This Week in Blue Raider Volleyball...

Middle Tennessee defeated UAB 3-0 on Tuesday night to begin the week on a high note. The Blue Raiders open Sun Belt action on Friday with rival Western Kentucky. It will be the only match of the weekend for Middle Tennessee.

Sun Belt Action...

Middle Tennessee opened Sun Belt action 1-0 after a thrilling 3-2 win over Western Kentucky.

Blocking Machine...

Senior Janay Yancey has really picked up the pace on the defensive side of the net. Against Western Kentucky, Yancey had three solo blocks and a career-high 14 block assists posting 17 total blocks in the game. The Columbia, Tenn., native had 19 total blocks in the two matches to guide the block for the team.

Closing in on 1,000...

Senior Ashley Mead and junior Izabela Kozon are closing in on the 1,000 kill mark for their careers. Mead needs just 33 as she has 967 while Kozon is looking for 37 as she had 963 total kills.

Closing in on 5,000...

Already Middle Tennessee's all-time assists leader, senior Leslie Clark is closing in on 5,000 assists in her career. The Olathe, Kan., native currently has 4,854 assists and needs just 146 to reach the milestone.

UT-San Antonio Classic...

After Rice dropped out of the tournament due to illness the schedule changed for the Blue Raiders pitting them against No. 3 Washington first. The Blue Raiders played well the first two sets despite losing but the Huskies took all control in the third set to take the 3-0 win. Middle Tennessee snapped its six-match losing streak on Saturday with a 3-0 win over tournament host UTSA. Seniors Leslie Clark and Ashley Mead were named to the All-Tournament team after their impressive performances.

Miami/FIU Invitational...

The Blue Raiders travelled to Miami hoping to snap its two-match losing streak that began during the Blue Raider Bash. Middle Tennessee was unable to turn things around falling to Albany, Miami and No. 22 Florida State. Senior Ashley Mead and sophomore Stacy Oladinni were named to the All-Tournament team for their performances during the weekend.

Blue Raider Bash...

Middle Tennessee began the Blue Raider Bash on a high note with a 3-1 victory over Georgia Tech. The Blue Raiders won the match on a fourth set nail biter improving to 4-0 on the season.

The next day was not as good for the Blue Raiders. After defeating Northern Illinois 3-0

to begin the day, Middle Tennessee fell to Northern Iowa 3-0 in its second match. Then the Blue Raiders fell to Ohio 3-0 to close the weekend.

Middle Tennessee Invitational...

The Blue Raiders began the 2009 season the same way they did in 2008, undefeated. Middle Tennessee took wins over Kansas, Murray State and Xavier on its way to the Middle Tennessee Invitational title. Senior Leslie Clark and sophomore Stacy Oladinni were named to the All-Tournament team while junior Izabela Kozon was named Most Valuable Player. Kozon led the Blue Raiders in kills in each match, collecting 46 on the weekend, while Oladinni led the defense at the net with nine total blocks.

Losing Streaks...

Middle Tennessee's six-match losing streak was the longest since the Blue Raiders lost seven straight matches from Sept. 20 through Oct. 8 in 2003.

Success under Peck...

Since head coach Matt Peck took over the program in 2004, the Blue Raiders have not started the season 3-0 just twice.

vs. rival Western Kentucky...

Middle Tennessee is 3-14 all-time in its first meeting of the season with the Blue Raiders winning the first meeting for the first time in eight seasons. Until Sept. 25, 2009 Middle Tennessee had not won the first contest between the two schools since Sept. 23, 1997 when it defeated the Hilltoppers 3-0 in Bowling Green, Ky.

Since 1997, the Blue Raiders hold a 5-7 record against Western Kentucky after the first meeting of the season.

Season Openers...

Middle Tennessee is 5-1 in season openers under head coach Matt Peck and 7-3 since 2000 when the school joined the Sun Belt Conference.

Young players add depth...

Newcomers have added depth to the Blue Raider arsenal during the 2009 season. Junior Alyssa Wistrick and freshmen Brandi Waller and Halie Vannoy have all seen

Scouting the Owls...

Florida Atlantic ended the opening weekend of Sun Belt action 1-1 defeating South Alabama but falling to Troy. In the five-set battle with the Trojans Krystena Castro notched a team high 18 kills with three others posting double-digit kills.

The Series: Middle Tennessee leads the all-time series 6-2. The Blue Raiders won both meetings in 2008.

Scouting the Golden Panthers...

In her first weekend back this season Yarimar Rosa led Florida International to wins over South Alabama and Troy to open Sun Belt play. Rosa ended the weekend with 32 kills as she averaged 5.33 kills per set.

The Series: Middle Tennessee leads the all-time series 11-4. The Blue Raiders were 1-1 against FIU in 2008.

Preseason Honors...

Senior Leslie Clark and Izabela Kozon were named to the Sun Belt Conference Preseason Team as announced by the league office on Tuesday. The Blue Raiders were also picked to finish second in the East Division.

Introducing the 2009 Blue Raiders...

The team returns five starters and its libero along with three other letterwinners from 2008. After having just one senior a year ago, the Blue Raiders have four seniors leading the way this season. Six freshmen join the team this season: Ashley Adams-Williams (San Luis Obispo, Calif.), Brandi Waller (New Albany, Ind.), Jasmine Tipton (Antioch, Tenn.), Morgan Peterson (Seymour, Tenn.) and Halie Vannoy (Morristown, Tenn.). Junior transfer Alyssa Wistrick (Longview, Wash.) rounds out the newcomers for Middle Tennessee.

Local Ladies...

For the first time in four years there is no player from Murfreesboro, Tenn., but six players are from the state of Tennessee. Redshirt-sophomore Stacy Oladinni is from nearby La Vergne while senior Janay Yancey is from Columbia. Four freshman round out the group as Stephanie Daniels is from Nashville, Jasmin Tipton hails from Antioch, Morgan Peterson is from Seymour and Halie Vannoy is from Morristown.

My Name Is ...

There are three players on the 2009 squad with the name Ashley (Adams-Williams, Mead, Waugh). Two of those three (Mead and Waugh) are seniors and have played together since their freshmen seasons.

Senior Leslie Clark is first on the all-time career assists list after recording 43 assists against Troy on in 2008. The Olathe, Kan., native now has 4,807 assists as she passed Megan Sumrell who held the record with 4,020. Clark is just the second Blue Raider in history to reach 4,000 assists in a career.

MATT PECK

HEAD COACH • MICHIGAN, 1980

Matt Peck is in his fifth season at the helm of the Blue Raider volleyball program.

Last season, Peck and his team received the first at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament in program history. The Blue Raiders played in their third consecutive NCAA Tournament advancing to the second round.

The team posted a 27-8 record the same record it had in 2006 when it won an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament for the first time under Peck. Ashley Asberry and Leslie Clark helped guide the team throughout the season receiving First Team All-Conference honors while Izabela Kozon was named to the Second Team.

In 2007, Peck led the Blue Raiders to the best finish in school history. After winning its second straight Sun Belt Conference title, Middle Tennessee defeated Louisville and then Hawaii to advance to the NCAA Tournament Regional. The Blue Raiders ended the season ninth in the NCAA Tournament. Middle Tennessee posted an impressive 35-3 overall record during the historical season.

Middle Tennessee's No. 1 seed in the tournament in 2007 and 16-1 record in Sun Belt matches is the best mark in school history, and the Blue Raider's 35 wins set the record for most wins in school history.

Ashley Adams and Ashley Asberry each earned All-America honors as they helped guide the Blue Raiders throughout the season. Adams was named MVP of every tournament Middle Tennessee played in and Sun Belt Player of the Year. The pair was also named Sun Belt First Team All-Conference.

In 2006, Peck continued to build on the success of the program in 2005, leading the Blue Raiders to a NCAA Tournament berth and a first-round win on the road at Louisville after winning the Sun Belt Tournament. The team fell to No. 18 Ohio State in the second round but posted a 27-8 overall record while finishing conference play in a three-way tie for first with a record of 14-3. The win in game one against OSU snapped a 30-game winning streak for the Buckeyes.

Middle Tennessee picked up its first All-American honor under Peck in sophomore Ashley Adams. Adams earned the honor after being named First Team All-Conference, Most Valuable Player of the Sun Belt Tournament, and All-South Region.

In just his second year, Peck led the Blue Raiders to their first Sun Belt Tournament Championship match appearance since joining the league.

With Peck at the helm, Alicia Lemau' earned the Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Year award. It was also during Peck's watch that Ashley Adams became the first Blue Raider volleyball player in school history to be named AVCA National Player of the Week.

With 25 years of coaching experience, Peck has an overall career record of 633-233*. Prior to arriving at Middle Tennessee in February 2004, Peck spent nine seasons at the University of North Alabama.

In 2003, he led the Lions to an NCAA Division II

National Championship title and was named the 2003 American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) Tachikara Division II National Coach of the Year. He is also a four-time AVCA Region Coach of the Year (1998, 2000, 2003, 2007).

Peck guided North Alabama to its eighth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance in 2003, capped with the school's first-ever NCAA Championship with a 3-0 win over Concordia St. Paul. North Alabama finished the 2003 season with an overall record of 33-7. Overall, Peck is 19-8 all-time in NCAA Tournament play and compiled a record of 107-3 against Gulf South Conference opponents.

In his nine-year stint at North Alabama, Peck compiled a record of 312-61, which includes seven straight Gulf South Conference Championships and four appearances in the NCAA Division II Elite Eight. Peck is the only coach in GSC history to be selected coach of the year for three consecutive seasons (1996, 1997, 1998) and won the award four times overall. He also produced 20 All-Americans, and UNA set two individual and five NCAA Division II Tournament records under his guidance.

In 2002, UNA went 30-5, won the GSC volleyball title, and advanced to the NCAA Regional for the seventh time. In 2001, UNA was 32-4 and won its sixth straight GSC title before falling in the regional championship match.

It was 2000 when Peck and the Lions made their closest bid to the national title before winning it in 2003. UNA went 40-3 and reached the Division II Final Four for the first time. This included a 39-match win streak as well as GSC and NCAA Division II South Regional titles.

In 1999, the Lions went 35-7 and earned the school's second straight NCAA Division II South Central Regional championship and second consecutive appearance in the Division II Elite Eight. UNA also claimed a fourth straight GSC title.

In 1998, Peck led UNA to a 38-6 record and the Lions first-ever berth in the NCAA Division II Elite Eight. The Lions also climbed as high as seventh in the NCAA Division II national rankings.

In 1997, the Lions finished 39-5 on their way to a No. 8 national ranking, their second straight GSC championship and their second consecutive NCAA Regional appearance.

The 1996 Lions had a 44-4 record that included a Top 15 national ranking in Division II, a GSC Championship, and the first NCAA Tournament bid ever received by any collegiate volleyball team from the state of Alabama.

Peck joined UNA on July 17, 1995, inheriting a program that had enjoyed just three winning seasons in six years prior to his arrival. In his first season, Peck led UNA to a 21-20 record and third place finish in the GSC Tournament. The Lions recorded a 4-0 start, which was their best start in three years, and claimed the Francis Marion Invitational Championship. In 1996 UNA and Flowers Hall were selected as the site for the four-team NCAA Division II South Central Regional, where the Lions downed Texas Women's University before falling to Central Missouri

State in the championship game.

In 1998 UNA again hosted the NCAA Division II South Regional, and the Lions knocked off Alabama-Huntsville and Rockhurst to claim the school's first-ever regional volleyball title.

Before North Alabama, Peck coached in Michigan at Wayne State for 11 years. His best season came in 1986, when he guided WSU to a 32-6 record and a top 15 ranking among NCAA Division II schools. The 32 victories set a school record for wins in a season.

In 1987, WSU advanced to the NCAA Division II National Championships with a record of 27-7 and finished the season ranked No. 10. For his efforts in 1987, Peck was named GLIAC Coach of the Year. Wayne State also produced the school's first Division II volleyball All-American in 1987.

Wayne State was ranked in the Division II Top 20 four of Peck's last five years at the school. In 1992, WSU claimed three tournament championships and had a 17-0 mark against Division II opponents outside the GLIAC.

A 1980 graduate of the University of Michigan with a B.A. in psychology, Peck received his master's degree in physical education-sports administration from Wayne State in 1992. Peck is a native of Dearborn Heights, Mich.
