No. 13 Tennessee on tap for Blue Raiders

Middle Tennessee plays host to No. 13 Tennessee to conclude a three-game homestand to start the season. The Volunteers are 2-0 with wins against in-state foes Chattanooga and UT-Martin, both in Knoxville. Tennessee is averaging 102.5 points per game and has had at least five players in double figures (including two players with double doubles) in both contests. Junior forward Tyler Smith leads Tennessee with 20 points, four rebounds and five assists per game, while junior center Wayne Chism is averaging a double double with 12.5 points and 11.5 rebounds. Freshman Scotty Hopson was named the SEC Freshman of the Week earlier this week. Head Coach Bruce Pearl is 79-24 in his fourth season at Tennessee.

Tennessee makes first regular season visit to Murphy Center

Middle Tennessee and Tennessee have met seven previous times with Tennessee owning a 6-1 lead in the series but Friday's meeting marks the first time the teams have played at Murphy Center - Middle Tennessee's home venue - for a regular-season game. Middle Tennessee beat Tennessee, 85-80, at Murphy Center in the first game of the series March 3, 1988; however, it was a NIT postseason contest. The teams have played six times since with five games taking place in Knoxville and the other one in Nashville. Tennessee has won six straight in the series.

Nationally-ranked teams at home rare for Blue Raiders

No. 13 Tennessee is the highest-ranked team to play Middle Tennessee at Murphy Center since No. 6 Kansas visited Dec. 5, 1999 which also is the last time the Blue Raiders played a ranked team on their home court. The highest-ranked team ever to play Middle Tennessee at Murphy Center was No. 3 North Carolina, Nov. 30, 1998. Tennessee is the highest-ranked team to play a Sun Belt team on its home court since New Orleans played host to No. 7 Villanova, Dec. 22, 1995. Middle Tennessee has wins vs. two Top 20 teams since 1985 and both have occurred during the postseason. The highest-ranked team Middle Tennessee has beaten is Kentucky, which was ranked No. 15 when the Blue Raiders beat them in the first round of the 1982 NCAA Tournament.

Record attendance anticipated

Middle Tennessee's game vs. No. 13 Tennessee was sold out days prior to tipoff and could result in a new single-game attendance record at Murphy Center. The current record is 11,807, set against WKU Feb. 26, 2004. Tennessee's only other visit to Murphy Center in the first round of the NIT in 1988 drew a crowd of 11,520 - tied for fourth on the single-game list. If a new record is established vs. Tennessee, the top two marks would have come under Kermit Davis. Prior to his arrival in 2002 Middle Tennessee had one sellout since 1975.

Blue Raiders On the Air

All Middle Tennessee basketball games may be heard on 106.7-FM The Fan, as well as WGNS 1450-AM, 100.5-FM, and 101.9-FM. All Blue Raider broadcasts also are carried on the web at GoBlueRaiders.com. Nine-time SEC Broadcaster of the Year Charlie McAlexander begins his second season as the Blue Raiders' play-by-play announcer in 2008-09, with Chip Walters providing color analysis. McAlexander won the prestigious Lindsey Nelson Award in 2006 and he is the only announcer in SEC history to be named Sportscaster of the Year at four different league schools in four different states (Mississippi, Vanderbilt, Kentucky and South Carolina.) McAlexander was elected to the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association (NSSA) Board of Directors in 1993 and he was named President of the association in 1995.

Kermit Davis Call-in Show

The Kermit Davis Call-In Show begins Monday, Jan. 5 and airs each Monday for the remainder of the season. The weekly radio show can be heard at 106.7-FM, WGNS 1450-AM, 100.5-FM, and 101.9-FM. Kermit Davis TV Show

The Kermit Davis television show airs each week on CSS, CSN49, and CSS Regional. Kermit Davis and host Chip Walters will review the previous week with commentary and highlights, as well as preview the week ahead. The show airs Monday at 6:30 a.m. on CSS and 7:30 p.m., on CSN49. The show also airs regionally and is available in 10 states and 6.3 million homes each Wednesday at 3:30 p.m., on CSS. The Kermit Davis Show is also available free ON DEMAND to all digital cable subscribers each Wednesday.

Middle Tennessee players will not be available for any media activities on the day of the game at home or away; however, head coach Kermit Davis will be available following the team's gameday preparation practice. Media are suggested to contact Tony Stinnett in advance to arrange this interview.

Yates named Mid-Major All-American

Junior forward Desmond "Boogie" Yates has been named to the CollegeInsider.com Preseason Mid-Major All-American team. He is the only Sun Belt Conference player selected to the 25-player list. Yates also earned honorable mention recognition from CollegeHoops.net on its Mid-Major Preseason All-American team. Yates also was named Blue Ribbon Magazine's SBC Preseason Player of the Year, and Lindy's Magazine named him the SBC's Best NBA Prospect in its preseason honor roll.

Players within reach of career marks

Several Blue Raiders are chasing career records and milestones in 2008-09. Senior guard Kevin Kanaskie is closing in on Gerald Harris' career assists record that has stood for almost 20 years. Kanaskie is fourth on the career list with 385 helpers and needs 78 to set a new standard. He also is fifth all-time for 3-point field goals with 152 and needs 71 to break Robert Taylor's mark of 222. Kanaskie also is ninth all-time for free-throw percentage (.796) and also is on pace to set the all-time record for games played and most minutes played during a four-year career. Senior center Theryn Hudson's .605 field goal percentage is second all-time and he trails only Warren Kidd (.664) for the top spot. Hudson's 60 career blocks are fourth on the career list. Kidd owns the all-time mark with 185 blocks in a three-year career. Kanaskie and teammate Desmond Yates can also become the 28th and 29th players in program history to join the 1,000-point club. Kanaskie is 37th all-time in scoring at Middle Tennessee with 904 points and needs 96 to reach the milestone. Yates is 38th all-time in scoring with 889 points, needing just 101 to become a member of the 1,000-point club.

HEAD COACH KERMIT DAVIS

Kermit Davis File



In six-plus seasons at Middle Tennessee, Kermit Davis has established himself as one of the most successful men's basketball coaches in program history. The Blue Raiders registered four straight winning seasons under Davis to start

his Blue Raider coaching career, making him only one of two of the 19 Middle Tennessee men's basketball coaches to start his Blue Raider career with four straight winning campaigns. The Blue Raiders have averaged 17 wins in Davis' first six seasons, which is the second-best wins average after six seasons in program history. The Blue Raiders are one of three current league members to play in multiple SBC Championship games during this six-year span (2003, 2008). Davis earned his 100th win as Middle Tennessee's head coach when the Blue Raiders upset South Alabama in the semifinals of the 2008 SBC Championships. He became the second fastest to 100 wins among Blue Raider men's basketball coaches, reaching the milestone in 182 games. **Davis is third on the all-time wins list with 102.**

HEAD COACH KERMIT DAVIS

Davis notches milestone win

Head coach Kermit Davis became the second-fastest to reach 100 wins at Middle Tennessee when the Blue Raiders upset South Alabama, 82-73, in the semifinals of the 2008 Sun Belt Championships. Davis reached the milestone in his 182nd career game at Middle Tennessee. The 100 wins under Davis in his first six seasons represent the best six-year total for the program since 1988-93 (105 wins). The Blue Raiders have averaged 17 wins in Davis' first six seasons, which is the second-best wins average for any Middle Tennessee coach after six seasons.

Davis among coaching leaders

Kermit Davis joined Bruce Stewart as the only head coaches in program history to begin their Blue Raider careers with four straight winning seasons in 2005-06. **He currently has 102 wins.** Jimmy Earle is the program's all-time winningest coach with 164 wins. Davis also is third in winning percentage (.554) among Blue Raider men's basketball coaches with a minimum of 50 games coached, trailing only Jimmy Earle (.614), and Bruce Stewart (.648).

Davis secures career win 225

Kermit Davis secured his 225th win as a head coach when Middle Tennessee beat Denver, 68-50 (1/5/08) at Murphy Center. Davis owns 173 wins in his 11th season at the Division I level and he won 66 in three years as a junior college head coach. **He currently has 239 career victories as a head coach.**

Davis among Sun Belt's all-time winningest coaches

Middle Tennessee coach Kermit Davis is second in all-time victories among active Sun Belt coaches with 51, trailing only Ronnie Arrow in his second stint at South Alabama. Overall, Davis is 12th among the league's all-time winningest coaches in Sun Belt play with 51 victories. Next on the list is former UNCC/USF coach Lee Rose with 53 wins. The all-time Sun Belt wins leader is Gene Bartow, who won 111 games during his 12 seasons at former conference member UAB. These totals only include regular-season conference wins.

Middle Tennessee among SBC's best under Davis

Middle Tennessee is one of three league members (WKU, Louisiana-Lafayette) to play in multiple SBC Championship games (2003, 2008) since 2003, and it is just one of three SBC members (WKU, South Alabama) to reach the quarterfinals in each of the last six years. Middle Tennessee and WKU are the only SBC schools to reach the league's semifinals five times in the last six years.

Coaches peg Middle Tennessee team to beat in SBC East

Middle Tennessee was the overwhelming favorite to win the Sun Belt's East Division in the Preseason Coaches Poll released at Media Days in October. The Blue Raiders received 11 of a possible 13 first-place votes and 76 total points to outdistance South Alabama, which was picked second with 60 points and received the remaining two first-place votes. WKU was picked third in the East with 52 points. The top three teams in the West Division were separated by one point in preseason balloting. UALR and North Texas tied for first with 76 points and Louisiana-Lafayette was third with 75 points.

Yates SBC Preseason Player of Year; Kanaskie named All-SBC

Junior forward Desmond "Boogie" Yates was voted Sun Belt Preseason Player of the Year at the league's annual Media Days. Yates was an all-first team performer as a sophomore. He also was named to the All-SBC first team. Senior guard Kevin Kanaskie was named to the All-SBC second team.

Middle Tennessee No. 17 in preseason Top 25 Mid-Major poll

Middle Tennessee is ranked No. 17 in the preseason Mid-Major Top 25 poll released by Collegelnsider.com. The Blue Raiders received 203 points in the balloting and are ranked ahead of future foes Belmont (18) and South Alabama (19). Gonzaga is ranked No. 1, followed by Davidson and St. Mary's. Head Coach Kermit Davis has been selected to serve as chairman of the panel for the 2008-09 season.

Blue Raiders popular pick for publications

Middle Tennessee was picked as the preseason favorite to win the Sun Belt's East Division by league coaches but national publications that release preseason polls also have jumped on the Blue Raider bandwagon. Middle Tennessee was voted the Sun Belt's preseason favorite by Blue Ribbon Magazine, Athlon, Lindy's, and Rivals.com. Blue Ribbon Magazine named Desmond Yates its preseason player of the year in the Sun Belt and placed him on the preseason All-SBC team. Yates also was named Preseason All-SBC by Lindy's and Athlon. Lindy's also named senior guard Kevin Kanaskie to its All-SBC second team. Additionally, Lindy's cited three Blue Raiders as being among the league's best players. The magazine named Yates the SBC's best NBA prospect; Kanaskie the league's best playmaker; and Calvin O'Neil the best defender.

Backcourt draws rave reviews from Blue Ribbon Magazine

An experienced backcourt is part of the reason for optimism regarding Middle Tennessee basketball in 2008-09 and Blue Ribbon Magazine believes the Blue Raiders sport the best backcourt in the Sun Belt. In its rating of the league's top backcourts, Blue Ribbon listed Middle Tennessee first, followed by North Texas and Louisiana-Lafayette. The Blue Raiders return all three starting guards from 2007-08 in Kevin Kanaskie, Nigel Johnson and Demetrius Green.

Hudson questionable for Tennessee, Green returns

Senior center Theryn Hudson (ankle) missed both exhibition games and the first two regular-season games with an ankle injury and his status for Friday's game vs. Tennessee is questionable. Senior guard Demetrius Green returns from a four-game suspension for his first action of the season vs. the Vols.

Blue Raiders eye 3-0 start

Middle Tennessee will be gunning for its first 3-0 start in seven seasons against Houston Baptist. The Blue Raiders last started 3-0 in 2001-02.

Yates moves up career scoring list

Preseason Sun Belt Player of the Year Desmond "Boogie" Yates racked up 19 points on 8-of-11 shooting vs. Houston Baptist for move into 38th on the all-time scoring list with 899 points. He is one spot behind teammate Kevin Kanaskie and both players are closing in on the top 30.

Yates' scoring binges key victories

Desmond "Boogie" Yates has registered 15 games with 20-plus points in his career and the Blue Raiders are 11-4 in those games, including 1-0 this season. He has scored double figures in 47 of 66 career games (71 percent), including 15 straight and 23 of the last 25. The high-scoring Yates is shooting 76 percent (16-of-21) from the field and has raised his career field goal percentage to 56.5 percent, which is tied for seventh all time. Yates led the Blue Raiders in scoring for the 28th time with 19 vs. Houston Baptist. He has been the team's leading scorer in 42 percent of 66 career games.

Kanaskie enjoys strong start

Heralded guard Kevin Kanaskie set records, reached milestones and tied all-time Blue Raider greats with one of his best performances in a career filled with memorable ones against Trevecca. Kanaskie enjoyed his third career double double with 22 points and 11 assists. Kanaskie tied former great Duane Washington for the most career double-figure assist games in school history (4). The 11 assists tied for 13th most in a single game. He also tied the school record for 3-point field goal percentage by going 6-of-6 from 3-point range. Kanaskie surpassed 150 career 3-pointers and 375 career assists in the impressive outing. He has 20 assists and just three turnovers in the first two games. Kanaskie is averaging a double double with 15.5 points and 10.0 assists per game.

Kanaskie takes unconventional approach for double doubles

The conventional double double is points and rebounds but Middle Tennessee players have turned in nine such games dating back to 1985 using a different approach and Kanaskie has produced three of the nine. Kanaskie produced his third career double double with 22 points and 11 assists in the opener. Each of his three double doubles has consisted of points and assists. Kanaskie narrowly missed a second straight double double with nine points and nine assists vs. Houston Baptist.

Extended 3-point line doesn't hurt record-setting Blue Raiders

The NCAA extend the men's basketball 3-point line one foot to 20-feet, nine-inches in order to make the great equalizer in the sport a bit more difficult for the 2008-09 season. The added distance didn't hurt Middle Tennessee shooters in the opener. The Blue Raiders established a new single-game record for 3-point field goal percentage, scorching the nets to the tune of 66.7 percent (12-of-18) to best the previous mark of 64.7 (11-of-17) against UT-Martin during the 1999-00 season. Middle Tennessee shot 89 percent from beyond the arc in the opening half by knocking down eight of nine attempts. The eight treys tied for the second-most in one half in a single game.

SBC's star power rests in East Division?

Four of the five players selected to the Preseason All-SBC first team by league coaches hail from the East Division and seven of the top 10 players (first and second teams) are from the East Division. Middle Tennessee is one of three teams to have two players listed on the first or second team (Kevin Kanaskie, Desmond Yates), joining South Alabama and North Texas.

O'Neil enjoys successful comeback

Junior Calvin O'Neil returned to the court for Middle Tennessee one year after suffering a season-ending injury in the 07-08 opener and earned starts in both games to date. O'Neil is showing signs of the solid guard was prior to the injury. O'Neil is averaging 10 points, 5.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists in the first two games. He scored 10 points in each of the first two contests, marking the 12th time he has produced double figures. Middle Tennessee is 10-2 in those games.

Sharing the wealth: Blue Raiders assist all but six baskets in win

Middle Tennessee players combined to assist a staggering 84 percent of the team's 38 field goals in their season-opening win. The Blue Raiders' 32 assists tied for the fifth most in a single game. Kevin Kanaskie led with 11 helpers. In fact, guards Kanaskie, Nigel Johnson, Eric Allen, and Demario Williams combined for 24 assists and just three turnovers for a 7-to-1 assist/turnover ratio. Kanaskie had 11 assists and one turnover, Johnson had five assists and no turnovers, Allen had three assists and no turnovers, and Williams had five assists and two turnovers.

80 is a good number

When Middle Tennessee has been able to light up the scoreboard under Head Coach Kermit Davis the results have been staggering. Middle Tennessee has won 97 percent of the 32 games in which it has scored 80 or more points in Davis' six-plus seasons. The Blue Raiders are 31-1 in such games. The only time Middle Tennessee failed to win under Davis when scoring more than 80 was an 85-83 overtime setback at Western Kentucky, Feb. 24, 2005. The Blue Raiders have won 16 straight overall when scoring 80 or more points. They are 65-16 under Davis when scoring 70 or more points.

Difficult to beat with the lead

Middle Tennessee has been solid playing with the lead under seventh-year Head Coach Kermit Davis. The Blue Raiders are 77-15 under Davis when they lead at the half, and they have won an astounding 87 percent (89-13) of the 102 games in which they have led with five minutes remaining.

Outshooting opposition a key

Outshooting the opposition does not guarantee victory for Middle Tennessee but it is a trend that comes as close to perfection as any under coach Kermit Davis. The Blue Raiders are 86-12 overall under Davis when the shooting percentage is higher than the opponent. They had won 29 straight when outshooting the opposition before suffering a 75-69 OT setback to Toledo in 2006-07, despite shooting 58 percent. Middle Tennessee has won 58 of the last 68 games when it has a higher shooting percentage.

Did you know?

Middle Tennessee has hit at least one 3-pointer in 371 consecutive games. The last time the Blue Raiders failed to hit a shot from beyond the arc was Jan. 20, 1996 at Morehead State.

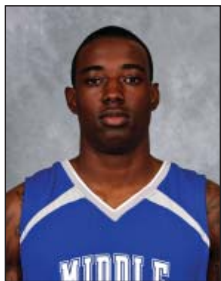
What's in a name?
