This Week in Blue Raider Volleyball...

Middle Tennessee begins its season by playing host to the Blue Raider Bash. The Blue Raiders will face Idaho, Southeast Missouri State and South Dakota State in the two-day tournament with the first competition scheduled for 7:30 a.m. on Friday, August 29, against the Idaho Vandals.

Season Openers...

Middle Tennessee is 3-1 in season openers under head coach Matt Peck and 5-3 since 2000 when the school joined the Sun Belt Conference.

Making History...

The 2008 Middle Tennessee volleyball team will begin the season nationally ranked for the first time in school history. On Tuesday, August 19, the Blue Raiders were picked 15th in the AVCA Preseason Top 25.

The Blue Raiders received votes in every CSTV/AVCA Coaches Top 25 Poll in 2007 and ended season ranked 15th after posting the one of the best records in the country.

Introducing the 2008 Blue Raiders...

The team returns five starters along with four other letterwinners from 2007. Senior Ashley Asberry (Murfreesboro, Tenn.) is the lone senior leading the team. Five freshmen join the team this season: Kim Bell (Germantown, Tenn.), Lindsey Cheatham (Deerfield Beach, Fla.), Tosin Elebure (Coral Springs, Fla.), Brynne Henderson (Cincinnati, Ohio) and Courtney Wilson (Auburndale, Fla.).

Local Ladies...

Two players (Ashley Asberry and Lauren Britton) on the 2008 squad hail from Murfreesboro, while five others are from surrounding cities. Redshirt-freshman Stacy Oladinni is from nearby La Vergne, junior Janay Yancey is from Columbia, sophomore Laura Brock is from Chattanooga, redshirt junior Katie Brush is from Jackson, and freshman Kim Bell is from Germantown.

Preseason Honors...

Senior Ashley Asberry and junior Leslie Clark were named to the Sun Belt Conference Preseason Team as announced by the league office on Monday. The Blue Raiders were also picked to finish first in the East Division.

Scouting the Vandals...

Idaho returns nine starters from its 2007 squad, after a fifth place Western Athletic Conference finish with a 9-7 conference, 13-7 overall record. Head coach Debbie Buchanan begins her ninth season leading the Vandals, posting a 115-122 overall coaching record.

The Series: Middle Tennessee leads the series 1-0 after defeating the Vandals 3-1 in 2007.

Scouting the Redhawks...

Southeast Missouri State is coming off of a first place finish in the Ohio Valley Conference in 2007, with five starters plus libero returning. The Redhawks finished 20-12, 15-5 in conference play. The team is led by Renata Nowacki, who is in her fourth season as head coach with a 52-46 overall record.

The Series: Southeast Missouri State leads the all-time series 21-0 with the two schools last meeting in 1999.

Scouting the Jackrabbits...

South Dakota State is coming off a first place finish in the Summit Conference after posting a 13-3 conference and 25-11 overall record in 2007. The Jackrabbits return five starters under first year coach Nana Allison-Brewer.

SDSU fell to Nebraska in the first round of the NCAA tournament 3-0 in the school's first NCAA tournament appearance in any sport.

The Series: First meeting.

All-America Adams, Asberry...

Juniors outside hitter Ashley Adams (Columbus, Ohio) and Ashley Asberry (Murfreesboro, Tenn.) earned AVCA All-America honors in 2007. The pair led the Blue Raiders in kills, kills per game, hitting percentage, block assists and total blocks during the 2007 season. Both were named to the All-South Region team and Adams was a two-time Sun Belt Player of the Week selection.

Win Streaks...

Middle Tennessee's 14 match win streak, which tied for the longest in school history, was snapped in the 3-0 loss to BYU. Earlier in the season, Western Kentucky snapped an 11 match win streak for the Blue Raiders handing them their second loss of the season. Middle Tennessee won its first 10 games of the 2007 season but lost to Missouri State after playing host to the Blue Raider Bash.

2007 Season...

The Blue Raiders posted 35-3 record in 2007 which is the best record ever by a Middle Tennessee volleyball team. In 1995, Middle Tennessee ended the season 32-7 and took its first trip to the NCAA Tournament.

2007 Postseason Recap...

For the second consecutive year the Blue Raiders received an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. Middle Tennessee made its third trip to the NCAA Tournament after making its first appearance in 1995.

For the second consecutive year Middle Tennessee defeated Louisville 3-2 in the first round. In 2006, the Blue Raiders defeated Louisville 3-2 in the first round of the tournament.

The Blue Raiders sealed a spot in history with a 3-1 win over Hawai'i to advance to the regionals for the first time in school history. Middle Tennessee's win over Hawai'i handed the Rainbow Wahine its first ever loss in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Blue Raiders in League Play...

In 2007, Middle Tennessee posted its best season in Sun Belt conference play since joining the league in 2000. The Blue Raiders ended the season 16-1; this is the most wins in Sun Belt Conference play by a Middle Tennessee team since joining the conference. The Blue Raiders clinched the East Division Sun Belt Conference title and the No. 1 seed in the conference tournament after defeating Western Kentucky 3-0.

All-Conference Honors...

The Blue Raiders racked up on conference honors in 2007 including Player of the Year and Coach of the Year. Junior Ashley Adams was named Player of the Year after leading the league in 2007. Head coach Matt Peck received Coach of the Year honors after leading the Blue Raiders to one of their best seasons in school history. Adams along with teammates junior Ashley Asberry and sophomore Leslie Clark were named First Team All-Conference.

Sun Belt Conference Tournament...

Middle Tennessee was the No. 1 seeded team in the tournament hosted by the University of Denver on Nov. 15-17. The Blue Raiders held true to form defeating Arkansas State, Florida International and Western Kentucky to take home the tournament title. This is the second consecutive year the Blue Raiders have won the SBC tournament and an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. Quanshell Scott, Leslie Clark and Ashley Adams were all named to the All-Tournament team for their performances during the SBC Tournament. Adams also received Most Outstanding Player, which was her fifth MVP or MOP award of the year.

Academic All-District...

Sophomore Leslie Clark and junior Ashley Adams received ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District honors in 2007.

Clark received First Team recognition in District 4. The Olathe, Kan., native is an elementary education major with a 3.93 GPA.

Adams was named to the District 4 Second Team. The Columbus, Ohio native is majoring in political science (pre-law) with a 3.45 GPA.

Head Coach Matt Peck...

Matt Peck is in his fifth season at the helm of the Blue Raider volleyball program.

Last season, Peck led the Blue Raiders to the best finish in school history. After winning its second straight Sun Belt Conference title, Middle Tennessee defeated Louisville and then Hawaii to advance to the NCAA Tournament Regional. The Blue Raiders ended the season ninth in the NCAA Tournament. Middle Tennessee posted an impressive 35-3 overall record during the historical season.

Ashley Adams and Ashley Asberry each earned All-America honors as they helped guide the Blue Raiders throughout the season. Adams was named MVP of every tournament Middle Tennessee played in and Sun Belt Player of the Year. The pair was also named Sun Belt First Team All-Conference.

In 2006, Peck continued to build on the success of the program in 2005, leading the Blue Raiders to an NCAA Tournament berth and a first round win on the road at Louisville after winning the Sun Belt Tournament. The team fell to No. 18 Ohio State in the second round but posted a 27-8 overall record while finishing conference play in a three-way tie for first in the Sun Belt Eastern Division with a record of 14-3. The win in game one against OSU in the NCAA Tournament snapped a 30-game winning streak for the Buckeyes.

Middle Tennessee picked its first All-American honor under Peck in sophomore Ashley Adams. Adams earned the honor after being named First Team All-Conference, Most Valuable Player of the Sun Belt Tournament and All-South Region.

In just his second year, Peck led the Blue Raiders to their first Sun Belt Tournament Championship match appearance since joining the league. Middle Tennessee's No. 2 seed in the tournament in 2005 and 10-2 record in Sun Belt matches is

the best mark in school history, and the Blue Raiders 28 wins is a tie for second-most wins in school history.

With Peck at the helm, Middle Tennessee received a Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Year award in Alicia Lemau'u. It was also during Peck's watch that Ashley Adams became the first Blue Raider volleyball player in school history to be named AVCA National Player of the Week.

With 24 years of coaching experience, Peck has an overall career record of 605-225*. Prior to arriving at Middle Tennessee in February 2004, Peck spent nine seasons at the University of North Alabama.

Fans may notice evidence of several rule changes that have been implemented for the 2008 season. Here are some of the more significant changes.

Rule Changes

Coaches Position: When the ball is in play, coaches will be asked to stay at least 1.75 meters from the court's sideline. An imaginary line perpendicular to the outside edge of the extended attack line indicates this distance. If a coach doesn't comply, the referees may assess a team delay sanction.

Terminology: The term "game" will be changed to "set". A match still consists of the best three out of five sets.

Points Required to Win a Set: Instead of 30 points, the number of points needed to win sets one through four is now 25 (and a two-point lead). Fifteen points (and a two-point lead) is still the requirement to win the fifth (deciding) set.

Substitutions: Each team is now allowed a maximum of 12 substitutions per set.

Points of Emphasis

Ball Handling Decisions: In recent years, referee training has emphasized focusing on the player's contact point with the ball, and not allowing outside influences, such as spin after release, to influence ball handling decisions. A 2008 point of emphasis regarding the second team contact now instructs referees to only call multiple contacts that are obvious enough to be readily seen, and to be less severe when judging extremely athletic plays.
