Horton added 12 in a 78-48 victory over Florida Atlantic at FAU Arena Thursday night. The victory is the 11th straight for the Blue Raiders, who improve to 14-3 this season and 6-0 in Sun Belt action.

The Blue Raider defense was on full display in the first half, forcing 20 FAU turnovers and converting those into 18 points. Givens was 9-of-10 from the field in the opening 20 minutes, scoring 19 points, while Holt and Horton both had eight.

The Owls were just 5-of-22 in the first half from the field, shooting 18 percent, and had only one field goal over the final 11:22 before intermission. Middle Tennessee outscored the home team, 29-7. during the final 11 minutes of the half.

"We were going more to score in first half [against their pressure]," Horton said. "It's a long road trip and it's good to get another win. It's unusual to be on this long a trip, but it's good for us maintain concentration on what we're doing, executing and staying healthy, It also gets us ready for the [Sun Belt] tournament."

In the second half the game turned very physical, with the two teams combining for 19 fouls. Freshman Chelsia Lymon scored seven of her eight points after the break and Holt netted six.

Middle Tennessee shot just 31 percent in the second half but hit the offensive glass for 20 rebounds in the contest. The Blue Raiders also forced 35 turnovers in the game by the Owls, tying a season high for an opponent.

FAU was led by Brittney Crenshaw's 10 points off the bench. The Owls shot just 34 percent from the field in the contest.

"We played hard in the first half and forced them into turnovers," head coach Rick Insell said. "In the second half we didn't focus as well and it was really a poorly played game from our side. We're thankful to get a win and get out of here without anyone getting hurt."

Rest is certainly merited for the road-wearied MTSU women's basketball team.

The No. 21-ranked Lady Raiders capped off a three-game road swing in five days Saturday morning by whipping New Orleans 78-50 to run their winning streak to 12 games.

MTSU defeated Florida International 86-52 Tuesday, Florida Atlantic 78-48 Thursday and quickly put away New Orleans Saturday when it led 46-17 at halftime and by as many as 47 points in the second half.

"I'm really proud of this basketball team," said MTSU coach Rick Insell said. "I don't know of too many basketball teams in the country that could have done what we did in conference play this week.

"I'm most pleased that we won (Saturday), played a lot of people and we got out of this trip with nobody hurt."

MTSU forced a season-high 40 turnovers against New Orleans, and senior guard Chrissy Givens had a school-record 11 steals — just three shy of the NCAA record — in only 22 minutes of play.

"Our pressure defense was key again," Insell said. "We forced a bunch of turnovers and our kids were just all over the place.

"Chrissy and Amber (Holt) were great again, and Starr Orr was everywhere. She was everywhere in every game we played this week. She was getting rebounds, forcing turnovers, getting steals, knocking down jumpers and hitting 3-pointers."

Givens' 17 points led MTSU, while Holt had 14, freshman Brandi Brown 12 and Orr 10. The Lady Raiders hit 10-of-25 3-pointers.

"We're definitely tired," said Orr, who also had six rebounds, four steals and three assists against UNO. "(Insell) told us we just had to come back and play hard and that's what we did.

MTSU forced 104 turnovers in the three-game road trip, and opponents have turned the ball over 486 times (27 per game) this season.

"We've got some athletic young ladies with great lateral quickness," Insell said. "There aren't a lot of teams in the country that have what we've got, and we're doing a good job taking advantage of it right now.

"I just have to give our kids all the credit in the world. They're very tired, physically and mentally, but that showed how resilient they are this week."

The blowout materialized, but it was a longer time in the making than MTSU fans have been accustomed to this season.

No. 20-ranked MTSU, which had outscored Sun Belt Conference foes by more than 31 points per game, certainly got a test from Arkansas State early at Murphy Center Thursday night.

However, behind senior guard Chrissy Givens 27 points and a stifling defense that forced 37 turnovers, the Lady Raiders overcome early shooting woes and raced off to an 82-54 victory before a crowd of 4,884.

MTSU won its 13th straight game to improve to 16-3 overall and 8-0 in the Sun Belt, while Arkansas State dropped to 13-6 and 7-2. The Lady Raiders' winning streak is the third longest in the nation behind undefeated Duke and North Carolina.

MTSU led just 39-32 at halftime, but Givens scored 10 of her team's first 16 points in the second half to ignite a 19-11 run that gave the Lady Raiders a 58-43 lead with 11:25 left.

"(Coach Insell) really chewed my butt at halftime. He really chewed it," Givens said. "He was right, too. Our team plays like I do, and I'm like a coach on the floor and I needed to get with it."

Arkansas State got no closer than 13 points, while MTSU's biggest lead was 80-50 in the final minute.

"We just need to play defense, rebound and stay focused," said MTSU junior Amber Holt, who had 19 points and seven rebounds. "We had a great crowd and we want to win for them, too."

MTSU missed a golden opportunity to put the game away in the first half when it forced 20 Arkansas State turnovers.

However, the Lady Raiders shot just 37 percent from the field and struggled from the perimeter (6-of-18 3-pointers). Meanwhile, when Arkansas State did beat MTSU's press and operate in the half-court setting, it sizzled. The Indians hit 11-of-16 (69 percent) and canned 4-of-5 3-pointers.

"We just didn't play well in the first half like we can," Insell said. 
"We got caught up in the crowd and not the game. But we came out 
in the second half and played like we can. We shot the ball better 
and kept getting turnovers."

MTSU jumped out to an 18-9 lead seven minutes in, but saw the Indians storm back to tie the score, 23-23, with 6:09 left when Ashley Anderson scored inside. The Lady Raiders grabbed their biggest first-half lead, 39-29, with 57 seconds left before ASU's Rudy Sims hit a 3-pointer to cut the margin to 39-32 at intermission. MTSU freshman Brandi Brown added 12 points, all on 3-pointers. Arkansas State was led by senior post Adrianne Davie's 16 points.

With her fan club on the opposing bench, MTSU's Chrissy Givens couldn't resist putting on a show.

After scoring a season-high 33 points in the No. 20 Lady Raiders' 75-62 win over Arkansas-Little Rock, Givens was asked to speak to the Trojans. She entered the opposing locker room to a standing ovation moments after cutting UALR's throats in a Sun Belt showdown.

Givens was MTSU's brightest star during an otherwise dim performance.

The usual sharp-shooting Lady Raiders (17-3, 9-0) made just 26 percent from 3-point range, narrowly missing their season low of 24 percent. But Givens carried the scoring load through the team's offensive struggles.

Givens carried the Lady Raiders through some critical dry

When UALR (12-8, 5-5) went on a 23-13 run midway through the second half, she scored nine of MTSU's points to hold off the hard-charging Trojans. She added eight more points in the final 5:08 amid a pivotal Lady Raiders' run.

Despite some offensive lulls, the Lady Raiders led for more than 36 minutes of the game.

Holt had 13 points, and Horton added 10 points on 5-of-5 shooting.

MTSU's backcourt made only 3-of-13 from beyond the arc, and the team shot 20 percent from 3-point range in the second half. But sophomore Johnna Abney's trey with 5:22 remaining both revived the Lady Raiders and snapped an 0-for-7 skid beyond the arc. MTSU followed Abney's 3-pointer by forcing back-to-back turnovers and going on a 9-1 run to clinch the road win.

MTSU took advantage of a pair of fast starts. The Lady Raiders jumped out to a 32-15 lead in the first half, then started the second half with a 10-3 spurt. UALR outscored MTSU 44-33 in the remainder of the game.

The Lady Raiders extended their winning streak to 14 games, the third longest in the country and only one win shy of tying the school record. A 9-0 Sun Belt record is also the team's best conference start since 1988.

"It was a tough win against a good team," Insell said. "We got some key turnovers in key spots, and that helped us get a 13-point win. That's the bottom line."

Freshman Anshel Cooper led UALR with 20 points on 8-of-11 shooting. Kim Sitzmann added 18 points, but committed seven turnovers.

Middle Tennessee began the second half with an 18-2 run, breaking open a one-point game at the half, as the 19th-ranked Blue Raiders tied a school-record with their 15th straight victory in a 70-56 win over North Texas Wednesday night at the Super Pit.

Middle Tennessee (18-3, 10-0 Sun Belt) led by just one at the half after some sloppy play in the opening 20 minutes. The Blue Raiders rode the quick start and better defensive pressure after halftime, outscoring the Mean Green, 29-10, in the first 12 minutes of the second half.

The Blue Raiders opened the lead to as many as 20 points after the break, but UNT made a 10-0 run, cutting the Middle Tennessee lead to 12, but a 3-pointer from the corner by Starr Orr with 3:30 remaining sealed the victory.

Chrissy Givens led all scorers with 26 points, but the Blue Raiders shot just 40 percent from the floor in the game. Amber Holt added 16 points in the win for Middle Tennessee, their ninth road victory of the season and 10th away from home this year. Krystle Horton grabbed 10 rebounds and scored four points.

Despite a very shaky opening 20 minutes, the Blue Raiders led 32-31 at the break after failing to score for the final 3:36 of the half. Givens scored 15 before intermission but picked up her third foul on a charging call with 4:15 remaining in the break.

North Texas (5-13, 2-6 SBC) handled the Middle Tennessee full-court press fairly well in the half and Amber Jackson was an All-American, scoring 15 of the Mean Green's 31 points. Middle Tennessee used a three-quarters court and half-court trap in the second half, forcing 12 turnovers after intermission.

"[North Texas] is very athletic. They have lateral quickness and [Amber] Jackson is just deadly. She just did a great job," head coach Rick Insell said. "Right off the bat we let her get off.

"Then we got Chrissy Givens in foul trouble but I felt like we'd be alright. But they came out and really stuck it to us. They did a great job. They were prepared. They shut down some of the things we like to do and they did that because they were so athletic."

The Blue Raiders open a three-game homestand Sunday with a 2 p.m. contest against Western Division leader Louisiana-Lafayette.

It looked like MTSU might die by the 3-pointer against Louisiana-Lafayette Sunday afternoon.

However, after a horrific shooting performance in the first half, the No. 19-ranked Lady Raiders erupted with a second-half scoring frenzy that propelled them to a 84-57 victory before a crowd of 5.228 at Murohy Center.

MTSU missed its first nine 3-point attempts and made only 3-of-23 in the first half. However, the Lady Raiders made 9-of-25 in the second half. The Lady Raiders set a school record with 48 3-point attempts.

MTSU won its 16th consecutive game, which set a school record, and improved to 19-3 overall and 11-0 in the Sun Belt Conference. UL-Lafavette dropped to 17-6 and 9-3.

"It's a great win," Insell said. "I think we've been a little tired, but hopefully we're over that. We're just glad to be back at home."

Leading just 33-29 at halftime, the Lady Raiders opened the second half with an 18-5 run to take a 51-34 lead with 15:23 remaining.

Horton stole the ball from UL-Lafayette's Yolanda Jones on the Ragin' Cajuns' first possession of the second half and drove in for a layup to give MTSU a six-point cushion.

Freshman guard Chelsia Lymon hit consecutive 3-pointers, while Abney hit one and Brown two on three straight possessions to give the Lady Raiders a 57-34 lead with 13:10 left.

"Our plan was to make them shoot from the perimeter," said UL-Lafayette coach J. Kelley Hall. "We knew they're capable of making them, but we felt if they hit 10 or 11 we could still win. We've given up 11 and won this year. We felt like we should have had a lead at halftime."

MTSU held UL-Lafayette to 39 percent shooting and scored 30 points off the 29 Ragin' Cajuns floor mistakes.

Horton was also a key factor defensively, holding Jones to only 10 points — eight below her average.

"We knew she was a good player and we were well prepared," Horton said. "We knew she was capable of taking one on five, but we did a good job on her."

Horton had a double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds. She also had three assists and three steals.

"Thirteen points and 12 rebounds ... I'll take that every night," added Insell.

Brown added 15 points in only 14 minutes of play, while Lymon had nine points and Amber Holt eight.

MTSU's streak wasn't in jeopardy, but the Lady Raiders did get a quick wake-up call Wednesday night at Murphy Center.

After a sluggish start, however, MTSU built a 14-point halftime lead and exploded with a 30-10 run in the first eight minutes of the second half to whip Denver 82-58 before a crowd of 3, 227.

MTSU, ranked No. 20 in the Associated Press poll and No. 19 in the USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll, won its 17th straight game and improved to 20-3 overall and 12-0 in the Sun Belt. It's the fourth straight year the Lady Raiders have won at least 20 games.

MTSU led 37-23 at halftime before outscoring Denver 13-2 in less than four minutes and doubling up the Pioneers, 50-25.

Senior guard Chrissy Givens picked up her fourth foul with 13:20 remaining with MTSU leading 57-31. The Lady Raiders not only maintained the advantage but led by as many as 31 points.

Five MTSU players scored in double figures, led by Givens' 16. Freshman forward Brandi Brown had 15, junior forward Amber Holt 13, junior guard Starr Orr 11 and freshman guard Jackie Pickel 10.

MTSU fell behind 10-4 and trailed 14-9 before taking the lead, 17-14, on a Johnna Abney 3-pointer with 12:13 remaining.

Denver refused to wilt, however, as it stayed within three points until MTSU closed the final nine minutes of the half with a 17-6 run to take a 37-23 halftime lead.

Denver had success early breaking down MTSU's press and avoiding turnovers, yet it still finished with 13 in the first half.

However, MTSU had issues offensively, turning the ball over an uncharacteristic nine times in the first half.

The Lady Raiders shot 50 percent and hit five first-half 3-pointers during their key run.

Holt had a huge first half, scoring 11 points, pulling down six rebounds and dishing out four assists. She was 5-of-5 from the field.

MTSU returns to action Saturday when it plays host to South Alabama at 3 p.m. The Lady Raiders beat the Jaguars, 93-58, in their Sun Belt Conference opener.

MTSU coach Rick Insell made a statement Saturday, and his star player took it to heart.

Insell pulled senior Chrissy Givens from the court with nine minutes to play in the first half against South Alabama, and she did not return until the second half.

Givens made up for the lost time and her supporting cast — in particular Amber Holt — didn't miss a beat as the Lady Raiders whipped the Jaguars 86-58 before a crowd of 3,911 at Murphy Center.

MTSU, ranked No. 19 in the USA Today/ESPN coaches' poll and No. 20 in the Associated Press poll, won its 18th straight game and improved to 21-3 overall and 13-0 in the Sun Belt Conference. South Alabama fell to 11-12 and 5-8.

"She wasn't doing what I wanted her to do," Insell said of taking Givens out of the game. "I love her, I wouldn't trade her for nobody, but she was missing one- and two-footers and I decided she needed to sit.

"She came back in the second half and did was she needed to do. She got everyone involved."  $% \begin{center} \end{center} \begin{center} \en$ 

Givens finished with 16 points, including 14 in the second half. She also had six assists, five rebounds and five steals.

"I knew when he took me out I wasn't going back in," Givens said. "I wasn't knocking down shots and what does that say to our younger players? "I'm very pleased that we played so well when I wasn't in there. It should give us a lot more confidence."

Holt, meanwhile, had her most dominant game in conference play with 27 points and eight rebounds. She hit 11-of-16 shots, including 3-of-6 from 3-point range.

MTSU held South Alabama scoreless for the first 5:42 of the first half en route to building a 10-2 advantage. The Lady Raiders allowed just four points in the first eight minutes and stretched the lead to 17-4. However, MTSU was not sharp offensively, shooting only 42 percent in the first half. The Lady Raiders led by as many as 19 points, but South Alabama scored the last seven points of the half to pull within 37-26 at intermission.

MTSU opened the second half with an 18-6 run to build a 55-32 lead with 15:47 left. The Lady Raiders led by as many as 30 points. Junior guard Starr Orr had 11 points, all in the first half, while freshman guard Jackie Pickel had nine points and freshman guard Chelsia Lymon eight. MTSU shot 62 percent in the second half and 51 percent overall. The Lady Raiders forced 23 turnovers that resulted in 26 points.

Chrissy Givens scored 18 points in the first half and Amber Holt had 20 in the second half, as 18th-ranked Middle Tennessee held off a tough Louisiana-Monroe team, 83-70, Wednesday night at Fant-Ewing Coliseum, extending the Blue Raiders school-record winning streak to 19 games.

Middle Tennessee (22-3, 14-0 Sun Belt) won their 10th road game of the season and ninth in a row. The Blue Raiders have not lost a game since November 26 and own the nation's third longest winning streak. The squad's record is the best in school history after 25 games as well.

Middle Tennessee led 45-32 at halftime, but ULM pulled to 68-58 with 7:53 remaining. The Blue Raiders pulled away behind Holt in the second half when the junior was 8-for-14, using an isolation play on the leftside to score on trip after trip down the floor.

Holt finished with 25 points and Givens had 24, leading four Blue Raiders in double figures. Krystle Horton netted 13 points and Chelsia Lymon had 11 off the bench, including a 3-pointer with three minutes left in the game that put a dagger in the Warhawks.

After Givens had her high school jersey retired on Tuesday night, she played in her hometown for the first time in her career on Wednesday. The senior set the tone early, scoring nine of the team's first 14 points of the game.

Givens scored 18 points in the first half in all on 6-of-9 shooting from the field and 6-of-8 from the foul line. Horton and Lymon added eight points apiece for the Blue Raiders, who had 11 turnovers in the half but forced 15 by the Warhawks. Both teams shot better than 65 percent in the opening 20 minutes, including 70 percent (16-of-23) for Middle Tennessee.

In the second half Holt took over and actually missed at least four other shots in close. She hit eight field goals in the last 20 minutes and followed a 27-point effort on Saturday against South Alabama with 25 points in tonight's victory.

"When Chrissy [Givens] got Amber [Holt] involved in that isolation, [Amber] was able to make some big baskets for us," head coach Rick Insell said. "Chelsia [Lymon] and Johnna [Abney] and even Brandi Brown stepping up and hitting those 3-pointers when they did gave us a nice cushion."

The Blue Raiders shot a season-best 60 percent from the field, hitting 31-of-52, and making 6-for-9 on 3-pointers. Middle Tennessee also made 15-of-21 free throws.

Louisiana-Monroe ended the contest with 26 turnovers but made up for it by hitting 61 percent from the floor. Nedra Watson led the Warhawks with 15 points, while LeJeanna Howard had 14 and Shannon Lloyd netted 13.

MTSU had the look and the heart of a champion Sunday at Western Kentucky.

Despite being plagued with foul troubles, the loss of point guard Chelsia Lymon to a knee injury and a seven-point deficit in the first half, the Lady Raiders summoned the wherewithal to storm back and handily defeat Western Kentucky, 78-63, before a crowd of 4,492 at E.A. Diddle Arena.

"I'm real proud of our young ladies," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "We did have foul problems. We are aggressive and they were fouls."

No. 18-ranked MTSU improved to 23-3 overall and 15-0 in the Sun Belt, and it notched its 20th consecutive victory. It also was the Lady Raiders first win at Western Kentucky in the regular season since 2001. The Lady Toppers dropped to 17-6 and 11-3.

In the first half, senior forward Krystle Horton was whistled for her third foul with 14:07 remaining, while sophomore point guard Johnna Abney picked up her third foul with 10:51 left. Meanwhile, Lymon suffered a knee injury midway through the half and missed the rest of the game.

However, despite trailing by as many as seven points, MTSU rallied to take a 34-33 halftime lead.

"We felt real good at the half," said MTSU senior guard Chrissy Givens. "We had players like Lakira Boyd and Latoya Barclay who played great. Coach always says be ready when it's your time. Without Lakira and Barclay, we wouldn't have had this game."

Without Givens and junior forward Amber Holt, MTSU would have been in trouble.

 $Holt poured in a game-high 24 points and had seven rebounds, \\ while Givens had 22 points, 12 rebounds and seven assists.$ 

Western Kentucky did a good job controlling MTSU's 3-point shooting, but Givens, Holt and Horton dominated in the paint. Horton scored all 13 of her points in the decisive second half.

"Teams are taking the 3-pointer away, but when they do that we've got Amber, Chrissy and Krystle to go to inside," Insell said.

Western Kentucky's Kenzie Rich opened the second half with a 3-pointer to give Lady Toppers a 36-34 lead, but MTSU went on a 16-2 run to take a 50-38 lead with 15:38 left.

"We've got to put together a 40-minute basketball game," said Western Kentucky coach Mary Taylor Cowles. "... They have runs like that and those are the types of things you have to eliminate."

Western Kentucky got as close as seven points, but the Lady Raiders used a 13-0 spurt to go ahead 67-47 with 5:23 remaining. MTSU shot 59 percent in the second half, while Western Kentucky shot only 36 percent. Western Kentucky was led by senior guard Tiffany Zaragoza with 22 points, while Kelly had 14.

MTSU certainly got the close game coach Rick Insell said his team needed.

Florida International pushed the No. 17 Lady Raiders to the limit Thursday night before they finally held off the Panthers 66-59 before a crowd of 4,907 at Murphy Center.

MTSU led by as many as 21 points in the second half and looked to be on its way to another Sun Belt Conference blowout. However, the Panthers never wilted.

"We needed this game," Insell said. "We needed this type of game because we're going to have these types of games down the stretch."

MTSU started the second half with a 7-0 run to take a 44-23 lead with 17:33 remaining, but FIU answered with 10 unanswered points and eventually trimmed the Lady Raiders lead to six, 55-49, with 6:39 left in the game.

"They never panicked and we did some strange things," Insell said. "But we'll give [our players] a couple of days off and maybe will flush it out of our system."

MTSU won its school-record 21st consecutive game to improve to 24-3 overall and 16-0 in conference play. The 24 regular-season wins is a new school record, breaking the 1982-83 team that went on to win a record 26 games. The 16 sbc wins also ties Louisiana Tech for the most victories in Sun Belt history.

With MTSU struggling offensively throughout the second half (39.4 percent), senior forward Krystle Horton turned in one of her most key performances of the season.

The 6-foot-2 forward scored 10 of her 12 points in the second half and tied Chrissy Givens with a team-high nine rebounds. She also had a team-high six assists and three steals.

Horton's quickness and ability to drive to the goal hurt the much bigger FIU frontline, particularly when she was matched up with 6-4 center Lasma Jekabsone.

MTSU had an uncharacteristic 20 turnovers, but forced 28 FIU floor mistakes.

"We didn't take care of the basketball very well tonight," said Givens, who led MTSU with 17 points. "We didn't execute like we can, but we're glad to be 16-0 in the Sun Belt."

MTSU had no answer for FIU sophomore forward Marquita Hadley, a 6-foot bruising and athletic forward who had a game-high 23 points, including 10-of-11 shooting. After FIU got as close as six points, MTSU extended the lead back to 12, 64-52, with 3:57 remaining. The Panthers never got closer than the final seven-point margin of victory. MTSU also got 15 points from Holt, while freshman guard Jackie Pickel hit three 3-pointers to finish with nine points. Jekabsone had 13 points and a game-high 11 rebounds for FIU, which dropped to 15-10 overall and 9-6 in conference play.

Seniors Chrissy Givens and Krystle Horton both recorded double-doubles and 17th-ranked Middle Tennessee used a 16-5 run to start the second half to take the lead and then held on for a 68-60 victory over Troy Thursday night at Trojan Arena. The win is the 22nd in a row for the Blue Raiders, who also set a Sun Belt Conference record with their 17th SBC win of the season.

Middle Tennessee eclipsed a mark set twice by Louisiana Tech in the Sun Belt, recording its 17th consecutive win in conference play. The Blue Raiders were led by Givens with 31 points and 13 rebounds, her sixth double-double of the season, and Horton, who recorded 14 points and 10 rebounds.

The Blue Raiders struggled mightily from the field in the first half, shooting 34 percent, and the Trojans barely missed, hitting almost 60 percent for most of the half. Troy used a 24-6 run in the first half to open a lead as many as 11 points, the biggest deficit for Middle Tennessee since its last loss, November 26 at Tennessee.

Givens kept the Blue Raiders in the game with 19 points, while Horton added 10, including six at the foul line.

In the second half Amber Holt scored six of the first 12 points of the half for the Blue Raiders and Givens gave Middle Tennessee the lead with a bucket with 15:02 remaining. Middle Tennessee built the lead to as many as 12 points in the second half at 63-51 with 4:16 to play, but the Trojans refused to go away.

Troy went on a 9-2 run over the next three minutes to close to within five with 1:26 left, but Latoya Barclay hit two free throws to seal the victory with 37 seconds remaining.

The turning point of the second half may have come with just under five minutes remaining in the game and Troy down just six points. Troy's Amy Lewis beat her defender on a backdoor cut and had an easy lay-up, but she missed the gimme and the Blue Raiders came back down, with Barclay hitting a 16-footer from the wing to extend the lead back to eight. Givens then had two straight buckets to put Middle Tennessee up a dozen.

Troy also went 6:20 at one point in the second half without a point, with the Blue Raiders outscoring the Trojans, 12-2.

Holt scored 14 points and had seven rebounds despite playing just 10 minutes in the first half after picking up two fouls. Givens was 15-for-29 from the field for 31 points, setting a career-high for makes and tying her career-high for attempts in a game. She also added six steals.

Horton was 8-for-9 at the foul line and also had a big bucket late in the game, hitting a lefthanded runner in the lane with 5:59 remaining.

It was only fitting that perfection was achieved on the strength of Chrissy Givens' and Krystle Horton's play Saturday afternoon.

The two MTSU seniors played the final game of their career at Murphy Center and combined for 58 points in a 78-63 victory over Florida Atlantic before a crowd of 5,505.

MTSU ended the regular season with a 26-3 record, an 18-0 Sun Belt Conference record and became the first team since Louisiana Tech (2001) to go undefeated in league play.

Givens' 31 points was two shy of her season high, while Horton scored a season-high 27 points and grabbed 10 rebounds.

"It's like a fairy tale," Givens said. "To come here four years ago and go out like this is great. I don't want to wake up. It's like a dream come true. I'm really glad the way it ended."

Added Horton: "It couldn't of ended any better. I'm glad I was able to have a game like that. I was hoping I wouldn't be nervous after the pregame stuff, and it's exciting to be where we're at."

MTSU's 26 victories is tied for the most in school history and it currently has a 23-game winning streak.

"I think when we clinched the No. 1 seed at Western [Kentucky], it got a little easier," Insell said of dealing with the pressure of trying to go unbeaten in league play. "I think we realized it was very possible, and we felt if we ran the table, we'd also clinch a spot in the NCAA Tournament."

Though MTSU won by 13 points, it was a struggle the entire first half and in the early stages of the second. The Lady Raiders led 32-26 at halftime and just 41-38 with 16 minutes left before going on a 18-0 run to take a 59-38 advantage with 10:57 remaining.

MTSU suffered through one of its worst offensive halves of the season in the first 20 minutes when it made only 12-of-46 shots. If you took away Horton's 6-of-6 performance, the rest of the team made only 6-of-40 field goal attempts.

Despite scoring 11 points in the first half, Givens made only 3-of-14 shots, while junior forward Amber Holt was 0-of-6.

"There's something about this team that when things look bad, somebody gives us a spark," Givens said. "Starr Orr will get a big steal or Krystle [Horton] will get a big rebound. It seems when it starts to get close, we get a spark and start clicking."

Orr added seven points and nine rebounds for MTSU, which shot 34 percent. The Lady Raiders made just 3-of-26 3-pointers (11 percent).

FAU (6-24, 2-16) was led by Mistoria Brown with 14 points and Cristal Randolph with 12.

Any questions about whether MTSU had lost its focus or was in a rut were quickly answered Saturday in the quarterfinals of the Sun Belt Conference Tournament.

MTSU stormed out to a 14-0 lead and continued to ride the momentum to a 79-52 blowout over South Alabama at Louisiana-Lafayette's Cajun Dome.

The three-time defending champions and 17th-ranked Lady Raiders improved to 27-3 overall and won their 24th consecutive game — the longest streak in the nation after Duke lost Saturday to North Carolina State. The 27 victories also set a school record.

MTSU won its 11th straight tournament game. The Lady Raiders are 15-3 all-time in the tournament. The Lady Raiders advanced to play Denver Monday at 12:30 p.m.

MTSU held South Alabama scoreless until the 14:44 mark when Valencia Boswell hit two free throws, and the Jaguars didn't manage their first field goal until 10:17 left before halftime.

By that point, the Lady Raiders had sizzled offensively and built a 25-2 lead before Whitney Woodard hit the Jaguars' first field goal. The Lady Raiders led 39-6 with 4:20 left before halftime.

MTSU shot 54 percent in the first half and went to the locker room with a 46-18 lead.

The Lady Raiders had a balanced scoring effort, led by Givens' 24 points. Senior forward Krystle Horton and junior forward Amber Holt had 13 points apiece, while junior back-up guard Latoya Barclay had all 10 of her points in the first half.

Barclay was a key in MTSU's first-half dismantling of the Jaguars, recording three steals and hitting two 3-pointers.

"Coach Insell has confidence in me, and when I go in there I need to do what I do," Barclay said. "I just played my game and did what I can do "

MTSU scored 42 points off 25 turnovers by South Alabama, which had a combined 84 in its three games against the Lady Raiders this season.

MTSU didn't have a letdown in the second half, as it scored the first six points to go up 52-18 with 18:23 left. The Lady Raiders led by as many as 40 points on two occasions before the Jaguars closed the game with a 15-3 run to pull within the final 27-point margin.

"Whoever plays them (in the NCAA Tournament) is in deep trouble," said South Alabama coach Rick Pietri. "You can not simulate what they do, the way they play. Nobody plays that way."

South Alabama, which ended the season 14-16, was led by senior forward Whitney Woodard with 14 points and 11 rebounds.

MTSU's women took the suspense out of it early Monday and emphatically moved into the Sun Belt Conference Tournament championship game for the fifth straight year.

The No. 16-ranked Lady Raiders again used their harassing and pressing defense, which keyed their 76-50 semifinals victory over Denver at the Cajundome.

MTSU, which has won the last three league tournament titles, improved to 28-3 and extended the nation's longest winning streak to 25 games. The Lady Raiders have won 12 straight Sun Belt Tournament games.

"It's exciting to be going to the finals for the fourth time," said MTSU senior forward Krystle Horton, who played in her school-record 126th game. "We've come out with a lot of focus in the tournament. Everybody is prepared and ready for the challenge ahead of them."

MTSU jumped out to an 11-3 lead over Denver, and later used a 9-0 run to take a 25-7 advantage with 7:55 left in the first half.

"I was real pleased with the way we started the game," hea coach Rick Insell said. "We did a good job making adjustments, and I'm real satisfied with the way we picked things up."

The Lady Raiders led 43-17 at halftime and by as many as 40 points in the second half.

"I just think we have a lot of our goals still in front of us," said MTSU senior guard Chrissy Givens, who had a game-high 28 points, seven rebounds, five assists and three steals, and set the school's single-season scoring record with 695 points. "We're not just thinking about a conference championship. This is a stepping stone, and we're playing for a high seed in the NCAA Tournament."

Denver coach Pam Tanner said the Lady Raiders have the ability to do just that.

Louisiana Tech is the only team in the Sun Belt to win four straight tournament championships. The Lady Techsters actually won six straight from 1996-2002.

MTSU junior forward Amber Holt had 15 points and 11 rebounds, while freshmen Brandi Brown and Jackie Pickel added nine apiece.

It was a test MTSU needed, and one it passed with grit, determination and the ability to answer anything Louisiana-Lafayette threw its way.

No. 16-ranked MTSU won its fourth consecutive Sun Belt Conference Tournament championship Tuesday, holding off the Ragin' Cajuns 77-67 in a title game that more than lived up to expectations

"What a great game," said MTSU coach Rick Insell, whose team extended the nation's longest winning streak to 26 games and improved to 29-3. "Lafayette was well prepared, they're a quality team and they're well-coached."

MTSU is the first team since Louisiana Tech to win four straight tournament titles, and senior guard Chrissy Givens is the first player in Sun Belt history to win Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year and tournament MVP awards in successive years.

"It's unbelievable, four straight," said Givens, who scored a game-high 33 points and set the tournament record for points scored (85). "It's great to see where this program is headed and it's great to be part of the building blocks."

MTSU senior forward Krystle Horton echoed Givens' sentiments.

"To be part of history is a great, great feeling," Horton said. "To be part of a group that is all about team makes it very special."

Although MTSU never trailed, it never did take off on one of its patented runs to put the game out of reach.

The Lady Raiders led by 12 in the first half, 31-19, at the 5:42 mark, but the Ragin' Cajuns (25-8) stormed back to pull within 33-29 with 2:51 left.

Givens then scored the final six points of the half, including a 10-footer at the buzzer to give the Lady Raiders a 39-29 halftime advantage.

The game stayed in the six- to 10-point range the entire second half until Amber Holt and Johnna Abney hit back-to-back 3-pointers to give MTSU a 61-45 lead with 9:43 left.

However, the Ragin' Cajuns got within 63-56 three minutes

"It was very important to have a game like that, with each team playing so well," said Horton, who had seven points and a teamhigh nine rebounds. "It prepared us for the NCAA tournament and it made us keep our focus on what we needed to do."

Holt sparked the final MTSU surge, scoring six points over a two-minute span that gave MTSU a 73-60 lead with 2:31 left.

Holt, an all-tournament selection along with Horton and Givens, finished with 20 points and seven rebounds, while Abney had 12 points — all on 3-pointers.

MTSU's Lady Raiders know what its like to win as a No. 12 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

What they didn't want to feel was the anguish of losing in the first round as a No. 5 seed.

No worries on this night as MTSU jumped all over Gonzaga Saturday from the onset and raced off for am 85-46 victory at Stanford's Maples Pavilion.

The Lady Raiders, who pulled upsets over North Carolina and North Carolina State as 13 and 12 seeds in 2004 and 2005, certainly didn't overlook No. 12 seed Gonzaga, which had won nine straight games.

"That's one thing we talked about before the game and in the huddle before the game — that we had two players, Chrissy (Givens) and Krystle (Horton), who had won two of these games as a 12 and 13 seed."

MTSU improved to 30-3 — the most wins ever in one season — and won its 27th consecutive game.

Gonzaga's season ended at 24-10. MTSU will face Marist — which upset Ohio State 67-63 late Saturday — at a time to be determined

"We came in with the mindset that we want to go to the Final Four," Givens said. "Everybody has laughed, but we believe. Tonight we were playing this game like was to go to the Final Four and we were ready to play and we aren't going to look past anyone."

MTSU never trailed Gonzaga and used a 12-0 run midway through the first half to take a 29-10 lead with 8:42 remaining.

Gonzaga handled the Lady Raiders' press well early but eventually wilted under the pressure. The Bulldogs had 21 first-half turnovers that led to 23 Lady Raider points.

Gonzaga was averaging just 16 turnovers a game but had a season-high 37.

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{MTSU}}$  led by as many as 25 points in the first half and held a 44-20 halftime lead.

Gonzaga scored eight straight points during a stretch early in the second half to get within 20 points with 15:49 remaining, but the Lady Raiders had the lead back to 24 points in less than two minutes.

Givens led all scorers with 24 points, including 18 in the first half, and added five rebounds, four assists and five steals.

"We just wanted to go out and play Middle Tennessee basketball." Givens said.

Gonzaga made its final push when it got within 19 points, 56-37, with 11:33 left, but Horton scored back-to-back baskets to give the Lady Raiders a 60-37 cushion with 9:40 left.

Middle Tennessee played from behind almost the entire game and every time the 17th-ranked Blue Raiders made a run, Marist answered, as the Red Foxes advanced to the Sweet 16 with a 73-59 victory Monday night at Maples Pavilion. The loss ended Middle Tennessee's season and its 27-game winning streak along the way.

Marist hit every shot at crucial times and Middle Tennessee missed several excellent opportunities to take the lead in the second half, including a missed lay-up on a breakaway by Starr Orr and a missed two-footer from Amber Holt.

Marist also handled the Blue Raider press as well as any team all season, committing just 12 turnovers, including only seven in the first half. Middle Tennessee went to a triangle-and-two defense in the second half to slow down the Marist guards, but Meg Dahlman scored seven of her 13 points after the break and Lynzee Johnson came off the bench to net seven points, including a big 3-pointer with 7:40 to play in the game.

The Red Foxes started the game on fire, hitting eight of their first 11 shots and racing out to a 17-11 advantage. Marist led 19-11 before the Blue Raiders ran off nine straight points for a brief lead.

But the Red Foxes answered with a 21-9 run over the final eight minutes of the half to take a 40-29 lead at the break.

Chrissy Givens scored 12 of Middle Tennessee's 19 points in the half, but the Blue Raiders made just 36 percent from the field, including 4-of-16 from 3-point range.

Middle Tennessee scored the first eight points of the second half. The Blue Raiders pulled within 42-40 but no closer. Middle Tennessee dared Kresge to shoot and her trifecta from the wing with 12:54 to play pushed the Marist advantage to 47-40. The Blue Raiders pulled to 52-47 before Johnson's 3-pointer gave the Red Foxes lead back to eight

Givens led the Bue Raiders with 16 points, while Krystle Horton added 10 points and six rebounds. Holt was just 2-for-10 from the field and Middle Tennessee made only 7-of-26 from the 3-point line, though Jackie Pickel had a trio of trifectas and Brandi Brown added a pair.

The Blue Raiders end the season 30-4 overall, making their fourth straight NCAA Tournament and winning a first round game for the third time in four seasons. Middle Tennessee broke the school record for victories and finished 21-0 against Sun Belt opnoents.
