


# What players/fans are saying about Rick Stockstill

"First impressions always are a big deal, and I think he's made a big one. He told us he wants to win and that's what we want to do here at Middle Tennessee. "I was real excited. I think he said all of the things I expected him to say about getting back to fundamentals, and that excites me. He is going to take responsibility for the product on the field, and he understands his role as far as the responsibility of putting fans in the stadium. The way to get attendance up is to put a good product on the field, so it's good to see that he is willing to take responsibility for that. "I liken it back to (men's basketball coach) Kermit Davis. He took over a program in the same situation in a way. The program was down, attendance was down, and Kermit came in and said, 'we may not win every game but I guarantee you there will be a product on the court that is going to be worth coming to watch,' and it has been. Hopefully the same holds true with coach Stockstill. The students want to support the team but there have been so many times the past couple of seasons when they came, they were excited, and they left disappointed. It wasn't just that we lost, but how we lost."

**Bud Morris**

"It is a new era. We were so lucky to have 'Bubber' Murphy for 25 years, and then Boots Donnelly for 17 years, and then coach Andy 'Mac' for the last seven years, and I think it was great that coach Stockstill eluded to that in his speech today. We have a good base here. We do have a long to go,
