HOLT VOTED FIRST TEAM, BLUE RAIDERS PICKED SECOND IN SBC: Middle Tennessee senior Amber Holt was voted First Team All-Sun Belt and the Blue Raiders were picked second in the East in a poll of league coaches released during the Sun Belt Media Days in Mobile, Ala. Holt was a First Team All-SBC selection last season after averaging 16.7 points, 6.3 rebounds and 2.7 steals per contest. She is one of three starters returning for the Blue Raiders from last year's record-setting 30-4 club.

She had her best games in 2006-07 against some of the nation's top teams, including 28 points and eight rebounds against top-ranked Maryland, 26 points and 10 boards versus Chattanooga and 21 points, including 15 in the second half, in Middle Tennessee's victory at eighth-ranked Georgia. Holt also scored 27 points against Old Dominion, tallied 15 points and 11 rebounds in the semifinals of the Sun Belt Championships versus Denver and posted 23 points against Gonzaga in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The Duluth, Ga., native made it to the final cut this past summer for USA Basketball's Pan American Games Team.

Middle Tennessee ran through the conference last season undefeated and won all 21 contests in 2006-07 versus Sun Belt foes. The Blue Raiders have won 24 consecutive games against SBC opponents dating to the 2005-06 season. Middle Tennessee received four first-place votes in the East Division and had 69 total points. The coaches picked Western Kentucky first in the division, with the Lady Toppers receiving nine first-place votes and 74 total points. Florida International was selected third in the East, with Troy and South Alabama tied for fourth and Florida Atlantic sixth.

RAIDERS OPEN REGULAR SEASON AT OLD DOMINION: Middle Tennessee opens its 33rd season of women's basketball at traditional power Old Dominion Saturday at 6 p.m., the second meeting between the two schools in the last two seasons. The Blue Raiders defeated the Lady Monarchs, 86-71, on December 19, 2006 at Murphy Center (a full recap of the game appears on page 8 of these notes). Middle Tennessee is 19-13 all-time in season openers and has lost the last three, including an 80-76 defeat to top-ranked Maryland last year at Murphy Center. Head coach Rick Insell is 0-2 in season openers, dropping a 76-66 decision at Chattanooga

BLUE RAIDERS 27TH IN ESPN/USA TODAY POLL:

Middle Tennessee was ranked 27th in the Preseason ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll released October 31 and missed the Top 25 by just seven points. Defending national champion Tennessee is ranked No. 1 and garnered 26 of the 31 first-place votes in the poll, while Connecticut received four first-place votes and LSU, who Middle Tennessee plays on December 28 in Murfreesboro, garnered the remaining top vote. The Blue Raiders posted 71 points in the poll, while 25th-

ranked N.C. State had 78 points. DePaul received 75 points and was ranked 26th. The Blue Raiders were ranked in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll for the first time since 1988 last season and appeared in the final 12 rankings of the season, reaching as high as No. 16 and ending the year rated 23rd nationally. Middle Tennessee's 30-4 mark in 2006-07 was the best ever in the history of the program and one of the best in Sun Belt history, as the Blue Raiders rolled through league play and the conference tournament with a 21-0 mark against SBC competition.

HOLT SECOND TEAM ALL-AMERICAN, TEAM RANKED 13TH BY SPORTING NEWS:

Middle Tennessee was ranked 13th and senior Amber Holt was named Second Team All-American by the Sporting News in their Preseason College Basketball magazine. It was the second preseason ranking for the Blue Raiders after Lindy's rated the club 22nd nationally. Middle Tennessee ended the 2006-07 season ranked 17th by the Associated Press and 23rd in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. The Blue Raiders return three starters and seven letterwinners from last year's record-setting 30-4 club.

Holt garnered First Team All-Sun Belt honors last season after averaging 16.7 points, 6.3 rebounds and 2.7 steals per game. She started all 34 contests and scored in double figures in 30 games. The Duluth, Ga., native netted 28 points and eight rebounds in her first career game, versus top-ranked Maryland, and followed that with the first of three double-doubles during the season with 19 points and 10 boards against South Dakota State. Holt scored 26 points with 10 rebounds versus Chattanooga and 21 points, including 15 in the second half, in a victory at eighth-

ranked Georgia. She also posted 27 points with eight boards, including 10-of-12 free throws, against Old Dominion. Holt registered 20-plus points in three straight games in February, scoring 27 against South Alabama, 25 at Louisiana-Monroe and 24 at Western Kentucky. She added 15 points and 11 rebounds versus Denver in the semifinals of the Sun Belt Championships and netted 20 points in the championship game against Louisiana-Lafayette. Holt scored 23 points versus Gonzaga in the opening contest of the NCAA Tournament.

RAIDERS 28TH IN FIRST AP POLL: Middle Tennessee was ranked 28th in the first Associated Press poll released on November 3. The Blue Raiders appeared in the final 10 AP polls in 2006-07, reaching as high as No. 16 on March 5. Last season's ranking was the first-ever in school history in the Associated Press poll for Middle Tennessee. The Blue Raiders ended the year ranked 17th in the final AP poll of 2006-07.

BLUE RAIDERS 22ND IN LINDY'S: Middle Tennessee was ranked 22nd in a preseason poll released in Lindy's 2007-08 College Basketball Magazine. The Blue Raiders ended the 2006-07 season ranked 17th by the Associated Press and 23rd in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. Middle Tennessee returns three starters and seven letterwinners from last year's 30-4 club, including senior Amber Holt, who averaged 16.7 points and 6.3 rebounds per game. She also posted 2.7 steals per contest and scored in doubles figures

in 30 of the 34 games. The Blue Raiders play three other teams in Lindy's Top 5, including Tennessee (No. 1), Maryland (No. 4) and LSU (No. 5).

HOLT NOW THE FIRST OPTION: Senior Amber Holt flourished as the second option in Middle Tennessee's offense last season, averaging 16.7 points, 6.3 rebounds and 2.7 steals per contest. The Duluth, Ga., native will become the first option this season in head coach Rick Insell's motion offense. Holt had 10 games with 20-plus points last season, including 28 in the season opener versus Maryland and 27 points in mid-December against Old Dominion. Holt picked up her game considerably in the month of February, netting 27 points against South Alabama on February 3, 25 points at Louisiana-Monroe on February 7 and 24 points at Western Kentucky on February 11. She averaged 18.2 points in six February contests, netted 20 versus Louisiana-Lafayette in the championship game of the Sun Belt Championships and then posted 23 points against Gonzaga in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. She tied for first on the club with 6.3 rebounds per outing. Holt ranked 82nd nationally in scoring and 33rd in the country in steals per game last season.

WHO WILL BE THE SECOND OPTION: With Amber Holt becoming the team's first option on the offensive end, someone must step into the role as the second scorer for the Blue Raiders. The squad has several candidates for the position, but consistency from one of last year's role players is the key. Every returning player had at least one game in double figures last season and the six players combined for 32 double-digit contests [Brandi Brown (11), Starr Orr (8), Jackie Pickel (5), Johnna Abney (4), Chelsia Lymon (3) and Latoya Barclay (1)].

LYMON RETURNS AT FULL STRENGTH: Middle Tennessee point guard Chelsia Lymon has returned to the court at full strength just nine months after tearing her ACL on February 11 at Western Kentucky. The sophomore played 19.0 minutes per game in the two exhibition contests for the Blue Raiders, a little more than her season average of 16.3 in 2006-07. Never afraid to take her shot, Lymon was 6-for-13 from the field and 3-7 from 3-point range in the two exhibitions, averaging 8.0 points and 3.0 rebounds per contest. Her return to the floor helps the Blue Raiders in several ways – adding to the depth at the point guard position as well as experience on a very young team,

and also a scoring punch from the guard position. Lymon averaged 5.5 points per game last year and had three double-figure scoring contests – 13 points versus top-ranked Maryland, 10 points against South Dakota State and 11 points at Louisiana-Monroe.

ORR SUSPENDED FOR EXHIBITION GAMES, OPENING TWO CONTESTS: Senior Starr Orr has been suspended for the two exhibition games as well as the first two contests of the regular season, at Old Dominion and versus Tennessee Tech, due to a violation of athletic department policy. Orr averaged 5.5 points, 4.4 rebounds and 2.4 steals per game last season and the Blue Raiders were 30-2 when she started. The Danville, Ala., native ranked 76 nationally in steals per game and scored in double figures eight times, including 10 points versus Gonzaga in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

RAIDERS VERY YOUNG IN 2007-08: Middle Tennessee will start the 2007-08 season with just 11 players available for head coach Rick Insell's relentless style of full court basketball, and only three of those players have played more than one season at Middle Tennessee – seniors Starr Orr and Latoya Barclay and junior Johnna Abney. Senior Amber Holt has been in Murfreesboro one year after transferring from Southeastern Illinois College. The rest of the squad is made up of three sophomores (Jackie Pickel, Chelsia Lymon and Brandi Brown), one redshirt freshman (Angelique Burtts) and three true freshmen (Emily Queen, Morgan Boyd and Anne Marie Lanning).

NEW HOME ON THE RADIO: Middle Tennessee will take a significant stride in 2007-08, with the flagship station moving to WMOT 89.5 FM in Murfreesboro. The 100,000-watt station reaches beyond Bowling Green, Ky., to the north and Cookeville, Tenn., to the east. The station also reached the Tennessee River to the west and Huntsville, Ala., to the south. All Blue Raider women's basketball games may also be heard on the Internet as well at GoBlueRaiders.com.

INSELL NUMBER ONE: With the win over Florida International on February 15, 2007, head coach Rick Insell posted his 44th victory at Middle Tennessee, the most in school history by a coach in his first two years. Insell broke the previous mark of 43 victories set by Lewis Bivens during the 1987-88 and 1988-89 campaigns. The Blue Raiders posted their 15th 20-win campaign in 31 seasons of varsity basketball this year, and Insell became just the second coach, along with Bivens, to have back-to-back 20-win campaigns to begin a career as head coach at Middle Tennessee. Insell begins his third season at Middle Tennessee with an overall record of 50-15.

An All-Sports Pass, which covers all sporting events for the remainder of the 2007-08 academic year, costs \$99.95, while a single-game pass is \$6. Fans may also purchase a package for all home basketball games this year, which includes men's and women's contests, totaling 35 games for \$50.

SEASON TICKETS AVAILABLE: Middle Tennessee's women have already surpassed last year's season ticket total and still have more than one week before the regular season opener on Wednesday, November 14 versus Tennessee Tech. Last year the Blue Raiders sold 2,111 season tickets and already this season fans have purchased 2,432 season passes for the 12 regular season home dates, which includes a December 28 contest against four-time

NCAA Final Four participant LSU. Women's hoops season tickets are \$100.

RAIDERS SET SUN BELT VICTORIES MARK:

Middle Tennessee set a school and Sun Belt record for conference victories in 2006-07, running the table against SBC foes and compiling an 18-0 record. Last season marked the 20th time in the 31-year history of varsity basketball that Middle Tennessee has posted double-figure wins in league play. The 1982-83 squad's 10-0 record is the only other undefeated conference record in school history. The Blue Raiders broke the previous Sun Belt high of 16 league wins set by Louisiana Tech in both 1999-00 and 2000-01. Middle Tennessee ended the season 21-0 against Sun Belt opponents after winning its fourth consecutive SBC Tournament. Only three other schools in the 31-year history of the Sun Belt finished undefeated in conference play (Old Dominion, 6-0 in 1984-85, 1987-88; UAB, 6-0 in 1990-91; Louisiana Tech, 14-0 in 1993-94, 1995-96, 12-0 in 1998-99, 16-0 in 1999-00, 2000-01). Across the nation last season, only seven other programs out of 31 conferences posted undefeated marks, including: George Washington, 14-0 in the Atlantic 10; Tennessee, 14-0 in the SEC; Connecticut, 16-0 in the Big East; Duke, 14-0 in the ACC; Wisconsin-Green Bay, 14-0 in the Horizon; Coppin State, 18-0 in the MEAC; and UT-Arlington, 16-0 in the Southland.

INSELL VOTED COACH OF THE YEAR: After setting the school-record for wins with 30 and setting a Sun Belt record with 18 league victories, Rick Insell was voted Coach of the Year by his peers in 2006-07. The Coach of the Year award is the first such honor for a Middle Tennessee head coach since Lewis Bivens in 1988. Insell has compiled a 50-15 record in his two seasons at the helm of the program, including last year's 30-4 mark, which included a 27-game winning streak. He compiled more wins in his first two seasons than any other previous Blue Raider coach and posted back-to-back 20-win campaigns for just the sixth time in school history.

HOLT GARNERS SBC PLAYER OF THE WEEK TWICE:

Forward Amber Holt was voted the Sun Belt Player of the Week on two occasions in 2006-07, on November 14 and again on February 5. The Duluth, Ga., native averaged 23.5 points and 9.0 rebounds in Middle Tennessee's first two games of the year, versus No. 1 Maryland and South Dakota State. Against the defending national champion Terrapins, Holt tallied 28 points on 11-of-24 shooting with eight rebounds. Her 15 first-half points kept the Blue Raiders in the contest when the Terrapins threatened to run away with the game. Against SDSU, Holt scored 19 points and added 10 boards for her first career double-double. In February, Holt averaged 20.0 points and 8.0 rebounds in the Middle Tennessee victories over Denver and South Alabama. The junior scored 13 points with eight boards and four assists versus Denver on January 31 before exploding for 27 points, eight rebounds, three assists and two steals against South Alabama on February 3. The 27-point effort was just one short of her career-high set in the season opener against Maryland and was her second 27-point effort of the season (Old Dominion on

December 19 was the other). The Duluth, Ga., native was 11-for-16 from the field, tying her season-high for makes, and set career-highs by going 3-of-6 from 3-point range.

HOME DOMINATION CONTINUES VERSUS SBC FOES:

Middle Tennessee's home dominance of Sun Belt foes continued throughout last season, as the Blue Raiders won their 30th in a row versus league foes at Murphy Center with a win on February 24 against Florida Atlantic. The last time Middle Tennessee dropped a conference home game was February 5, 2004, in double overtime against Western Kentucky. Overall, the Blue Raiders have won 34 of their last 35 home conference games and head coach Rick Insell is a perfect 18-0 at the Glass House against SBC competition. In fact, since joining the Sun Belt before the 2000-01 season, the Blue Raiders are 46-6 at home against Sun Belt competition, an exquisite .885 winning percentage. Western Kentucky has won two games, with South Alabama, Florida International, North Texas and New Mexico State claiming one victory each.

HOME SWEET HOME:

Middle Tennessee ended the 2005-06 season 15-1 at home, with its lone loss to then 17th-ranked Georgia on November 30, 2005. The Blue Raiders had their 12-game home winning streak snapped in last year's season-opener against top-ranked Maryland, losing 80-76, and then dropped a 72-61 decision three nights later to South Dakota State. But the squad rebounded, posting 13 straight victories at home and running head coach Rick Insell's mark on the home floor to 28-3 overall and 13-2 last season. Middle Tennessee owns an overall mark of 315-89 all-time at Murphy Center, a winning percentage of .780.

HOLT RECORDS THREE DOUBLE-DOUBLES:

Junior Amber Holt was one of the main cogs in Middle Tennessee's success this season, recording three double-doubles and leading the Blue Raiders in either points and/or rebounds in 16 of the 32 games. Holt was the first to accomplish the double-double feat last season with 19 points and 10 rebounds against South Dakota State on November 13, just her second game as a Blue Raider. The Duluth, Ga., native then had 26 points and 10 boards versus Chattanooga on November 24. Holt's final double-double came during the Sun Belt Tournament, netting 15 points and grabbing a career-high 11 rebounds versus Denver in the semifinals. In 2004-05 and 2005-06, the Blue Raiders posted seven double-doubles as a team in each campaign and had 14 in 2003-04. Last season the squad had 12 double-doubles as a team.

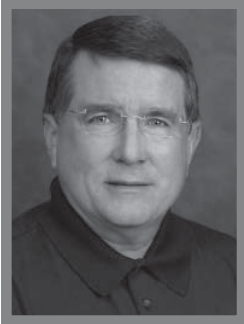
BLUE RAIDERS RANK SIXTH IN ATTENDANCE INCREASE:

After leading the nation in increased attendance in his first season as head coach, Rick Insell and Middle Tennessee ranked sixth nationally in increased attendance for the 2006-07 season, according to official figures released by the NCAA. Middle Tennessee ranked sixth in the country in increased attendance in 2006-07, averaging 4,157 fans for 15 home games. The 4,157 fans per contest ranked 26th nationally for average attendance per game, ahead of traditional women's basketball pow-

ers such as Kansas State, national runner-up Rutgers, Old Dominion, Stanford and Louisiana Tech. The Blue Raiders set a single-game record with 10,010 for the season-opener against top-ranked Maryland and had six total crowds over 4,000 during the 2006-07 campaign (Arkansas State - 4,884; Louisiana-Lafayette - 5,228; South Alabama - 4,711; Florida International - 4,907; Florida Atlantic - 5,505). The women's program has increased its attendance more than 550 percent over the last two seasons, going from 744 per contest in 2004-05 to 2,699 last season to this year's 4,157.

Head Coach Rick Insell



Rick Insell begins his third season as head coach at Middle Tennessee amid great expectations after a record-breaking season in 2006-07 that included a school-record 30 victories, a fourth straight trip

to the NCAA Tournament and a No. 16 national ranking by the Associated Press and the ESPN/*USA Today* Coaches poll.

Insell has helped elevate the program into the national spotlight, including last season's victory at then eighth-ranked Georgia in early December. The victory in Athens was the first in program history over a ranked team on the road and just the fifth victory over a ranked foe in the 32-year history of the Middle Tennessee program.

The Blue Raiders won 27 games in a row in 2006-07, the longest streak in the nation at one point, and did not lose for more than 100 days.

Middle Tennessee eclipsed the school record for victories in a season as well last year, posting a 30-4 overall record, besting the previous mark of 26 set by the 1982-83 squad. The 2006-07 squad also tied the record for consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, tying a mark set from 1983-86, and collected the program's fourth consecutive 20-win campaign, also a school record. The four straight conference tournament titles also ties a school record set from 1983-86.

Insell's two-year mark of 50-15 is the best back-to-back seasons in program history, bettering the mark of 48-17 posted during 2003-04 and 2004-05.

Fans have also taken notice of the team's entertaining playing style. Middle Tennessee led the nation in increased attendance percentage in 2005-06, drawing 2,699 fans per game, a 276 percent increase over the previous season. The Blue Raiders improved on that number in 2006-07 as well, setting a single-game record with 10,010 in the season opener against defending national champion Maryland and averaging 4,157 fans for 15 home games, an increase of 65 percent. Middle Tennessee's attendance ranked in the Top 30 nationally and the crowd for the Maryland game was one of the Top 50 for attendance in the nation in 2006-07.

Insell also developed one of the best players in school history over the last two seasons. Chrissy

- In 1992, Rick Insell was named Head Coach of the Girls High School All-American Game and from 1992-96 was a member of the All-American Selection Committee. He became the chairman of the All-American Selection Committee in 1996 and began serving as an advisor in 1999.
- Insell was named to the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors as High School Representative in 2001.

Givens registered the second-most points in school history in 2005-06 and eclipsed the top mark in 2006-07, and ranked in the Top 10 nationally in scoring both seasons.

Insell, a Woodbury, Tenn., native, made a huge splash in his first year at the helm of the Middle Tennessee program, guiding the Blue Raiders to their third consecutive Sun Belt Tournament title and doing so in front of a record-setting home crowd in the finals of the Sun Belt Championships.

Insell directed one of the most thrilling comebacks in Sun Belt Tournament history, leading Middle Tennessee to an 84-73 win over Western Kentucky after being down by as many as 14 points in the first half.

The 2005-06 campaign also saw another first in program history as three players – Givens, Tia Stovall and Krystle Horton – all joined the 1,000-point club. It marked the first time in school history three current players all were represented on

the prestigious list, and the Blue Raiders were one of only four teams in the 2006 NCAA Tournament to boast such an honor.

Middle Tennessee notched one of its biggest wins of the season when the Blue Raiders defeated traditional Big 10 power Penn State, 79-65, in the UAB Blaze Tournament in December.

With the first conference title and NCAA Tournament appearance under his belt, Insell's recruiting class was ranked 10th nationally and included current sophomores Jackie Pickel, Brandi Brown and Chelsia Lymon.

A 1977 graduate of Middle Tennessee, Insell built a high school girls basketball dynasty at nearby Shelbyville Central High School, just a 30-

minute drive from the Middle Tennessee campus. He guided the Golden Eaglettes to a record 10 TSSAA Class AAA state championships and two *USA Today* national championships (1989, 1991), as he compiled a sparkling 775-148 worksheet during his 28-year tenure.

Insell was named *USA Today* National High School Coach of the Year in 1989 and 1991 and he also was named Converse National High School Coach of the Year on two occasions (1990, 1992). A name synonymous with high school girls basketball in Tennessee, Insell's teams hold the Tennessee state records for consecutive wins with 110, consecutive state titles with four (1989-1992), most state championships for a coach with 10 (1986, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1995, 2000, 2001, 2003 and 2004), and his 1990 Golden Eaglette squad was named the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame Team of the Year, the first high school team so honored.

For his accomplishments at Shelbyville, Insell was elected to the National High School Hall of Fame in February 2007 and was inducted with a class of 12 in July 2007. Insell is one of only six Tennesseans, including just the fourth coach, elected to the National High School Hall of Fame.

Under Insell's guidance, Shelbyville Central

won 23 district championships, 16 regional championships and appeared in the Class AAA state championship game a remarkable 15 times, winning 10. He developed six Tennessee Class AAA Miss Basketball Award recipients, 15 high school All-Americans and 57 of his players received either athletic or academic scholarships to continue their careers at the collegiate level.

While Insell built a basketball dynasty at Shelbyville during his time there, he also made sure his players got the job done in the classroom, as evidenced by his teams receiving the TSSAA Distinguished Award for Academic Success from 1989-2000, an award based on team grade-point-average. The lowest cumulative GPA at Shelbyville from 1989-00 was 3.4 and the highest was 3.98. The academic emphasis has continued during his tenure at Middle Tennessee, as the Blue Raiders posted a cumulative 3.22 GPA in Fall 2006.

Additionally, Insell's Shelbyville team received a special invitation to the Oval Office by President George H. Bush for academic and athletic achievement and his teams also have been honored in the United States Senate and House of Representatives, the Tennessee State House and Senate and by two Tennessee Governors.

Insell had high praise for the head coaching position when he accepted the position at Middle Tennessee.

"Dreams do come true," Insell said after Director of Athletics Chris Massaro announced his hiring on May 18, 2005. "It's something you think about. I'm a coach and it's all I've ever done,

from elementary to junior high to junior pro, AAU and high school. To be able to come on board at Middle Tennessee, a Division I school, that's a dream come true, not only for me, but for all of the high school coaches and junior high coaches across the country and it says if you stay in there long enough and dream big enough, one day it will eventually happen."

Insell said Middle Tennessee will be a pressing basketball team on defense and force the issue, and he added that the Blue Raiders would back down from no one on the recruiting trail.

"We are going after the best players in the state of Tennessee every year," Insell said. "If Tennessee or Vanderbilt is after them, then Middle Tennessee is going to be after them, too. We will recruit alongside of them. We are not going to be intimidated, nor will we back down because they are in the Southeastern Conference. We are Division I and they are Division I. We are going to use all of our contacts."

Insell is married to Debbie and the couple have three sons, Tom, Kyle and Matt.

LAST TIME VERSUS OLD DOMINION

MTSU adds ODU to hit list

MURFREESBORO, Tenn. — With each passing game, the MTSU women's basketball team continues to serve notice to the old guard that there's a new kid on the block.

The Lady Raiders added another notch in that belt with an 86-71 victory over Old Dominion Tuesday night in front of 3,227 at the Murphy Center. The win was the sixth in a row for MTSU and fourth this season — along with victories over Georgia, Minnesota and Louisiana-Monroe — over a former Final Four team.

MTSU overcame a rocky start to take control of what had been a back-and-forth game. Freshman Jackie Pickel came off the bench to knock down her first three 3-point attempts, and senior Krystle Horton had her best game of the season as the Lady Raiders improved to 9-3.

"We're very fortunate," said

MTSU coach Rick Insell. "[Old Dominion] is going to end up winning their conference, so we're happy to get the win and be 9-3 and getting ready for Western Kentucky."

Horton scored a season-high 23 points, including 12 in the first half, as the senior from Riverdale almost single-handedly kept MTSU in the ballgame over the first 10 minutes.

"That's going to happen sometimes," said Horton, who also pulled down a game-high nine rebounds. "If they're guarding Chrissy (Givens) and Amber (Holt), someone has to step up. Tonight it was me."

The Lady Raiders shot just 32 percent in the first 20 minutes of the game, including hitting just eight of their first

28 attempts from the field. But on the strength of 13 first-half free throws and a five-point scoring flurry by Givens in the final minute, MTSU held a one-point lead (39-38) at intermission.

Old Dominion committed 16 first-half fouls and shot just five free throws in the first half. MTSU gave itself some room early in the second with a 6-0 run to take a 45-38 lead. But ODU fought back, eventually tying the game at 51-51 on Tish Lyons' layup before taking a 54-53 lead on a 3-pointer by T.J. Jordan with 12:49 remaining in the game.

Two free throws by Lady Monarch point-guard Jazzmin Walters — who led the Lady Monarchs with 13 points — put ODU up 59-57 with just over eight-and-a-half minutes left.

Then the Jackie Pickel show started.

The 5-10 freshman from Cleveland connected on her first three attempts from long-range over a 2:40 span to turn a two-point deficit into a four-point lead with 5:56 remaining.

"That first shot is always huge," said Pickel, who knocked down four treys in Sunday's win over Louisiana-Monroe. "When I get in there and hit the first shot, it does a lot for my confidence, and tonight it really helped."

Pickel's long-range shooting sparked a 10-1 Blue Raider run over the next two-and-a-half minutes, which all but put the game away. Junior Amber Holt scored eight of her game-high 27 points in the final three minutes, including hitting 4-of-6 free throws.
