

Blue Raiders hold kicking scrimmage

Stockstill pleased with improvement

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COACH RICK STOCKSTILL ON MONDAY'S KICKING SCRIMMAGE: "I thought it went well. We had some improvement, but still made a couple of mistakes that we need to correct. But for the most part I thought the kicking and execution was sound. Overall, I was pleased with the kicking part of the practice but we are still too inconsistent."

COACH RICK STOCKSTILL ON SATURDAY'S SCRIMMAGE AFTER REVIEWING FILM: "It confirmed everything that I thought I saw. I thought we played better on defense than we did the first scrimmage, were more fundamentally sound and more "gap" sound. I thought we played our responsibility better and we tackled well. Offensively, I was pleased that we didn't have any turnovers. I thought our protection was good. Benny (Cunningham) didn't get a whole lot of work, but I thought William Pratcher looked good when he was in there. He's a guy that looks like we can depend on, that'll be able to help us this year. Our receivers were consistent in catching the ball, and we didn't have a bunch of drops. It was a good, solid day."



COACH RICK STOCKSTILL ON PHILLIP TANNER'S PLAY WITH THE COWBOYS SUNDAY NIGHT: "I didn't see it, but I did see the link to it, and saw his interview. I talked to Phillip last night after the game, and I told him how proud I was of him, and that he was doing a good job. He's played well in the kicking game and been productive offensively. He's healthy, he's out there, and he's got a great attitude which is typical Phillip. When he was here, he was a phenomenal young man who came to work every day and was a pleasure to coach. We wish him all the best."

COACH JOE CAUTHEN ON THE SPECIAL TEAMS PLAY: "It's coming together, but we still have

this week and next to get ready for our first game. It's a process, so we can't necessarily worry about the end process yet. We are getting better each day, and I think we got better today. Getting lined up is the first thing. I saw some good things on our kickoff, our punt return looked good, and we communicated on our kickoff returns. "If we had to pinpoint one area to work on, it would be the fundamentals of playing football. Every day we have to come out here and learn how to attack a block, how to defeat a block, and make a tackle. Also, cover kicks and protect our kicker. Our punt team looked great today. It's coming together."

ALAN GENDREAU ON HIS KICKING (He made 6 of 7 FGs with lone miss coming from 51 yards):
"I did pretty well, but I had some nice help from the wind. The 53-yarder was just shy of my best of 55 (which is the current Sun Belt Conference record). The kicking game is going really well, and the guys are coming together."
