#### Blue Raiders begin four game road swing

Middle Tennessee will hit the road for a pair of matches this weekend, taking on Troy and South Alabama. The Blue Raiders are coming off a 3-0 sweep of arch-rival Western Kentucky on Wednesday.

#### **Scouting the Blue Raiders**

7 PM

After a 3-4 start, Middle Tennessee has won each of the past 12 matches, posting eight sweeps.

As has been the case for much of her career, the Blue Raiders are led by Izabela Kozon with a team-high 300 kills, recording 4.29 per set. Four other Blue Raiders have posted 100 or more kills, including Ashley Adams with 159 in just 47 sets played. Maria Szivos and Stacy Oladinni have 142 and 137, respectively. Lindsay Cheatham has recorded 108 in the category.

Defensively, Brynne Henderson holds the team lead in digs with 251, and Kozon is second at 156.

At the net, Oladinni has been a force to be reckoned with, averaging 1.17 blocks per set. The junior, who earned All-American honors last season, holds the team lead in the category with 82. Cheatham is second on the team with 69, including 13 of the solo variety.

#### **2010 BLUE RAIDERS**

#### **Scouting the Trojans**

Troy enter Friday's match with an 10-11 record after beating Alabama A&M in a midweek battle. The Trojans boast of a 2-2 Sun Belt record with wins over ULM and UALR. The Blue Raiders have not dropped a match to Troy since 1994.

This season, the Trojans are led by Natasha Kolunja with 194 kills, and Devin Von Pingel is right on her heels with 190 of her own. Brittany McClelland is third on the team with 161. Megan Henderson has been the primary setter with 695 assists, averaging 9.65 per set.

On defense, Courtney Cohen holds the team lead in digs with 319, and Henderson is second with 185. The trio of McClelland, Kolunja and Von Pingel have combined for 139 blocks.

#### **Scouting the Jaguars**

South Alabama are going into the weekend with 8-11 record, including a 3-1 Sun Belt record after a pair of five-set victories over both UALR and Arkansas State last week. The Blue Raiders have never lost to the Jaguars.

Juliana Almeida and Samia Salomao the primary offensive forces for USA, tallying 179 and 173 kills, respectively. Jessica Hagberg has 682 assists to this point in the season, averaging 9.74 per set.

Defensively, Salomao leads the team in digs with 251, and Jenna Hassell is second with 227. Torlandria Jones leads the blocking effort at the net and has 43 stoppers this season.

## 2010 BLUE RAIDERS

#### Middle Tennessee receiving votes

In the latest AVCA Top 25 poll, the Blue Raiders have received 14 votes, placing them 30th overall among vote-getters. The poll is voted on by the country's coaches, and this week marks the third consecutive week this season that Middle Tennessee has earned votes.

Entering the week, the NCAA had the Blue Raiders ranked 37th in RPI.

#### Among the nation's best

Entering play this week, the Blue Raiders were among the nations leaders in attack percentage, kills per set, assists per set, and blocks per set. The prolific Middle Tennessee offense ranked 15th in attack percentage at .281, and clocked in at 16th in kills per set (14.25) and 24th in assists per set (13.09). On defense, MT was 39th in blocks per set, averaging 2.50.

#### Raiders on a roll

Middle Tennessee is currently on an 12-match winning streak, something that is familiar territory for Matt Peck and the Blue Raiders. Since the 2006 season, MT has posted eight winning streaks of at least eight matches.

#### **Champion of Champions**

The Blue Raiders have played five defending regular season conference champions this season, posting a sterling 5-0 record. Over the past weekend, MT knocked off FIU, the reigning Sun Belt champion and a team that had not lost a regular season conference match since October of 2008. Previously, Middle Tennessee beat Southern Miss of Conference USA, Albany of the America East, Long Beach State of the Big West and VCU of the Colonial Athletic.

#### Kozon eying history

Izabela Kozon is currently second all-time in career kills for Middle Tennessee with 1,523 and eighth all-time in digs with 1,024. She is just the fourth Blue Raider to ever post at least 1,000 career kills and 1,000 career digs.

In 127 career matches, Kozon has reached double digits in kills on 90 occasions, and led the team in the category 56 times. She's also notched 10 or more digs in 42 instances, recording an impressive 34 double-doubles.

#### Kozon in the national spotlight

Kozon again made headlines after her dominating play against FIU and Florida Atlantic on Oct. 1 and 2. The senior earned a special mention for the American Volleyball Scouting Report Player of the Week, an award that honors international players currently plying their trade at American universities, and was named a College Volleyball Update Top Performer. Kozon recorded 45 kills and 21 digs and helped the Blue Raiders to a 2-0 weekend.

After a 64 kill and 42 dig stretch, Izabela Kozon earned nationwide acclaim, taking home the College Volleyball Update National Player of the Week award on Sept. 14. It was the second national award the senior received for helping the Blue Raiders to a pristine 4-0 week, as she was also recognized as the American Volleyball Scouting Report Player of the Week.

## Kozon takes home Sun Belt Player of the Week. Again.

Kozon earned her third Sun Belt Conference Player of the Week of the season on Oct. 4. She tallied 45 kills and 21 digs over two matches as the Blue Raiders improved to 5-0 in conference play. The honor marked the 13th time that a Blue Raider volleyball player has received the award. Kozon has now earned the accolade a school-record six times.

Once again, Izabela Kozon earned Sun Belt Player of the Week on Sept. 13, her second consecutive honor. The senior took home the MVP award for the Middle Tennessee Invitational with 64 kills and 42 digs over four matches, and leading Middle Tennessee to a 4-0 week that featured sweeps of previously unbeaten Kansas and defending America East champion Albany.

Previously, after earning All-Tournament honors at the Blue Raider Bash, Kozon was named Sun Belt Player of the Week on Sept. 7. The senior tallied 65 kills and three double-doubles over four matches for Middle Tennessee.

#### A well-traveled roster

Of the 13 players on the Middle Tennessee roster, 10 are from outside the state of Tennessee. Lindsay Cheatham is from Florida, and Sasha McGlothin and Angela Peyton are natives of Texas. Both Ashley Adams and Alyssa Wistrick make their homes on the west coast, in California and Washington, respectively. Kendall Howard comes to Murfreesboro from Colorado, Brandi Waller from Indiana, and Brynne Henderson from Ohio.

However, two athletes probably rack up more travel time than the rest of the roster combined. Iza Kozon is a native of Poland, and Maria Szivos calls Hungary her home.

#### Blue Raiders knock off No. 24 Long Beach State

On Sept. 18, Middle Tennessee knocked off five-time national champion Long Beach State in five sets. The match marked the first victory for the Blue Raiders over a ranked opponent since the 2007 NCAA Tournament, which featured victories over 24th-ranked Louisville and ninth-ranked Hawaii.

Middle Tennessee started the match on fire, winning a hard-fought first set and cruising to an impressive 25-9 second set victory to go up 2-0. However, the 49ers came roaring back out of the break to tie the affair at 2-2 and send it to a fifth and final set. LBSU appeared to be on a mission in the final stanza, grabbing a 6-9 lead, but the Blue Raiders would respond with five consective points and hold on to a slim margin to eventually wining, 17-15.

#### Middle Tennessee tabbed as favorite

For the third time in four seasons, the Blue Raiders were picked as the favorite in the Sun Belt Eastern Division by the conference's head coaches, just edging out defending regular season champion FIU. Three Blue Raiders were named to the Preseason All-Sun Belt Team, which led all schools. Senior Izabela Kozon and junior Stacy Oladinni appeared on the list after each earned All-SBC honors at the end of last season. Junior transfer Maria Szivos made it after an All-SBC performance for New Orleans in 2009.

#### Middle Tennessee in its 34th season

The Blue Raiders will begin their 34th season in 2010. Since 1984, the first season that full results are available, MT holds an overall record of 334-436. However the Blue Raiders are amid their most successful run in school history, having played in the last four NCAA Tournaments. Over that timespan, Middle Tennessee boasts of a 114-29 mark and a 59-9 record in Sun Belt play.

The 2009 campaign was certainly one to remember for the Blue Raiders, running up a 25-10 record against one of the toughest schedules in school history and knocking off FIU in the Sun Belt Championship match, the only loss to a conference opponent for the Golden Panthers last season. In the NCAA Tournament, MT fell in a tough back-and-forth five set match against host Colorado State in the first round.

# matt PECK Head Coach Michigan, 1980 Seventh Season

Matt Peck is in his seventh season at the helm of the Blue Raider volleyball program.

Last season, Peck led the Blue Raiders to their fourth consecutive NCAA tournament appearance after winning the Sun Belt Championship tournament, earning an automatic bid. Middle Tennessee ended the season with a 25-10 record and a 15-2 mark in conference action.

Stacy Oladinni was named to the South All-Region team by the AVCA. Oladinni also earned All-Sun Belt honors along with fellow Blue Raiders Leslie Clark, Izabela Kozon and Ashley Mead. Clark and Janay Yancey were awarded with All-Sun Belt Tournament accolades, and Mead took home the event's Most Outstanding Player award.

In the 2008 campaign, Peck guided Middle Tennessee to its third consecutive NCAA tournament appearance. The Blue Raiders defeated Miami (Ohio) in the first round to advance to the second round of the tournament for the third straight year. Middle Tennessee ended the season 27-8 and 14-3 in Sun Belt Conference action.

Ashley Asberry and Leslie Clark each earned All-American honors as they guided the Blue Raiders throughout the season. It was the third straight season at least one Blue Raider received All-American honors. The pair also received First Team All-Sun Belt honors, and Asberry was named to the All-Tournament team.

In 2007, Peck led the Blue Raiders to the best finish in school history. After winning its second straight Sun Belt Conference title, Middle Tennessee defeated Louisville and then Hawaii to advance to the NCAA Tournament Regional. The Blue Raiders ended the season ninth in the NCAA Tournament. Middle Tennessee posted an impressive 35-3 overall record during the historic season.

Ashley Adams and Ashley Asberry each earned All-America honors as they helped guide the Blue Raiders throughout the season. Adams was named MVP of every tournament Middle Tennessee played in and Sun Belt Player of the Year. The pair was also named Sun Belt First Team All-Conference.

In 2006, Peck continued to build on the success of the program in 2005, leading the Blue Raiders to a NCAA Tournament berth and a first round win on the road at Louisville after winning the Sun Belt Tournament. The team fell to No. 18 Ohio State in the second round but posted a 27-8 overall record while finishing conference play in a three-way tie for first with a record of 14-3. The win in game one against OSU snapped a 30-game winning streak for the Buckeyes.

Middle Tennessee picked up its first All-American honor under Peck in sophomore Ashley Adams. Adams earned the honor after being named First Team All-Conference, Most Valuable Player of the Sun Belt Tournament, and All-South Region.

In just his second year, Peck led the Blue Raiders

to their first Sun Belt Tournament
Championship match appearance
since joining the league. Middle Tennessee's No. 2 seed in the tournament
in 2005 and 10-2 record in Sun Belt
matches is the best mark in school
history, and the Blue Raider's 28 wins
is a tie for second-most wins in school history.

With Peck at the helm, Alicia Lemau'u earned the

Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Year award, and Ashley Adams became the first Blue Raider volleyball player to be named AVCA National Player of the Week.

With 24 years of coaching experience, Peck has an overall career record of 605-225. Prior to arriving at Middle Tennessee in February 2004, Peck spent nine seasons at the University of North Alabama.

In 2003, he led the Lions to an NCAA Division II National Championship title and was named the 2003 AVCA Tachikara Division II National Coach of the Year. He is also a four-time AVCA Region Coach of the Year (1998, 2000, 2003, 2007).

Peck guided North Alabama to its eighth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance in 2003, capped with the school's first-ever NCAA Championship with a 3-0 win over Concordia St. Paul. North Alabama finished the 2003 season with an overall record of 33-7. Overall, Peck is 19-8 all-time in NCAA Tournament play and compiled a record of 107-3 against Gulf South Conference opponents.

In his nine-year stint at North Alabama, Peck compiled a record of 312-61, which includes seven straight Gulf South Conference Championships and four appearances in the NCAA Division II Elite Eight. Peck is the only coach in GSC history to be selected coach of the year for three consecutive seasons (1996, 1997, 1998) and won the award four times overall. He also produced 20 All-Americans, and UNA set two individual and five NCAA Division II Tournament records under his guidance.

In 2002, UNA went 30-5, won the GSC volleyball title, and advanced to the NCAA Regional for the seventh time. In 2001, UNA was 32-4 and won its sixth straight GSC title before falling in the regional championship match.

It was 2000 when Peck and the Lions made their closest bid to the national title before winning it in 2003. UNA went 40-3 and reached the Division II Final Four for the first time. This included a 39-match win streak as well as GSC and NCAA Division II South Regional titles.

In 1999, the Lions went 35-7 and earned the school's second straight NCAA Division II South Central Regional championship and second consecutive appearance in the Division II Elite Eight. UNA also claimed a fourth straight GSC title.

In 1998, Peck led UNA to a 38-6 record and the Lions first-ever berth in the NCAA Division II Elite Eight. The Lions also climbed as high as seventh in the NCAA Division II national rankings.

Also in 1998, UNA hosted the NCAA Division II South Regional, and the Lions knocked off Alabama-Huntsville and Rockhurst to claim the school's first-ever regional volleyball title.

Before North Alabama, Peck coached in Michigan at Wayne State for 11 years, where his best season came in 1986, when he guided WSU to a 32-6 record and a top 15 ranking among NCAA Division II schools. The 32 victories set a school record for wins in a season.

In 1997, the Lions finished 39-5 on their way to a No. 8 national ranking, their second straight GSC championship and their second consecutive NCAA Regional appearance.

The 1996 Lions had a 44-4 record that included a Top 15 national ranking in Division II, a GSC Championship and the first NCAA Tournament bid ever received by any collegiate volleyball team from the state of Alabama. Peck joined UNA on July 17, 1995, inheriting a program that had enjoyed just three winning seasons in six years prior to his arrival. In his first season, Peck led UNA to a 21-20 record and third place finish in the GSC Tournament. The Lions recorded a 4-0 start, which was their best start in three years, and claimed the Francis Marion Invitational Championship. In 1996 UNA and Flowers Hall were selected as the site for the fourteam NCAA Division II South Central Regional, where the Lions downed Texas Women's University before falling to Central Missouri State in the championship game.

In 1987, WSU advanced to the NCAA Division II National Championships with a record of 27-7 and finished the season ranked No. 10. For his efforts in 1987, Peck was named GLIAC Coach of the Year. Wayne State also produced the school's first Division II volleyball All-American in 1987.

Wayne State was ranked in the Division II Top 20 four of Peck's last five years at the school. In 1992 WSU claimed three tournament championships and had a 17-0 mark against Division II opponents outside the GLIAC

A 1980 graduate of the University of Michigan with a B.A. in psychology, Peck received his master's degree in physical education-sports administration from Wayne State in 1992.

Peck is a native of Dearborn Heights, Mich.
