Tuesday's football game between Middle Tennessee and Troy will be the 15th meeting on the gridiron between the two schools. The series, which began in 1936, is led by Middle Tennessee, 11-3. Middle Tennessee won the first eight meetings before Troy came away with its first win in 1999. MT is 7-2 against Troy in Murfreesboro and 4-1 at Troy, including a victory in its last meeting at Movie Gallery in 2005. The 2006 contest was the most memorable as the Trojans scored 14 points over the final 2:19 to down the Blue Raiders, 21-20. Troy converted a rare onsides kick to earn a share of the SBC title

THE NATIONAL STAGE

■ The Middle Tennessee-Troy game will be the fifth nationally-televised broadcast for the Blue Raiders in the Rick Stockstill era. Prior to his arrival in 2006, the Blue Raiders had made only two other national appearances. This will mark the second appearance on ESPN2 this season and the third overall. The Blue Raiders are 2-4 on national television and 0-2 on ESPN2.

SBC ROAD SUCCESS

■ Since the arrival of Rick Stockstill in 2006, the Blue Raiders have been an excellent road team against league competition. Under Stockstill, the Blue Raiders own a 6-1 conference mark on the road with the lone loss coming in the season opener this year at FAU.

BLUE RAIDERS IN SBC

■ Middle Tennessee has an overall mark of 28-19 in Sun Belt action all-time, including a 16-8 mark at home and a 12-11 record on the road. The 28 league wins rank as the second most in league history behind North Texas' 30.

MT-TROY NOTES

- The Blue Raiders own five shutouts in the series.
- In the 1999 game, MT compiled 840 all-purpose vards.
- Even though they were not league foes in 2003, the SBC designated the game a conference game.
- Middle Tennessee has 17 sacks in the last five meetings, including four last year.

National Team of the Week

Middle Tennessee was named the National Team of the Week by CollegeSportsReport.com following its 21-7 win at Memphis.

■ In the 2005 game, Stephen Chicola set a record for a tight end with nine receptions.

BATTLE FOR THE PALLADIUM

Greek Mythology holds that The Palladium is a wooden statue that fell from the Heavens. It was kept at the Temple of Athena in the city of Troy. According to legend, as long as The Palladium was preserved within the walls of the city, Troy would be safe and could not be taken. However, a "Raider" by the name of Odysseus - also known as the Raider of Cities - stole The Palladium during the Trojan War leading to the fall of Troy. In the spirit of the Blue Raiders and Trojans Greek mythology link, Middle Tennessee and Troy compete in The Battle for The Palladium during their annual Sun Belt Conference game. Legend dictates the winner of The Palladium gains an unknown and unexplainable advantage over the other making it more difficult to regain control during future battles. The history between the two schools dates back to 1936 with the Blue Raiders owning an 11-3 advantage in the series. Now competing in the same conference for the first time, the legend may extend well after the football season is over. Many believe losing possession of The Palladium has an enduring effect, mystically influencing other athletic events throughout the year matching the Trojans and Raiders. It's just another factor to overcome in this rivalry game between Middle Tennessee and Troy.

212 DEGREES

A motto the Blue Raider football team is following in 2007 is "212 Degrees: The Extra Degree" based off the motivational movie. Coach Stockstill read the book and showed the video to the team on its report day.

Workout sessions end with a chant of '212' and the team wears a t-shirt with 212 displayed on the back.

"We talk about what it stands for everyday," said Stockstill. "It means giving a little bit more every day to be great. The difference between good and great is one more ounce of effort, one more inch, one more yard. What's it worth to you to stay out there 10 extra minutes? Do you want to be good or do you want to be great?"

At 211 degrees, water is hot. At 212 degrees, it boils. And with boiling water, comes steam. And steam can power a train. One extra degree makes all the difference. One extra degree of effort seperates good from great.

TURNOVER BATTLE - ALL BLUE

One of the biggest reasons for Middle Tennessee's late season success has been in the turnover department. Over the past four games, the Blue Raiders are +13 in turnovers and has only turned the ball over themselves once in three games. For the year, Middle Tennessee ranks 11th nationally in turnover margin at +11 and has been on the wrong side of the turnover ledger just once in the last nine games (Memphis).

BIG DAY FOR DEFATTA

■ One of the lone bright spots for the Blue Raiders in their loss to ULL was punter David DeFatta who is enjoying a solid season. DeFatta enjoyed one of the best punting days in school history against the Ragin' Cajuns. DeFatta boomed seven punts for a career-best 53.0 yard average which was the third-best single-game total in school history. DeFatta nailed two punts for over 60 yards including a personal-best 68 varder.

CAREER DAY FOR GEE

■ Sophomore Desmond Gee, who is a wide receiver but had to play tailback due to the injury to Phillip Tanner, turned in his best rushing performance of his career against ULL. Gee carried eight times for a career-high 71 vards, including a personal-best 39-yard run. Gee's previous rushing high was 61 yards last year against Tennessee Tech.

WALDEN IN A GROOVE

■ Is there any doubt Erik Walden is finally healthy? After being named the SBC Defensive Player of the Week on Nov. 5, Walden responded with 11 tackles against ULL. Over the last three games, Walden has 27 stops, five tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, an interception, a pass breakup, and a safety.

DISRUPTIVE DEFENSE

After setting school records in quarterback sacks and tackles for loss last year, the Blue Raider defense is back to their disruptive ways in 2007. The unit leads the SBC in sacks with 25.0 (54th nationally) and is second in tackles for loss with 70 (T61st nationally) and has forced 28 turnovers which ties for the most in the league. During the last five games, the defense has collected 33 tackles for loss, 15 sacks, 11 interceptions, and 12 pass breakups.

ROBINSON IN THIRD

■ Senior corner Bradley Robinson continues his climb up the all-time interception list at Middle Tennessee. The Duncan, S.C., native recorded his 13th career interception in the win over ULM to move into a tie for third place on the all-time list and is tied for ninth among active players in the NCAA. His 13 picks also ranks third all-time in Sun Belt history, just one shy of tying the record of 14. Robinson,

The home of Middle Tennessee football since 1933, Floyd Stadium has grown its original capacity from a facility with just a few portable bleachers to the present-day 30,788.

Floyd Stadium has undergone numerous renovations to make it one of the top facilities in the Sun Belt Conference and the region. New synthetic turf was installed during the summer of 2006 and the most recent addition was a state-of-the-art video board that was erected in 2007 to go along with new outdoor suites in the north endzone.

The Blue Raiders own an overall record of 253-101-13 at Floyd stadium and have won 13 of their last 19 in the facility.

TWO OVER 1,000

■ For just the second time in the FBS-I-A era, Middle Tennessee has two quarterbacks with over 1,000 yards passing. Freshman Dwight Dasher has thrown for 1,148 yards while junior Joe Craddock has 1,143 passing yards. The last time MT had two signal callers over 1,000 yards was 2000 when Wes Counts and Jason Johnson topped four digits.

CRADDOCK SETS RECORD

Pressed into starting duty in place of injured guarterback Dwight Dasher, Joe Craddock not only enjoyed a career game against ULM but he put together one of the best games in school history for a quarterback in engineering his first win as a starter. Craddock had a school-record 471 yards total offense and five touchdowns in the win. He completed 22-of-29 passes for 401 yards and four touchdowns and he rushed for a career-best 70 yards on 11 carries and a touchdown. The 401 yards passing were the third most in school history and the four touchdown passes tied for third most in a game. The 471 yards marked a new school record for total offense, besting the previous mark of 461 yards. He threw touchdown passes of 42, 11, 66, and 94 yards. The 94 yard touchdown pass went down as the third longest in school history, the longest scoring pass in ULM's Malone Stadium history, and the fourth longest pass completion in the NCAA this season.

ROBINSON COMES UP BIG

■ After ULM scored to go ahead 40-33 with :57 seconds left to play, senior Bradley Robinson went to Head Coach Rick Stockstill and asked to line up deep and return the ensuing kickoff. Robinson had never returned a kickoff but that did not keep Stockstill from granting Robinson's wish. The senior promptly took his first career return 89 yards for the game-winning touchdown. It was the third kickoff return for a TD under Stockstill and Robinson joined teammate Damon Nickson as Blue Raiders who have taken their first career return for a score.

TWO OVER 100

■ For the first time under Rick Stockstill and the first overall since 2004, Middle Tennessee had two 100-yard receivers in the same game in the win at ULM. Desmond Gee hauled in four passes for a career-best 139 yards and two touchdowns, while teammate Jonathan Grigsby added two receptions for a personal-best 109 yards. The duo became the first to accomplish the feat since Kerry Wright and Chris Henry did it against Arkansas State on Oct. 9, 2004.

JONES MOVING UP SACK LIST

■ Senior Tavares Jones moved up to fourth place on the all-time sack list at MT with 1.5 quarterback sacks against ULM. Jones now has a career-best 6.0 sacks on the season and 11.5 for his career with all of his sacks coming in his last 21 games.

STEADY SUBER

■ The steadiest player in the secondary for the Blue Raiders this season has been junior Alex Suber. The former running back enjoyed one of his better games with a career-best 11 tackles (10 solos) against ULM to go along with his first career interception and two tackles for loss. For the year, the Tampa, Fla., product has set personal highs in tackles (50), tackles for loss (7.5), interceptions (1) and forced fumbles (3).

DWIGHT CHASING MARVIN

■ Dwight Dasher moved his season rushing total to 528 yards following a nine-yard effort against ULL. Over his last four games, Dasher has rushed 58 times for 309 yards. Dasher's season total of 528 yards rushing is the most by a quarterback in the I-A era, breaking the previous mark of 486 yards set by Andrico Hines in 2002. The most rushing yards by a signal caller in school history is 594 by Marvin Collier in 1985.

GOOD START FOR DASHER

■ True freshman Dwight Dasher, who leads the SBC in passing efficiency, has made the start at quarter-back in six of the last eight games for the Blue Raiders and has played beyond his years. In seven games as a starter, Dasher has completed 87 of 152 passes for 1,126 yards and nine touchdowns while adding 483 yards and three scores on the ground. As a team during those seven games, Middle Tennessee has put up 2,466 total yards of offense and Dasher has tallied 1,609 of those yards (65.2 %).

ENDS WREAK HAVOC AT UNT

■ Middle Tennessee's all-conference defensive ends, Tavares Jones and Erik Walden, were quite the disruptive force in the win over North Texas. The tandem became the first pair of MT defensive ends to both record an interception in the same game when they did it on back-to-back possessions in the third quarter. The duo also added 3.5 tackles for loss, a sack, a pass breakup, and numerous quarterback hurries in the victory. The two also were responsible for the Blue Raiders' two safeties on back-to-back possessions allowing MT

to tie a Sun Belt Conference record and fall one shy of the NCAA mark set by four teams.

SCORING LEADER

■ Senior DeMarco McNair extended his lead for the conference scoring title with a touchdown against ULL. McNair now has a league-best 78 points and 13 touchdowns and 11 of his scores have come in the last seven games. McNair's 13 TDs equals the 10th most in a single-season at MT and his 78 points stand one point shy of equaling the 10th most in a season (Garth Petrilli is 10th with 79 points). The Thomson, Ga., native has 132 career points entering the Troy game.

CANNON GETS BLOCK

■ Junior wide receiver Michael Cannon registered the first blocked punt of his career when he got a rejection against North Texas in the first quarter. Cannon also recovered the punt for his second punt block recovery of the year. It was the fifth blocked kick all-time against UNT for the Blue Raiders and went down as the second of the season (vs FAU) and the third blocked kick under Rick Stockstill. Overall, the block was the 22nd of the I-A-FBS era with eight being punts, eight field goals and six extra points.

DAVID WAS A GOLIATH

■ David DeFatta was a one-man special teams wrecking crew for the Blue Raiders against North Texas. DeFatta punted eight times for a career-best 47.2-yard average (tied for eighth all-time) and three went for 51 yards or more including a career long of 58 yards. Four of his eight punts were downed inside the 15-yard line with THREE landing at the 1-yard line and setting up both Middle Tennessee safeties. DeFatta also nailed a career-best 39-yard field goal to open the Blue Raiders scoring in the first quarter. Over the last six games, DeFatta has punted 35 times and 18 have been downed inside the 20-yard line.

CAREER YEAR FOR GLOVER

■ Senior Damon Nickson recorded the second multiple interception game of his career against North Texas. Nickson came up with his first two interceptions of the season and ran his career total to eight. Nickson recorded a school and conference record four interceptions last year on the road against Louisiana-Lafayette.

THE FUTURE IS NOW

■ Head Coach Rick Stockstill has not shied away from playing true freshmen in 2007. Some of it has been out of necessity due to the Blue Raiders' lack of numbers, but most of it has been the talent of the 2007 class. Entering the Troy game, the Blue Raiders have played 13 true freshmen, but the youth movement does not stop there as a total of 22 true and redshirt freshmen have played to date. Overall, 32 freshmen and sophomores have played this season.

STOCK TIES HURT

■ With the win over ULM, Middle Tennessee Head Coach Rick Stockstill tied Ben Hurt for ninth place on the all-time coaching victory list. Stockstill now has 12 wins and needs five more victories to tie E.W. Midgett for eighth.

GOING OVERTIME

■ Middle Tennessee enters the Troy game having competed in four overtime games as a member of I-A (FBS) and is 2-2 in those contests. The Blue Raiders had one overtime contest in 2000 and played three in 2003. In 2003, the Blue Raiders lost in one overtime at No. 23 Missouri, then bounced back to take an overtime win at Idaho before losing a four overtime game at home against UL-Lafayette. The four overtime loss to ULL was the longest game in the history of MT football and was

the longest in the history of the SBC at the time.

■ For the third time under Rick Stockstill and the fourth overall, Middle Tennessee made a clean sweep of the weekly Sun Belt Conference Player of the Week awards when they accomplished the feat on Nov. 5. Quarterback Joe Craddock, defensive back Alex Suber, and defensive back Bradley Robinson earned the three honors. Craddock earned the offensive award, while Suber brought home the defensive honor and Robinson took the special team's award.

QUICK HITTERS

- The 48 points scored against North Texas this year went down as the most in the Rick Stockstill era.
- The Blue Raiders' safety against FIU earlier this year was the first in the FBS era for MT.
- Middle Tennessee's crowd of 23,227 against UVA ranked as the fourth largest in Floyd Stadium history.
- The Blue Raiders have won 505 football games all-time and have an overall record is 505-364-28.
- Head Coach Rick Stockstill directed two shutouts in 2006 to become the first rookie coach at MT to accomplish that feat since Charles Murphy in 1947.
- As a I-A member (103 games), the Blue Raiders have scored 50 or more points nine times.
- The Blue Raiders are 37-7 in the I-A era when leading at the half and are 40-7 when leading a game entering the 4th guarter during that time.

Turnovers, Penalties cost Blue Raiders in opener

FT. LAUDERDALE, Fla. - Middle Tennessee seemed opponent.

The Blue Raiders' fourth-quarter surge still left them behind Florida Atlantic in a 27-14 loss in both teams' season and conference opener.

"I can't point out one thing that did it for us because it was a lot of things that went wrong," MTSU senior

safety Damon Nickson said. "We fought hard, but (FAU) just outplayed us.

"... Hopefully, our first is our worst."

The loss was the first follow-up performance to MTSU's Sun Belt co-championship in coach Rick Stockstill's debut season, yet it lacked the luster and precision of the 2006 squad.

MTSU's offense played poorly, its defense wilted late and special teams dug the team into a hole it could not climb out of.

MTSU (0-1, 0-1) gained about half as many yards as

FAU (217 to 411) and committed four turnovers to the Owls' one. The Blue Raider offense only had three drives of more than 10 yards in the game, but even some of its limited prosperity was squandered.

Trailing 24-0, MTSU managed two late touchdowns under odd circumstances.

MTSU junior guarterback Joe Craddock, making his first career start, made a circus under-handed pass to sophomore Desmond Gee for a 27-yard touchdown early in the fourth quarter.

Craddock, pressured by FAU (1-0, 1-0) defenders all afternoon, stepped away from a pass rusher. With a hand around his foot, Craddock flipped the ball to Gee, who sprinted down the sideline for the late score.

On FAU's next possession, North Lauderdale native Jeremy Kellem blocked an Owls' punt. Junior Michael Cannon scooped it and scampered 32 yards to cut FAU's lead to 24-14.

But MTSU could not extend its momentum, as FAU added a late field goal, and Craddock tossed an interception in the end zone with 2:44 remaining in the game while trying to improvise a quarterback run into a pass on third-and-10.

"We were running out of time, and I thought the play was there," said Craddock, who was 20-of-32 passing for 199 yards, one TD and two interceptions. "It still felt like it was there. We thought maybe we could do what Troy did to us last year, where we score, kick an onside kick, and score again."

MTSU put itself behind seemingly just as the game began.

FAU was stopped on its opening possession, but the to start its season two hours later than its Week One ensuing punt was short and struck MTSU freshman Kevin Brown on the leg and FAU recovered the ball. MTSU challenged the call, but it was upheld and the Owls responded with a nine-play, 35-yard touchdown

> FAU converted two third-down plays on the abbreviated drive, and Charles Pierre dove in for a 1-yard

> > score.

Nickson, one of the nation's top kick returners last season, mishandled FAU's ensuing kickoff. The Owls recovered and missed a field goal soon after, but MTSU's offense remained stranded on the sideline.

"That was frustrating," MTSU junior offensive tackle Franklin Dunbar said. "We thought we were getting the ball, and then we don't get the ball. Then we're ready to get the ball again, and we still don't get it."

Ultimately, had the ball twice, a total of

15 plays and more than six minutes, before MTSU's offense took a snap. And once the offense finally played, its appearance became instantly forgettable.

The Blue Raiders went three-and-out on their first two possessions, managed only 44 yards of total offense in the first half and didn't pick up its initial first down until early in the second quarter.

Stockstill recognized the compounded miscues.

"The first (turnover) was when the punt hit a freshman," Stockstill said. "Then Damon drops the kickoff, and there's no excuse for that. And there's no excuse for Joe throwing that last interception. I just don't understand it."

Even when the offense's tires weren't spinning in the first half, blunders squandered any hint of momentum. With MTSU trailing 7-0 in the second quarter, two passes gave the Blue Raiders their first back-to-back first downs of the day. But after driving to the FAU 29yard line, the next three snaps were a one-yard loss, an illegal procedure penalty and a botched shotgun snap for a 22-yard loss.

Craddock's first interception came with 49 seconds remaining in the first half, and it set up an FAU field

Then an MTSU drive early in the third quarter was halted by an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty on Dunbar. FAU answered with TD passes to Jason Harmon and Cortez Gent.

FAU guarterback Rusty Smith was 12-of-26 passing for 195 yards and two scores. Charles Pierre added 95 yards on 16 rushes.

LOUISVILLE, Ky. - MTSU and No. 8 Louisville pushed the pedal to the floor before the Blue Raiders finally ran out of gas just shy of a monumental upset.

The teams combined to score 59 points in the first 19 minutes of the game, but Louisville pulled away for a 58-42 win.

The sellout crowd of 40.882 at Papa John's Cardinal

Stadium and a national TV audience saw perhaps the most exciting start to a game of the young college football season.

"I told our team we went toe to toe with the eighthranked team in the country," MTSU coach Rick Stockstill said after the game. "And I couldn't be more proud of them. If we played a little bit smarter and not turned it over a couple of those times, we might have had a chance to win the ballgame."

Louisville scored touchdowns on its first, fourth and

seventh plays of the game, as Heisman trophy hopeful quarterback Brian Brohm led the Cardinals on quick strikes. MTSU quarterback Joe Craddock led the Blue Raiders on five consecutive touchdown drives in the first half.

Brohm went 25-of-39 passing for a career-high 401 yards and five touchdowns without an interceptions. Likewise, Craddock, making his second career start, went 14-26 passing for a career-high 290 yards and three scoring passes.

"We put up big numbers and a lot of people played their best game," Craddock said. "It was nothing I did, but we can take positives from this. If a few more things go our way, we get a (win)."

Louisville's Anthony Allen (275 yards on 35 carries) and MTSU's Phillip Tanner (144 yards on nine carries) also crushed their career-high rushing marks.

Louisville's third score, a 5-yard run by Allen, followed MTSU senior Damon Nickson's fumble on a kick return. That stood as the only significant discrepancy between the two teams' scoring pace in the first half.

Despite Louisville lighting up MTSU for 409 yards in the first half, the Blue Raiders never flinched. MTSU answered the Cardinals' early scores with 21 first-quarter points in similar fashion to Louisville's explosive offense, and the Blue Raiders did not punt until the third quarter.

After Brohm hit tight end Gary Barnidge for an 81yard touchdown pass on the game's opening snap, MTSU countered with a 78-yard catch-and-run touchdown grab from Craddock to DeMarco McNair.

MTSU sophomore Phillip Tanner scored his first career touchdown on a 23-yard run with 10:37 remaining in the first guarter.

back with a 13-play march to the end zone, and then Craddock dropped a flawless faderoute pass into Bobby Williams' hands for a 24-yard pass to cut the Cardinals' lead to 28-21 with 2:22 still remaining in the first quarter.

Sparked by Bradley Robinson's vicious hit at the goal line, MTSU held Louisville to a field goal to start the second quarter, serving as the first failure of either team to reach the end zone.

McNair scampered

for a 39-yard touchdown run 48 seconds later to draw boos from the Louisville home crowd, as MTSU trailed 31-28.

Shortly after, the Cardinals showed the wear from the Blue Raiders' rally, as wide receiver Patrick Honeycutt was left uncovered before the snap on MTSU's next possession. Craddock tossed the ball to the wide-open Honeycutt, who ran 51 yards to the Louisville 13-yard line. Tanner then dove over left guard for a touchdown, and MTSU trailed 38-35 at halftime.

Louisville scored 13 unanswered points in the third quarter, but Tanner answered with a 79-yard touchdown run, his third score of the night.

Brohm hit Douglas for a 10-yard score to put Louisville ahead 58-42 early in the fourth quarter, and Craddock tossed a late interception to seal the outcome.

BATON ROUGE, La. - Middle Tennessee got its loss to No. 2 LSU.

The Blue Raiders (0-3) forced LSU's first turnovers of the season and contained the Tigers' (3-0) offense early on. However, they could not muster an attack against perhaps the nation's best defense and a fleeting opportunity passed MTSU by.

"You have to play perfect against a team like LSU, and we had some early chances to score," MTSU coach Rick Stockstill said. "But give their defense credit. They swamped us. They stuffed us. We just couldn't sustain drives."

MTSU marched to LSU's 33-yard line on its first offensive drive of the night, but quarterback Joe Craddock was sacked on third-and-9. The loss pushed the Blue Raiders out of field-goal range and capped their longest drive until late in the game.

MTSU did not gain another first down until the second play of the fourth quarter, a span of eight offensive possessions without moving the chains. The Blue Raiders only gained 90 total yards on 52 plays in the game. "Once we got those turnovers and got on their side of the field, (LSU) really turned up the heat on defense," said Craddock, who finished 6-of-11 passing for 59 yards.

MTSU didn't look too overmatched early on, but it the 4-yard line. did not take advantage of LSU's few miscues.

MTSU safety Dana Stewart made his first career a 3-0 lead. interception, returning the pick to the LSU 44-yard line. MTSU then lost seven yards on the next two plays and ultimately failed on a fourth-and-3 conversion attempt.

LSU scored on its next play, a 62-yard pass from quarterback Ryan Perrilloux to Demetrius Byrd to go ahead 17-0.

LSU fumbled on its next offensive play nearly two minutes later when MTSU cornerback Alex Suber stripped the ball from tight end Keith Zinger.

MTSU took over at its own 49-yard line, but responded with a 1-yard run, an incomplete pass and a 15-yard loss when Craddock was sacked on third down.

"We got off the field and got turnovers, and of course, it was a frustration that we went back out there so quick," Suber said. "But that's our job on defense. We have to be able to go right back at them."

MTSU had 11 offensive possession. Eight ended breaks, but couldn't do anything with them in a 44-0 on punts, two on downs and one on Phillip Tanner's

> "Regardless of where we got the ball, it was hard to move the ball," MTSU offensive tackle Franklin Dunbar said. "Whether it was 50-in or in the minus yardage on our side of the field, it was hard to move the ball all niaht.

> > "This was a pretty good defense, probably the best in the country and the best we'll ever see."

> > As MTSU spun its tires, LSU (3-0) gradually revved its offensive engine to excite a crowd of 92,407 at Tiger Stadium.

> > The Tigers took advantage of prime field position and scored on an MTSU defense that showed improvement from its loss to Louisville the week before.

> > LSU racked up 505 total yards and 26 first downs.

Perrilloux, replacing injured starter Matt Flynn (high ankle sprain), went 20-of-25 passing for 298 yards, three touchdowns and one interception.

MTSU's defense contained the Tigers early on, allowing LSU to only complete short passes underneath.

LSU ran 10 times in a 64-yard game-opening drive, but MTSU made a goal line stand capped by redshirt freshman Gary Tucker's sack on third-and-goal from

LSU settled for Colt David's 29-yard field goal to take

MTSU's resistance began to wilt a bit beginning on LSU's second possession, as Perrilloux connected on five consecutive passes, including a 13-yard touchdown toss to running back Charles Scott.

Three Perrilloux completions converted third downs on the 12-play drive, including the scoring pass.

LSU's second touchdown didn't take nearly as long as the first. Perrilloux slung a 62-yard touchdown pass to Demetrius Byrd, who leaped over MTSU cornerback Bradley Robinson to make the grab. The score came only 12 seconds after MTSU was halted on a fourthdown play inside the LSU 40-yard line.

LSU soon sprinted away from MTSU with three third-quarter touchdowns.

Brandon LaFell ran an 18-yard reverse in for a TD, freshman Terrance Toliver snatched a 15-yard TD pass and Richard Murphy added an 8-yard scoring run.

MURFREESBORO, Tenn. - MTSU recalled a series a statement. We looked at it as our Sun Belt statement team eager to step into the future.

The Blue Raiders lost 20-17 at Floyd Stadium to Western Kentucky, which is still two years away from reaching the highest level of college football (Football Bowl Subdivision), in the schools' first football meeting since 1991.

The victory served as a statement game for WKU, which joins MTSU (0-4) in the Sun Belt Conference in football in 2009. It marked MTSU's seventh consecutive loss, tied for the fourth-longest losing skid in the nation.

"Being a home opener just adds to the frustration because we were real jazzed to play this game," MTSU defensive end Erik Walden said. "Give them credit, and we didn't underestimate them, but it was mindboggling that we played so bad."

MTSU's offense was handicapped and its playbook MTSU's march, and King missed a 39-yard field goal. trimmed down, as true freshman Dwight Dasher got his first career start in place of injured starter Joe Crad- regained possession after Erik Walden popped Wolke

Dasher was solid, but the Blue Raider offense was stale. MTSU gained only 288 total yards, as WKU loaded

Dasher was 14-of-24 passing for 169 yards. He also led MTSU in rushing with 53 yards and guided his team on a potential game-tying drive in the final 39 seconds. Dasher had runs of 21 and 15 yards and completed two passes on the final drive, but Matt King missed a 34yard field goal as time expired.

"I couldn't be more pleased with the way we played in the last 39 seconds," MTSU coach Rick Stockstill said. "We gave ourselves an opportunity to tie the game and go to overtime.

"We knew this would be a 60-minute game, and we played all 60 minutes. It went down to the last four seconds, but we just couldn't convert on the kick."

WKU (3-1) took a 20-17 lead on K.J. Black's 22-yard touchdown pass to Jake Gaebler on the first play of the fourth guarter. It capped a 10-play, 75-yard drive.

Black was 5-of-7 for 74 yards and one TD. He also ran for 56 yards after replacing former Smyrna High standout and WKU starter David Wolke in the second half.

"This is our new rival," Black said. "We had to make

from the past, but was bitten by a Western Kentucky game with our new rivals. We came out here with a lot of fire and we pulled this one out."

In a back-and-forth battle, MTSU went ahead 17-13 on DeMarco McNair's 4-vard touchdown run, his second score, in the third quarter. The TD was set up by Taron Henry's 32-yard catch-and-run.

> But the Blue Raiders missed other touchdown opportunities, including their first possession of the night.

> Dasher ran MTSU's offense at a steady tempo after the opening kickoff. The Blue Raiders' devoured nearly 10 minutes of game clock, ran 17 plays and converted two fourth-down tries, but came away with no points.

MTSU called nine consecutive running plays to start the game, including four carries by Dasher. But holding and illegal procedure penalties on back-to-back plays halted

WKU's defense rested little, as the Blue Raiders from behind, forcing a fumble that was recovered by Wes Hofacker at the 18-vard line.

King hit a 19-yard field goal six plays later after the tackle box and bottled up the Blue Raiders' ground Dasher's 1-yard touchdown run had been negated by an illegal procedure penalty.

> WKU took its first lead with a seven-play, 60-yard drive that stretched midway through the second quarter. Similar to MTSU's early offense, the Hilltoppers remained on the ground with guarterback draws, option plays and well-executed runs. A 29-yard pass from Wolke to Gaebler and an unsportsmanlike penalty on the Blue Raiders moved WKU to the MTSU 4-yard line. After a WKU penalty, Tyrell Hayden galloped in for a 9yard TD run to put the Hilltoppers ahead 10-3.

> MTSU's second score again followed a Wolke fumble. which was recovered by Blue Raider linebacker Andrew Harrington at the Hilltoppers' 32-yard line.

> Dasher connected on three passes to set up an MTSU touchdown just before halftime, including a 13-yard completion to Patrick Honeycutt on fourth-and-5. Mc-Nair scored on a 1-yard run to tie the score at 10.

> MTSU was outrushed 234 yards to 119. WKU's Hayden rushed for a career-high 144 yards and one touchdown.

MURFREESBORO, Tenn. - MTSU's slump-buster completed 5-of-7 passes on the first possession, the had a bit of hyperbole in the Blue Raiders' home conference opener.

The Blue Raiders broke a seven-game losing streak their longest since 1980 — with a 47-6 rout of Florida International in front of 15,605 at Floyd Stadium.

FIU (0-5, 0-1 in Sun Belt Conference) extended the nation's longest losing streak to 17 games, last winning in the 2005 season finale against MTSU. The Blue Raiders (1-4) notched their first win since Nov. 11, 2006, and improved to 1-1 in Sun Belt play.

"It's a relief. It's a monkey off our back because we played like we know we can," MTSU wide receiver Bobby Williams said. "We've got goals we want to accomplish, and we're going to focus in on them from here on out."

MTSU started fast and furiously, posting 47 points in the first half behind multitalented true freshman quarterback Dwight Dasher, who made his second career start in place of injured starter Joe Craddock.

Dasher accounted for five touchdowns just in the first half, including three passing and two rushing. Meanwhile, the Blue Raiders scored on seven of its first eight possessions before halftime.

"I don't know if how important it was to have a guick start, but I think it was important that something good happen to us," MTSU coach Rick Stockstill said. " ... With how our guys did this week, I sensed something special was going to happen. I was very impressed with how the team responded."

Dasher finished his night 10-of-17 passing for 240 yards, three touchdown passes and no interceptions. He also had nine rushes for 58 yards and two scores, leaving the game midway through the third quarter with MTSU leading 47-0.

His five touchdowns marked the most by an MTSU player since guarterback Josh Harris accounted for five scores on Nov. 15, 2003, in an overtime game versus Louisiana-Lafayette, and the most in regulation since

"I felt comfortable, not like a freshman," Dasher said. "I felt like I got the job done."

Dasher racked up 78 total yards on MTSU's gameopening 61-yard drive, which included two Blue Raider penalties to account for the statistical anomaly. He

last going to Williams for a 14-yard touchdown pass.

On MTSU's third possession, Dasher escaped two tacklers in the backfield to break open a 22-yard touchdown run. It capped an abbreviated three-play drive where the Blue Raiders took advantage of prime field position, a trend throughout the first half.

> Dasher ran three times and passed once on the Blue Raiders' third scoring march. He faked a quarterback draw, then stepped back to toss a 27-yard TD pass to Desmond Gee to put the Blue Raiders ahead 21-0 through one quarter.

MTSU's fourth score a 71-yard TD toss from Dasher to DeMarco McNair — had more to do with Mc-Nair's leas than Dasher's arm. The senior tailback caught a screen pass near the line of scrimmage and sprinted past half of the FIU defense down

the sideline to paydirt.

The Blue Raiders' first-half scoring spree ended with a pair of 1-yard TD runs by both Dasher and McNair and Matt King's 39-yard field goal.

MTSU also added a safety off a botched FIU punt following a high snap. FIU's Chance Attaway scored a touchdown early in the fourth quarter on a botched MTSU punt, but the Golden Panthers missed the extrapoint kick.

MTSU outgained FIU 405 yards to 145, and the Golden Panthers had only 34 yards in the first half.

"They jumped out on us early and didn't stop," FIU coach Mario Cristobal said. "They outplayed us in every facet of the game. ... They coached better, they played better, and they executed better."

"I felt like the way we played would be enough to win the game," Dasher said. "The end of the game changed all that."

Virginia broke a 14-14 tie on Andrew Pearman's 5-yard touchdown run on the third play of the fourth quarter, capping a 15-play, 85-yard drive.

However, Virginia was flagged for a false start on the ensuing extra-point kick. On a second try, Gould missed the PAT, and Virginia only led 20-14. MTSU drew first blood, and Virginia chased the Blue Raiders early on.

MTSU scored on Dasher's 24-yard touchdown pass to Taron Henry near the front pylon at the goal line. Henry's grab, which came with a defender in his face, capped an 11-play, 67-yard drive on MTSU's second possession of the night.

It was also only the second pass on the drive, a steady march that included seven rushes between three and eight yards each.

The Blue Raiders held Virginia to four-plays-and-out on the ensuing possession, but gave the Cavaliers got new life on a holding penalty during the punt. MTSU's Alex Suber, who was defending Virginia's wideout on the punt, was called for holding before the kick, which gave the Cavaliers a first down.

"You'll have to ask those ACC officials about that,"

Stockstill said.

Virginia took advantage of its second chance, finishing the final 43 yards of the drive. Tight end John Phillips snagged a 20-yard touchdown pass from Sewell on third-and-4 to tie the score 7-7 early in the first quarter.

MTSU had two chances to make a field goal and retake the lead in the second quarter. Matt King's first field goal attempt, a 38-yarder, missed wide left but was negated by a Virginia penalty. His second try, a 33-yarder, was blocked.

"We might just have to start going for it on fourth down" Stockstill said

About three minutes later, MTSU finished a scoring opportunity when Dasher hit Bobby Williams on a quick slant for a 7-yard touchdown pass and a 14-7 lead

Virginia countered with a 10-play, 85-yard drive that took less than three minutes. Pearman scampered around right end and dove from the 3-yard line to paydirt to finish his 21-yard scoring run.

Sewell finished 22-of-37 passing 223 yards, one touchdown and one interception.

Anthony Glover led MTSU with seven tackles, and Trevor Jenkins had two tackles for loss.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. - MTSU did more with less opportunities on the road. game's opening drive. McNair made a fingertip catch on a swing pass from Dasher and sprinted through a

The Blue Raiders beat Memphis 21-7 in front of a crowd of 30,101 at the Liberty Bowl, converting the Tigers' lone turnover into the go-ahead score in the first meeting between the schools since 1954.

"When we're talking a little bit (with Memphis)

and things got going, it got to be a rivalry real quick," MTSU senior running back DeMarco McNair said. "We were due for a big win and getting it instate against a good team feel pretty good."

MTSU took a 14-7 lead in the third quarter by turning around its own mistake.

After the Blue Raiders drove 61 yards to the Memphis 13yard line, true freshman quarterback Dwight Dasher tossed an interception in the end zone while avoiding pressure. It was Dasher's first career thrown interception, but the

MTSU defense atoned for the young quarterback's error one play later. Linebacker Danny Carmichael exploded through the Memphis offensive line and nailed the Tiger tailback, whose fumble was recovered by defensive end Tavares Jones at the 14-yard line.

The Blue Raiders took advantage of a second scoring chance. Desmond Gee ran for nine yards. McNair followed with three rushes, including a 1-yard score.

MTSU committed four turnovers in the game, but Memphis did not convert any for points on the Blue Raider mistakes.

"We won the game despite not playing our best game because we didn't protect the football," MTSU coach Rick Stockstill said. "We were fortunate to win the game, and our defense played really well."

Dasher had one interception and one fumble, but he remained the driving force behind MTSU's victory.

Dasher faked a handoff and scampered 61 yards for a nail-in-coffin touchdown with 3:46 remaining in the game. The freshman finished with 180 rushing yards, the most ever by a quarterback in MTSU history.

Dasher was also 16-of-26 passing for 230 yards, one touchdown and one interception.

"I made some mistakes, and I told myself that I wasn't going to make anymore," Dasher said. "I put them behind me and got a big play. That was a big relief when I got the touchdown."

MTSU's fastest man showed his wheels on the

game's opening drive. McNair made a fingertip catch on a swing pass from Dasher and sprinted through a gauntlet of Memphis tacklers en route to a 55-yard touchdown.

Memphis answered with a 40-yard drive, but MTSU broke up back-to-back passes and Tigers kicker Matt Reagan missed a 47-yard field goal.

Memphis tied the score 7-7 late in the first quarter when Duke Calhoun snagged a 19-yard touchdown pass from Will Hudgens. The score was set up by 6-foot-8 Carlos Singleton's 41-yard leaping catch over 5-10 cornerback Bradley Robinson.

Dasher connected on back-to-back passes to start MTSU's ensuing possession, but wide receiver Patrick Honeycutt's tossed an interception on a trick play on the first play of the second quarter. Honeycutt caught a lateral from Dasher and threw

a deep pass intended for Desmond Gee, but Memphis defensive back Tony Bell recovered to make the overthe-shoulder pick.

"This was a good win for our program, a good win over Conference USA and good win for our team because we've been in some close games this year that we haven't been able to pull out," Stockstill said. "I'm happy for our players and for our school."

Defense leads the way in convincing win over ASU

MTSU beat Arkansas State 24-7 for its fifth consecutive win over the Indians. ASU has never beaten the Blue Raiders in Floyd Stadium in five trips to Murfreesboro.

"I don't know if it's something we're doing or some-

thing they're not doing, but we always play them well," MTSU fifth-year senior Taron Henry said. "They're always on a roll when they get to us and maybe they just underestimate us. Maybe they just think they can show up in Murfreesboro and win the game, but that's not the case."

MTSU scored 24 points in the first 21 minutes of the contest and handed the game's outcome to a seething defense, which responded with its stingiest performance of the year.

The Blue Raider defense

notched a school record nine sacks and limited the Sun Belt's No. 1 offense to a mere 138 total yards and eight first downs. The Indians averaged 210 rushing yards play. per game, but managed only 22 yards on the ground against MTSU.

"Football is a game about passion, and our guys played with it," MTSU coach Rick Stockstill said. "That was the No. 1 offense in the conference, No. 1 defense in the conference and No. 1 scoring offense in the conference, but we hold them to seven points and 138 yards when they had (681) yards last week.

"... I thought we were dominating on defense. To me, this was about toughness. We were a much tougher team than they were (Saturday). I'm not trying to downgrade them or anything, but when you do what we did on defense, it's all about who was tougher."

MTSU forced four turnovers, including two that resulted in the game's first pair of touchdowns. Freshman defensive back Rod Issac scooped an ASU fumble on the game's third play and returned it 42 yards for a touchdown. Freshman Jeremy Kellem picked off two ASU passes, including one in the end zone.

MTSU followed Kellem's first interception with an 11-play, 80-yard drive, capped by true freshman guarterback Dwight Dasher's 17-yard touchdown pass to

Dasher temporarily left the game with an ankle injury, and former starter Joe Craddock returned after

MURFREESBORO, Tenn. - MTSU penned part five missing the last four games with a back injury. Both quarterbacks were also simultaneously featured in unique formations throughout the game.

> With Dasher sidelined, Craddock tossed a 52-yard touchdown pass to Henry to put MTSU ahead 24-7 early in the second quarter.

"That felt great after being out so long," Craddock

said. "I had a little success and I guess made the right read on the touchdown. That felt

Craddock, a junior, was 2-of-4 passing for 61 yards and one touchdown.

Dasher was 9-of-20 passing for 118 yards, one touchdown and one interception. Dasher also rushed for 96 yards, giving him 495 yards for the season, which is the most rushing yards by an MTSU quarterback in the Football Bowl Subdivision era (formerly Division I-A).

The game broke a tie for third place in the Sun Belt. MTSU (3-5) moved to 2-1 in conference play. ASU (3-4) fell to 1-2 in league

MTSU leads ASU in the all-time series 8-1. ASU coach Steve Roberts is now 1-5 against MTSU (including 0-3) in Murfreesboro) and 18-13 versus all other Sun Belt opponents.

"(MTSU) is no different than any other place we play," Roberts said. "We just didn't play well and they played great."

DENTON, Tex. - MTSU both inflicted and suffered pain Saturday night.

The Blue Raiders defeated North Texas 48-28 to gain ground in the Sun Belt title race, but lost its quarterback, at least for a time.

MTSU (4-5 overall) improved to 3-1 in Sun Belt play for a tie for second place with Florida Atlantic (3-1), which suffered its first Sun Belt loss Saturday. Only Troy

(5-0) lies ahead of MTSU in the standings, while FAU has the head-to-head tiebreaker over the Blue Raiders, who have three conference games remaining.

"We're not going to lose focus of the present, and (Saturday night) we got a tough road win," MTSU coach Rick Stockstill said. "We had so many people hurt in this game, that it was a credit to our players to win on the road. That's hard, and this team did it."

MTSU suffered a rash of injuries, including freshman starting quarterback Dwight

Dasher's ailment originally diagnosed as a left knee sprain suffered in the second quarter. Dasher did not return to the game, and he will undergo an MRI as soon as today.

Former starter Joe Craddock finished the game under center, but the Blue Raider defense determined the game's outcome.

MTSU had four interceptions and two safeties by early in the fourth quarter while the offense sputtered a bit.

With the Blue Raiders clinging to a 37-28 lead, defensive end Tavares Jones leaped high to make an interception on Giovanni Vizza's screen pass. Jones rumbled 44 yards to the UNT 5-yard line, and running back Phillip Tanner, a Dallas native, scored one play late in the third quarter.

"The linemen let me go free, and they never do that," Jones said. "So I stepped back and jumped up to get it. I thought I'd score, but I ran out of gas."

UNT desperately tried to jump-start its offense in the fourth guarter while MTSU defenders blitzed the Mean Green backfield.

Vizza threw an interception, his fourth of the game, to MTSU defensive end Erik Walden while under pres-

MTSU punter David DeFatta then landed back-toback boots on the UNT 1-yard line, and the Mean Green suffered two safeties. Vizza was flagged for intentional grounding in the end zone for the first safety, and running back Jamario Thomas was dropped for a loss for the second safety.

"We knew North Texas had problems with pressure, and we brought plenty of it," Walden said.

MTSU's defense recorded two sacks, eight tackles for loss and five turnovers.

MTSU running back DeMarco McNair added his third touchdown of the night in the fourth guarter to finish

After a lackluster start, MTSU surged ahead with

three unanswered touchdowns in about a four-minute span midway through the first half.

Junior Michael Cannon sparked the spurt with a punt block that rested on UNT's 10-yard line. Four plays later, McNair dove over left guard for a 1-yard touchdown to give MTSU its first lead at 10-7.

UNT fumbled on the first play on its ensuing possession, and MTSU freshman Gary Tucker recovered on the Mean Green 32-yard line.

Dasher and Crad-

dock then completed a combined 5-of-6 passes, including Dasher's 10-yard pass to Taron Henry on fourth-and-9 to keep the drive alive. Dasher connected on a 7-yard score to wideout Patrick Honeycutt, his first career TD reception. Matt King missed the extra-point kick, and MTSU led 16-7.

UNT failed on a third consecutive series, going three-and-out, and MTSU took over at its own 49-yard line. On the first snap of the possession, Henry got UNT's cornerback to bite on an out-and-up route, and Dasher hit him in stride for a 51-yard catch-and-run touchdown to put the Blue Raiders ahead 23-7 with 12:49 remaining in the second quarter.

UNT rallied with back-to-back scoring drives of 79 and 80 yards.

The first march ended on Vizza's 20-yard TD pass to Sam Dibrell and the second finished with Vizza's 9-yard TD toss to Casey Fitzgerald.

The Blue Raiders regained the game's momentum but lost Dasher during a scoring drive just before half-

MTSU marched 83 yards in 12 plays, but Dasher was injured on the 11th snap of the possession. Dasher scrambled right for a pass, tried to cut left to evade three Mean Green defenders at the 4-yard line and rolled over in pain grabbing his left leg. He was helped off the field and did not return.

One play after Dasher's injury, Craddock tossed a 4yard TD pass to McNair to put MTSU up 30-21 at half-

MTSU senior Bradley Robinson broke an 89-yard kick return with 45 seconds remaining to put the Blue Raiders (5-5, 4-1) ahead 43-40.

hook-and-ladder ULM's play near midfield failed as time expired.

Robinson's touchdown was his first kick return attempt of his career, and it capped a topsy-turvy night where records fell and leads were whisked away in moments.

There were three lead changes on three touchdowns in the final 2:36.

MTSU quarterback Joe Craddock scored on a 1-yard touchdown dive on fourth-and-1 to put the Blue Raiders ahead 37-33 with 2:36 remaining. ULM answered with a quick-strike, 65-yard drive, capped by Zeek Zacharie's 6-yard TD catch with 57 seconds remaining to give the Warhawks a 40-37 lead.

After Robinson returned the game-winning score, Matt King missed the ensuing extra-point kick, but ULM could not reach field-goal range in the waning seconds for a chance to force overtime.

"That's about as wild as they get, and you've got to take your hat off to both teams for putting together a game like that," said MTSU defensive end Erik Walden, who had a career-high 12 tackles.

Craddock, the former starting guarterback replacing injured freshman Dwight Dasher in the lineup, had one of the program's all-time performances.

Craddock broke the school record with 471 yards of total offense. He also accounted for five touchdowns (four passing, one rushing). His 401 passing yards ranks third all-time.

"To be honest, we came in wanting to run the ball," said Craddock, who led MTSU with 70 rushing yards. "The credit for all those yards goes to the other 10 guys with me. I wasn't pressured one time, and our guys caught it and ran with it."

ULM had its own record-breaking performance. Senior running back Calvin Dawson had a school-

Craddock hit Jonathan Grigsby for a 94-yard touchdown pass to put MTSU ahead 30-26 early in the third guarter, the longest play from scrimmage in ULM's Malone Stadium history.

ULM answered with Dawson's 62-yard touchdown run to put the Warhawks ahead 33-30 with 10:33 remaining in the third quarter.

ULM guarterback Kinsmon Lancaster fumbled and threw an interception on sec-

ond-half drives, but MTSU did not score any points off either takeaway.

MTSU had to fight to regain the game's momentum, which it lost in a 34-second span just before halftime.

MTSU's Alex Suber intercepted Lancaster's pass to halt ULM's drive at the 10-yard line. Three plays later on third-and-12 from the 8, MTSU's Desmond Gee was dropped for a safety on a reverse that cut the Blue Raiders' lead to 24-19. On the ensuing free kick, ULM's Dawson broke a 54-yard return to MTSU's 27-yard line.

Lancaster hit LaGregory Sapp three plays later for a 4-yard TD pass, capping ULM's nine-point flurry in 34 seconds. ULM led 26-24 at halftime.

MTSU scored on four of its first five possessions.

Sophomore kicker David DeFatta capped the first drive with a 47-yard field goal, the longest of his ca-

ULL ruins Senior Day/Homecoming for Blue Raiders

MURFREESBORO, Tenn. - MTSU was more than and ankle injuries, replaced starter Joe Craddock in the one miracle shy of a win, as the Blue Raiders' Sun Belt second guarter and showed rustiness. title hopes entered the category of long shot with a 34-24 loss to Louisiana-Lafayette.

MTSU had a four-game winning streak broken in its home finale for the second straight year, and its scenario of sharing the conference title now relies on an extensive series of events.

"There was a lot on the line like the Sun Belt title and a bowl game," said MTSU senior receiver Taron Henry, a Murfreesboro native. "This was the last time that I'll step off the field that I've been playing on for 12 or 13 years. That hurt me a lot."

For MTSU (5-6, 4-2) to earn a share of the Sun Belt title. Florida Atlantic (4-1 in Sun Belt) must lose to Florida International, (0-4) and Troy (5-0) must lose its last two games to MTSU (Nov. 20) and Florida Atlantic (Dec. 1).

The Blue Raiders led Louisiana-Lafayette 14-0 early in the first guarter, but were thought we had a better chance of winning the game outscored 34-10 from there.

ULL, the Sun Belt's No. 1 rushing offense, ran for 376 yards a week after MTSU allowed 360 rushing yards to Louisiana-Monroe. ULL junior Michael Desormeaux, the nation's top rushing quarterback, ran for 175 yards on 19 carries. Tailback Tyrell Fenroy added 100 yards on 24 rushes.

"It was kind of the similar to the ULM game," MTSU defensive back Rod Issac said. "We just came out with our jazz level not up enough, and they punched us square in the mouth for it."

ULL outgained MTSU 528 yards to 256, yet the Blue Raiders led 21-14 at halftime.

The Ragin' Cajuns (2-8, 2-3) scored on second-half drives of 70, 97 and 48 yards. Two of ULL's late scoring drives were prolonged by MTSU defensive penalties.

MTSU was called for defensive holding on ULL's failed third-and-15 pass play in the third guarter that vielded an automatic first down. Desormeaux followed with a 4-yard touchdown pass to Kevin Belton.

The dagger was delivered when MTSU's Erik Walden was called for roughing the passer after ULL failed to pick up a first down on third-and-9 midway through the fourth quarter. ULL's Jason Chery then took a reverse pitch around the left end for 31 yards to put MTSU away with 8:27 remaining.

MTSU closed the game with a three-and-out series and an interception thrown by freshman guarterback Dwight Dasher.

Dasher, who missed last week's game due to knee

Dasher finished 5-of-11 passing for 29 yards and one interception. Craddock was 8-of-11 passing for 89 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions before being replaced in the second guarter with the score tied

MTSU coach Rick Stockstill said he was displeased

in Craddock's decision-making in taking two sacks and nearly throwing an interception, and added that he did not consider putting Craddock back in the game.

"I didn't think Joe was playing particularly well," Stockstill said. "... Dwight is not healthy, but with the way Joe was playing (Dasher) was a better option. But Dwight's time being out the last couple of weeks showed.

"I thought Dwight gave us the best chance of winning the game. Even him not being full speed, I still

with him."

MTSU took a 14-0 lead on Craddock touchdown passes to seniors Taron Henry and Jonathan Grigsby.

Grigsby's 11-yard TD catch in the corner of the end zone capped a nine-play, 55-yard drive that took only three minutes, 12 seconds.

For MTSU's second score, Craddock was sacked for a seven-yard loss and then nearly tossed an interception on the next play, the 32-yard touchdown pass to Henry. The pass went through ULL defensive back Torres Kingsby's hands and ricocheted into Henry's grasp, who ran untouched to the end zone. The score was set up by Issac's first career interception near the ULL goal

The Cajuns tied the game 14-14 with back-to-back second-quarter scoring drives, one with a steady running game and another with a breakaway run.

ULL ran 10 times and passed only once for its first score, a 1-yard run by Deon Wallace. The second score was sparked by Desormeaux's 86-yard scramble to the MTSU 2-yard line. Tyrell Fenroy scored on a run two plays later.

"There were a lot of missed tackles," senior defensive back Roy Polite said. "They ran hard through us, and then they got long runs off missed tackles, too."

MTSU lost its third straight home finale.

"It donned on me that this was my last game in this stadium, and for it to end this way is killing me inside," said Walden, who had a game-high 11 tackles. "I'm trying not to show it, but it really hurts."
