HOLT STAYS NO. 1 IN SCORING: Senior Amber Holt leads the nation in scoring for the eighth consecutive week through games of March 6, averaging 27.1 points per game this season. Sade Logan of Robert Morris ranks second with 25.0 points per contest. Holt has posted 11 30-point games

in 2007-08, a Blue Raider single-season record. She has seven double-doubles this year and ranks 96th nationally in rebounds (8.2), 53rd in steals per game (2.57), 56th in field goal percentage (.520) and 70th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.60). Of the 13 games this season with 40-point scorers, Holt is the only player with a pair of 40-point showings. The Duluth, Ga., native scored 41 points in an upset of No. 8 LSU in December and broke a 21-year-old school record for points in a game with 44 at Louisiana-Monroe in January. Holt leads the Sun Belt in scoring and ranks second in FG percentage and assist-to-turnover ratio, first in steals and offensive rebounds, third in rebounding, fourth in FT percentage, and seventh in assists. Seven of her 30-point efforts have come versus SBC competition. She has won an unprecedented five Sun Belt Player of the Week awards and is a member of all three National Player of the Year award watch lists – the Wade Trophy, the Naismith Award and the

Wooden Award. She also does it on the de-

fensive end, drawing 54 charges in 2007-08, almost twice the number

the rest of the team has combined.

day's quarterfinal victory over Troy. The Blue Raiders are aiming for their fifth straight SBC Tournament title and have not lost in the SBC Tournament since falling in the finals of the 2003 tourney to Western Kentucky in Bowling Green, Ky. Middle Tennessee upped its record all-time to 18-3 in the SBC Tournament, including 16 victories in the last 17 games. Middle Tennessee won three games for the title in 2004 in Bowling Green, became the only team in league history to claim four wins in taking the 2005 championship in Denton, Texas, and won three games in 2006 for the title in Murfreesboro. Last year the Blue Raiders won three contests again, including the championship game over Louisiana-Lafayette. The Blue Raiders are now 40-16 all-time in conference tournaments with 10 tourney titles. The average margin of victory in the 14 contests has been 18.0 points (252 total), including 21.0 in the three victories in 2006 and 21.0 in last year's three contests.

half. It was her fourth double-figure scoring game this season and the second in the last three contests. She has averaged 13.7 points per game over the last three outings. Barclay added five assists, tying a career-high, and it was her second five assist game of the year (at South Alabama, Dec. 22, 2007). Barclay added a miraculous chapter to her career at Florida Atlantic on February 23, scoring a career-high 22 points in the overtime victory, including 11 in the final three minutes of regulation. Barclay had an old-fashioned 3-point play with 3:10 to play in the game, then hit a 15-footer 13 seconds later. Her 3-pointer with a minute to play tied the game at 73 before her final heroics, another trifecta, this one from the wing, with 2.9 seconds left that pushed the game into overtime. She added another bucket in the extra period. For the game Barclay was 7-for-9 from the field and 2-of-3 from 3-point range. She was also 6-for-8 at the foul line and tied her career-high with four rebounds. The Harvest, Ala., native also set career-highs for FG made and FT attempts and tied career-bests for FG attempts and FT made. It was just the third double-figure scoring game of the season for Barclay and the first since the first two contests of the year, at Old Dominion and versus Tennessee Tech. For the season Barclay is averaging 5.3 points per game and has five contests of seven points of more in the last nine games.

rebounds in the victory over Troy, her 11th 30-point game of the season, adding to Holt's single-season record for 30-point outings. It was also her 18th contest this season with eight or more rebounds. Holt was 14-for-24 from the field, her 15th game with double-digit field goals made this year, and was also 5-of-6 at the foul line. The Duluth, Ga., native set a pair of singleseason records and tied another along the way as well. Holt passed Chrissy Givens for field goals and field goal attempts and heads into Monday's semifinal contest against UALR with 312 career field goals and 600 FG attempts. She added to her single-season total for free throws and now has 171, while tying Robin Hendrix (1981) for tops on the free throw attempts list with 220. Holt already owns the single-season

scoring record and heads into Monday's game with 813 points this season. She moved up four spots to ninth on the single-season rebounding list (247).

#### BROWN, QUEEN BOTH HIT THE BOARDS:

Sophomore Brandi Brown and freshman Emily Queen were both big parts of the victory over Troy with their rebounding efforts. Brown tied a career-high with six rebounds, all in the first half, the second time this season she grabbed six boards in a contest (LSU was the other). Queen had nine rebounds in the contest, her eighth game this season with eight or more boards. It was the most boards she has posted since collecting 10 versus North Texas on January 26, a span of nine contests. The duo also combined for 17 points and along with Holt's 33, gave the Middle Tennessee frontline a combined 50 points in the triumph.

RAIDERS POST 20TH VICTORY: Middle Tennessee posted its 20th victory of the season, giving head coach Rick Insell a 70-25 record in his three seasons at the helm of the program. The win gives the Blue Raiders 20 victories for the fifth straight season. Before the 2003-04 campaign, Middle Tennessee had never had more than two straight seasons of 20 wins. It is also the 16th time in 32 seasons of basketball at Middle Tennessee that the Blue Raiders posted at least 20 victories.

HOLT VOTED FIRST TEAM ALL-SBC, DE-FENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR: Senior Amber Holt was voted First Team All-Sun Belt and SBC Defensive Player of the Year, as announced by the conference office this week. Holt is the nation's leading scorer for the eighth straight week and ranks nationally in five categories, including rebounding, field goal percentage, steals and assist-to-turnover ratio. She scored a then career-high 41 points in Middle Tennessee's upset of eighth-ranked LSU in December and broke a 21-year-old school record in January, netting 44 points at Louisiana-Monroe. The Duluth, Ga., native is the only player in the nation with a pair of 40-point games this season and also the only player in the country to lead her team in points, rebounds, assists and steals in 2007-08. She has 11 games with 30-plus points and seven double-doubles as well as ranking in the Top 5 in the Sun Belt in points, rebounds, steals, offensive rebounds, FG percentage, FT percentage and assist-toturnover ratio. Seven of her 30-point efforts have come versus SBC competition. Holt has won an unprecedented five Sun Belt Player of the Week awards and is a member of all three National Player of the Year award watch lists the Wade Trophy, the Naismith Award and the Wooden Award. The Meadowcreek High School product was also a First Team All-SBC selection in 2006-07 and is one of five players to garner First Team accolades since the Blue Raiders joined the league eight seasons ago. Middle Tennessee has earned 11 First Team All-SBC selections during the eight seasons. Holt was voted Defensive Player of the Year, as well, the sixth straight season a Blue Raider has won the award. She averages 2.57 steals per game and has also drawn 54 charges in 30 contests this season, almost twice the number the rest of the team has combined.

MORE ON HOLT: Senior Amber Holt's 44 points at Louisiana-Monroe ties for the fourth most this season by any player in the country. Tennessee State's Kendra Appling scored 50 points against Jacksonville State on February 23, Traci Edwards of Wisconsin-Milwaukee netted 45 versus Loyola (IL) on Feb. 21 and Oklahoma State's Andrea Riley scored 45 versus Oklahoma on January 12. Lamar's Tamara Abalde netted 44 against Wiley on November 24. Holt is the only player in the nation with more than 40 points in two games in 2007-08. She has netted 30-plus points 11 times this year, passing Tawanya Mucker for the most 30-point games in a single season. She outscored Troy's team, 22-18, in the first half on Jan. 17, tying for the most points scored in a half this season and besting her previous high for points in the first half (19 versus LSU and at Western Kentucky). The senior has made double-figure field goals in a game 15 times this season and hit the doublefigure mark for free throws made in six contests. One other note - the Meadowcreek HS product has also posted 18 contests with eight or more

rebounds, has recorded seven double-doubles this season and has 13 games with four or more assists.

HOLT LEADS BLUE RAIDERS ACROSS THE **BOARD:** Middle Tennessee senior Amber Holt leads the Blue Raiders in scoring, rebounding, assists and steals heading into Monday's semifinal contest versus UALR in the Sun Belt Championships, and is the only player in the nation currently leading her team in all four categories. Holt is averaging 27.1 points, 8.2 rebounds, 3.30 assists and 2.57 steals per game for Middle Tennessee. The Duluth, Ga., leads the nation in scoring for the eighth straight week, but she has done much more than score for the Blue Raiders this season, as evidenced by her statistics. She has seven double-doubles in 30 games and 18 contests with at least eight boards despite playing against much-taller opponents in almost every outing. She also has 13 contests with at least four assists, including six at Old Dominion, seven at Maryland and five at Tennessee. Holt has scored at least 27 points in 18 contests this season as well, including 41 against No. 8 LSU on December 28 and a school-record 44 points at Louisiana-Monroe on January 24.

DOUBLE DOSE FOR HOLT: Senior Amber Holt posted double-doubles in consecutive games at the end of February, her sixth and seventh double-doubles of the season and the ninth and 10th of her career. She scored 34 points and tied her career-high with 15 rebounds at Florida Atlantic on February 23. Holt set career-highs by going 16-for-22 at the foul line. She had seven offensive rebounds in her totals and was the only player on either team to play all 45 minutes in the overtime contest. The Duluth, Ga., native

scored 30 points with 11 boards at Denver on Feb. 21, hitting 12-of-20 from the floor and 8-for-9 at the foul line.

RAIDERS WIN BATTLE OF THE BOARDS: Middle Tennessee won the battle of the boards at Florida Atlantic on February 23, 43-41, including 18 on the offensive glass for the Blue Raiders. It was a team season-high for rebounds and all eight players on the roster had at least one rebound, including Amber Holt's 15 boards, which tied her career-high. It was also the most rebounds by the club since grabbing 44 versus Denver in the semifinals of the Sun Belt Championships in 2007. The Blue Raiders are 8-1 this season when outrebounding an opponent and have won the battle of the boards against some of the nation's best competition, including at Maryland (40-34) and Houston (37-32) and versus the Sun Belt's best rebounding team, North Texas (39-33).

LANNING LEADS FROM THREE: Freshman Anne Marie Lanning continues to find ways to score for the Blue Raiders, especially from 3point range, though she has struggled over the last two contests. Lanning leads the Sun Belt in 3-point shooting at 43 percent (46-for-108) and is tied for 11th in the SBC in 3-pointers per game (1.53). She has missed all five 3-point attempts in her last two outings and is just 1-for-7 overall in those two contests. Lanning's best play this season has come in Sun Belt action, with the freshman posting 10 of her 13 doublefigure scoring efforts versus the SBC. She has averaged 9.3 points per game in SBC contests. The Murfreesboro, Tenn., native has 13 outings this season with at least two 3-pointers and six contests with three or more trifectas. Lanning is averaging 8.2 points per game overall this sea-

HOLT BREAKS SINGLE-SEASON SCORING RECORD: Senior Amber Holt scored 23 points versus Troy on March 1, breaking the single-season scoring record in the process and adding to her list of accolades this season. Holt broke the record of 768 points set last season by Chrissy Givens. Three of the top four single-season scoring marks at Middle Tennessee have been set in the last three seasons. Holt's 567 points in 2006-07 ranks 11th on the single-season charts. Holt has 813 points this year heading into Monday's semifinal contest versus UALR in the Sun Belt Championships and needs only 40 points to reach the Top 20 nationally for points in a season.

11 at Florida International. She has 12 contests this season with seven or more rebounds, including nine versus the SBC. Queen grabbed nine rebounds in the quarterfinal victory over Troy in the SBC Championships, her most rebounds since collecting 10 versus North Texas on January 26, a span of nine contests. The Ashland, Ky., native is averaging 5.4 points and 5.8 rebounds per game overall this season and 6.4 points and 6.7 boards in SBC play. She is 17th in the Sun Belt in rebounding heading into Monday's semifinal contest versus UALR in the Sun Belt Championships and also ranks 12th in the SBC in offensive rebounds, averaging 2.40 per outing.

LYMON TAKES ON LEADERSHIP ROLE: Sophomore Chelsia Lymon moved into a leadership role and also took over a scoring responsibility in mid-January with her insertion into the starting lineup. Lymon has really come into her

own during Sun Belt action, starting the last 14 games and helping the Blue Raiders post a 11-3 mark during that stretch. She has averaged 10.9 points per game in SBC action, with 11 of her 14 double-figure games this season versus the SBC. She has averaged 11.9 points during her 14 games as a starter and has 15 contests this season with at least two 3-pointers, including seven with three or more trifectas. Lymon scored 11 points with three assists and three steals in the quarterfinal victory over Troy in the Sun Belt Championships. Some of her best games have come against top competition, including 14 points at Maryland and a combined 30 points in two contests versus Western Kentucky as well as 24 points against North Texas. For the season the Georgetown, Ky., native is averaging 9.2 points per game along with 2.00 assists and 2.10 steals. She ranks third in the Sun Belt in steals, seventh in 3-point FG percentage (.343) and 10th in 3-pointers per game (1.57).

TURNOVERS STAY DOWN: Middle Tennessee committed a season-low six turnovers in the victory over Western Kentucky on February 17, the fourth time this season the squad has posted single digit turnovers. The Blue Raiders have committed more than 14 turnovers just once in the last 12 games, registering 140 turnovers (11.7 per game) during the 12-game stretch. Middle Tennessee committed only eight turnovers versus UALR on Feb. 6 and nine against South Alabama on Feb. 14. The only hiccup during the last 12 games came at Florida Atlantic on Feb. 23 when the club committed a season-high 22 miscues. It was only the second 20-turnover game of the season and the first since the season-opener at Old Dominion. Middle Tennessee is averaging just 13.6 turnovers per game for the season, ranking 11th nationally. The Blue Raiders started the year averaging 19.7 turnovers per game over the first three contests, but the club cut down on that number dramatically over the next 13 games (November 25-January 10), committing just 13.2 miscues (172 total) per outing. Middle Tennessee posted nine contests of 15 or less during the stretch. The Blue Raiders averaged only 14.6 turnovers per game last season, ranking 26th nationally among 323 teams.

#### RAIDERS KNOCKING DOWN TRIFECTAS:

Middle Tennessee uses the 3-pointer as much as any team in the nation as part of its basic offense and the Blue Raiders posted a great level of consistency over a recent eight-game stretch. The squad hit 73-for-223 (.327) from 3-point range over eight outings from January 26-February 23, making at least eight trifectas in every

contest. The club hit 10 3-pointers versus North Texas on Jan. 26 and 14 at Louisiana-Lafayette on Jan. 30, the seventh and eighth double-digit efforts this season by the Blue Raiders. The Blue Raiders set season-highs for makes and attempts at UL, hitting 14-of-43 from behind the arc. The squad is making 32 percent from behind the arc this season, ranking 4th nationally in 3-pointers made per game (8.00). Middle Tennessee has hit double-figure trifectas 23 times during Insell's tenure. The club averages 25.0 3-point attempts per contest. The team hit a low Jan. 10 versus Florida Atlantic, making only 3for-20 (.150), the second worst percentage of the season behind the 2-for-18 effort against Western Carolina on December 2. Middle Tennessee broke out of its 3-point shooting slump in the victory at Troy on Jan. 17, hitting 12-of-21 (.571), a season-best percentage. The Blue Raiders hit 37 percent from behind the arc in 2005-06 and 35 percent last season. Freshman Anne Marie Lanning leads the club from behind the arc, shooting 43 percent (46-for-108) from 3-point range. Sophomore Brandi Brown, who returned to the lineup at UL after missing eight contests, is hitting 33 percent (34-for-104) of her 3-point attempts this season, while sophomore Chelsia Lymon is making 34 percent (47-for-137) from behind the arc in 2007-08.

#### COMEBACKS BECOMING MORE OF THE

NORM: After winning just one time when trailing at the half in the first 24 games of the season, Middle Tennessee achieved the feat twice in a four-game stretch in February. Middle Tennessee overcame a halftime deficit to post a victory in the 66-46 triumph over South Alabama on Feb. 14 and then did it again at Florida Atlantic on Feb. 23. The only other time the Blue Raiders trailed at the half and won this year came January 10, also against FAU. The Blue Raiders trailed in that game by seven at halftime before posting a 79-63 triumph. Against USA the Blue Raiders were down five at the break before coming back for the team's 15th victory of the season. In the second FAU contest, the squad was down three at halftime and by eight points

with three minutes to play before triumphing in overtime. Middle Tennessee has won six times under head coach Rick Insell when trailing at halftime.

SHOOTING WOES HINDER RAIDERS: Middle Tennessee's struggles from the field hit rock bottom not once but two games in a row in early February, with the Blue Raiders making just 29 percent from the field in a pair of losses. Middle Tennessee made just 18-of-63 field goals (.286) against UALR on Feb. 6, a season-low percentage from the field. It was the worst shooting percentage under head coach Rick Insell and the worst percentage since the Blue Raiders made 18-of-64 (.280) versus Georgia on December 30, 2002. The 18 field goals was a season-low and the 53 points tied for the least scored in a contest during Insell's tenure. The Blue Raiders netted just 53 in a five-point loss at UALR on January 14, 2006. In the following game at Florida International on Feb. 9, the club hit only 18-for-62, shooting exactly 29 percent from the floor. In contests versus UALR and FIU along with a January 30 victory at Louisiana-Lafayette, the Blue Raiders made just 65-of-203 (.320) from the field. But the squad has picked up the slack in the last six games, making 162of-378 (.429) in victories over South Alabama, Western Kentucky, Denver, Florida Atlantic, and twice versus Troy.

#### HOLT MORE EXPLOSIVE AFTER HALFTIME:

Amber Holt averages 27.1 points per game this season, but the senior has been much more productive after halftime, scoring in double figures in the second half in all but three games and scoring more points in the second half than in the first in 19 of the 30 contests. The Duluth, Ga., native has netted 437 of her 813 points (14.6 per game) this season after intermission. Holt scored 20 of her team-high 28 at No. 1 Tennessee after the break and posted 22 of her career-high 41 after intermission versus No. 8 LSU. She added 18 of her then career-high 33 at Austin Peay in the second half as well. Holt had 19 of her game-high 27 points after intermission at Arizona on November 25, including the first six points of the second half and seven of the team's final 11 points of the contest. She posted 20 of her 31 points at Arkansas State after the break, including 12 of the team's final

BLUE RAIDERS IN MARCH: Middle Tennessee owns a 54-36 (.600) all-time record in the month of March, including 22-10 (.688) in this decade. The Blue Raiders are 8-2 in March under head coach Rick Insell, with both losses in the NCAA Tournament. The club has won 18 of the last 22 games during the month of March, registering four consecutive Sun Belt Tournament titles as well as three NCAA Tournament victories during that stretch.

#### RAIDERS LEADERS ARE TRIPLE THREATS:

Amber Holt not only leads Middle Tennessee with 27.1 points per game, but the senior also ranks first on the club with 8.2 rebounds and 3.30 assists per game, continuing an eight-year trend where the club's leading scorer also ranks near the top in both rebounds and assists. Chrissy Givens led the Blue Raiders in scoring and assists the last two seasons and also ranked first in rebounds in 2005-06 before tying for second in boards last year. Patrice Holmes was first in scoring and assists her final three years as a Blue Raider and ranked first in rebounding twice and fourth once. Jamie Thomatis was also first in scoring and rebounding as a junior and senior and ranked second and third in assists during those seasons as well.

#### RAIDERS RANK 27th THIS WEEK IN ATTEN-

DANCE: The first unofficial national attendance rankings of the year were released December 3, with Middle Tennessee ranking 23rd despite playing just two home games to that point. In the newest unofficial attendance figures released March 3, the Blue Raiders rank 27th in the nation, averaging 4,303 fans in 12 home contests, ahead of traditional basketball hotbeds, Stanford, Ohio State and Old Dominion and just behind Kansas State. Middle Tennessee drew the second largest crowd in school history on December 28 versus LSU, with 7,858 fans coming through the turnstiles to watch the Blue Raiders upset the eighth-ranked Lady Tigers. The club

had the third-largest crowd in school-history on February 17, as 6,968 came for "Think Pink" Day. Middle Tennessee ranked 26th nationally in attendance last season, averaging 4,157 fans per game.

#### **Season Notes**

HOLT EARNS RECORD FIFTH POW AWARD: Amber Holt was voted the Sun Belt Player of the Week on February 18 for the fifth time this season after helping the Blue Raiders to victories over South Alabama and Western Kentucky. Holt averaged 27.5 points, 8.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.5 steals per game in the two victories. The senior netted 27 points on 10of-20 shooting versus USA, hitting 7-of-8 free throws as well as posting eight boards, three assists and three steals in the 66-46 victory. Against WKU she collected 28 points and eight rebounds, going 12-of-23 from the field, along with three assists and four steals. She was 3for-4 at the foul line and hit a 10-footer with 26 seconds remaining to give the Blue Raiders a four-point lead. She then knocked down a 1and-1 with 14 seconds left to seal the victory.

HOLT GARNERS PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS: Senior Amber Holt earned four other Player of the Week honors this season, including November 20, December 18, January 7 and January 28.

Holt averaged 24.5 points and 10.0 rebounds per game in victories over Tennessee Tech and at Houston to earn POW honors on November 20. She set then career-highs with 30 points and 15 rebounds at Houston, including scoring nine straight points in the second half after the Cougars tied the game. Against Tennessee Tech, Holt scored 19 points with five rebounds.

The Duluth, Ga., native averaged 30.5 points and 9.0 rebounds in contests against topranked Tennessee and at Austin Peay, earning POW accolades on December 18. Against UT, Holt netted 28 points, hitting 8-of-16 from the floor and 10-of-11 at the foul line. She scored 20 of her 28 points in the second half. At Austin Peay, the senior scored a then career-high 33 points, making 12-of-16 shots and 8-of-11 free throws. She grabbed 14 rebounds with five assists and three steals.

She averaged 29.7 points, 7.7 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 3.0 steals in six games over the holidays, garnering the honor on January 7. She posted a double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds as well as five assists and five steals versus Florida International and netted 27 points, eight boards and four assists at South Alabama. Holt scored a then career-high 41 points in the 67-56 upset of No. 8 LSU on

Dec. 28. She grabbed nine rebounds and made four steals against the Lady Tigers, as well, and followed that with 32 points and nine boards at Louisville. She scored 36 points at Western Kentucky and netted 24 points in just 27 minutes of action versus Denver.

Holt averaged 32.0 points, 8.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 3.5 steals per game to win the award on January 28. She broke a 21-year-old school record Jan. 24 at Louisiana-Monroe, scoring 44 points on 17-of-25 shooting and 10-for-13 at the foul line. Holt scored 22 points in both halves, including the first 11 of the game, the final nine of the first half and 16-of-18 during one stretch of the second half. In a victory over North Texas, Holt scored 20 points with nine rebounds, five assists and four steals.

HOLT BREAKS SINGLE-GAME SCORING RECORD: Senior Amber Holt broke a 21-yearold mark January 24 at Louisiana-Monroe, scoring a school-record 44 points against the Warhawks, hitting 17-of-25 field goals and 10-of-13 at the foul line. She passed the previous record of 42 points set by Kim Webb on February 21, 1987. Holt scored 22 points in both halves, tying her career-high for points in a half. She passed her previous career-high of 41 points set December 28 of this season versus LSU. It was just the fifth 40-point game in school history. Before this season no player had scored more than 40 points since Tawanya Mucker on December 2, 1988, and Holt has now achieved the feat twice. Her 17 field goals tied a career-high and tied for the fourth most field goals in a single game in school history.

HOLT SETS ANOTHER RECORD: Senior Amber Holt set another school-record at Arkansas State on January 14, becoming the fastest player to reach 1,000 points in program history. She reached the feat in just 51 career games, besting the previous mark of 55 games held by Priscilla Robinson (1990-91, 1991-92). Holt became the 20th player in school history to reach the exclusive 1,000-point club and the fifth player in the last five seasons (Patrice Holmes in 2003-04, Tia Stovall in 2004-05, Chrissy Givens and Krystle Horton in 2005-06). Holt also tied for 42nd on the national list of fastest players to reach 1,000 points, ahead of players such as Katie Smith of Ohio State (52 games), Stanford's Candice Wiggins (54), Kansas State's Kendra Wecker and Nicole Ohlde (56) and LSU's Seimone Augustus (61).

HOLT ADDED TO WADE WATCH LIST: Senior Amber Holt has been added by the State Farm Wade Watch List, the national player of the year award sponsored by the Women's Bas-

ketball Coaches Association. Holt was added to the Watch List along with Idaho State's Natalie Doma and California's Ashley Walker, bringing the total number of players to 29. The renowned Wade Watch List for the State Farm Wade Trophy is comprised of student-athletes who are members of an NCAA Division I institution and are selected based on the following criteria: game and season statistics, leadership, character, effect on their team and overall playing ability. The Wade Trophy Coalition was established in June of 2000 when the WBCA partnered with The National Association of Girls and Women in Sport (NAGWS). For the past five years the two have worked together to present The State Farm Wade Trophy Player of the Year Award. A committee comprised of coaches, administration and media from across the United States selects the winner. HOLT VOTED TO WOODEN AWARD MID-SEASON TOP 20: Amber Holt was named to her third national player of the year award list after the senior appeared on the Wooden Award Midseason Top 20 on January 31. The Women's Wooden Award Committee made the announcement for the nation's most coveted college basketball award. Composed of the top 20 players who will compete for this season's player of the year award, the midseason list is based on individual player performance and team records during the first half of the season. Forty-seven players received votes for the midseason list, indicating the depth of this year's field. Six players have been selected to the Midseason Top 20 who were not on the Preseason Top 30 list. This impressive group includes returning players (Chante Black of Duke, Natalie Doma of Idaho State, Andrea Riley of Oklahoma State, Ashley Walker of California, and Holt, the nation's leading scorer) and one freshman, Maya Moore of Connecticut. Seven NCAA conferences are represented, including the Big East Conference topping the list with six players, followed by the ACC with four, the SEC with three, the Big 12, Sun Belt and Pac-10 each with two, and the Big Sky with one. In March, the Women's National Advisory Board will release the names of the players selected to the official voting ballot. The ballot consists of approximately 15 players who have proven to their universities that they are making progress toward graduation and are maintaining a cumulative 2.0 GPA. More than 300 voters, comprised of sports media members and women's college basketball experts from across the nation, will cast their votes for the fivemember All-America team and Wooden Award honor as the most outstanding female collegiate basketball player in the nation. The top five male and female finalists will be invited to Los Angeles for the awards ceremony and will receive a contribution from The Los Angeles Athletic Club for their university's general scholarship fund. SBC STREAK ENDS AT 26: Middle Tennessee's school-record 26-game winning streak overall against Sun Belt competition ended with the January 3 defeat at Western Kentucky. The Blue Raiders won all three games in the 2006 Sun Belt Championships and put together a perfect 18-0 regular season mark in 2006-07 before posting three straight triumphs in the 2007 SBC Championships. Before the WKU loss, Middle Tennessee's previous defeat came February 27, 2006, at Florida International. The Blue Raiders broke the previous Sun Belt high of 16 league wins last year set by Louisiana Tech in both 1999-00 and 2000-01. Middle Tennessee ended the 2006-07 season 21-0 against Sun Belt opponents after winning its fourth consecutive SBC Tournament. Only three other schools in the 31year history of the Sun Belt finished undefeated in conference play (Old Dominion, 6-0 in 198485, 1987-88; UAB, 6-0 in 1990-91; Louisiana Tech, 14-0 in 1993-94, 1995-96, 12-0 in 1998-99, 16-0 in 1999-00, 2000-01).

OH, TO BE HOME: Middle Tennessee played just 12 times at Murphy Center this season in 29 games, winning 10 of the 12 contests, including a 67-56 upset of No. 8 LSU on December 28. The Blue Raiders have played consecutive contests at Murphy Center just twice this season. Historically the Blue Raiders have played excellent within the confines of the Glass House, owning a 325-91 all-time record at Murphy Center, a winning percentage of .781. Middle Tennessee ended the 2005-06 season 15-1 at home in head coach Rick Insell's first season, with the lone loss to then 17th-ranked Georgia on November 30, 2005. The Blue Raiders had their 12-game home winning streak snapped in the 2006-07 seasonopener against top-ranked Maryland, losing 80-76, and then dropped a 72-61 decision three nights later to South Dakota State. But the squad rebounded, posting 13 straight victories and ending the year 13-2 at home. Middle Tennessee dropped a 77-71 decision to Western Carolina on December 2 this season at Murphy Center, ending a 14-game home winning streak. Insell's three-year mark on the home floor is 38-5 overall, including 27-1 versus Sun Belt competition.

HOLT DOMINANT IN DECEMBER: Senior Amber Holt was on quite a roll during the month of December, posting three double-doubles in eight games. She recorded 18 points and 11 rebounds against Florida International on Dec. 19 in the Sun Belt opener, adding five assists and five steals versus the Golden Panthers as well, the seventh double-double of her career. The Duluth, Ga., native also had a double-double at Austin Peay on December 15, registering a then careerhigh 33 points along with 14 rebounds. Holt had one of her best all-around games of her career at Maryland on December 5, scoring 16 points with 10 rebounds and a career-high seven assists in 39 minutes of action. The Meadowcreek HS product posted a double-double November 19 at Houston when she had then career-highs of 30 points and 15 rebounds. Holt has just missed a double-double on five other occasions in 2007-08, grabbing nine rebounds at Arizona, versus No. 8/8 LSU, at Louisville, Florida Atlantic and North Texas

HOLT'S SCORING TOPS AFTER 15 GAMES: Senior Amber Holt tallied 392 points this season through 15 games, leading the nation in scoring. Her point total is the most ever by a Blue Raider player after 15 contests. Holt's 41 points against LSU is also tied for the fifth most this season by any player in the country. At her current pace, Holt would pass the school single-season record

for points (758) in the last regular season game of the year. Her current pace would give her 777 points

UPSET RANKS AMONG BEST IN SCHOOL HISTORY: Middle Tennessee's victory over eighth-ranked LSU ranks among the best in school history. The win for Middle Tennessee marks the second year in a row the Blue Raiders have knocked off a team ranked in the Top 10 after beating eighth-ranked Georgia last season in Athens. It is also just the second victory over a Top 10-ranked program at home in school history and only the third win over a Top 10 program ever for Middle Tennessee.

HOLT NETS 41 IN UPSET OF LSU: Amber Holt's senior season has been spectacular to say the least, with the Duluth, Ga., native leading the Blue Raiders and ranking first nationally in scoring. Holt put on a show in the 67-56 victory over eighth-ranked LSU on Dec. 28, scoring a then career-high 41 points, just one shy of the school record held by Kim Webb. She hit 15of-26 shots from the floor and 11-for-12 at the foul line, scoring 19 in the first half and 22 after the break. The 41 points tied Tawanya Mucker for the second most in school history and is also the third best total this season by any player in the nation. Holt set career-highs for FG made (15) and FT made (11) and tied her career-high for free throw attempts (12). The 15 field goals tied for seventh most in a single game in school history. Holt became the first player to score 40 for Middle Tennessee since Mucker's 41 against Mississippi College on Dec. 2, 1988.

SQUAD VERY YOUNG IN 2007-08: Middle Tennessee will play the 2007-08 season with just 11 players available for head coach Rick Insell's relentless style of full court basketball, and only three of those players have played more than one season at Middle Tennessee - seniors Starr Orr and Latoya Barclay and junior Johnna Abney. Senior Amber Holt has been in Murfreesboro one year after transferring from Southeastern Illinois College. The rest of the squad is made up of three sophomores (Jackie Pickel, Chelsia Lymon and Brandi Brown), one redshirt freshman (Angelique Burtts) and three true freshmen (Emily Queen. Morgan Boyd and Anne Marie Lanning). A good example of the program's youth came November 25 at Arizona. The Blue Raiders played at the McKale Center against Utah in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in 2005-06, but only three players remain on the squad who played in that contest – Orr, Barclay and Abney.

#### **Preseason Notes**

HOLT VOTED FIRST TEAM, BLUE RAIDERS PICKED SECOND IN SBC: Middle Tennessee senior Amber Holt was voted First Team All-Sun Belt and the Blue Raiders were picked second in the East in a poll of league coaches released during the Sun Belt Media Days in Mobile, Ala. Holt was a First Team All-SBC selection last season after averaging 16.7 points, 6.3 rebounds and 2.7 steals per contest. She is one of three starters returning for the Blue Raiders from last year's record-setting 30-4 club.

She had her best games in 2006-07 against some of the nation's top teams, including 28 points and eight rebounds against top-ranked Maryland, 26 points and 10 boards versus Chattanooga and 21 points, including 15 in the second half, in Middle Tennessee's victory at eighth-ranked Georgia. Holt also scored 27 points against Old Dominion, tallied 15 points and 11 rebounds in the semifinals of the Sun Belt Championships versus Denver and posted 23 points against Gonzaga in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The Duluth, Ga., native made it to the final cut this past summer for USA Basketball's Pan American Games Team.

Middle Tennessee received four first-place votes in the East Division and had 69 total points. The coaches picked Western Kentucky first in the division, with the Lady 'Toppers receiving nine first-place votes and 74 total points. Florida International was selected third in the East, with Troy and South Alabama tied for fourth and Florida Atlantic sixth.

BLUE RAIDERS 27TH IN FIRST ESPN/USA TO-DAY POLL: Middle Tennessee was ranked 27th in the Preseason ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll released October 31 and missed the Top 25 by just seven points. Defending national champion Tennessee was ranked No. 1 and garnered 26 of the 31 first-place votes in the poll, while Connecticut received four first-place votes and LSU, who Middle Tennessee plays on December 28 in Murfreesboro, garnered the remaining top vote. The Blue Raiders posted 71 points in the poll, while 25th-ranked N.C. State had 78 points. DePaul received 75 points and was ranked 26th. Middle Tennessee received 15 votes in the second ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll released November 13, ranking 33rd nationally.

The Blue Raiders were ranked in the ESPN/ USA Today Coaches Poll last season for the first time since 1988 and appeared in the final 12 rankings of the season, reaching as high as No. 16 and ending the year rated 23rd nationally. Middle Tennessee's 30-4 mark in 2006-07

was the best ever in the history of the program and one of the best in Sun Belt history, as the Blue Raiders rolled through league play and the conference tournament with a 21-0 mark against SBC competition.

BLUE RAIDERS 22ND IN LINDY'S: Middle Tennessee was ranked 22nd in a preseason poll released in *Lindy's* College Basketball Magazine. The Blue Raiders ended last season ranked 17th by the Associated Press and 23rd in the ESPN/*USA Today* Coaches Poll. Middle Tennessee returns three starters and seven letterwinners from last year's 30-4 club, including senior Amber Holt, who averaged 16.7 points and 6.3 rebounds per game. She also posted 2.7 steals per contest and scored in doubles figures in 30 of the 34 games. The Blue Raiders play three other teams in *Lindy's* Top 5, including Tennessee (No. 1), Maryland (No. 4) and LSU (No. 5).

RAIDERS 28TH IN FIRST AP POLL: Middle Tennessee was ranked 28th in the first Associated Press poll released on November 3. The Blue Raiders appeared in the final 10 AP polls in 2006-07, reaching as high as No. 16 on March 5. Last season's ranking was the first-ever in school history in the Associated Press poll for Middle Tennessee. The Blue Raiders ended the year ranked 17th in the final AP poll of 2006-07. Middle Tennessee was tied for 33rd in the second AP poll this year, released November 13, with nine votes.

HOLT SECOND TEAM ALL-AMERICAN, TEAM RANKED 13TH BY SPORTING NEWS: Middle Tennessee was ranked 13th and senior Amber Holt was named Second Team All-American by the *Sporting News* in their Preseason College Basketball magazine. It was the second preseason ranking for the Blue Raiders after *Lindy's* rated the club 22nd nationally. Middle Tennessee ended the 2006-07 season ranked 17th by the Associated Press and 23rd in the ESPN/*USA Today* Coaches Poll. The Blue Raiders return three starters and seven letterwinners from last year's record-setting 30-4 club.

Holt garnered First Team All-Sun Belt honors last season after averaging 16.7 points, 6.3 rebounds and 2.7 steals per game. The Duluth, Ga., native netted 28 points and eight rebounds against top-ranked Maryland, scored 26 points with 10 rebounds versus Chattanooga and 21 points, including 15 in the second half, in a victory at eighth-ranked Georgia. Holt registered 20-plus points in three straight games in February, added 15 points and 11 rebounds versus Denver in the Sun Belt Championships and netted 20 points in the championship game against Louisiana-Lafayette. Holt scored 23 points versus Gonzaga in the opening contest of the NCAA Tournament.

# THIS SEASON VERSUS UALR

Lady Raiders fall Little-Rock defense clamps down on MTSU By MONTE HALE JR. hale@dnj.com

MURFREESBORO -- MTSU kept missing, Arkansas-Little Rock kept defending, and the Trojans made a major statement at Murphy Center Wednesday night.

UALR, the top defensive team in the Sun Belt Conference, looked the part in stifling the Lady Raiders, 66-53, before a crowd of 3,166.

Meanwhile, MTSU hardly looked like the top offensive team in the Sun Belt, as it made just 18-of-63 shots for a dismal 29 percent.

"We shot the ball 63 times and we didn't knock down shots," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "When you miss five gimmes — bunnies — in the first half, it kind of sets the tempo for the game.

"Give Little Rock credit. They came in here and executed and we didn't." MTSU had won 35 straight games at Murphy Center, with its last setback

coming in double overtime to Western Kentucky on Feb. 5, 2004. It was just the Lady Raiders' eighth home loss in Sun Belt play since it joined the conference in 2001 — a span of 61 games.

"It's really disappointing," said MTSU sophomore point guard Chelsia Lymon. "We did some things we shouldn't have done. If we had knocked down shots we would have won the game.

"We were on this winning streak, we were playing pretty well and we hit a road block, which was today."

MTSU fell to 14-9 overall and 9-3 in the Sun Belt Conference. while UALR, which leads the East Division,

improved to 16-6 and 8-3.

"We didn't come in with the right attitude — right across the board," Insell said. "You can't do that against a team like Little Rock. We were playing well. We didn't play well tonight.

"I'm going to start playing more people if we're going to drag around out there. We've got kids who want to play."

While MTSU struggled to get into an offensive rhythm, UALR was efficient in the half-court and in breaking the Lady Raiders' press. The Trojans had 10 turnovers in the first half, but only eight in the second. The 18 miscues were the second fewest for an MTSU opponent this season.

More impressive, UALR shot 64 percent (25-of-39) from the floor and placed three players in double figures — Anshel Cooper (20), Nikya Hughes (18) and Kim Sitzmann (14).

Holt, the nation's leading scorer at 26.8 points a game, led MTSU with 26 points. However, Lymon was the only other player in doubles figures as she netted 11.

"They were doubling down," Holt said, "but we just didn't knock down shots. If we knock down our shots, we would have won the game."

Both teams were efficient offensively to open the first half. MTSU hit three 3-pointers in the first five minutes, while UALR's Hughes scored her team's first nine points.

However, MTSU managed just one field goal — a Holt 3-pointer — in the final six minutes of the first half and trailed 27-26 at intermission. UALR hit a sizzling 62 percent (10-of-16), but 10 Trojan turnovers kept them from building a bigger cushion at halftime.

"We broke the press a lot better than we normally do," said UALR coach Joe Foley. "That cost them a little bit. It's a great tribute to Middle Tennessee to have a great win streak at home. It's a great tribute for our kids to come in and stay focused and not get rattled."

The Lady Raiders went almost four minutes without a field goal to open the second half before Holt scored on a layup with 16:17 left to pull MTSU with 35-31.

MTSU plays at Florida International Saturday at 4:15 p.m.

#### POSTGAME NOTES

HOME WINNING STREAK COMES TO AN END: Middle Tennessee's 35game home winning streak against conference opponents came to an end with the 66-53 loss to UALR. The Blue Raiders had not lost at home versus a Sun Belt foe under head coach Rick Insell, who was a perfect 24-0 at Murphy Center, and had not lost a home contest versus an SBC opponent since February 5, 2004. Overall the Blue Raiders have won 39 of the last 41 games versus the SBC at the Glass House.

HOLT MOVES UP SCORING LISTS: Senior Amber Holt scored 26 points in the game and moved up the career and single-season scoring lists with her efforts. Holt surpassed Holly Hoover (1,181 points, 1982-84) for 16th place and has 1,182 points heading into Saturday's contest at Florida International. Holt needs 52 points to pass Jonelda Buck (1,233 points, 1996-99) for 15th place and 55 points to move past Kay Willbanks (1,236 points, 1984-87) for 14th place on the all-time list. On the single-season charts, Holt passed Kim Webb (610, 1987) for sixth place and now has 615 points in 2007-08. She needs six points to surpass Tawanya Mucker (620, 1989) for sixth place and 25 points to move past Jamie Thomatis (639, 2001) for fourth place on the single-season charts. At her current pace Holt would break the single-season mark set last season by Chrissy Givens (768) in the final regular season game of the year.

RAIDERS STRUGGLE FROM THE FIELD: Middle Tennessee made just 18of-63 field goals in the contest, shooting a season-low 29 percent from the field in the loss to UALR. It was the worst shooting percentage under head coach Rick Insell and the worst percentage since the Blue Raiders made only 28 percent (18-of-64) versus Georgia on December 30, 2002.



# **Head Coach Rick Insell**



Rick Insell is in his third season as head coach at Middle Tennessee amid great expectations after a record-breaking season in 2006-07 that included a school-record 30 victories, a fourth straight trip to the NCAA Tourna-

ment and a No. 16 national ranking by the Associated Press and the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll.

Insell has helped elevate the program into the national spotlight, including last season's victory at then eighth-ranked Georgia in early December. The victory in Athens was the first in program history over a ranked team on the road and just the fifth victory over a ranked foe in the 32-year history of the Middle Tennessee program.

The Blue Raiders won 27 games in a row in 2006-07, the longest streak in the nation at one point, and did not lose for more than 100 days.

Middle Tennessee eclipsed the school record for victories in a season as well last year, posting a 30-4 overall record, besting the previous mark of 26 set by the 1982-83 squad. The 2006-07 squad also tied the record for consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, tying a mark set from 1983-86, and collected the program's fourth consecutive 20-win campaign, also a school record. The four straight conference tournament titles also ties a school record set from 1983-86.

Insell's two-year mark of 50-15 is the best back-to-back seasons in program history, bettering the mark of 48-17 posted during 2003-04 and 2004-05.

Fans have also taken notice of the team's entertaining playing style. Middle Tennessee led the nation in increased attendance percentage in 2005-06, drawing 2,699 fans per game, a 276 percent increase over the previous season. The Blue Raiders improved on that number in 2006-07 as well, setting a single-game record with 10,010 in the season opener against defending national champion Maryland and averaging 4,157 fans for 15 home games, an increase of 65 percent. Middle Tennessee's attendance ranked in the Top 30 nationally and the crowd for the Maryland game was one of the Top 50 for attendance in the nation in 2006-07.

Insell also developed one of the best players in school history over the last two seasons. Chrissy

- Insell was named to the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors as High School Representative in 2001.

Givens registered the second-most points in school history in 2005-06 and eclipsed the top mark in 2006-07, and ranked in the Top 10 nationally in scoring both seasons.

Insell, a Woodbury, Tenn., native, made a huge splash in his first year at the helm of the Middle Tennessee program, guiding the Blue Raiders to their third consecutive Sun Belt Tournament title and doing so in front of a record-setting home crowd in the finals of the Sun Belt Championships.

Insell directed one of the most thrilling comebacks in Sun Belt Tournament history, leading Middle Tennessee to an 84-73 win over Western Kentucky after being down by as many as 14 points

The 2005-06 campaign also saw another first in program history as three players - Givens, Tia Stovall and Krystle Horton - all joined the 1,000-point club. It marked the first time in school history three current players all were represented on

in the first half.

the prestigious list, and the Blue Raiders were one of only four teams in the 2006 NCAA Tournament to boast such an honor.

Middle Tennessee notched one of its biggest wins of the season when the Blue Raiders defeated traditional Big 10 power Penn State, 79-65, in the UAB Blaze Tournament in December.

With the first conference title and NCAA Tournament appearance under his belt, Insell's recruiting class was ranked 10th nationally and included current sophomores Jackie Pickel, Brandi Brown and Chelsia Lymon.

A 1977 graduate of Middle Tennessee, Insell built a high school girls basketball dynasty at nearby Shelbyville Central High School, just a 30-

minute drive from the Middle Tennessee campus. He guided the Golden Eaglettes to a record 10 TSSAA Class AAA state championships and two *USA Today* national championships (1989, 1991), as he compiled a sparkling 775-148 worksheet during his 28-year tenure.

Insell was named *USA Today* National High School Coach of the Year in 1989 and 1991 and he also was been named Converse National High School Coach of the Year on two occasions (1990, 1992). A name synonymous with high school girls basketball in Tennessee, Insell's teams hold the Tennessee state records for consecutive wins with 110, consecutive state titles with four (1989-1992), most state championships for a coach with 10 (1986, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1995, 2000, 2001, 2003 and 2004), and his 1990 Golden Eaglette squad was named the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame Team of the Year, the first high school team so honored.

For his accomplishments at Shelbyville, Insell was elected to the National High School Hall of Fame in February 2007 and was inducted with a class of 12 in July 2007. Insell is one of only six Tennesseeans, including just the fourth coach, elected to the National High School Hall of Fame.

Under Insell's guidance, Shelbyville Central

won 23 district championships, 16 regional championships and appeared in the Class AAA state championship game a remarkable 15 times, winning 10. He developed six Tennessee Class AAA Miss Basketball Award recipients, 15 high school All-Americans and 57 of his players received either athletic or academic scholarships to continue their careers at the collegiate level.

While Insell built a basketball dynasty at Shelbyville during his time there, he also made sure his players got the job done in the classroom, as evidenced by his teams receiving the TSSAA Distinguished Award for Academic Success from 1989-2000, an award based on team grade-point-average. The lowest cumulative GPA at Shelbyville from 1989-00 was 3.4 and the highest was 3.98. The academic emphasis has continued during his tenure at Middle Tennessee, as the Blue Raiders posted a cumulative 3.22 GPA in Fall 2006.

Additionally, Insell's Shelbyville team received a special invitation to the Oval Office by President George H. Bush for academic and athletic achievement and his teams also have been honored in the United States Senate and House of Representatives, the Tennessee State House and Senate and by two Tennessee Governors.

Insell had high praise for the head coaching position when he accepted the position at Middle Tennessee.

"Dreams do come true," Insell said after Director of Athletics Chris Massaro announced his hiring on May 18, 2005. "It's something you think about. I'm a coach and it's all I've ever done, from elementary to junior high to junior pro, AAU and high school. To be able to come on board at Middle Tennessee, a Division I school, that's a dream come true, not only for me, but for all of the high school coaches and junior high coaches across the country and it says if you stay in there long enough and dream big enough, one day it will eventually happen."

Insell said Middle Tennessee will be a pressing basketball team on defense and force the issue, and he added that the Blue Raiders would back down from no one on the recruiting trail.

"We are going after the best players in the state of Tennessee every year," Insell said. "If Tennessee or Vanderbilt is after them, then Middle Tennessee is going to be after them, too. We will recruit alongside of them. We are not going to be intimidated, nor will we back down because they are in the Southeastern Conference. We are Division I and they are Division I. We are going to use all of our contacts."

Insell is married to Debbie and the couple have three sons, Tom, Kyle and Matt.

# LAST TIME OUT FOR MIDDLE TENNESSEE

MTSU defeats Troy to begin quest for fifth straight title By MONTE HALE JR. hale@dnj.com

MOBILE, Ala. — Troy had visions of an upset, but MTSU never got rattled in its Sun Belt Conference Tournament quarterfinals matchup against Troy Saturday night.

Meanwhile, the Trojans fell apart during a critical six-minute stretch of the second half and were whipped 74-51 at the Mitchell Center.

Trailing by five points with 14:22 remaining, the Lady Raiders exploded on a 23-4 run, turning a back-and-forth game into a runaway.

Troy had just seven turnovers in the first half, but 13 in the second as MTSU's relentless defense finally wore the Trojans down.

Meanwhile, Amber Holt — the nation's leading scorer — poured in 22 of her game-high 33 points in the second half.

"Amber Holt is Amber Holt," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "I got on to her at halftime because she had three quick turnovers and that's not like her. Then she came back in the second half and showed everybody why she is one of the top players in the country."

During the pivotal run, Holt got plenty of help, as Latoya Barclay hit back-to-back jumpers to put MTSU (20-10) up 44-40, Jackie Pickel hit a long 3-

pointer and Chelsia Lymon scored five straight points.

"You'll see that all night when we need it, we had so many kids step up," Insell said. "It was all night long — Chelsia Lymon, Latoya Barclay, Emily Queen, Jackie Pickel and Brandi Brown. They just stepped up all night."

Lymon added 11 points and Barclay netted 10.

"We knew coming in that it was going to be a tough game," Lymon said. "They've got seniors like we do and they played hard. It was an exciting game. I know some people might have got nervous, but it was an exciting game."

UNA got back into the game when Middle Tennessee went six minutes with just one basket. The Lions put together a 14-5 run over an eight minute stretch to pull within 29-21, but the Blue Raiders scored the final four points of the half on free throws, two each from Lanning and Queen.

Holt scored eight points and grabbed 12 rebounds in the first half, while Lanning added seven points.

In the second half Lanning netted eight of her 18 points during the 21-3 run, while Holt and Latoya Barclay each added four. Lanning was a perfect 8-for-8 at the foul line in the contest, grabbed six rebounds, dished out four assists and made four steals.

Sophomore Jackie Pickel had seven rebounds for the Blue Raiders, sophomore Brandi Brown added nine points and five boards, and redshirt freshman Angelique Burtts netted nine points in her first career game

For 32 minutes, Middle Tennessee looked out-of-place and out-of-sync Saturday night against Old Dominion. But then the Blue Raiders dialed up the defense, forcing five straight turnovers and cutting the deficit to three points, but Old Dominion pulled away in the end en route to a 76-68 season-opening victory at the Ted Constant Convocation Center

Middle Tennessee (0-1) trailed by as many as 17 points in the second half and was down 68-55 with 6:11 remaining in the game. But the Blue Raiders scored 12 of the game's next 13 points, started by a 3-pointer from Brandi Brown and including a trio of trifectas from senior Latoya Barclay. The 12-1 spurt took just over three minutes, pulling the Blue Raiders with three points at 69-66.

After another ODU turnover, Middle Tennessee had the ball with a chance to tie, but Jackie Pickel missed a 3-pointer from the corner. Lady Monarch Shalida Williams drove to the basket on the other end, hitting Megan Pym for a driving layup and taking the momentum away from the Blue Raiders.

Pym had another layup on a putback the next time up the floor and Old Dominion made their free throws over the final minute, just as they had all night.

Barclay finished the game with a career-high 17 points, including 15 in the second half, in just the second start of her career. Brown was also a major factor for the Blue Raiders, netting 14 points with four rebounds in 35 minutes of action.

Everyone on the Blue Raiders had to step into a more prominent role after senior Amber Holt played just six minutes in the first half because of three fouls and then picked up her fourth foul less than four minutes into the second half. The Duluth, Ga., native did play the final 12:26 of the contest without fouling out, scoring 14 points with six rebounds in just 22 minutes of action.

Middle Tennessee trailed by seven at the half, but the Lady Monarchs scored the first six points after intermission before the Blue Raiders answered with a pair of 3-pointers, one from Holt and the other from Pickel, who scored nine points in the game on a trio of

But ODU expanded the lead to 17 points in the second half thanks to the charity stripe, the Lady Monarchs best friend for most of the game. ODU's Tiffany Green hit 6-of-7 in the second half and ODU was 11-of-15 after the break and 27-for-35 in the contest. Compare that to Middle Tennessee, who shot just three free throws after halftime and only 17 foul shots in the game.

Anne Marie Lanning grabbed six rebounds and Emily Queen came off the bench to contribute seven boards for the Blue Raiders, who were outrebounded only 44-41 despite a large difference in size at almost every position. T.J. Jordan led four double figure scorers for ODU with 19 points, while Williams had 15, Green added 12 and Jessica Canady scored 13 off the bench.

It didn't take long for MTSU to set the tempo for its home opener against Tennessee Tech Wednesday night at Murphy Center.

It didn't take long, either, for the Lady Raiders to race out to a 89-62 rout before a crowd of 2,614.

MTSU hit seven of its first 10 shots, which proved to a sign of things to come as the Lady Raiders drained 12 3-pointers and shot 51 percent from the field.

"Anytime you shoot the ball like we shot it, and we got some good looks and kept knocking them down, you're going to have a chance to have a good night," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "Overall, I was pleased with our intensity."

MTSU forced 33 Golden Eaglette turnovers, including 20 in the

Tennessee Tech continuously struggled to get the ball in the half-court against the Lady Raiders' pressure defense. The Golden Eaglettes managed just eight shots in the first 12 minutes and only 15 in the first half.

"We take a lot of pride in our press and we were able to contain the ball," said MTSU sophomore guard Chelsia Lymon, who had four of MTSU's 24 steals. "They're a good team with good shooters, and we did a good job rotating.

Seven different Lady Raiders hit 3-pointers and five players hit for double figures, led by senior forward Amber Holt's 19. Freshman Emily Queen hit three 3-pointers, while Lymon, Anne Marie Lanning and Jackie Pickel hit two apiece.

"Hopefully we won't ever start off shooting like we did against Old Dominion," Pickel said of the Lady Raiders' shooting woes in a 76-68 season-opening loss Saturday. "When one of us hits one, we do gravitate and feel the energy off each other."

MTSU led 58-24 at halftime and went ahead by as many as 44 points in the second half, when it outscored Tennessee Tech 16-6 in the first five minutes. However, the Lady Raiders scored just 15 points in the final 15 minutes.

"We changed our press in the second half," Insell said, "but we needed to work on some things that we'll have to do later. We gave up some easy baskets, but they were things we needed to work on.

"We've got a lot of work to do, but it was a good win tonight."

Lymon had 15 points, while Lanning had 12 and Latoya Barclay 11. Queen netted nine.

Tennessee Tech (1-1) was led by Cara Reed's 13 points, while freshman and former Smyrna standout Jasmine White netted 11. The Golden Eaglettes shot 64 percent (23-of-36) but were obviously plagued by the 33 floor mistakes.

Amber Holt recorded her fourth career double-double with career-highs of 30 points and 15 rebounds, including nine straight points in the second half when the game was tied, as Middle Tennessee held on for a 69-68 victory over Houston Monday night at Hofheinz Pavilion.

Houston's Tye Jackson and Twiggy McIntyre had potential game-winning shots in the final 10 seconds of the game. The Cougars scored the final 10 points of the game over two minutes.

The Blue Raiders put together a 20-9 run after Houston tied the contest at 49 with 12:53 remaining in the contest. At that point Holt took over, hitting four straight buckets plus a free throw and then hit Anne Marie Lanning for a layup on the next possession.

Lanning had two free throws of her own on the next trip down the floor to extend the lead to 60-49 for the Blue Raiders, but Houston had a mad rush at the end, highlighted by a pair of 3-pointers from Brittney Scott. Courtney Taylor also had two layups in the final minute after a Blue Raider turnover and a missed shot.

After another Middle Tennessee (2-1) miscue, Jackson brought the ball up the floor with nine seconds remaining, but her jumper in the lane was short and missed the rim completely. McIntyre grabbed the rebound and tried to come from underneath the basket for a shot, but it fell harmlessly on the floor as the buzzer sounded and Middle Tennessee escaped.

Lanning scored 11 points for the Blue Raiders, while Taylor came off the bench to lead the Cougars with 18 points. Jackson added 15 points, while Scott had 14 and McIntyre scored 11.

After missing its first four shots of the game, turning the ball over four times in the first four-plus minutes and failing to score, the Blue Raiders found the range from the field, hitting six of their next 11 shots, including four 3-pointers, for a 16-9 advantage at the 12minute media timeout.

Middle Tennessee raced out to a 14-point advantage after an Emily Queen putback with 8:15 remaining in the half, prompting a Cougars timeout. Houston cut the deficit in half at intermission thanks to three straight buckets from McIntyre, and the Blue Raiders headed to the locker room with a 41-34 advantage.

After missing their first three 3-pointers of the half, the Blue Raiders were 7-of-13 over the remaining 15 minutes. Holt scored 11 points and Chelsia Lymon had eight off the bench before the break.

UH scored 15 of the first 23 points after halftime, knotting the contest at 49 after a steal and layup from McIntyre, before Holt scored on four straight possessions to give the Blue Raiders the lead for good.

Latoya Barclay came off the bench and provided a big spark with seven points and three assists in Middle Tennessee's 70-60 victory over Arizona Sunday at McKale Center.

Holt netted 19 of her 27 in the second half and Barclay was all over the floor, including in the middle of a huge 7-0 run in the middle of the second half that opened the Middle Tennessee advantage from two points to nine. Barclay hit a 3-pointer in the corner before Holt had a bucket underneath. Barclay then got a deflection and a steal and dribbled in to take a mid-range jumper off the glass for a 53-44 lead with 7:43 remaining.

The Blue Raiders battled against the much bigger Wildcats and were outrebounded by just one, 28-27, but Middle Tennessee hit the offensive glass, getting 14 boards, including two from Brandi Brown to start the second half and big ones by Starr Orr and Barclay in the final minute to seal the victory.

Johnna Abney was the only other Blue Raider in double figures, hitting a trio of 3-pointers, including one from at least eight feet from behind the arc. It was a total team effort, as Brandi Brown added eight points, Orr had six and Anne Marie Lanning scored five.

The first half was a seesaw affair, with six ties and six lead changes, and a late flurry by the Blue Raiders gave the visitors a 32-30 edge at the break. Middle Tennessee had great opportunities in the opening 20 minutes but shot just 34 percent from the field, while Arizona made 69 percent from the floor.

But that number was deceiving, as the Wildcats also had 14 turnovers and the Blue Raiders were whistled for nine fouls in the half. UA either hit a bucket, was fouled or turned the ball over on almost every possession before intermission.

Middle Tennessee started hot, thanks to a driving layup from Chelsia Lymon, a 3-pointer by Brown and a turnaround jumper in the lane from Holt for an early 7-2 lead and a timeout by Arizona. The Wildcats made a living in the paint in the half, though, scoring 20 points near the bucket on a host of layups and backdoor cuts.

The Blue Raiders held UA scoreless over the final 3:03 of the half and took advantage, with Orr hitting a driving layup as the shot clock expired and Brown nailing another trifecta for the two-point halftime lead

In the second half Holt scored the first six points for the Blue Raiders, who never trailed after intermission. Arizona kept the came within a bucket until Middle Tennessee's 7-0 run led by Barclay that helped the Blue Raiders pull away.

It was Middle Tennessee's second road victory of the young season after posting 13 last season.

"We came out sluggish in the second half and it was like we didn't care," said senior forward Amber Holt. "I think we learned if you come out like that you're going to get your butt kicked big time."

The Lady Raiders (3-2) led 29-28 at halftime, but fell behind 32-31 early in the second half and never regained the lead.

"We didn't execute," said senior guard Starr Orr. "We had people pass up shots, we didn't rebound and we didn't execute."

MTSU trailed 45-41 with eight minutes left before Holt scored back-to-back baskets to tie the game with 6:04 left.

Chattanooga's Jenaya Wade-Fray hit a 3-pointer out of the corner with 2:11 remaining and MTSU never got closer than two

"They've got a very good basketball team and I knew they felt they had something to prove after a bad second half against Louisville the other night," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "They played hard, we played hard and they had some kids make some plays down the stretch "

Added Chattanooga coach Wes Moore: "It was a good win. . I told them that this was a game we could take if we took care of the

MTSU made just 6-of-29 3-pointers, while Chattanooga hit 5-of-14. The Lady Raiders shot just two free throws — both coming after Moore was hit with a technical foul in the first half. The Lady Mocs cashed in on 16-of-20 attempts at the free throw line.

"I don't know if I've ever played a game — from junior pro, to middle school, to coaching high school, to coaching here — that we shot two free throws," Insell said. "... Wes gave us those and we appreciate it.

"That's not the difference in the game, but I've never seen that. They had a good game plan and they made the tough plays.

MTSU was outrebounded 38-31 — another statistic Holt pointed to as a difference in the outcome.

"We just need our five to step up and rebound," she said. "Basically, we need to rebound better. Hopefully the next game we'll come

Added Orr: "We've got to box out better and we've got to help Amber rebound."

Holt led the Lady Raiders with 19 points and seven boards, while Orr scored 11. Freshman Anne Marie Lanning netted 10 points, all in the first half

The growing pains continued for MTSU's women's basketball team Sunday. Plagued by another poor shooting performance, a terrible rebounding performance and foul problems, the Lady Raiders fell, 77-71, to Western Carolina before a crowd of 3,806 at Murphy Center.

"I thought we had a chance in the second half to take the game by the neck," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "... But they did a good job of getting the ball to the people they wanted to. In Division I basketball you've got to make plays, and we didn't make enough

MTSU shot just 40 percent from the field and made only 2-of-18 from 3-point range. The Lady Raiders also were outrebounded, 53-27, and made just 15-of-24 at the free-throw line.

The game was tied 13 times and there were 12 lead changes, with the final one coming when Kristen Feemster gave the Lady Catamounts a 59-58 lead with 9:13 remaining.

MTSU trailed just 72-69 with 3:06 remaining after Amber Holt scored in the paint, but the Lady Raiders could get no closer.

"Our rebounding, we've got to box out better," said Holt, who had a game-high 28 points. "We didn't score off their turnovers and we didn't make our free throws. If we had rebounded, scored off their turnovers and made our free throws we would have won the game.

One positive was the play of freshman forward Angelique Burtts, who came off the bench to score 12 points and grab five rebounds in 11 minutes of play.

"Angeligue gave us good minutes," Insell said. "She's got to build on it now. She deserved it. She's been velled at a lot."

Burtts was inserted into the game due to the fact the Lady Raiders were in so much foul trouble in the second half.

"I didn't go into to score," Burtts said. "I went in to rebound and play defense. When I rebounded, I guess the scoring came. I've got to come back to practice hard and build on this. Sometimes I'm not into it, and I've got to work harder."

MTSU got several open looks from 3-point range, but the Lady Raiders were 2-for-11 in the first half and 0-for-7 in the second.

'We come to practice, but we don't bring it on the floor," Holt said. "I really don't know why."

Western Carolina opened the game with an impressive 15-6 run before MTSU took a 19-16 lead with a 13-1 spurt at the 9:07 mark of the first half.

MTSU led 29-25, its biggest cushion in the first half before Western Carolina came back to tie the game at 37 at intermission.

Holt and Burtts were the only two Lady Raiders in double figures. Western Carolina was led Lauren Powell with 17 points, while Monique Dawson had 14, including going 12-of-12 at the free-throw line. Six-foot-4 post Brooke Johnson had 12 points and a game-high

An 11-0 run with four minutes remaining in the game gave thirdranked Maryland the lead for good and the Terps held on to defeat Middle Tennessee, 74-69, Wednesday night at the Comcast Center.

Middle Tennessee senior Amber Holt had 16 points and 10 rebounds and sophomore Brandi Brown scored a season-high 22 points, hitting six 3-pointers in the contest. Sophomore Chelsia Lymon added 14 points off the bench, but a charging call on Lymon with 35.1 seconds left in the game and the Blue Raiders down just three was the final blow to the visitors.

The teams were nip-and-tuck almost the entire second half-The contest had seven ties and 16 lead changes and Middle Tennessee led 62-61 with 4:32 left in the contest before Tolliver took over. hitting a 3-pointer and then a 15-footer the next time down the floor. UMD's All-America point guard added four free throws, including two with 12.1 seconds remaining to ice the game for the Terrapins.

Tolliver's 3-pointer and jumper started the 11-0 run for the Terps, but Middle Tennessee came back with seven straight points. Brown hit the last of her trifectas, then Lymon made a steal and got a layup before Holt hit a tough fall away jumper in the lane with the shot clock running down to cut the deficit to three with 1:10 left.

The Blue Raiders got a stop on Maryland's next possession. Lymon went to the right and drove to the bucket, laying the ball up and looking like she drew a foul, but former Shelbyville High School star Ashleigh Newman was laying at the bottom of the pile, drawing a charge to help UMD survive for the second straight year against Middle Tennessee

The Blue Raiders used a 10-4 run to start the second half, tying the contest at 39, and took the lead at 45-44 after a bucket from Holt with 13:59 remaining. From that point there were two ties and eight lead changes as the teams headed down the stretch.

Tolliver led the Terps with 19 points, while Laura Harper had 16 and Crystal Langhorne added 14.

"We've been shooting the ball poorly, but we shot the ball better tonight," head coach Rick Insell said. "We're not as big as Maryland, but we match up pretty good with them because all of our kids can shoot the three and it kind of spreads [Maryland] out a little bit. My kids have the green light to shoot anytime." Insell said.

The Blue Raiders started the game quickly with 3-pointers from Johnna Abney and Brown, Langhorne and Harper scored the first 14 points for Maryland, but Middle Tennessee stayed with the Terps by hitting the offensive glass, grabbing 13 offensive rebounds, and also making seven 3-pointers in the opening 20 minutes.

Anne Marie Lanning's trifecta from the top of the key just before the break cut the UMD advantage to 35-29 at intermission. Holt was just 2-of-10 from the field but grabbed eight rebounds. Middle Tennessee actually outrebounded the much talker Terps, 23-20, in the

With six minutes remaining in the game, MTSU coach Rick Insell patted the heads of freshmen forwards Emily Queen and Angelique Burtts and sophomore forward Brandi Brown.

All three were on the bench — having fouled out.

Each, at times, was charged with trying to guard Tennessee All-American Candace Parker, who scored 34 points in leading the No. 1 Lady Vols to a 84-61 victory at Thompson-Bolling Arena.

Parker, a 6-foot-4 junior, also had 13 rebounds and made 17-of-21 at the free throw line.

MTSU senior forward Amber Holt nearly matched Parker's performance, scoring a team-high 28 points and making 10-of-11 at the free throw line. She also had five assists, four rebounds and two steals

"I had trust in my teammates," Holt said. "When I can get out and shoot the 3, they have to guard me. When they come out and guard me, I can drive to the basket. I guess the best thing is to keep the ball away from me."

Despite the 23-point final margin of victory, Tennessee found itself in a much closer game than most expected.

MTSU (3-5) trailed just 61-55 left with seven minutes remaining in the game before the Lady Vols (8-0) scored 18 unanswered points. Eight came at the free throw line.

Meanwhile, MTSU was playing with such a small lineup that even freshman guard Anne Marie Lanning (5-foot-10) was guarding Parker at times.

MTSU cut a nine-point halftime deficit to four, 41-37, with 17:51 left, but Tennessee used a 8-0 spurt to take a 49-37 advantage with 15:45 remaining. The Lady Vols built as big as a 15-point lead before the Lady Raiders stormed back to make it 58-53 with 7:53 remaining on back-to-back 3-pointers from Holf and Johnna Abney.

MTSU was outrebounded 47-26, and the Lady Vols were deadly at the free throw line, making 28-of-37.

MTSU senior guard Starr Orr jump-started MTSU early, hitting three straight 3-pointers to give the Lady Raiders a 14-6 advantage with 16:20 left in the first half.

However, after the first media timeout with 15:59 left, MTSU didn't score until almost six minutes later.

Tennessee was unable to run away, though, as it never led by more than nine points in the first half.

MTSU had a chance to cut the lead to 34-30, but it missed two easy shots down low. The Lady Vols took a 39-30 into the locker-room at intermission.

MTSU was plagued by foul problems in the first half. Brown had four personals, while Queen and Burtts had three apiece.

Orr finished with a season-high 12 points, while Abney added 11. Alexis Hornbuckle added 17 for Tennessee, while former Shelbvville standout Alex Fuller had 16.

Two days removed from scoring 28 points against No. 1 Tennessee, Amber Holt picked up where she left off against Austin Peay Saturday night.

The MTSU senior forward poured in a career-high 33 points and pulled down 14 rebounds as the Lady Raiders routed Austin Peay, 95-60, at the Dunn Center.

Holt made 12-of-16 shots and hit 8-of-11 at the free throw line. She also had five assists and three steals.

"What can you say — that's Amber Holt," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "She had 33 points, 14 rebounds and only had two turnovers in 34 minutes."

The victory snapped a four-game losing streak — the longest MTSU skid since the 1998-99 season. MTSU improved to 4-5, while Austin Peay slipped to 4-5.

"We needed this win," Holt said. "I feel like we could have won every game we've lost, so it felt good tonight."

MTSU led 36-23 at halftime, but had the lead up to 20 points in less than two minutes. Holt scored eight of the Lady Raiders first 11 points after intermission

MTSU's defense was relentless, forcing 39 Austin Peay turnovers that equated into 43 Raider points.

"We had to have a little talk at halftime," Insell said. "We spent a lot of energy the other night at Tennessee, but we came out in the second half more focused and more aggressive.

"Austin Peay is not a bad basketball team and it was a good win for our kids. Now, the real stuff starts (Wednesday) with conference play."

Four Lady Raiders scored in double figures. Freshman forward Emily Queen had a career-high 14 points, while sophomore guard Chelsia Lymon had 14 and freshman guard Anne Marie Lanning 11.

"I'm not necessarily looking to score," said Queen, who hit 5-of-7 attempts. "I'm in there for rebounding and defense, and when you do those things, the scoring comes to you.

"We're running our offense much better right now and we've got a lot of people who can score."

MTSU scored the first eight points of the game and built a 20-7 lead with 12:52 left

Austin Peay got as close as seven pints, 20-13, with 11:38 before MTSU closed the half with a 16-10 run to take a 36-23 halftime advantage.

Holt scored 15 points and had eight rebounds in the first half, which coupled with 20 Austin Peay turnovers, allowed the Lady Raiders to build the 13-point cushion.

The Lady Govs were led by senior guard Ashley Herring's 19 points.

As was the case a number of times previously, Amber Holt stole the show Wednesday. This time, however, the MTSU senior's performance featured an unusual number of steals.

It took less than one half for the reigning Sun Belt Conference player of the week to match her career-high for takeaways in a game (five). She did not get any over the second half but the 6-foot forward played every minute and finished with a game-high 18 points and a team-best 11 rebounds as the Lady Raiders defeated Florida International, 77-64, at the Murphy Center in the conference opener for both teams.

It was her third double-double in the last four games and her fourth of the season.

"What can you say? That's really unheard of for anybody," coach Rick Insell said. "Especially for somebody her size — she's playing out of position."

Holl's first steal of the contest came 2:02 after the opening tip and her last was with 8:22 to play in the first half. Both led to 3-point shots by Brandi Brown, the first of which gave MTSU its first lead, 5-2, and the second of which produced the largest lead of the first half.

The victory was the Lady Raiders' 25th straight in conference play and 31st straight at home against SBC opponents.

"I was just there," Holt said. "They were just turning over the ball. They just threw it, and that's how I got the five steals."

Twice last season Holt had five steals in a game, the second of those was Januaary 11 against Florida Atlantic. Her season-high coming into this one was four, Dec. 2 against Western Carolina.

Her total was two more than FIU ( $\bar{3}$ -7, 0-1) had the entire night. Seven different Lady Raiders had at least one steal, and as a team they finished with 13. At the same time they committed a season-low eight turnovers.

Just as Holt wasn't the only one making steals, Brown, a sophomore, was not the only one knocking down long-range shots.

MTSU matched its season-best with 12 3-pointers on 37 attempts (two shy of its season-high). Sophomore Jackie Pickel made a team-high four, all in the second half, and freshman Anne Marie Lanning's 3 with 13:28 to play in the first half put MTSU ahead to

Brown finished with 14 points, Pickel scored 12 and Lanning added nine.

"I think we're always going to shoot a lot of 3s," Brown said. "(Insell) wants us to shoot 3s. He always makes sure we know if we don't shoot them, we won't play."

Insell also made it clear following the contest that he wants his team to rebound better. Holt had three more than the Lady Raiders' other four starters combined, and only Lanning, with six, had as many as half that total. As a team, MTSU was outrebounded,

Amber Holt scored a game-high 27 points and grabbed eight rebounds and Anne Marie Lanning added a career-high 15 points, as Middle Tennessee won their 26th straight contest against Sun Belt competition with an 80-46 victory over South Alabama Saturday at the Mitchell Center.

Holt scored 11 of the team's first 13 points of the second half and the Raiders extended a 20-point halftime advantage to as many as 35 at one point. Middle Tennessee's defense forced 26 USA turnovers and turned those into 26 points.

Lanning had her best game of the year, going 5-for-7 from the floor and hitting three 3-pointers. She scored the 15 points in just 11 minutes of action.

Brandi Brown also netted 12 points for Middle Tennessee (6-5, 2-0 Sun Belt), who won its third straight overall and 20th consecutive regular season Sun Belt contest.

The Blue Raiders started very slowly in the contest but put together a 14-2 run over eight-plus minutes to take an 18-10 advantage in the first half. Brown hit a pair of 3-pointers during the run and USA scored just one field goal in a 13-minute stretch, committing nine turnovers

The Lady Jaguars closed the gap to 29-19 at the four-minute media timeout, but Middle Tennessee finished the half with a 10-0 run, highlighted by 3-pointers from Lanning and Chelsia Lymon for a 39-19 lead at the break.

Holt scored 12 points in the half and Lanning added 10. The Blue Raiders also netted 15 points off 15 USA turnovers in the opening 20 minutes.

Middle Tennessee dominated all phases of the game, outrebounding the Lady Jaguars (10-2, 1-1), 35-30, and committing just 12 turnovers compared to USA's 26. The Blue Raiders shot 51 percent from the floor and hit 9-of-19 from 3-point range.

"South Alabama started the game really running right by us on the press so we want to more of a contain and made them really work to get the ball up the court and use time off the clock and it worked very well," head coach Rick Insell said. "They're a good halfcourt team but when we made them take time off the clock they weren't able to get into their sets.

"I really thought all of our girls played well and we really executed the offense and got the ball to people in a position to score. One of the reasons they played so well is because they get an extra day off for the Christmas break."

MTSU senior forward Amber Holt was disappointed to find out LSU All-American center Sylvia Fowles was out with a knee injury Friday night.

"I really wanted to her play," said Holt. "I was kind of disappointed."

LSU was distraught, too, after Holt poured in a career-high 41 points to lead the Lady Raiders to a stunning 67-56 victory over the nation's eighth-ranked team before a crowd of 7,858 at Murphy Center

Fowles, a 6-foot-6 center, was obviously missed, but the second largest crowd to ever witness a women's basketball game at Murphy Center saw Holt make her own bid for postseason honors.

MTSU (7-5) saw a 10-point second-half lead evaporate into a one-point deficit, 54-53, with 4:34 remaining, but the Lady Raiders outscored LSU 14-2 down the stretch.

After falling behind 54-53, Holt snatched an offensive rebound and kicked it out to Brandi Brown, who hit a 3-pointer out of the corner to give the Lady Raiders the lead for good.

Holt, who also had nine rebounds, made 15-of-26 shots and hit 11-of-12 at the free-throw line.

Added LSU coach Van Chancellor: "Holt's a difficult matchup for us. We made up our mind that we were going to give Holt some points and try to take away the three ball. We just didn't realize that we were going to give Holt so many points."

Holl said previous road games at Tennessee, Maryland and Old Dominion prepared the Lady Raiders for the Lady Tigers.

"It prepared us real well and made our freshmen and younger players not be scared," she said. "(Freshman) Emily Queen had 12 rebounds tonight and she needs to do more of that."

MTSU struggled early, turning the ball over five times in the first five minutes, but LSU shot the ball poorly and never could get into a rhythm offensively.

Chancellor was hit with a technical foul with 42 seconds left after Quianna Chaney was call for a charging foul, which was her fifth.

MTSU cashed in on 22-of-29 free-throw attempts, while LSU made 6-of-9.

Although Holt was a one-person wrecking crew, MTSU got more contributions from her supporting cast in the second half. Brown had eight points, while senior guard Starr Orr and junior Johnna Abney scored five.

LSU (9-3) got 13 points from Allison Hightower and 11 from Chanev.

Two days after one of the more significant victories in program history, the MTSU women's basketball team was forced to play from behind — almost exclusively.

With the exception of the first 17 seconds, when the game was scoreless, and 15 seconds when it was 2-2, the Lady Raiders played catch-up with the University of Louisville before an enthusiastic crowd of 5 243 at Freedom Hall

Try as they might — and they tried several different things — they never pulled even, let alone took the lead, and eventually fell 76-64 in their final non-conference game of the season.

They fell behind 10-2 in the first four minutes and trailed by 13 (33-20) with 4:07 to play in the first half. From there, they actually outscored the Lady Cardinals but never got even on the scoreboard, as the teams tested one another with similar philosophies and star power in a contest that featured the country's top two scorers — Holt and Louisville's Angel McCoughtry.

First, MTSU (7-6) turned to Holt to try and get back in the game. The senior forward scored four straight points and 12 of MTSU's next 22 over a 12-minute stretch (she also had two steals during that time) capped by a pair of baskets 24 seconds apart, which got the Lady Raiders within six, 50-44, with 12:24 to play.

From there, the Lady Raiders attempted to shoot their way to the finish, which proved fruitless. Chelsia Lymon's 3-pointer with 11:03 to play made it 50-47, which was as close as they got in the second half, but MTSU then missed six straight 3-pointers (by six different players) over the next three-and-a-half minutes.

For the game, the Lady Raiders made just 8-of-31 (25.8 percent) 3-point attempts.

Ultimately, Holt, the nation's leading scorer, finished with 32 points — half of MTSU's total.

Louisville (11-2), however, got 32 of its own from McCoughtry, but her total included two well-timed 3-pointers that turned back a pair of MTSU runs.

McCoughtry made just three 3-point baskets in the game, one with 18:17 left after the Lady Raiders had pulled within four, 37-33, and the last 24 seconds after Lymon's had made it a three-point

"You aren't going to see two better players on the floor for two teams than you did (Sunday)," Louisville coach Jeff Walz said. "Amber Holt is a kid who is an unbelievable basketball player. ... Then Angel, ... she had to step up and make some big shots — and she did."

In so doing, she saw to it that MTSU never caught up completely.

Whether or not there will be a shift in power in the Sun Belt Conference this season remains to be seen.

However, Western Kentucky stated its case that it will be a major player by beating MTSU's women, 85-81, before a crowd of 2,982 at E.A. Diddle Arena Thursday night.

"This rivalry goes back so far that it really feels good," said WKU senior post Crystal Kelly, who poured in 22 points and grabbed 14 rebounds

MTSU, which has won four straight Sun Belt tournament titles, saw its 26-game winning streak against league foes snapped. It was just the second time in eight meetings the Lady Toppers had defeated the Lady Raiders, who dropped to 7-7 overall and 2-1 in the conference.

"Western Kentucky is a very good basketball team," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "I'm very proud of our team. We had two freshmen and two sophomores out there. ... I don't think they gave any trophies out tonight. ... They've got a good basketball team and we've got a good basketball team."

Western Kentucky led by as many as 10 points on three occasions in the second half, including 76-66 with 3:30 left before the Lady Raiders mounted a furious comeback.

MTSU sophomore Chelsia Lymon scored seven of her team's next nine points and the Lady Raiders finally tied the game at 79 with 1:05 remaining.

MTSU had a chance to take the lead but Holt missed a short jumper in the lane, and the Lady Toppers made four straight free

Holt finished with a game-high 36 points, while Johnna Abney added 16 and Lymon 12.

WKU, which trailed 33-28 in the first half, put on an offensive clinic after intermission, as it continuously broke down MTSU's defense. The Lady Toppers (9-5, 2-0) made 17 of their first 21 shots in the second half (81 percent) and finished at a 77.3-percent clip after intermission. Forty-eight of their points came in the paint.

WKU dominated MTSU on the boards, outrebounding the Lady Raiders, 40-18. The Lady Toppers had 17 offensive rebounds and 21 second-chance points.

Brown scored 17 points off the bench and grabbed 14 rebounds, while Kenzie Rich also added 17 points.

WKU opened the game with an 8-2 spurt before MTSU scored 13 unanswered points to take a 15-8 lead with 9:56 remaining in the first half. The Lady Toppers went almost eight minutes without a

However, WKU cut the lead to 25-24 with 2:42 left before halftime. MTSU converted two turnovers into easy layups and built a five-point advantage, 33-28, at intermission.

Kelly and Duck, who guarded Holt, each picked up three fouls in the first half, while Abney and Starr Orr were whistled for three apiece for the Lady Raiders.

Amber Holt got her points, but she got plenty of help in MTSU's 93-55 whipping of Denver at Murphy Center Sunday afternoon.

Freshman forward Emily Queen scored a career-high 17 points and pulled down 11 rebounds, and freshman guard Anne Marie Lanning netted a career-high 18 as the Lady Raiders took out their frustrations on the Pioneers before a crowd of 3,307.

Coming off its first Sun Belt Conference loss in 27 games, an 85-81 defeat at Western Kentucky Thursday, MTSU (8-7, 3-1) took it to the Pioneers from the outset and had the game well in hand

Denver had 11 turnovers and made just one of six field goals in the first eight minutes, which helped MTSU jump out to a 15-3 lead.

"Rebounding and defense are what we've got to get better at," said MTSU coach Rick Insell, whose team outrebounded Denver, 39-30.

Holt, who leads the nation in scoring at 26.1 points per game, scored 24 despite sitting out 13 minutes. She had played 40 minutes in each of the previous three games.

Along with Queen's and Lanning's contributions, sophomore point quard Chelsia Lymon also added 12 points.

Queen made 4-of-6 from the field and hit all eight of her free throw attempts. She also had a team-high four steals.

"It felt good to come out in the second half and do better," Queen said. "I didn't come out ready to play in the first half.

"Coach has really been enforcing (having more point production from other players). If Amber comes out of the game, we've got to know we can score without her. We've been working on that."

Lanning hit 4-of-7 field-goal attempts, including three 3-pointers, and made 7-of-8 free throws. She said team members have talked among themselves about giving Holt more support.

"We've talked a lot about it, especially with Brandi (Brown) out (with a broken hand)," Lanning said. "Tonight we all stepped up and we need to keep doing that. (Holt) can do it all by herself, but she doesn't have to."

MTSU led 39-22 at halftime despite turning over the ball 14 times. However, Denver had 17 first-half turnovers and finished with 32. The Lady Raiders had just four in the second half.

"That's uncharacteristic for us," Insell said of the turnovers. "We had 12 the other night (at Western Kentucky) and scored 81 points and lost, and that's hard to do."

MTSU built a 24-point lead early in the second half before the Pioneers cut the deficit to 56-41 with 10:17 remaining. However, the Lady Raiders went on a 14-3 run over the next three minutes to take

Denver, which dropped to 4-9 and 0-3, was led by Nnenna Akotaobi's 16 points. No other Pioneer scored in double figures.

MTSU finally got some sense knocked in it Thursday night at Murphy Center.

Actually, a hard foul that sent MTSU freshman Emily Queen sprawling to the floor seemingly was the wake-up call the Lady Raiders needed to rally for a 79-63 victory over Florida Atlantic before a crwod of 3 227

With the Lady Raiders trailing 49-45 with 11:13 remaining, Queen was going in for a layup when she absorbed a hard foul that knocked her out of bounds.

Queen sank both free throws, which ignited a 12-2 spurt to give the Lady Raiders a 59-51 lead with 6:29 left. Queen scored six of the points during the decisive run.

Holt had 29 points, nine rebounds, a career-high eight steals and four assists, while Queen scored 14 points and pulled down a career-high 15 rebounds.

MTSU improved to 9-7 overall and 4-1 in the Sun Belt Conference, while FAU slipped to 4-9 and 0-4.

"Give them a lot of credit," Insell said of the Owls. "They came in with a good gameplan and they stuck to it."

MTSU struggled mightily throughout offensively and trailed the Owls, 47-38, with 14:30 remaining.

However, FAU turned the ball over four straight possessions during one point and went without a field goal from the 10:59 mark until 6:10 remaining.

"You could tell they were getting kind of down," Queen said

The Lady Raiders suffered through a horrific first half offensively. Holt scored 15 of MTSU's 29 first-half points, making 5-of-9 shots. The rest of the team hit a collective 6-of-27, and the Lady Raiders made only 1-of-12 from 3-point range. They hit just 3-of-20 overall.

"We just came out in the second half and took our time," said Holt. "The first half was just horrible. ... (Insell) got on me. My teammates gravitate to me and what I do. .. We didn't panic."

Added Insell: "We were not playing our game. Everybody took their turn shooting the ball, and that's not our team."

FAU led 36-29 at halftime. However, the Owls had 18 turnovers in the second half, and after outrebounding MTSU 28-19 in the first half, they were outrebounded 21-12 in the second.

MTSU made 26-of-33 at the free throw line, including 20-of-24 in the second half. FAU hit 9-of-10 at the free-throw line in the first half, but didn't attempt one in the second

"We played hard," said FAU coach Chancellor Dugan. "They got to the free throw line and did what they did. I am not going to take anything away from Middle Tennessee because they are a great team. When you send a team like that to the line 33 times and we don't get to the free throw line in the second half, it's crap."

MTSU freshman Anne Marie Lanning scored 12 points, while sophomore point guard Chelsia Lymon added 10, four steals and three assists

But as it turned out, it was ASU that survived a frantic Lady Raider comeback for a 70-68 victory before a crowd of 1,914 at the Convocation Center. The loss snapped a four-game winning streak against the Lady Indians, who last beat the Lady Raiders 66-65 on Jan. 12, 2006.

"They did a good job and they were well prepared," said MTSU coach Rick Insell, whose team fell to 9-8 overall and 4-2 in the Sun Belt Conference. "We played at our worst and they played harder and wanted it more than we did."

The Lady Indians (10-8, 5-2) led by as many as 15 points in the second half. MTSU got within four points, 60-56, with 1:58 remaining after Jackie Pickel hit back-to-back 3-pointers and Amber Holt scored in the paint.

Holt's 3-pointer with 11 seconds left cut the lead to 67-64. Jazmine Taylor made one of two free throws for ASU with 9.8 seconds left before Holt was fouled attempting a 3-pointer with 4.1 seconds. She made all three to cut the margin to 68-67 with 4.1 seconds

Taylor was fouled on the in-bounds play before any time went off the clock and made both free throws. MTSU's Latoya Barclay was fouled with 0.6 seconds left. She made the first, missed the second intentionally and a desperation tip-in at the horn didn't draw iron.

The Lady Raiders labored offensively, didn't take care of the basketball, and Holt never consistently got involved in the offense.

Holt, who entered the game leading the nation in scoring (26.3 ppg), scored a game-high 31. However, after giving MTSU a 27-22 lead with a 3-pointer with 6:43 left in the first half, she didn't connect on her next field-goal attempt until 8:28 remained in the second

MTSU, which trailed 33-32 at halftime, managed just two field goals in the first 11 1/2 minutes of the second half, which enabled ASU to build a 53-42 lead.

MTSU shot just 38 percent, was outrebounded 41-36 and committed 19 turnovers.

The Lady Raiders were plagued with foul problems and turnovers in the first half. Freshman forward Emily Queen, who fouled out with 10:09 remaining, had three first-half fouls, while Holt, freshman forward Angelique Burtts and senior Starr Orr had two apiece.

After Holt's 3-pointer at the 6:43 mark gave MTSU a 27-22 advantage, the Lady Raiders were outscored 11-5 and trailed by one at halftime

Insell said MTSU tried to do things offensively it wasn't capable of doing.

MTSU's women played with only eight players Thursday night.

One would've probably been enough, as the Lady Raiders trounced Troy 87-53.

MTSU senior Amber Holt, the nation's leading scorer, had 30 points, 10 rebounds and six assists.

"They wanted to crowd me in the paint because one-on-one they can't guard me," Holt said. "So when they sucked into the paint, I went from being a scorer to finding my shooters on the outside. Both ways worked for us."

MTSU (10-8, 5-2 in Sun Belt) mauled Troy (9-8, 2-4) despite an abbreviated roster, as Johnna Abney left the team earlier in the week for personal issues and Brandi Brown is out with a broken hand.

In their absence, Holt outscored Troy's entire team 22-18 in a lopsided first half, tying her career-high for most points in a single half

MTSU freshman Anne Marie Lanning, a former Riverdale High standout, added 17 points with career highs in 3-pointers (5) and field goals (6).

The Lady Raiders tied their season-high with 12 3-pointers, and all eight players scored.

"We've been working on positioning our 3-point shooters," Lanning said. "We did a real good job of re-positioning, and they got confused about whether or not they should help on (guarding Holt). That got us some open shots, and I hit two big (3-pointers) right off the bat. So that changed things for them, too."

The Lady Raiders built an insurmountable lead before breaking a sweat, jumping out to a 17-3 lead to start the game. Lanning canned back-to-back 3-pointers following the opening tip. Holt went the first six minutes of the game without scoring, but then exploded for 19 points over the next 10 minutes.

Troy's shooters couldn't find the basket or even their offensive end of the court early on. The Lady Trojans committed eight turnovers on their first 12 possessions and took only five field-goal attempts in the game's first eight minutes, as MTSU's press swarmed ball-handlers and clogged passing lanes.

Troy committed 24 turnovers, leading to 35 MTSU points.

"We changed up our press on them," Insell said. "I think they thought we were going to hard press, but we came out with a (flexed press and three-quarter court press) and that kind of messed with their kids' minds. Last year, we went baseline to baseline with a 94-foot press, but we backed it up and changed things this time."

MTSU led 43-18 at halfitime. Troy started the second half with a brief spurt, but the Lady Raiders answered with five 3-pointers in six possessions to spark a 25-4 run.

Troy went seven-and-half minutes without a field goal, and the Lady Raiders' lead swelled to 71-30 midway through the second half

MTSU capped off a week of adversity with an impressive Sun Belt Conference victory over New Orleans Sunday afternoon at Murphy Center.

Senior forward Amber Holt led four players in double figures with 24 points, as the Lady Raiders routed the Privateers, 80-61, before a crowd of 3,763.

MTSU, which lost at Arkansas State Monday and then lost junior point guard Johnna Abney, who left the program for personal reasons, won its second straight league game to improve to 11-8 overall and 6-2 in the Sun Belt. The Lady Raiders again played with just eight players, as sophomore forward Brandi Brown is still out with a broken hand.

"We knew after the Arkansas State game that we had an obstacle in front of us," said sophomore point guard Chelsia Lymon, who had 12 points, six rebounds, three assists and three steals. "We knew what the situation was. We didn't make any excuses and we knew we had to come together as a team. This is making us stronger as a team."

MTSU senior Starr Orr scored a season-high 14 points, while freshman Anne Marie Lanning had 13, including making 4-of-9 from 3-point range

"All it takes is five players to win a game," said Holt, who leads the nation in scoring. "We just need to go out and play like that, rebounding and defending. Starr Orr had a great game, and with Chelsia running the point, if we play like that we're unstoppable."

UNO cut a 12-point first-half Lady Raider lead to four, 32-28, with 2:47 left before Lanning and Holt scored the rest of the team's points during a 10-2 run to close out the half.

Lanning hit back-to-back 3-pointers, while Holt hit two free throws and a jumper off a steal to give MTSU a 42-30 lead at intermission.

"Anne Marie made a couple of 3s and we went to a flex press," Insell said. "They threw it right to Amber and she got to the line and got another steal and basket. That was five or six big possessions."

"They're a tough team," Lymon said. "If we hadn't come and played like we did, it would have been a different game. ... They attack you, but we were able to come out and put them away."

UNO, which was led by Brittany Helm's 16 points, turned the ball over 21 times, while MTSU committed just 11. The Lady Raiders out-rebounded the Privateers, 40-37, led by freshman Emily Queen's eight.

"When you are pressed for 40 minutes, you anticipate to turn the ball over a little bit," said UNO coach Amy Champion. "The full-court pressure didn't bother us as much as the half-court pressure did. Our decision making wasn't the greatest once we got past the half-court line."

Lady Raider senior Amber Holt scored a school-record 44 points to carry MTSU to a 64-61 win over Louisiana-Monroe.

Her final basket — the one that broke Kim Webb's 21-year-old MTSU record of 42 points — came with 31 seconds remaining and the score tied at 60

Holt, the nation's leading scorer, made a spin move to split a ULM double-team and dropped in her final shot to put MTSU ahead for good at 62-60. Starr Orr made two free throws to finish off the

Holt's go-ahead basket prompted her to make the understatement of MTSU's season.

"Coach tells me that I'm our No. 1 option, and I felt like I was tonight," Holt said. "I just tried to score when we needed it."

The Lady Raiders needed it the entire game.

Holt had 44 points and a season-high 17 field goals. The rest of the Lady Raiders combined had 20 points and four field goals (4-of-

"We thought we could contain (Holt), not stop her, but contain her," ULM coach Mona Martin said. "If we could do that and not let the rest of their team beat us, we thought we would have a chance and we did."

Fortunately for the Lady Raiders, their scoring futility coincided with Holt's finest performance. She scored 22 points in the first and second halves, both of which tied her career-high for points in a single half.

Holt's 41 points against LSU earlier this season missed the school record by one point. On Thursday, she bested Webb's all-time mark of 42 points, set on Feb. 21, 1987 versus Eastern Kentucky.

MTSU trailed the entire first half until Holt scored 11 straight for the Lady Raiders to tie the score at 27. The rest of MTSU's team had two field goals in both the first and second halves

And MTSU's shots — sans Holt — didn't fall from anywhere on the floor

Despite leading the Sun Belt with 25 3-point attempts per game, the Lady Raiders didn't shoot a trey for the game's first 12 minutes. They finished 1-of-9 from beyond the arc, posting season lows in 3-pointers made and attempted.

Jackie Pickel made MTSU's lone 3-pointer with 4:45 remaining in the first half, which was also the Lady Raiders' first field goal not scored by Holt in the game.

Starr Orr scored 12 points for MTSU on 6-of-6 free-throw shooting. Regena Jackson's 17 points paced ULM, which led by 10 midway through the first half.

MTSU, which has won five of its last six games and three in a row, improved to 12-8 overall, 7-2 in Sun Belt play.

ULM, the West Division's co-leader entering Thursday's game, dropped to 12-7, 5-3 in Sun Belt play.

MTSU's supporting cast picked an ideal time to emerge Saturday night.

With senior forward Amber Holt struggling offensively, the rest of the Lady Raiders helped spark an 89-50 rout of North Texas before a crowd of 4,806 at Murphy Center.

MTSU (13-8, 8-2) won its 35th straight Sun Belt game at Murphy Center. North Texas dropped to 9-11 and 4-4.

Holt, who entered the game leading the nation in scoring at 27.5 points a game, finished with 20, but made just 7-of-25 field goal

Sophomore point guard Chelsia Lymon scored a career-high 24 points, including 20 in the second half. She hit four of MTSU's 10 3-pointers.

Senior guard Starr Orr, sophomore reserve guard Jackie Pickel and Lymon scored 16 of MTSU's first 18 points in the second half and turned a close six-point advantage into a runaway.

"I've said all along that I've got some talented young players," Insell said. "They're freshmen and sophomores and it's a lot to ask of them to come out and win games.

"Right now, with the schedule we've played, having played Tennessee and Maryland, it's starting to hold true that our schedule is

Freshman forward Angelique Burtts also had eight points and 10 rebounds off the bench and gave MTSU key minutes after freshman forward Emily Queen was whistled for her second foul 11 minutes into the game and her fourth with 17:03 left in the game.

MTSU trailed 23-16 with 5:35 left before halftime after going scoreless for five minutes.

However, Pickel ended the drought with a 3-pointer and Holt scored 10 of the Lady Raiders final 12 points of the half. They finished with a 19-6 run to take a 35-29 halftime lead.

The Lady Raiders opened the second half with a 10-2 run to take a 14-point lead at the first media timeout with 15:54 remaining.

Orr scored the first five points, including a 3-pointer and a layup when Pickel intercepted a Mean Green pass.

"Normally, I'm up in the press," said Pickel. "The past month I've been playing in the back and like that because I can anticipate the pass.

Pickel then hit a 3-pointer as the shot clock expired to give the Lady Raiders a 43-31 lead.

"Finally," said Pickel, who equaled her season high with 11 points and made three 3-pointers "All season I've kind of been struggling. I think that everybody gets upset when people ask what's wrong with the rest of us. (This) gives us some confidence back."

MTSU outrebounded North Texas, the leading rebounding team in the Sun Belt. 39-33. The Lady Raiders also forced 28 turnovers. including 19 in the pivotal second half.

To cure a slow start, MTSU's women's basketball squad went to a tried and true remedy

Because they did, the Lady Raiders took their fifth straight win here Wednesday night, rallying from an early eight-point deficit and rolling to an 85-66 win over Louisiana-Lafayette in their Sun Belt Conference contest

The Lady Raiders (14-8, 9-2 Sun Belt) didn't force a turnover from the host Ragin' Cajuns in the game's first five minutes, and ULL held a 10-2 lead. Over the next eight minutes, MTSU scored 19 points just off Cajun turnovers, and the Raiders led 27-17.

Chelsia Lymon more than did her part in that turnaround. The sophomore guard had a career-high point total for the second straight game with a 27-point effort, but her six steals were just as important for a defense that forced more than 20 turnovers (25) for the eighth time in nine games.

The defensive numbers aren't unusual in MTSU's current win streak. In those five games, the Raiders have averaged almost 32 points off turnovers after getting 40 in Wednesday's win.

Lymon had 24 points on Saturday in the Lady Raiders' 89-50 victory over North Texas, and topped her 3-point output from that game by one. That was a big part of MTSU's 14-of-43 showing outside the arc, both of those numbers season highs.

It was tough on the Cajuns (5-15, 1-8), who lost to the Lady Raiders for the 13th time in 13 contests.

Amber Holt, the nation's leading scorer with a 27.1 average, finished with 19 points, including three 3-pointers, in a 6-of-15 shooting night - only her fourth this season not to lead MT in scoring.

The hosts didn't make many mistakes early, as MTSU made only one of its first eight shots and the Cajuns scored three transition baskets on the way to a 10-2 advantage. However, Latoya Barclay and Lymon each had layups off steals and Lymon and Jackie Pickel nailed 3-pointers to kick off a 25-7 run.

Holt didn't attempt a shot over the first nine minutes, but her two free throws at the 10:27 mark of the first half gave the Lady Raiders their first lead at 16-15. She followed with a 3-pointer 45 seconds later, and then ended the run with another three that made it 27-17 at the 7:18 mark.

Brandi Brown, seeing her first action in nine games after breaking her hand in late December, nailed a 3-pointer just before the halftime horn to give MTSU a 37-24 advantage.

The Cajuns, losing their sixth straight Sun Belt game, never got within single digits again, but did knock the margin to 55-44 halfway through the final period before the Lady Raiders went on another 10-2 run

Annie Marie Lanning was MTSU's other twin-digit scorer with 14 points, while Alicia McDaniel led four Cajuns in double figures with 17 points.

MTSU kept missing, Arkansas-Little Rock kept defending, and the Trojans made a major statement at Murphy Center Wednesday night.

UALR, the top defensive team in the Sun Belt Conference, looked the part in stifling the Lady Raiders, 66-53, before a crowd of 3 166

Meanwhile, MTSU hardly looked like the top offensive team in the Sun Belt, as it made just 18-of-63 shots for a dismal 29 percent.

MTSU had won 35 straight games at Murphy Center, with its last setback coming in double overtime to Western Kentucky on Feb. 5, 2004. It was just the Lady Raiders' eighth home loss in Sun Belt play since it joined the conference in 2001 — a span of 61 games.

"It's really disappointing," said MTSU sophomore point guard Chelsia Lymon. "We did some things we shouldn't have done. If we had knocked down shots we would have won the game.

"We were on this winning streak, we were playing pretty well and we hit a road block, which was today."

MTSU fell to 14-9 overall and 9-3 in the Sun Belt Conference, while UALR, which leads the East Division, improved to 16-6 and 8-3.

"We didn't come in with the right attitude — right across the board," Insell said. "You can't do that against a team like Little Rock. We were playing well. We didn't play well tonight.

"I'm going to start playing more people if we're going to drag around out there. We've got kids who want to play."

While MTSU struggled to get into an offensive rhythm, UALR was efficient in the half-court and in breaking the Lady Raiders' press. The Trojans had 10 turnovers in the first half, but only eight in the second. The 18 miscues were the second fewest for an MTSU opponent this season.

More impressive, UALR shot 64 percent (25-of-39) from the floor and placed three players in double figures — Anshel Cooper (20), Nikya Hughes (18) and Kim Sitzmann (14).

Holf, the nation's leading scorer at 26.8 points a game, led MTSU with 26 points. However, Lymon was the only other player in doubles figures as she netted 11.

Both teams were efficient offensively to open the first half. MTSU hit three 3-pointers in the first five minutes, while UALR's Hughes scored her team's first nine points.

However, MTSU managed just one field goal — a Holt 3-pointer — in the final six minutes of the first half and trailed 27-26 at intermission. UALR hit a sizzling 62 percent (10-of-16), but 10 Trojan turnovers kept them from building a bigger cushion at halftime.

The Lady Raiders went almost four minutes without a field goal to open the second half before Holt scored on a layup with 16:17 left to pull MTSU with 35-31.

Middle Tennessee started well but ran into another buzzsaw, this one named Monica Bosilj, as the Florida International sophomore scored a career-high 32 points and the Golden Panthers shot 59 percent from the field en route to a 74-62 victory over the Blue Raiders Saturday at Pharmed Arena.

Middle Tennessee (14-10, 9-4 Sun Belt) jumped out to a 10-point lead midway through the first half only to be outscored 26-5 over the final nine minutes. FIU led 36-25 at halfitime and continued to pour it on, thanks to torrid shooting from the home team. Bosilj was especially deadly, netting 13 of 16 points during one stretch of the half, including three 3-pointers.

Asha Neal also scored 13 points for the Golden Panthers (11-13, 7-6) and grabbed 10 rebounds, part of FIU's 42-30 edge on the

The Blue Raiders did not score a field goal for the final 9:55 of the first half and another 3:27 of the second half (13:25 combined) and posted just five points during the stretch, all from the foul line.

FIU scored the first eight points of the second half to extend the lead to 44-25 and the Blue Raiders would get no closer than 14 until the final basket of the game, a 3-pointer from Lymon just before the buzzer. The Golden Panthers extended their lead to as many as 25 points at 72-47 after a Fanni Hutlassa layup.

Amber Holt led the Blue Raiders with 21 points and seven rebounds. She added three assists and three steals. Anne Marie Lanning hit four 3-pointers and finished with 14 points, while Chelsia Lymon and Emily Queen both scored 11 points.

Middle Tennessee hits just 29 percent from the field, its second straight game under 30 percent. The Blue Raiders were only 7-for-27 in the first half when FIU gained the momentum it needed.

"We started well but then just quit putting the ball in the hole and that was the difference in the game," head coach Rick Insell said. "We only shot 29 percent and [FIU] hit a lot of shots and they just continued to hit shots when we were trying to make a comeback."

The Blue Raiders started unusually fast, jumping out to a 20-10 advantage midway through the opening period. Lanning scored 11 of the team's points, hitting three 3-pointers. Holt added six and Starr Orr hit a 3-pointer with 9:55 remaining before intermission for a 10-point advantage.

But Orr's jumper would be the last basket of the half for the Blue Raiders, who scored just five more points before the break, all on free throws. Middle Tennessee hit just one of its last 14 shots in the final 10 minutes of the half and the Golden Panthers took full advantage, going on a 26-5 run to end the first 20 minutes with a 36-25 FIU advantage.

The home team made 9-of-14 from the field over the final 10:56 of the half, including eight points from LaQuetta Ferguson before she injured her knee with 3:55 before intermission. Bisilj also added eight points and Neal scored six of the team's final eight points of the half, including a driving layup with one second before the break.

The Blue Raiders committed nine turnovers during the FIU run after posting only two in the first nine minutes.

It took a while, but MTSU looked like the Lady Raiders of old in defeating South Alabama 66-46 Thursday night before a crowd of 4,411 at Murphy Center.

Coming off back-to-back Sun Belt Conference losses, MTSU's struggle continued until its patented pressing defense ignited a decisive second-half run.

The Lady Raiders (15-10, 10-4) trailed 35-28 with 17:17 left, but after tying the score at 41 with 12:33 remaining, they finished off the game with an impressive 25-5 spurt.

"This was a big game, we had lost two in a row," MTSU coach Insell said. "We've been trying to crank a motorcycle without a battery. We found a battery in the second half."

MTSU was coming off back-to-back games in which it shot just 29 percent from the field, and in the initial 20 minutes things didn't look any more promising.

The Lady Raiders missed all 11 of their 3-point field goal attempts, while USA went 4-of-11 to build a 30-25 halftime lead.

However, the Lady Raiders hit their first three 3-point attempts to open the second half and made 8 of 16 after intermission.

"We're 0-for-11 (from 3-point range) in the first half, and we got eight good looks," Insell said. "We should have knocked down five or

MTSU's defense was the biggest factor in the second half. After forcing nine turnovers in the first, the Lady Raiders forced 14 in the second and turned them into 17 points.

"They forced people to turn the ball over," said USA Roach Rick Pietri. "FIU had 26 turnovers and still beat them. That's going to happen. In the first half we did a much better job handling the pressure.

"In the second half, they were more aggressive. They started pushing, holding and grabbing us. If the officials don't call it a foul, then it's not a foul. We didn't react well to that."

Added MTSU senior guard Latoya Barclay: "We worked our defense in practice. We tried to give that second effort on defense and just play hard."

MTSU had just nine turnovers, the second time in three game it has had less than 10 floor mistakes.

"We're taking care of the basketball," Insell said. "We just need to nut the ball in the hole."

MTSU senior Amber Holt, the nation's leading scorer at 26.5 points a game, led the Lady Raiders with 27 points and eight re-

No other Lady Raider scored in double figures, but Holt got a balanced effort from her supporting cast. Chelsia Lymon and Barclay had eight apiece, Anne Marie Lanning had seven and Emily Queen had six points and eight rebounds.

Sophomore point guard Chelsia Lymon scored eight straight points to put MTSU in position to knock off Sun Belt Conference East Division leader Western Kentucky Sunday afternoon.

Senior forward Amber Holt made sure the Lady Raiders finished off the Lady 'Toppers before a crowd of 6,968 at Murphy Center.

With the shot clock winding down in the final 30 seconds, Holt banked in an eight-foot fadeaway jumper that helped lift MTSU to a

MTSU (16-10, 11-4) was clinging to a 62-60 lead when it called timeout with 36 seconds left in the game. Only 10 seconds were left on the shot clock

Holt scored a game-high 28 points, but Lymon scored eight straight during a pivotal four-minute stretch late in the second half.

Lymon scored inside off an offensive rebound and hit two key back-to-back 3-pointers. The last gave MTSU a 62-58 lead with 2:19 remaining.

MTSU led 40-32 at halftime and took its biggest lead of the second half, 42-32, on Holt's jumper with 19:31 remaining.

However, Western Kentucky ripped off an impressive 14-2 run, culminated by Duck's three-point play that gave the Lady 'Toppers a 46-44 lead with 14:59 remaining. The lead changed hands seven times and it was tied twice in the final 14 minutes.

"It was a good win," Holt said. "We just came out and played our hearts out. Some plays we had letdowns, but we came back even stronger. It was a great win."

Western Kentucky (19-7, 12-2), which could have clinched the East Division title with a win, pointed to giving up two offensive rebounds on one MTSU possession late as one of the reasons it came

"We gave up rebounds to guards — that's something out of character for us," said Western Kentucky senior forward Crystal Kelly. "It shows how important it is.

Western Kentucky coach Mary Taylor Cowles said Lymon got too many open looks from 3-point range

Insell praised the play of Lymon, who had 18 points, seven rebounds, two assists and two steals.

"We've been working on Chelsia backing up ... she's got great range," he said. "I thought Chelsia played a tremendous game. Seven rebounds from the point guard position, two steals and 18 points against a team like Western Kentucky is something."

MTSU hasn't lost at home to Western Kentucky since suffering a double-overtime setback in 2004.

"We've had a lot of adversity this year and we needed this type of win," Insell said. "We needed it for our fans, and more than anything today, we needed it for our team.

"We've been practicing hard, but the one thing we've kind of been frustrated with is we couldn't take our practice into the game. In practice, we'd look great, but then we get into the game and we struggle. We couldn't get the two together."

Amber Holt posted her sixth double-double of the season with 32 points and 11 rebounds and Middle Tennessee used a 28-4 run in the first half to build a big lead and never looked back, defeating Denver, 81-77, Thursday night at Magness Arena.

It was the first double-double for Holt since January 17 at Troy and her ninth 30-point game of the year. She scored 18 points in the first half, including eight during the 28-4 run, and the Blue Raiders (17-10, 12-4 Sun Belt) knocked down nine 3-pointers in the game by five different people to post their ninth straight victory over Denver in

After leading by 16-18 points for most of the second half, the Pioneers rallied frantically in the final minutes, cutting the deficit to two in the final minute before Holt made four straight free throws to seal the victory. The Blue Raiders made only 7-of-12 foul shots in the final minutes, allowing the home team to get back in the game.

Denver shot 69 percent in the second half from the field, making 20-of-29 shots, including six 3-pointers, storming back in the final five minutes before falling just short.

Anne Marie Lanning scored 13 points and Jackie Pickel came off the bench to hit three 3-pointers and net 11 for Middle Tennes-

"This was a tough win but we did what we needed to do," head coach Rick Insell said. "We started a little slow but then we picked it up, knocking down some shots and picking up our defense and that was a big factor. This is a tough road trip and we got the first one and that's what counts "

Sara Benham led four Pioneers (10-16, 5-10) in double figures with 18, including the 1,000th-point of her career. Alisha Godette scored 14 points, all in the second half, while Nnenna Akotaobi and Andie Mason both posted 12 points.

After making just two of their first 10 shots in the game, the Blue Raiders hit 10 of the next 12 from the field, outscoring the Pioneers, 28-4, over a seven-minute stretch. Middle Tennessee hit five 3-pointers during the stretch, all from different players, and Holt scored eight points, including a pair of old-fashioned 3-point plays.

The Raiders shot 49 percent in the half after their miserable start and Holt netted 18 points. Six of the eight players on the squad scored and the Blue Raiders committed just four turnovers. The defense also forced Denver into 13 miscues, resulting in 16 Middle Tennessee points.

Latova Barclay's 3-pointer with 2.9 seconds remaining tied the contest and Amber Holt scored nine of her game-high 34 points in overtime, as the Blue Raiders erased a seven-point deficit in the final minutes and defeated Florida Atlantic, 89-84, at FAU Arena Saturday evening.

The Blue Raiders (18-10, 13-4) continued to battle despite being down almost the entire game and being in foul trouble. Barclay provided the biggest game of her career-high at the most opportune time, netting 11 of her career-best 22 in the final three minutes of regulation, including an old-fashioned 3-point play with 3:12 remaining, a 15-footer at 2:58 and then the tying 3-pointer from the wing in the final seconds.

On the play Jackie Pickel was fouled setting the pick for Barclay, but Pickel missed both free throws that would have secured the win in regulation.

Nonetheless, the Blue Raiders started quickly in overtime, with Holt scoring four straight times up the floor and FAU (6-19, 2-14) committing three turnovers on its end. Middle Tennessee outscored the Owls, 11-6, in the extra period, moving closer to a first-round bye in the upcoming Sun Belt Championships.

The game was back-and-forth in the second half until FAU scored seven straight points in the middle of the period to take the lead for good. Jaimie Givens had two buckets and Brittany Bowe hit two free throws for the Owls, as Middle Tennessee went without a bucket for almost five minutes at one point.

But Holt's bucket with 6:30 remaining in the regulation started a frantic pace down the stretch where the Blue Raiders scored 22 points over the final 6:30. Holt had six during the stretch, but the show belonged to the senior Barclay.

She hit a runner in the lane plus the foul with 3:12 left to cut the FAU lead to 70-65. She followed with a jumper 14 seconds later that cut the deficit to four. Anne Marie Lanning made one free throw on the next trip up the floor for the Blue Raiders before making a leaner in the lane with 1:37 left, making it 73-70 FAU.

The Owls left the door open for the visitors by failing to convert from the foul line, making only 11-of-23 in the second half. Bowe made one foul shot with 25.6 seconds left and two more with 12.3 seconds remaining, but Barclay's 3-pointer tied the contest and the Blue Raiders pulled out the victory in overtime.

Holt played all 45 minutes in the game and tied her career-high with 15 rebounds to go with her 34 points. Lanning added 14 for the Blue Raiders, who committed a season-high 22 turnovers but still survived.

Bowe led the Owls with 23 points, while Givens scored 19 and Carla Stubbs netted 15 for FALL

Florida Atlantic started fast, hitting seven of its first 10 shots and racing out to a 14-9 advantage. FAU led 23-17 before the Blue Raiders put together a 13-2 run to take a five-point advantage with 4:06 remaining in the half.

The Lady Raiders' victory before a crowd of 4,307 earned them a No. 3 seed and first-round bye into the Sun Belt Conference Tournament and an automatic spot into the quarterfinals at the Mitchell Center in Mobile Ala

"It's real important right now," said Insell, whose squad is down to eight players. "We've talked about it for two weeks about how we decided our own destiny."

MTSU (19-10, 14-4) labored offensively most of the game until senior forward Amber Holt caught fire in the second half and scored five straight field goals to help rally the Lady Raiders from a 38-33 deficit to a 44-42 lead with eight minutes remaining.

Holt, who was double-teamed the entire game, got her teammates open looks with kickouts, but MTSU made just 5-of-27 from 3-point range, including missing all 11 attempts in the second half.

"The coaches told me I needed to take shots," Holt said. "Once i I made a couple, the offense starting coming."

Senior guard Latoya Barclay hit two key jumpers in the lane that helped lift MTSU to a 58-46 advantage and breathing room with 2:28 remaining.

"I just said if I was going to come off the pick, I was going to do something with it," Barclay said. "... If we'd hit our shots in the first half, we'd have been up by 20 or 30."

MTSU went 8-1 at home in Sun Belt play this season. During Barclay's and fellow senior Starr Orr's career, MTSU lost just once to Sun Belt foe during that span.

"I really didn't even realize that," Barclay said. "That's quite an accomplishment for us."

In her final Murphy Center appearance, Holt scored a teamhigh 23 points, pulled down seven rebounds, dished out five assists and recorded four steals

Holt didn't score until the 11:37 mark of the first half when she gave the Lady Raiders a 15-7 lead.

MTSU led by as many as nine points in the first half, but it managed just one field goal during a nine-minute stretch.

Meanwhile, Troy made 13 of its 17 shots in the first half for a sizzling 77 percent and led by as many as three points. The game was tied at 29 at halftime

Troy committed 16 first-half turnovers, which led to 19 of MTSU's first-half points.

Chelsia Lymon had 10 points and Barclay added nine for MTSU, which shot just 36 percent. Troy shot 57 percent, but made just 8-of-20 field goals in the second half. The Trojans also had 30

Troy (12-17, 5-13) placed three players in double figures, led by Kylie Morrissy's 16 points.

Trailing by five points with 14:22 remaining, the Lady Raiders exploded on a 23-4 run, turning a back-and-forth game into a run-

Troy had just seven turnovers in the first half, but 13 in the second as MTSU's relentless defense finally wore the Trojans down.

Meanwhile, Amber Holt — the nation's leading scorer — poured in 22 of her game-high 33 points in the second half.

"Amber Holt is Amber Holt," said MTSU coach Rick Insell. "I got on to her at halftime because she had three guick turnovers and that's not like her. Then she came back in the second half and showed everybody why she is one of the top players in the coun-

During the pivotal run, Holt got plenty of help, as Latoya Barclay hit back-to-back jumpers to put MTSU (20-10) up 44-40, Jackie Pickel hit a long 3-pointer and Chelsia Lymon scored five straight

"You'll see that all night when we need it, we had so many kids step up," Insell said. "It was all night long — Chelsia Lymon, Latoya Barclay, Emily Queen, Jackie Pickel and Brandi Brown. They just stepped up all night."

Lymon added 11 points and Barclay netted 10.

"We knew coming in that it was going to be a tough game," Lymon said. "They've got seniors like we do and they played hard. It was an exciting game. I know some people might have got nervous, but it was an exciting game."
