

Ninth Inning Home Run Just Short in 4-3 Loss

Bishop has big late hit in loss to Bulldogs

WINCHESTER, Tenn. - Junior Rawley Bishop hit a solo home run in the bottom of the ninth to put the Blue Raiders within one but it was not enough as Mississippi State took a 4-3 win on Wednesday night. Bishop and freshman Bryce Brentz were the only Blue Raiders (26-22-1) to post double digit hits on the night as each went 2 for 5 with one run scored. Freshman PJ Francescon (1-3) had the longest outing of his career as he allowed three runs on five hits with four strikeouts in six innings of work. Junior Brett Smalley pitched two and two-thirds innings in relief allowing one run on two hits while junior Kevin Whittaker struck out the only batter he faced. As a team, Middle Tennessee notched seven hits with one double and one home run, both hit by Bishop, but left 11 runners on base. The Bulldogs (20-29) also had seven hits on the night with one double and two home runs but left only six runners on base as Michael Busby (1-4) took the win with his one and one-third innings of work allowing just one hit.
