Middle Tennessee aiming for tournament success

For the sixth consecutive season and just the seventh time in program history, the Middle Tennessee volleyball team earned a spot in the NCAA Tournament field. The Blue Raiders were selected via at-large bid, marking the second in school history, and the first since the 2008 season.

The Blue and White have won 19 of their previous 21 matches en route to a second place finish in the Sun Belt Conference. The Blue Raiders will be looking to even their 4-5 tournament record under the direction of head coach Matt Peck.

Blue Raiders in the NCAA Tournament

Prior to Matt Peck taking over Middle Tennessee volleyball in 2004, the Blue Raiders had only made the NCAA Tournament on one occasion in school history, 1995. Things have changed as of late, and now the Blue and White are competing in their sixth tournament in as many years.

The Blue Raiders earned their berth via an at-large selection, the first since 2008. That season also marked the last time that MT advanced out of the first round, a feat that Middle Tennessee would love to repeat.

Under Peck, MT carries a 4-5 tournament record, advancing to the second round in both 2006 and 2008 and the round of 16 in 2007. The Blue Raiders fell in a hard-fought five sets to eventual Sweet 16 team Colorado State in 2009 and were defeated 3-0 by Louisville last year.

Middle Tennessee Volleyball

Middle Tennessee amid best run in Sun Belt history

The Middle Tennessee volleyball team is the most successful program in conference history when it comes to NCAA play. The Blue Raiders are tied with Western Kentucky with six appearances in the event, but the Blue and White have been far more successful in tournament play. MT carries an overall 4-5 record in the NCAA Tournament. The rest of the Sun Belt, dating back to the 1992 season, holds an overall 2-19 mark, with FIU accounting for both wins (in 2001 and 2008, respectively).

Blue Raiders on December 1

Middle Tennessee holds a sterling 2-0 record on December 1, boasting of Tournament victories over both Louisville in 2006 and ninth-ranked Hawaii in 2007. Both matches were played in Louisville.

Three Blue Raiders named All-Sun Belt

The trio of Ashley Adams, Maria Szivos and Oyinlola Oladinni all made return trips to the All-Sun Belt teams this season after each accomplished the feat last season. Adams and Szivos each earned First Team honors for the second straight year, and Oladinni was named a Second Teamer for the third season in a row.

Oladinni and Adams both took home All-Tournament honors for their performances in last week's Sun Belt Tournament. Oladinni earned the honors for the second straight season, and it was the first such honor for Adams.

Blue Raiders vs. Ohio State

Thursday marks the second-ever meeting between Middle Tennessee and Ohio State. The Buckeyes own the 1-0 advantage after taking home a 3-1 victory over the Blue Raiders in the 2006 NCAA Tournament Second Round in Louisville.

Historically, the Blue Raiders are 1-9 vs. Big Ten teams, with the lone win coming in the 1992 season over Northwestern. The Blue and White have matched up with a Big Ten school twice in the NCAA Tournament, falling to OSU in 2006 and at Purdue in 2008.

The Blue Raiders have a better record in neutral site NCAA Tournament matches, tallying a 2-3 mark with wins over Hawaii in Louisville in 2007 and Miami (Ohio) at Purdue in 2008.

The Buckeyes are coming into Thursday's match with an overall record of 19-14, including a 9-11 mark in Big Ten play. They will be making their 18th tournament appearance this year after a surprising run to the Sweet 16 last season, making Ohio State the fourth team MT has played this season who made the round of 16 a year ago. The Blue Raiders lost 3-0 to both Minnesota and Illinois, but knocked off Missouri in 3-1 fashion in the other meetings.

The hunt for 1,000

Another Blue Raider is within reaching distance of the 1,000 kill plateau this season. Oyinlola Oladinni currently has 995 kills and she is looking to become just the 12th player in school history to join the 1,000 kill club.

Blue Raiders run off a school record 16 consecutive wins

After flirting with breaking the school record for consecutive wins last year, the 2011 edition got the job done with 16 straight wins, surpassing the previous mark of 14, set in both the 2007 and 2010 seasons. The record looked to be in doubt in match 15 of the streak, as the Blue Raiders held off a feisty Troy squad, coming from behind twice to win 3-2. WKU ended the streak in five set fashion a week later.

Running off the wins in itself was pretty unexpected after the Blue Raiders dropped seven straight matches prior to winning the 16 in a row.

Defense key in streak

Middle Tennessee ranked first in opponent attack percentage in Sun Belt play this season. Conference foes are hit at a .127 rate against the Blue Raiders, and MT held six consecutive SBC opponents under .100 from Oct. 20 to Nov. 6.

Adams in rarefied air

With 24 kills on Oct. 26 vs. Georgia Tech, Ashley Adams has now recorded three 20+ kill matches this season. The junior is now one of just two Blue Raiders to achieve the feat in the 25-point rally scoring era. Former Blue Raider Izabela Kozon accomplished it in both the 2008 and 2010 campaigns. Adams has also been strong blocking at the net this season and boasts of 17 solo blocks, the most by a Blue Raider since KeKe Deckard put up 18 in 2004.

Wistrick reaches 1,000 kill plateau

In the first set last Saturday against Denver, Alyssa Wistrick surpassed the 1,000 kill mark for her career. The senior came to Middle Tennessee in 2009 having totaled 640 for the College of Southern Idaho, and she has now tallied 424 at Middle Tennessee. Wistrick is entering the weekend with 1,064 career kills.

Henderson tallies 1,000th dig

Brynne Henderson tallied a pair of digs in the third and final set against Marquette last week to become just the ninth Blue Raider in history to surpass 1,000 career digs. The senior, who has served as a defensive specialist or libero in nearly every set over the past four seasons now has 1,147 career digs, which ranks ninth all-time in the MT record books.

Adams earns SBC Player of the Week

Ashley Adams picked up her second Sun Belt Player of the Week award this season on October 10 as the junior totaled 42 kills at a .329 rate to go along with 11 blocks in a trio of wins over Western Kentucky, Troy and South Alabama. After handing Western their first loss in 15 matches on Tuesday, Adams led in kills MT in each of the weekend's matches, including 20 in a 3-0 win over Troy, becoming just the second Blue Raider to eclipse 20 in three sets since the NCAA switched to the current 25-point rally scoring rules.

Earlier this season on August 29, Adams became the first Blue Raider to take home Player of the Week honors this season after the school set a record with seven such awards last year. After posting 17 kills and 13 kills against Colorado State and Arkansas, respectively, the junior shared the weekly recognition with Western Kentucky's Tiffany Elmore. Since joining the conference in 2000, Middle Tennessee has garnered Player of the Week ac-

colades on 23 occasions, tied with WKU for most over that time.

Blue Raiders statistical rankings (as of November 28)

As the season has gotten underway, the Middle Tennessee volleyball team has assumed their normal perch at or near the top of the conference rankings. The Blue Raiders are currently second in attack percentage (.271), kills per set (13.63), assists per set (12.69) and blocks per set (2.58).

In Sun Belt matches, the Blue Raiders are tops in the conference in opponent attack percentage (.127) and second in attack percentage (.280), kills per set (13.70), service aces per set (1.31) and blocks per set (2.85).

Individually, Oyinlola Oladinni is second in the conference in attack percentage at .373 and blocks per set at 1.14. Ashley Adams is fourth in kills per set at 3.82.

In conference matches, Oladinni is second in attack percentage at .379 and fourth in blocks per set at 1.16. Adams is fifth in kills per set (3.65). Morgan Peterson ranks seventh in assists per set (9.63), and Lindsay Cheatham is third in blocks per set (1.27).

Szivos reaches 1,000 career kills

Maria Szivos entered the 2011 season just 24 kills shy of 1,000 for her career, and in Sept. 1's win over Missouri, the senior joined the club. Szivos, a transfer from New Orleans prior to the 2010 season, now has 1,287 kills. The Hungarian tallied 690 kills at UNO to go along with 597 for the Blue Raiders.

Szivos voted Preseason Player of the Year

Maria Szivos became the first Blue Raider in history to earn Preseason Player of the Year honors last week after a banner debut season in Murfreesboro in 2010. The senior earned Sun Belt First Team and All-Tournament honors last year and Second Team honors for New Orleans as a sophomore. Previously, Alicia Lemau'u earned Preseason Defensive Player of the Year accolades in both 2006 and 2007.

Two Blue Raiders earn preseason honors

In addition to Szivos, Ashley Adams earned a spot on the All-Sun Belt Preseason team. The junior was a revelation at outside hitter last season after Alyssa Wistrick suffered a knee injury early in the season. After playing in a reserve role as a freshman, Adams became a First Team All-Sun Belt honoree and ranked among the league leaders in kills per set.

A well-traveled roster

Of the 15 players on the Middle Tennessee roster, 10 are from outside the state of Tennessee, spanning across the United States. Lindsay Cheatham and Kaylee Kehoe are from Florida and Georgia respectively. Ashley Adams is from California, Alyssa Wistrick hails from Washington, Kendall Howard is a Colorado native and Angela Peyton calls Texas her home. The midwest is also well represented with Brandi Waller (Indiana), Brynne Henderson (Ohio) and Tyler Richardson (Michigan).

However, Maria Szivos likely racks up more mileage than anyone else on the team, as she makes her home in Jaszbereny, Hungary.

Middle Tennessee in its 35th season

The Blue Raiders will begin their 35th season in 2011. Since 1984, the first season that full results are available, MT holds an overall record of 385-46. However the Blue Raiders are amid their most successful run in school history, having played in each of the last five NCAA Tournaments. Since 2006, Middle Tennessee boasts of a 163-45 mark and a 88-11 record in Sun Belt play.

Eighth Season

Entering his eighth season at the helm of the Middle Tennessee volleyball program, Matt Peck has garnered a reputation as one of the best coaches in the region and has built the Blue Raiders into a perennial Sun Belt Conference contender.

Joining Middle Tennessee after nine seasons of building North Alabama into a Division II powerhouse, Peck has experienced enormous success in Murfreesboro, leading Middle Tennessee to their most successful run in school history. The Blue Raiders have gone to five consecutive NCAA Tournaments and have won four Sun Belt Tournament Championships and three Sun Belt regular season titles.

Peck's mark on the program can be seen throughout the record books. The winningest coach in school history, Peck holds an overall 143-53 mark at Middle Tennessee. Since taking over in 2004, Peck has coached each of MT's individual statistical leaders in kills (KeKe Deckard), assists (Leslie Clark) and digs (Alicia Lemau'u).

Under Peck's tutelage, a Blue Raider has been named to either the All-Sun Belt First or Second Team a remarkable 21 times, with eight going on to take home All-America Honorable Mention accolades from the American Volleyball Coaches Association. Peck has also coached four Sun Belt Tournament Most Outstanding Players, two Sun Belt Players of the Year and one Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Year.

Buoyed by the combination of the winningest senior class in school history and a number of impressive young players, Peck and the Blue Raiders turned in one of the most successful seasons in school history in 2010. Middle Tennessee posted one of their best ever conference records, going 15-1 en route to posting an overall mark of 29-6 and ending the season with an outright Sun Belt regular season championship and becoming the first conference team to win the tournament title on their home floor since 1999.

Following the season, Peck earned his second Sun Belt Coach of the Year Award.

Peck also helped Izabela Kozon, who is regarded as one of the best players in school history, take home a Sun Belt record-tying five SBC Player of the Week awards on the way to winning Sun Belt Player of the Year and Sun Belt Tournament Most Outstanding Player. She also garnered AVCA All-American Honorable Mention, marking the fifth consecutive season a Blue Raider has been so honored.

In fact, Middle Tennessee had two players earn All-American Honorable Mention as Second Team All-Sun Belt member Oyinlola Oladinni earned the recognition for the second consecutive season.

Maria Szivos and Ashley N. Adams rounded out the individual accolades for the Blue Raiders in 2010, each earning a place on the All-Sun Belt First Team, giving Middle Tennessee four All-SBC performers for just the second time in school history.

Peck guided the Blue Raiders to a conference tournament title in 2009. Led by the outstanding play of Sun Belt First Teamers Kozon and Clark and Sun Belt Tournament Most Outstanding Player Ash-

ley Mead, Middle Tennessee ran up a 25-10 record and knocked off SBC regular season champion FIU in four sets in the title match, the only loss FIU suffered to a conference opponent all season.

In addition to Kozon and Clark, Mead and Oladinni picked up Second Team honors, the latter of which was awarded All-American Honorable Mention by the AVCA. Janay Yancey and Clark were also named to the All-Tournament squad.

In 2008, Peck directed the Middle Tennessee volleyball squad to a new plateau, earning the school's first-ever at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament. After opening the season with nine consecutive victories, the Blue Raiders finished with a remarkable 27-8 record, winning a five-set thriller over Miami (Ohio) in the NCAAs before falling to host Purdue in similar fashion.

Clark and Ashley Asberry keyed the Blue Raiders individually, earning both First Team All-Sun Belt First Team and AVCA All-American Honorable Mention honors. Kozon was named to the All-SBC Second Team.

The 2007 season marked one of the best seasons by any Sun Belt team in any sport as the Blue Raiders posted a school record 35-3 record and made it to the Penn State Regional in the NCAA Tournament. Middle Tennessee opened up with a ten-match winning streak, and posted three double-digit win streaks over the course of the season, including setting a school record with 14 straight.

Peck was named Sun Belt Coach of the Year, a first for the Middle Tennessee program.

MT earned the outright Sun Belt regular season championship, also a first for the school, and took home the tournament title to earn an automatic bid to the NCAA Louisville subregional. After knocking off host Louisville in five sets in the opener, the Blue Raiders earned a trip to the Sweet 16 with a 3-1 decision over ninth-ranked Hawaii to punch their ticket to the Penn State Regional in State College, Pa., where they ultimately fell to BYU.

Peck coached Ashley E. Adams to one of the best individual seasons in MT history, earning the program's first ever Sun Belt Player of the Year honor to go along with her second consecutive SBC Tournament Most Outstanding Player award. The junior also grabbed her second straight All-American Honorable Mention accolade.

Aside from Adams, Asberry also took home All-American Honorable Mention and First Team All-Sun Belt honors. Clark rounded out the honors with placement on the First Team as well.

Peck led the Blue Raiders to their first NCAA Tournament since 1995, taking home a share of the Sun Belt's regular season title and winning the conference tournament. The Blue Raiders posted a 27-8 record and knocked off host Louisville in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament before falling to 18th-ranked Ohio State.

Adams was recognized as an All-America Honorable Mention and became the first-ever Blue Raider to win the Sun Belt Tournament Most Outstanding

Player award. She joined teammates Asberry and Quanshell Scott on the All-SBC First Team, marking the first time that three MT players had earned the honors in a single season. Scott and Jessica Robinson were named to the All-Tournament squad.

Peck guided Middle Tennessee to the second most wins in program history in 2005, going 28-4 and making it to the Sun Belt title match for the first time in history.

Under Peck's direction, Lemau'u was named to the All-Sun Belt First Team and became the first Blue Raider to take home SBC Defensive Player of the Year honors.

In just his first year at the helm of the MT volleyball program, Peck led Middle Tennessee to a 17-14 record and a 9-5 mark in Sun Belt play, marking the first time that the Blue Raiders posted a winning conference record since 1995.

Under Peck's guidance, Deckard and Dara McLean became the first All-Sun Belt First Team performers since the 2000 season.

Prior to coming to Murfreesboro, Peck established himself as one of the best coaches in Division II, leading the University of North Alabama to a national title in 2003 and earning National Coach of the Year honors.

Peck developed a national powerhouse at UNA, compiling a 312-61 record over nine years, and leading the Lions to seven consecutive Gulf South Conference titles, eight straight NCAA Tournament appearances and advanced to the Elite Eight in each of his final four seasons.

Peck earned GSC Coach of the Year four times, including a stretch of three consecutive from 1996-98. In 2010, the Gulf South Conference named Peck their Coach of the Decade.

Peck also showed a knack for player development in his time in Florence, coaching an astounding 35 All-GSC selections, 24 All-Tournament performers and 12 AVCA All-Americans.

Before joining North Alabama, Peck served as the head coach for seven seasons (1987-94) at Wayne State University. Peck led the Warriors to a 231-135 record, including NCAA Tournament trips in 1987 and 1994.

Prior to WSU, Peck coached volleyball on the high school level in Indiana and also served as a graduate assistant for the men's volleyball team at Purdue University from 1980-83. In addition, Peck worked with various volleyball clubs in the West Lafayette, Ind., area.

Peck is a graduate of the University of Michigan and a native of Dearborn Heights, Mich.
