ORR HAS BEST GAME OF SEASON: Senior Starr Orr was suspended for the first two games of the year for a violation of academic policy and returned to the lineup November 19 at Houston. Her game has come around slowly in contests at Houston and Arizona before she played her best game of the year Wednesday at Chattanooga, scoring 11 points with four rebounds, two assists and three steals in 28 minutes of action. Orr averaged 5.5 points, 4.4 rebounds and 2.4 steals per game in 2006-07, ranking 76th nationally in steals per game.

LANNING FILLS SCORING HOLE: Freshman Anne Marie Lanning has filled some of the scoring void left from the departures of Chrissy Givens and Krystle Horton. Lanning has netted double figures in three of Middle Tennessee's five games this season, scoring 12 versus Tennessee Tech, 11 at Houston and 10 this past Wednesday at Chattanooga. The Murfreesboro, Tenn., native has started four of the five contests and is averaging 25.6 minutes per game. Lanning has also contributed 3.6 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 2.4 steals per contest to go along with her 8.8 points per outing.

HOLT VOTED SBC PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Middle Tennessee's Amber Holt was voted the Sun Belt Player of the Week on November 20 after helping the Blue Raiders to a pair of victories. Holt averaged 24.5 points and 10.0 rebounds per game in Middle Tennessee victories over Tennessee Tech and at Houston. The senior set career-highs with 30 points and 15 rebounds in the 69-68 triumph at Houston, including scoring nine straight points in the second half after the Cougars tied the game. She also had career-highs in field goals made (13) and field goal attempts (27) and added four assists and three steals in 37 minutes in the contest. Against Tennessee Tech, Holt scored 19 points with five rebounds, three assists and two steals.

Nothing has changed this season, as the Blue Raiders are averaging 26.4 3-point attempts per contest. Middle Tennessee is shooting 33 percent from behind the arc, down a bit after the last two games, a 7-for-26 performance at Arizona last season and a 6-for-29 outing at Chattanooga this past Wednesday. But the shots in Tucson were quality looks and just didn't go down, with three or four spinning around the rim before falling out, and the same was true in Chattanooga. digit 3-pointers made under Insell after posting five such contests in 2005-06 and 11 more last season.

BARCLAY PROVIDES A SPARK: Senior Latoya Barclay has provided the Blue Raiders with a much-needed spark during the young season with both her defense and scoring. Barclay scored in double figures in the first two games of the year, including a career-high 17 points at Old Dominion in the season opener. In just her second career start, Barclay was 6of-9 shooting, including 3-of-5 from behind the arc, at ODU. The Harvest, Ala., native almost single-handedly brought the Blue Raiders back from a 17-point second-half deficit, hitting three straight 3-pointers during an 11-1 run that cut the deficit to three with just over three minutes remaining in the game. Not only did Barclay set a career high for points, but the Sparkman HS product also set career highs in FG made (6), 3-point FG made (3), 3-point FG attempts (5) and minutes (31), and tied her career high with nine FG attempts and four rebounds. She followed that performance with 11 points and three rebounds in the victory over Tennessee Tech on

November 14. Last Sunday at Arizona, Barclay came off the bench and was a big part of Middle Tennessee expanding a two-point halftime lead en route to victory against the Wildcats. She hit a 3-pointer in the corner before Amber Holt had a bucket underneath. Barclay then got a deflection and a steal and dribbled in to take a midrange jumper off the glass for a nine-point advantage with 7:43 remaining in the contest. For the season Barclay is averaging 7.4 points per game and also has nine assists and five steals while averaging 22.6 minutes per outing.

RAIDERS TURN AROUND TURNOVER TREND: One of Middle Tennessee's trademarks under Rick Insell, especially during last season's 30-4 campaign, has been its ability to force turnovers and turn those into points but also the team's knack for limiting its own miscues. In 2006-07 the Blue Raiders turned the ball over 14.6 times per game but forced 26.3 miscues by opponents, turning those into 30.2 points per outing. Through this season's first three games, Middle Tennessee was committing 19.7 turnovers per game, but the Blue Raiders have improved on that number drastically over the last two contests, committing 14 turnovers at Arizona last Sunday and then just 10 miscues at Chattanooga this past Wednesday. Middle Tennessee has continued to use its defense to force opponents into turnovers. Through the five games in 2007-08, opponents have committed 111 miscues, or 22.2 per game, and the Blue

SERIES WITH WESTERN CAROLINA: Middle Tennessee and Western Carolina have met just once previously, with the Blue Raiders winning 76-65 at Murphy Center on December 6, 1991.

The Blue Raiders had four players in double figures in the victory, including a game-high 19 points from Niki Bonner as well as 17 points from Priscilla Robinson, 12 by Sherie Harris and 10 from Cherrita Williams. Bonner also grabbed a game-high 16 rebounds while Maggie Cox and Shana Wright both had four assists.

BLUE RAIDERS MISS THE MARK: For the second time in five games this season Middle Tennessee shot below 36 percent, hitting only 23-of-64 (.359) shots at Chattanooga this past Wednesday. The Blue Raiders made only 22-of-64 (.344) in the season opener at Old Dominion. Middle Tennessee had just one game last season where they shot worse, making 20-of-65 (.308) against South Dakota State on November 13. The squad has posted just two other games with a worse shooting percentage under head coach Rick Insell - at Chattanooga on November 18, 2005 (24-of-70, .343) and at Florida International on February 27, 2006 (22-of-67, .328)

BLUE RAIDERS IN DECEMBER: Middle Tennessee owns a 116-81 mark all-time in the month of December, including 10-3 under third-year head coach Rick Insell. The Blue Raiders were 4-3 in Insell's first season and a perfect 6-0 last year, including victories at eighth-ranked Georgia and over Western Kentucky.

Preseason Notes

HOLT VOTED FIRST TEAM, BLUE RAIDERS PICKED SECOND IN SBC: Middle Tennessee senior Amber Holt was voted First Team All-Sun Belt and the Blue Raiders were picked second in the East in a poll of league coaches released during the Sun Belt Media Days in Mobile, Ala. Holt was a First Team All-SBC selection last season after averaging 16.7 points, 6.3 rebounds and 2.7 steals per contest. She is one of three starters returning for the Blue Raiders from last year's record-setting 30-4 club.

She had her best games in 2006-07 against some of the nation's top teams, including 28 points and eight rebounds against top-ranked Maryland, 26 points and 10 boards versus Chattanooga and 21 points, including 15 in the second half, in Middle Tennessee's victory at eighth-ranked Georgia. Holt also scored 27 points against Old Dominion, tallied 15 points and 11 rebounds in the semifinals of the Sun Belt Championships versus Denver and posted 23 points against Gonzaga in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The Duluth, Ga., native made it to the final cut this past summer for USA Basketball's Pan American Games Team.

Middle Tennessee received four first-place votes in the East Division and had 69 total points. The coaches picked Western Kentucky first in the division, with the Lady 'Toppers receiving nine first-place votes and 74 total points. Florida International was selected third in the East, with Troy and South Alabama tied for fourth and Florida Atlantic sixth.

BLUE RAIDERS 27TH IN FIRST ESPN/USA TODAY POLL: Middle Tennessee was ranked 27th in the Preseason ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll released October 31 and missed the Top 25 by just seven points. Defending national champion Tennessee was ranked No. 1 and garnered 26 of the 31 first-place votes in the poll, while Connecticut received four firstplace votes and LSU, who Middle Tennessee plays on December 28 in Murfreesboro, garnered the remaining top vote. The Blue Raiders posted 71 points in the poll, while 25th-ranked N.C. State had 78 points. DePaul received 75 points and was ranked 26th. Middle Tennessee received 15 votes in the second ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll released November 13, ranking 33rd nationally.

The Blue Raiders were ranked in the ESPN/ *USA Today* Coaches Poll last season for the first time since 1988 and appeared in the final 12 rankings of the season, reaching as high as No. 16 and ending the year rated 23rd nationally. Middle Tennessee's 30-4 mark in 2006-07 was the best ever in the history of the program and one of the best in Sun Belt history, as the Blue

Raiders rolled through league play and the conference tournament with a 21-0 mark against SBC competition.

HOLT SECOND TEAM ALL-AMERICAN, TEAM RANKED 13TH BY SPORTING NEWS: Middle Tennessee was ranked 13th and senior Amber Holt was named Second Team All-American by the Sporting News in their Preseason College Basketball magazine. It was the second preseason ranking for the Blue Raiders after Lindy's rated the club 22nd nationally. Middle Tennessee ended the 2006-07 season ranked 17th by the Associated Press and 23rd in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. The Blue Raiders return three starters and seven letterwinners from last year's record-setting 30-4 club.

Holt garnered First Team All-Sun Belt honors last season after averaging 16.7 points, 6.3 rebounds and 2.7 steals per game. She started all 34 contests and scored in double figures in 30 games. The Duluth, Ga., native netted 28 points and eight rebounds in her first career game, versus top-ranked Maryland, and followed that with the first of three double-doubles during the season with 19 points and 10 boards against South Dakota State. Holt scored 26 points with 10 rebounds versus Chattanooga and 21 points, including 15 in the second half, in a victory at eighth-ranked Georgia. She also posted 27 points with eight boards, including 10-of-12 free throws, against Old Dominion. Holt registered 20-plus points in three straight games in February, scoring 27 against South Alabama, 25 at Louisiana-Monroe and 24 at Western Kentucky. She added 15 points and 11 rebounds versus Denver in the semifinals of the Sun Belt Championships and netted 20 points in the championship game against Louisiana-Lafayette. Holt scored 23 points versus Gonzaga in the opening contest of the NCAA Tournament.

RAIDERS 28TH IN FIRST AP POLL: Middle Tennessee was ranked 28th in the first Associated Press poll released on November 3. The Blue Raiders appeared in the final 10 AP polls in 2006-07, reaching as high as No. 16 on March 5. Last season's ranking was the first-ever in school history in the Associated Press poll for Middle Tennessee. The Blue Raiders ended the year ranked 17th in the final AP poll of 2006-07. Middle Tennessee was tied for 33rd in the second AP poll this year, released November 13, with nine votes.

BLUE RAIDERS 22ND IN LINDY'S: Middle Tennessee was ranked 22nd in a preseason poll released in *Lindy's* 2007-08 College Basketball Magazine. The Blue Raiders ended the 2006-

RAIDERS SET SUN BELT VICTORIES MARK:

Middle Tennessee set a school and Sun Belt record for conference victories in 2006-07, running the table against SBC foes and compiling an 18-0 record. Last season marked the 20th time in the 31-year history of varsity basketball that Middle Tennessee has posted double-figure wins in league play. The 1982-83 squad's 10-0 record is the only other undefeated conference record in school history. The Blue Raiders broke the previous Sun Belt high of 16 league wins set by Louisiana Tech in both 1999-00 and 2000-01. Middle Tennessee ended the season 21-0 against Sun Belt opponents after winning its fourth consecutive SBC Tournament. Only three other schools in the 31-year history of the Sun Belt finished undefeated in conference play (Old Dominion, 6-0 in 1984-85, 1987-88; UAB, 6-0 in 1990-91; Louisiana Tech, 14-0 in 1993-94, 1995-96, 12-0 in 1998-99, 16-0 in 1999-00,

2000-01). Across the nation last season, only seven other programs out of 31 conferences posted undefeated marks: George Washington, 14-0 in the Atlantic 10; Tennessee, 14-0 in the SEC; Connecticut, 16-0 in the Big East; Duke, 14-0 in the ACC; Wisconsin-Green Bay, 14-0 in the Horizon; Coppin State, 18-0 in the MEAC; and UT-Arlington, 16-0 in the Southland.

INSELL NUMBER ONE: With the win over Florida International on Feb. 15, 2007, head coach Rick Insell posted his 44th victory at Middle Tennessee, the most in school history by a coach in his first two years. Insell broke the previous mark of 43 victories set by Lewis Bivens during the 1987-88 and 1988-89 campaigns. The Blue Raiders posted their 15th 20-win campaign in 31 seasons of varsity basketball in 2006-07, and Insell became just the second coach, along with Bivens, to have back-to-back 20-win campaigns to begin a career as head coach at Middle Tennessee.

INSELL VOTED COACH OF THE YEAR: After setting the school-record for wins with 30 and setting a Sun Belt record with 18 league victories, Rick Insell was voted Coach of the Year by his peers in 2006-07. The Coach of the Year award is the first such honor for a Middle Tennessee head coach since Lewis Bivens in 1988. Insell compiled a 50-15 record in his two seasons as head coach, including last year's 30-4 mark, which included a 27-game winning streak. He compiled more wins in his first two seasons than any other previous Blue Raider coach and posted back-to-back 20-win campaigns for just the sixth time in school history.

HOLT GARNERS SBC PLAYER OF THE WEEK TWICE: Forward Amber Holt was voted the Sun Belt Player of the Week on two occasions in 2006-07, on Nov. 14 and again on Feb. 5. The Duluth, Ga., native averaged 23.5 points and 9.0 rebounds in Middle Tennessee's first two games of the year, versus No. 1 Maryland and South Dakota State. Against the defending national champion Terrapins, Holt tallied 28 points on 11-of-24 shooting with eight rebounds. Her 15 first-half points kept the Blue Raiders in the contest when the Terrapins threatened to run away with the game. Against SDSU, Holt scored 19 points and added 10 boards for her

first career double-double. In February, Holt averaged 20.0 points and 8.0 rebounds in the Middle Tennessee victories over Denver and South Alabama. The junior scored 13 points with eight boards and four assists versus Denver on Jan. 31 before exploding for 27 points and eight rebounds against South Alabama on Feb. 3. The 27-point effort was her second 27-point effort of the season (Old Dominion on Dec. 19 was the other). The Duluth, Ga., native was 11-for-16 from the field, tying her season-high for makes, and set career-highs by going 3-of-6 from 3-point range.

HOLT RECORDS THREE DOUBLE-DOU-BLES: Junior Amber Holt was one of the main cogs in Middle Tennessee's success last season, recording three double-doubles and leading the Blue Raiders in either points and/or rebounds in 16 of the 32 games. Holt was the first to accomplish the double-double feat last season with 19 points and 10 rebounds against South Dakota State on Nov. 13, just her second game as a Blue Raider. The Duluth, Ga., native then had 26 points and 10 boards versus Chattanooga on Nov. 24. Holt's final doubledouble came during the Sun Belt Tournament, netting 15 points and grabbing a career-high 11 rebounds versus Denver in the semifinals. In 2004-05 and 2005-06, the Blue Raiders posted seven double-doubles as a team in each campaign and had 14 in 2003-04. Last season the squad had 12 double-doubles as a team.

BLUE RAIDERS RANK SIXTH IN ATTEN-DANCE INCREASE: After leading the nation in increased attendance in his first season as head coach, Rick Insell and Middle Tennessee ranked sixth nationally in increased attendance for the 2006-07 season, according to official figures released by the NCAA. Middle Tennessee ranked sixth in the country in increased attendance in 2006-07, averaging 4,157 fans for 15 home games. The 4,157 fans per contest ranked 26th nationally for average attendance per game, ahead of traditional women's basketball powers such as Kansas State, national runner-up Rutgers, Old Dominion, Stanford and Louisiana Tech. The Blue Raiders set a singlegame record with 10,010 for the season-opener against top-ranked Maryland and had six total crowds over 4,000 during the 2006-07 campaign (Arkansas State - 4,884; Louisiana-Lafayette - 5,228; South Alabama - 4,711; Florida International - 4,907; Florida Atlantic - 5,505). The women's program has increased its attendance more than 550 percent over the last two seasons, going from 744 per contest in 2004-05 to 2,699 last season to this year's 4,157.

Lady Raiders upset Lethargic start to second half dooms MTSU at Chattanooga By MONTE HALE JR. hale@dnj.com

CHATTANOOGA — Basketball seasons afford teams to learn a lot of valuable lessons. MTSU's Lady Raiders learned one Wednesday night when they lost 57-54 at Chattanooga The McKenzie Center.

"We came out sluggish in the second half and it was like we didn't care," said senior forward Amber Holt. "I think we learned if you come out like that you're going to get your butt kicked big time."

The sluggishness in reference came early in the second half when MTSU missed five straight 3-point attempts and made just two of its first 12 field goal attempts.

The Lady Raiders (3-2) led 29-28 at halftime, but fell behind 32-31 early in the second half and never regained the lead.

"We didn't execute," said senior guard Starr Orr. "We had people pass up shots, we didn't rebound and we didn't execute."

MTSU trailed 45-41 with eight minutes left before Holt scored back-to-back baskets to tie the game with 6:04 left.

Chattanooga's Jenaya Wade-Fray hit a 3-pointer out of the corner with 2:11 remaining and MTSU never got closer than two points.

"They've got a very good basketball team and I knew they felt they had something to prove after a bad second half against Louisville the "TEAM"

other night," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "They played hard, we played hard and they had some kids make some plays down the stretch."

MTSU made just 6-of-29 3-pointers, while Chattanooga hit 5-of-14. The Lady Raiders shot just two free throws — both coming after Moore was hit with a technical foul in the first half. The Lady Mocs cashed in on 16-of-20 attempts at the free throw line.

"I don't know if I've ever played a game — from junior pro, to middle school, to coaching high school, to coaching here — that we shot two free throws," Insell said. "... Wes gave us those and we appreciate it.

"That's not the difference in the game, but I've never seen that. They had a good game plan and they made the tough plays."

MTSU was outrebounded 38-31 — another statistic Holt pointed to as a difference in the outcome.

"We just need our five to step up and rebound," she said. "Basically, we need to rebound better. Hopefully the next game we'll come ready."

Added Orr: "We've got to box out better and we've got to help Amber rebound."

Holt led the Lady Raiders with 19 points and seven boards, while Orr scored 11. Freshman Anne Marie Lanning netted 10 points, all in the first half.

GAME NOTES

With the loss, Middle Tennessee dropped to 24-17 all-time against Chattanooga and head coach Rick Insell's record versus the Lady Mocs is now 1-2 with both losses on the road ... For the second time in five games this season the Blue Raiders shot below 36 percent, hitting only 23-of-64 (.359) shots in the contest. Middle Tennessee made only 22-of-64 (.344) in the season opener at Old Dominion. The Blue Raiders had just one game last season where they shot worse, making 20-of-65 (.308) against South Dakota State on November 13. The squad has posted just two other games with a worse shooting percentage under head coach Rick Insell - at Chattanooga on November 18, 2005 (24-of-70, .343) and at Florida International on February 27, 2006 (22-of-67, .328) ... Senior Amber Holt continued her offensive barrage in the second half, netting 15 of her 19 points after intermission. For the year Holt has scored 72 of her 109 points this season in the second half, and average of 14.4 per contest ... Middle Tennessee led 29-28 at halftime before losing the contest, 57-54. The loss dropped the Blue Raiders mark under Insell to 50-4 when leading at halftime and 3-1 this season.

Head Coach Rick Insell



Rick Insell begins his third season as head coach at Middle Tennessee amid great expectations after a record-breaking season in 2006-07 that included a schoolrecord 30 victories, a fourth straight trip to the NCAA Tourna-

ment and a No. 16 national ranking by the Associated Press and the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll.

Insell has helped elevate the program into the national spotlight, including last season's victory at then eighth-ranked Georgia in early December. The victory in Athens was the first in program history over a ranked team on the road and just the fifth victory over a ranked foe in the 32-year history of the Middle Tennessee program.

The Blue Raiders won 27 games in a row in 2006-07, the longest streak in the nation at one point, and did not lose for more than 100 days.

Middle Tennessee eclipsed the school record for victories in a season as well last year, posting a 30-4 overall record, besting the previous mark of 26 set by the 1982-83 squad. The 2006-07 squad also tied the record for consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, tying a mark set from 1983-86, and collected the program's fourth consecutive 20-win campaign, also a school record. The four straight conference tournament titles also ties a school record set from 1983-86.

Insell's two-year mark of 50-15 is the best back-to-back seasons in program history, bettering the mark of 48-17 posted during 2003-04 and 2004-05.

Fans have also taken notice of the team's entertaining playing style. Middle Tennessee led the nation in increased attendance percentage in 2005-06, drawing 2,699 fans per game, a 276 percent increase over the previous season. The Blue Raiders improved on that number in 2006-07 as well, setting a single-game record with 10,010 in the season opener against defending national champion Maryland and averaging 4,157 fans for 15 home games, an increase of 65 percent. Middle Tennessee's attendance ranked in the Top 30 nationally and the crowd for the Maryland game was one of the Top 50 for attendance in the nation in 2006-07.

Insell also developed one of the best players in school history over the last two seasons. Chrissy

- Janaury 17, 2007 Rick Insell and Middle Tennessee featured in two-page spread in *USA Today* about the program's rise to national prominence and success during his brief tenure.

- In 1989, ESPN did a feature story on the Shelbyville Eaglettes that aired nationally several times. The story won the National Television Journalism Award later that year. It was the first of several stories ESPN did on Insell and his team.
- In 1992, Rick Insell was named Head Coach of the Girls High School All-American Game and from 1992-96 was a member of the All-American Selection Committee. He became the chairman of the All-American Selection Committee in 1996 and began serving as an advisor in 1999.
- Insell was named to the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors as High School Representative in 2001.

Givens registered the second-most points in school history in 2005-06 and eclipsed the top mark in 2006-07, and ranked in the Top 10 nationally in scoring both seasons.

Insell, a Woodbury, Tenn., native, made a huge splash in his first year at the helm of the Middle Tennessee program, guiding the Blue Raiders to their third consecutive Sun Belt Tournament title and doing so in front of a record-setting home crowd in the finals of the Sun Belt Championships.

Insell directed one of the most thrilling comebacks in Sun Belt Tournament history, leading Middle Tennessee to an 84-73 win over Western Kentucky after being down by as many as 14 points

The 2005-06 campaign also saw another first in program history as three players - Givens, Tia Stovall and Krystle Horton - all joined the 1,000-point club. It marked the first time in school history three current players all were represented on

in the first half.

the prestigious list, and the Blue Raiders were one of only four teams in the 2006 NCAA Tournament to boast such an honor.

Middle Tennessee notched one of its biggest wins of the season when the Blue Raiders defeated traditional Big 10 power Penn State, 79-65, in the UAB Blaze Tournament in December.

With the first conference title and NCAA Tournament appearance under his belt, Insell's recruiting class was ranked 10th nationally and included current sophomores Jackie Pickel, Brandi Brown and Chelsia Lymon.

A 1977 graduate of Middle Tennessee, Insell built a high school girls basketball dynasty at nearby Shelbyville Central High School, just a 30-

minute drive from the Middle Tennessee campus. He guided the Golden Eaglettes to a record 10 TSSAA Class AAA state championships and two *USA Today* national championships (1989, 1991), as he compiled a sparkling 775-148 worksheet during his 28-year tenure.

Insell was named *USA Today* National High School Coach of the Year in 1989 and 1991 and he also was been named Converse National High School Coach of the Year on two occasions (1990, 1992). A name synonymous with high school girls basketball in Tennessee, Insell's teams hold the Tennessee state records for consecutive wins with 110, consecutive state titles with four (1989-1992), most state championships for a coach with 10 (1986, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1995, 2000, 2001, 2003 and 2004), and his 1990 Golden Eaglette squad was named the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame Team of the Year, the first high school team so honored.

For his accomplishments at Shelbyville, Insell was elected to the National High School Hall of Fame in February 2007 and was inducted with a class of 12 in July 2007. Insell is one of only six Tennesseeans, including just the fourth coach, elected to the National High School Hall of Fame.

Under Insell's guidance, Shelbyville Central

won 23 district championships, 16 regional championships and appeared in the Class AAA state championship game a remarkable 15 times, winning 10. He developed six Tennessee Class AAA Miss Basketball Award recipients, 15 high school All-Americans and 57 of his players received either athletic or academic scholarships to continue their careers at the collegiate level.

While Insell built a basketball dynasty at Shelbyville during his time there, he also made sure his players got the job done in the classroom, as evidenced by his teams receiving the TSSAA Distinguished Award for Academic Success from 1989-2000, an award based on team grade-point-average. The lowest cumulative GPA at Shelbyville from 1989-00 was 3.4 and the highest was 3.98. The academic emphasis has continued during his tenure at Middle Tennessee, as the Blue Raiders posted a cumulative 3.22 GPA in Fall 2006.

Additionally, Insell's Shelbyville team received a special invitation to the Oval Office by President George H. Bush for academic and athletic achievement and his teams also have been honored in the United States Senate and House of Representatives, the Tennessee State House and Senate and by two Tennessee Governors.

Insell had high praise for the head coaching position when he accepted the position at Middle Tennessee.

"Dreams do come true," Insell said after Director of Athletics Chris Massaro announced his hiring on May 18, 2005. "It's something you think about. I'm a coach and it's all I've ever done, from elementary to junior high to junior pro, AAU and high school. To be able to come on board at Middle Tennessee, a Division I school, that's a dream come true, not only for me, but for all of the high school coaches and junior high coaches across the country and it says if you stay in there long enough and dream big enough, one day it will eventually happen."

Insell said Middle Tennessee will be a pressing basketball team on defense and force the issue, and he added that the Blue Raiders would back down from no one on the recruiting trail.

"We are going after the best players in the state of Tennessee every year," Insell said. "If Tennessee or Vanderbilt is after them, then Middle Tennessee is going to be after them, too. We will recruit alongside of them. We are not going to be intimidated, nor will we back down because they are in the Southeastern Conference. We are Division I and they are Division I. We are going to use all of our contacts."

Insell is married to Debbie and the couple have three sons, Tom, Kyle and Matt.

Freshman Anne Marie Lanning scored 18 points, leading four double figure scorers, and senior Amber Holt netted 12 points and grabbed 14 rebounds in just 19 minutes of action, as Middle Tennessee defeated North Alabama, 82-36, in women's exhibition action Thursday night at Murphy Center.

Middle Tennessee scored 20 of the game's first 22 points, but went cold late in the half and led just 31-22 at the break. But the Blue Raiders went on a 21-3 run to start the second half and pull away from the Lions.

Middle Tennessee won the battle of the boards, 54-30, with Holt leading with way with her 14 caroms, including 12 in the first half. Freshman Emily Queen scored 11 points and sophomore Chelsia Lymon added 10 for the Blue Raiders in front of 1,681 in the first of two exhibition games over the next five days.

The Blue Raiders scored 20 of the game's first 22 points, including an 11-0 run to start the game over the first three minutes. Amber Rutherford netted UNA's first basket at the 16:45 mark and she also scored the Lions second bucket at 13:48.

UNA got back into the game when Middle Tennessee went six minutes with just one basket. The Lions put together a 14-5 run over an eight minute stretch to pull within 29-21, but the Blue Raiders scored the final four points of the half on free throws, two each from Lanning and Queen.

Holt scored eight points and grabbed 12 rebounds in the first half, while Lanning added seven points.

In the second half Lanning netted eight of her 18 points during the 21-3 run, while Holt and Latoya Barclay each added four. Lanning was a perfect 8-for-8 at the foul line in the contest, grabbed six rebounds, dished out four assists and made four steals.

Sophomore Jackie Pickel had seven rebounds for the Blue Raiders, sophomore Brandi Brown added nine points and five boards, and redshirt freshman Angelique Burtts netted nine points in her first career game.

Amber Holt scored 22 points and Anne Marie Lanning added 21, leading six double-figure scorers, and Middle Tennessee hit 15 3-pointers in the contest, as the Blue Raiders rolled to a 108-49 victory over Henderson State Monday night in women's basketball exhibition action at Murphy Center.

Middle Tennessee took advantage of aggressive play from Henderson State, who committed 30 personal fouls in the contest, putting the Blue Raiders at the foul line 31 times. Holt hit 10-of-11 at the foul line and Middle Tennessee made 25-of-31 as a team.

The Blue Raiders struggled from the field in a very sloppy first half, hitting just 32 percent from the floor and 25 percent from 3-point range. The Lady Reddies committed 18 personal fouls in the half, allowing Middle Tennessee to shoot 19 free throws in the opening 20 minutes, of which the Blue Raiders made 16.

Holt was 8-of-9 from the foul line and tallied 14 points in the half, while Lanning had nine points and Emily Queen grabbed seven rehounds.

In the second half Middle Tennessee turned up the defensive pressure and scored 70 points over the final 20 minutes, shooting 57 percent from the field and 52 percent from behind the arc. The Blue Raiders forced 18 second half turnovers and turned them into 32 points.

Middle Tennessee opened the second half with a 15-4 run, highlighted by six points from Holt. The Blue Raiders made 11 trifectas in the second half, including five from Johnna Abney, who finished with 15 points.

Queen grabbed a game-high 10 boards, while Morgan Boyd and Angelique Burtts both scored 11 points and Jackie Pickel added 10. Burtts also had seven rebounds in just 13 minutes of action.

For 32 minutes, Middle Tennessee looked out-of-place and out-of-sync Saturday night against Old Dominion. But then the Blue Raiders dialed up the defense, forcing five straight turnovers and cutting the deficit to three points, but Old Dominion pulled away in the end en route to a 76-68 season-opening victory at the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

Middle Tennessee (0-1) trailed by as many as 17 points in the second half and was down 68-55 with 6:11 remaining in the game. But the Blue Raiders scored 12 of the game's next 13 points, started by a 3-pointer from Brandi Brown and including a trio of trifectas from senior Latoya Barclay. The 12-1 spurt took just over three minutes, pulling the Blue Raiders with three points at 69-66.

After another ODU turnover, Middle Tennessee had the ball with a chance to tie, but Jackie Pickel missed a 3-pointer from the corner. Lady Monarch Shalida Williams drove to the basket on the other end, hitting Megan Pym for a driving layup and taking the momentum away from the Blue Raiders.

Pym had another layup on a putback the next time up the floor and Old Dominion made their free throws over the final minute, just as they had all night.

Barclay finished the game with a career-high 17 points, including 15 in the second half, in just the second start of her career. Brown was also a major factor for the Blue Raiders, netting 14 points with four rebounds in 35 minutes of action.

Everyone on the Blue Raiders had to step into a more prominent role after senior Amber Holt played just six minutes in the first half because of three fouls and then picked up her fourth foul less than four minutes into the second half. The Duluth, Ga., native did play the final 12:26 of the contest without fouling out, scoring 14 points with six rebounds in just 22 minutes of action.

Middle Tennessee trailed by seven at the half, but the Lady Monarchs scored the first six points after intermission before the Blue Raiders answered with a pair of 3-pointers, one from Holt and the other from Pickel, who scored nine points in the game on a trio of trifectas.

But ODU expanded the lead to 17 points in the second half thanks to the charity stripe, the Lady Monarchs best friend for most of the game. ODU's Tiffany Green hit 6-of-7 in the second half and ODU was 11-of-15 after the break and 27-for-35 in the contest. Compare that to Middle Tennessee, who shot just three free throws after halftime and only 17 foul shots in the game.

Anne Marie Lanning grabbed six rebounds and Emily Queen came off the bench to contribute seven boards for the Blue Raiders, who were outrebounded only 44-41 despite a large difference in size at almost every position. T.J. Jordan led four double figure scorers for ODU with 19 points, while Williams had 15, Green added 12 and Jessica Canady scored 13 off the bench.

It didn't take long for MTSU to set the tempo for its home opener against Tennessee Tech Wednesday night at Murphy Center.

It didn't take long, either, for the Lady Raiders to race out to a 89-62 rout before a crowd of 2,614.

MTSU hit seven of its first 10 shots, which proved to a sign of things to come as the Lady Raiders drained 12 3-pointers and shot 51 percent from the field.

"Anytime you shoot the ball like we shot it, and we got some good looks and kept knocking them down, you're going to have a chance to have a good night," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "Overall, I was pleased with our intensity."

MTSU forced 33 Golden Eaglette turnovers, including 20 in the

Tennessee Tech continuously struggled to get the ball in the half-court against the Lady Raiders' pressure defense. The Golden Eaglettes managed just eight shots in the first 12 minutes and only 15 in the first half.

"We take a lot of pride in our press and we were able to contain the ball," said MTSU sophomore guard Chelsia Lymon, who had four of MTSU's 24 steals. "They're a good team with good shooters, and we did a good job rotating.

Seven different Lady Raiders hit 3-pointers and five players hit for double figures, led by senior forward Amber Holt's 19. Freshman Emily Queen hit three 3-pointers, while Lymon, Anne Marie Lanning and Jackie Pickel hit two apiece.

"Hopefully we won't ever start off shooting like we did against Old Dominion," Pickel said of the Lady Raiders' shooting woes in a 76-68 season-opening loss Saturday. "When one of us hits one, we do gravitate and feel the energy off each other."

MTSU led 58-24 at halftime and went ahead by as many as 44 points in the second half, when it outscored Tennessee Tech 16-6 in the first five minutes. However, the Lady Raiders scored just 15 points in the final 15 minutes.

"We changed our press in the second half," Insell said, "but we needed to work on some things that we'll have to do later. We gave up some easy baskets, but they were things we needed to work on.

"We've got a lot of work to do, but it was a good win tonight."

Lymon had 15 points, while Lanning had 12 and Latoya Barclay 11. Queen netted nine.

Tennessee Tech (1-1) was led by Cara Reed's 13 points, while freshman and former Smyrna standout Jasmine White netted 11. The Golden Eaglettes shot 64 percent (23-of-36) but were obviously plagued by the 33 floor mistakes.

Amber Holt recorded her fourth career double-double with career-highs of 30 points and 15 rebounds, including nine straight points in the second half when the game was tied, as Middle Tennessee held on for a 69-68 victory over Houston Monday night at Hofheinz Pavilion.

Houston's Tye Jackson and Twiggy McIntyre had potential game-winning shots in the final 10 seconds of the game. The Cougars scored the final 10 points of the game over two minutes.

The Blue Raiders put together a 20-9 run after Houston tied the contest at 49 with 12:53 remaining in the contest. At that point Holt took over, hitting four straight buckets plus a free throw and then hit Anne Marie Lanning for a layup on the next possession.

Lanning had two free throws of her own on the next trip down the floor to extend the lead to 60-49 for the Blue Raiders, but Houston had a mad rush at the end, highlighted by a pair of 3-pointers from Brittney Scott. Courtney Taylor also had two layups in the final minute after a Blue Raider turnover and a missed shot.

After another Middle Tennessee (2-1) miscue, Jackson brought the ball up the floor with nine seconds remaining, but her jumper in the lane was short and missed the rim completely. McIntyre grabbed the rebound and tried to come from underneath the basket for a shot, but it fell harmlessly on the floor as the buzzer sounded and Middle Tennessee escaped.

Lanning scored 11 points for the Blue Raiders, while Taylor came off the bench to lead the Cougars with 18 points. Jackson added 15 points, while Scott had 14 and McIntyre scored 11.

After missing its first four shots of the game, turning the ball over four times in the first four-plus minutes and failing to score, the Blue Raiders found the range from the field, hitting six of their next 11 shots, including four 3-pointers, for a 16-9 advantage at the 12minute media timeout.

Middle Tennessee raced out to a 14-point advantage after an Emily Queen putback with 8:15 remaining in the half, prompting a Cougars timeout. Houston cut the deficit in half at intermission thanks to three straight buckets from McIntyre, and the Blue Raiders headed to the locker room with a 41-34 advantage.

After missing their first three 3-pointers of the half, the Blue Raiders were 7-of-13 over the remaining 15 minutes. Holt scored 11 points and Chelsia Lymon had eight off the bench before the break.

UH scored 15 of the first 23 points after halftime, knotting the contest at 49 after a steal and layup from McIntyre, before Holt scored on four straight possessions to give the Blue Raiders the lead for good.

Latoya Barclay came off the bench and provided a big spark with seven points and three assists in Middle Tennessee's 70-60 victory over Arizona Sunday at McKale Center.

Holt netted 19 of her 27 in the second half and Barclay was all over the floor, including in the middle of a huge 7-0 run in the middle of the second half that opened the Middle Tennessee advantage from two points to nine. Barclay hit a 3-pointer in the corner before Holt had a bucket underneath. Barclay then got a deflection and a steal and dribbled in to take a mid-range jumper off the glass for a 53-44 lead with 7:43 remaining.

The Blue Raiders battled against the much bigger Wildcats and were outrebounded by just one, 28-27, but Middle Tennessee hit the offensive glass, getting 14 boards, including two from Brandi Brown to start the second half and big ones by Starr Orr and Barclay in the final minute to seal the victory.

Johnna Abney was the only other Blue Raider in double figures, hitting a trio of 3-pointers, including one from at least eight feet from behind the arc. It was a total team effort, as Brandi Brown added eight points, Orr had six and Anne Marie Lanning scored five.

The first half was a seesaw affair, with six ties and six lead changes, and a late flurry by the Blue Raiders gave the visitors a 32-30 edge at the break. Middle Tennessee had great opportunities in the opening 20 minutes but shot just 34 percent from the field, while Arizona made 69 percent from the floor.

But that number was deceiving, as the Wildcats also had 14 turnovers and the Blue Raiders were whistled for nine fouls in the half. UA either hit a bucket, was fouled or turned the ball over on almost every possession before intermission.

Middle Tennessee started hot, thanks to a driving layup from Chelsia Lymon, a 3-pointer by Brown and a turnaround jumper in the lane from Holt for an early 7-2 lead and a timeout by Arizona. The Wildcats made a living in the paint in the half, though, scoring 20 points near the bucket on a host of layups and backdoor cuts.

The Blue Raiders held UA scoreless over the final 3:03 of the half and took advantage, with Orr hitting a driving layup as the shot clock expired and Brown nailing another trifecta for the two-point halftime lead

In the second half Holt scored the first six points for the Blue Raiders, who never trailed after intermission. Arizona kept the came within a bucket until Middle Tennessee's 7-0 run led by Barclay that helped the Blue Raiders pull away.

It was Middle Tennessee's second road victory of the young season after posting 13 last season.

Basketball seasons afford teams to learn a lot of valuable lessons. MTSU's Lady Raiders learned one Wednesday night when they lost 57-54 at Chattanooga The McKenzie Center.

"We came out sluggish in the second half and it was like we didn't care," said senior forward Amber Holt. "I think we learned if you come out like that you're going to get your butt kicked big time."

The sluggishness in reference came early in the second half when MTSU missed five straight 3-point attempts and made just two of its first 12 field goal attempts.

The Lady Raiders (3-2) led 29-28 at halftime, but fell behind 32-31 early in the second half and never regained the lead.

"We didn't execute," said senior guard Starr Orr. "We had people pass up shots, we didn't rebound and we didn't execute."

MTSU trailed 45-41 with eight minutes left before Holt scored back-to-back baskets to tie the game with 6:04 left.

Chattanooga's Jenaya Wade-Fray hit a 3-pointer out of the corner with 2:11 remaining and MTSU never got closer than two points.

"They've got a very good basketball team and I knew they felt they had something to prove after a bad second half against Louisville the other night," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "They played hard, we played hard and they had some kids make some plays down the stretch."

Added Chattanooga coach Wes Moore: "It was a good win. ... I told them that this was a game we could take if we took care of the little things."

MTSU made just 6-of-29 3-pointers, while Chattanooga hit 5-of-14. The Lady Raiders shot just two free throws — both coming after Moore was hit with a technical foul in the first half. The Lady Mocs cashed in on 16-of-20 attempts at the free throw line.

"I don't know if I've ever played a game — from junior pro, to middle school, to coaching high school, to coaching here — that we shot two free throws," Insell said. "... Wes gave us those and we appreciate it.

"That's not the difference in the game, but I've never seen that. They had a good game plan and they made the tough plays."

MTSU was outrebounded 38-31 — another statistic Holt pointed to as a difference in the outcome.

"We just need our five to step up and rebound," she said. "Basically, we need to rebound better. Hopefully the next game we'll come ready."

Added Orr: "We've got to box out better and we've got to help Amber rebound."

Holt led the Lady Raiders with 19 points and seven boards, while Orr scored 11. Freshman Anne Marie Lanning netted 10 points, all in the first half.
