Quick hitters...

- For the fifth-consecutive season, a ranked opponent will play inside Murphy Center as No. 4/5 Xavier comes to town for tonight's matchup live on Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast (CSS)/ESPN3.com. Middle Tennessee director of broadcasting Chip Walters will handle the play-by-play, while Kyle Turnham will serve as the analyst.
- The Blue Raiders are coming off their first extended road trip of the season, a three-game swing, in which they posted a 2-1 record with wins over Tennessee Tech and UCF, while the lone loss was at ACC foe Georgia Tech.
- Middle Tennessee, despite its youth of 11 sophomores and freshmen on this year's squad, owns the Sun Belt's top overall record thus far at 6-2.
- Three Blue Raider post players (sophomore **Icelyn Elie** and freshmen **Ebony Rowe** and **KeKe Stewart**) accounted for 52 of the team's 77 points in Tuesday's win at UCF. Stewart netted a game-high 21 points and Rowe added 20, becoming the first set of Middle Tennessee teammates to tally at least 20 points since **Alysha Clark** had 40 and **Jackie Pickel** poured in 21 during the Sun Belt Tournament quarterfinal win against North Texas March 7, 2010, in Hot Springs, Ark.
- Tonight's contest will serve as the annual Pack the House Challenge game, a national contest conducted by the NCAA in which Middle Tennessee has won for the Sun Belt in two of the last three seasons, in 2008 and 2010. Last year's record crowd of 11,802 for the Tennessee game Nov. 25, 2009, was the contest designated by the Blue Raider marketing staff.

Youth is Served

Middle Tennessee field one of the youngest teams not only in the Sun Belt, but also across the country both in terms of age and experience. Only three Blue Raiders entered the season with at least one start in their collegiate careers and 11 of the 15 players on the roster are either sophomores or freshmen.

Seniors **Emily Queen** and **Anne Marie Lanning** comprise the elder stateswomen on the squad, followed by juniors **Molly McFadden** and **Tina Stewart**. Among the quartet, only McFadden has yet to start a game in her career.

The remaining players include sophomores **Jamila Ajanaku**, **Icelyn Elie**, **Kortni Jones** and **Dy-mon Raynor**, redshirt freshman **Lauren March** and true freshmen **Janay Brinkley**, **Laken Leonard**, **Jordyn Luffman**, **Stephanie Myers**, **Ebony Rowe** and **KeKe Stewart**.

Were you not here before?

Freshman **KeKe Stewart** may be a familiar name to hardcore Blue Raider fans. Stewart was an original member of Rick Insell's first recruiting class, in 2006, along with recent graduates Brandi Brown, Chelsia Lymon and Jackie Pickel that was ranked as high as No. 10 nationally.

Stewart came to campus the summer before her freshman campaign, went through workouts and then decided college and basketball were not what she wanted to continue doing. She returned home to Oak Ridge, Tenn., went to work and had a child before rededicating herself to furthering her education and returning to the court. After a series of meetings with Coach Insell and other members of the Middle Tennessee athletic administration, she was allowed to rejoin the team over the summer and has shown glimpses of the skills that made her the No. 2-rated forward in the state coming out of high school.

Who are you?

In addition to a very young team on the court, Rick Insell had a busy offseason replacing his entire coaching staff. Joining the Blue Raiders are three new assistant coaches, a new director of operations and a new graduate assistant.

Lynn Burkey, **Kim Clark** and **Alex Fuller** join Insell as members of the coaching staff.

Burkey is a long-time high school and AAU coach in Tennessee, most recently serving as the head coach at Shelbyville Central HS in Shelbyville, succeeding Insell six years ago when he took the reigns of the Middle Tennessee program.

Clark joins the Blue Raiders after having spent the last six seasons as an assistant coach at Gardner-Webb in Boiling Springs, N.C., where her father, Rick Reeves, is the head coach.

Fuller played for Insell at Shelbyville Central and went on to win a pair of National Championships at Tennessee under Pat Summitt. She most recently was a graduate manager at Kansas.

Midstate native **Mariska Harris** is the program's new director of operations. A former athletic and academic All-American at Trevecca Nazarene in Nashville, she was the head coach at Independence HS before coming to Middle Tennessee.

Joe Bonham is the new graduate assistant after serving the last four years as a manager for the Blue Raider program, including the last two as the team's head manager.

Another Strong Schedule

Middle Tennessee has never backed down from a challenging schedule since head coach Rick Insell took over in 2005-06. This year, despite the youth on the roster, he will maintain his reputation by playing one of the toughest non-conference slates in the country. Among the schools ranked in the Preseason Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches polls, two opponents (Xavier - 5th [media], 6th [coaches]; Kentucky - 9th [media], 11th [coaches]) were ranked in or just outside of the Top 10, while three others (Georgia Tech, James Madison and UALR in both and Western Kentucky by the coaches) received votes.

Debuting in Style

Middle Tennessee freshman **Ebony Rowe** made quite an impact in her first game as a Blue Raider during the season opener against USF Nov. 14.

She became the first MT freshman to earn a start in the season opener since **Anne Marie Lanning** at Old Dominion Nov. 10, 2007, and just the fourth overall under head coach **Rick Insell**.

Rowe, a Lexington, Ky., product, led all players with 25 points and 16 rebounds for her first career double-double.

She converted 9-of-11 field goals and 7-of-14 free throws, while adding three blocked shots, three assists and two steals in playing all 40 minutes.

Deeper Analysis of Rowe's Work

Looking back at **Ebony Rowe's** impact during her first game in the season opener against USF puts her game in perspective.

Of the 27 Blue Raiders who have made their MT debut under head coach **Rick Insell** (since 2005-06), Rowe's 16 rebounds rank first and her 25 points list her at third.

She is the only Middle Tennessee player among the group to record a double-double in her first game and is the only Blue Raider with double-digit rebounds in her first game under Insell's direction.

Even Deeper into Rowe's Strong Start

Rowe became just the second player in school history to register a double-double in her first two games at Middle Tennessee, joining **Robin Hendrix** who accomplished the feat in 1980-81.

Rowe earns League Honor

Freshman **Ebony Rowe** was recognized by the Sun Belt as its Nov. 16 Player of the Week, the first weekly honor given out this season. Middle Tennessee did not allow the Jackrabbits to score until 11:32 of the first half when South Dakota State snapped a 19-0 Blue Raider run to start the game.

The 19 points ended up being the final margin in the 70-51 victory.

Turnover Woes

Middle Tennessee forced a season-high 38 South Dakota State turnovers in the 70-51 win Nov. 28.

Among the miscues were a pair of backcourt violations, a three-second call, an expiration of the shot clock and a lane violation.

Twelve of the 38 turnovers came during the first eight minutes as the Blue Raiders built a 19-0 cushion on their way to the victory.

Middle Tennessee converted the 38 turnovers into 28 points, including 14 during that opening stretch.

Earning Her Stripes

Redshirt freshman **Lauren March** started her first collegiate game Nov. 28 against South Dakota State. March, who missed all of last season due to a preseason injury, was a part of the starting five in just her fourth collegiate game as a Blue Raider.

First Time Opponents

Middle Tennessee is playing three first-time opponents this season and each one in the

trio will be in the Blue Raiders' next two weeks, which started Dec. 3 at Georgia Tech.

Middle Tennessee also are squaring off with James Madison (Dec. 12 in Murfreesboro) and St. Bonaventure (Dec. 20 in San Antonio at the UTSA Holiday Classic) in first-time meetings.

It's Gotta be the Mask, not the Shoes

Sophomore **Kortni Jones** wore a special face mask for the Nov. 26 home game against ETSU after injuring her nose in practice a few days prior.

While at first hesitant to wear it, the mask became a non issue as Jones erupted for a career-high 19 points to lead all players in scoring. She converted 5-of-7 3-pointers and 7-of-13 field goals overall, while handing out seven assists and swiping four steals in 33 minutes.

Jones joked afterwards about it helping her to a good game and declared she would wear it until she had a bad game, which she said she hopes never happens.

The mask continued to work wonders in the next game, Nov. 28 against South Dakota State, as she handed out a career-high 10 assists and swiped a career-best seven steals in 30 minutes.

Helping Others During Holiday Season

Middle Tennessee did its part to help others during the Thanksgiving holiday season as it handed out 24 assists among 30 field goals in the Nov. 26 home win over ETSU, the day after the holiday.

The Blue Raiders received seven assists apiece from senior **Anne Marie Lanning** and sophomore **Kortni Jones**.

MT also limited the Lady Bucs to just 11 assists in the game.

The proficiency was maintained in the next game, Nov. 28 against South Dakota State, as the Blue Raiders distributed 20 assists among their 23 field goals (87.0 percent). Jones paced the squad with a career-best 10 assists, finishing one shy of entering the school's single-game Top 10 list.

In the two games combined, Middle Tennessee handed out 44 assists on 53 field goals made for a 83.0 percent ratio.

Related, but Not Related

While Middle Tennessee has two players on this year's team with the last name **Stewart** (junior **Tina** and freshman **KeKe**), the two players are not related as they hail from different parts of the state. Tina is a native of Memphis, while KeKe is from Oak Ridge.

However, **KeKe Stewart** is related to sophomore **Kortni Jones**, as the pair are cousins from Oak Ridge, Tenn.

In terms of class years, Jones may be a sophomore as opposed to K. Stewart being a freshman; however, K. Stewart is three years older than Jones.

The pair both graduated from Oak Ridge HS -- K. Stewart in 2006 and Jones in 2009.

Insell Moving Up the List
