

Simmons, Faulkner talk about backfield as Blue Raiders hit final stretch to opener

COACH BUSTER FAULKNER ON THE QUARTERBACKS: “We are excited to have two quality, experienced quarterbacks in our program. Logan (Kilgore) will take most of the snaps with the first team, and when Murphy is called upon, he’s always ready. We are excited about both of them. It’s one of the best quarterback battles I’ve ever been around. They’ve both played well.

“It’s a shame that both can’t play, but at the quarterback position, you can only play one. Right now, Logan is our quarterback, we are moving forward with him as our starter. We look forward to continue to get better with him.”



COACH WILLIE SIMMONS ON BENNY CUNNINGHAM: “Benny Cunningham has had a phenomenal camp. He brings a workman’s attitude every single day, in the meeting rooms, on the field, every day. You can’t coach that. He’s got something special inside of him. A lot of the guys feed off of him, and I think that is why he is probably our best team leader. He’s been just what we expected. He doesn’t take a day off; he doesn’t take a play off, he doesn’t take a rep off. His enthusiasm is contagious, and that is what he brings to the table. He has a great attitude. He enjoys playing the game of football. He actually enjoys practice, and that’s pretty rare to get guys who truly enjoy practice. He’s not afraid to get in guys’ faces and tell them to get going. That’s what makes him such a great leader.”

COACH WILLIE SIMMONS ON D.D. KYLES: “Right now D.D. Kyles is injured with hamstring and ankle problems. He’s a guy that, if he can get back healthy this week, get back in shape, then he could help us at Purdue. His biggest deal is consistency. He is a player who can do things with the

football, it's just a matter of getting him in the right position where he can make plays and not let his lack of practice hurt us in certain situations.”

COACH WILLIE SIMMONS ON WILLIAM PRATCHER: “He’s had a strong camp. He’s gained a lot of confidence in himself as well as within the coaching staff. If D.D. (Kyles) can’t go, we have a lot of confidence in Pratcher as our Number two back. He has a great attitude and great work ethic. I think a lot of that has to do with Benny (Cunningham), and how those two guys challenge each other.”

“Benny, Pratcher and Marquise Branton will all play on special teams. Coach Stockstill has always put the best athletes on special teams. They all know that they have to excel on special teams for us to win.”

DT JIMMY STATEN ON ANCHORING THE DEFENSIVE LINE: “It’s a lot of responsibility, but I’m ready to go. We are all depending on each other, it’s not just me. Omar McLendon is going to be a real big factor on the line at one end. Kendall Dangerfield is going to do a great job this year at tackle. JiaJuan Fennell, a redshirt freshman, has been playing well and could be a starter at the other end.”

“Like Minnesota last year, Purdue has a big offensive line, but I think we will be fine if we stay low and play hard. No one can take a play off.”

“We can’t worry about being “young” or “inexperienced”. We’ve got players who can play. All we can do is play hard. It’s time for everybody to step up.”

CRAIG ALLEN ON HIS FIRST START: “Am I nervous? I’ve played football a long time and I’m used to it by now. I’m proud to be starting, and I have worked for this for a long time. I played some last year against Minnesota as a freshman, so it won’t be a totally new experience. I’m a lot more prepared this year. I know where I’m supposed to be, whether inside or outside. And I know my teammates better. I’m also playing on all the special teams.”
