Middle Tennessee welcomes conference foe Western Kentucky to Blue Raider Field today for a doubleheader. First pitch for Game 1 is set for 1 p.m. CT with the second game beginning 30 minutes following the first game's conclusion.

Today's doubleheader will be the conclusion of the squads' three-game season series. The Blue Raiders defeated the Lady Toppers 8-4 on April 24 in Bowling Green.

Middle Tennessee (16-31, 5-16 Sun Belt) will not be without motivation on Saturday against Western Kentucky (29-23-1, 9-12-1 Sun Belt). In addition to the long-time animosity that exists between the two schools, the Blue Raiders will be playing for a berth in next week's Sun Belt Tournament. The squad is currently tied with Florida Atlantic for the eighth and final spot in the field and Saturday's doubleheader coupled with the Owls' results this weekend against FIU will determine who receives the final berth. Also, with Saturday being Senior Day, the squad will be battling to send out its five seniors with what would certainly be a memorable sweep of the Lady Toppers.

Today's opener is the 44th all-time meeting on the diamond between the two schools. Middle Tennessee currently holds a 23-21 lead in the series following last month's victory.

Senior Caty Jutson enters play Saturday coming off a pair of solid performances beginning with a terrific performance in relief the last time the two squads met. The Phoenix, Ariz., product allowed just one earned run in six innings to help lead the Blue Raiders to their 8-4 victory. She followed that up with a complete game last weekend against Florida Atlantic in which she limited the Owls to two earned runs en route to Middle Tennessee's 11-4 win.

The Blue Raiders have been led at the dish by their trio of senior starters. Natalie Ysais hit .500 last week to up her season average to .289. She also added a home run, four RBIs and three runs scored to help Middle Tennessee to a 3-1 record. Meanwhile Kelsey Woodruff has tallied eight hits in her last 18 at-bats while smashing three long balls, knocking in seven runs and crossing the plate five times.

Kaycee Popham also had a productive final week of April at the plate. The Silver Creek, Ga., native has hit .471 over her last five games with a home run and five runs scored. She paces the team with 10 dingers, 27 RBIs and 27 runs scored.

The Blue Raiders will know their status for the Sun Belt Tournament by the end of the day Saturday. Stay tuned to the teams' social media pages throughout the weekend for updates.

SENIOR SALUTE

Middle Tennessee is honoring its five seniors today. Caty Jutson, Kaycee Popham, Abbey Sanders, Kelsey Woodruff and Natalie Ysais will be formally recognized following the doubleheader.

TONEY TO THE RESCUE

Blue Raider second baseman/designated player Kayla Toney returned to the lineup last week after missing 14 games due to injury. Even after her time away, the sophomore still leads the team in a number of offensive categories including slugging (.667), on-base percentage (.487) and doubles (12). Meanwhile she is second on the squad with 25 runs scored and third on the team with eight stolen bases. She went 2-4 with a home run and three runs knocked in against Western Kentucky and finished the week batting .500 over Middle Tennessee's four games. Perhaps most telling of her importance to the squad is the fact that the Blue Raiders went 1-13 in Toney's three-week absence.

POP STILL POPPING

First baseman Kaycee Popham has been Middle Tennessee's leading run producer in 2012. She hit her 10th home run of the season against Western Kentucky last week to extend her team-lead. She also leads the team in RBIs (27), hits (48), total bases (84) and runs scored (27).

SAY WHAT, YSAIS?

Known for her excellent handling of the Blue Raider pitching staff, catcher/designated player Natalie Ysais continues to provide Middle Tennessee with solid production at the plate. After a slow start offensively in 2012, she has increased her average to .287. The senior leads the team in walks with 14 on the season while ranking third with a .373 on-base percentage.

A WONDERFUL WOODRUFF

Right fielder Kelsey Woodruff has been a pleasant surprise for the Blue Raiders this season. After batting .257 in 27 games a year ago, she currently maintains a .336 clip at the plate which puts her second on the team. Even with her improved average, Woodruff has not lost any power as she is second on the squad with eight dingers while slugging .594 and tallying 25 RBIs.

DAVENPORT DELIVERING

After seeing her batting average dip to a season-low .194 on March 2, center fielder Nina Davenport has found her groove at the plate. Despite seeing her season-high seven-game hitting streak come to an end last weekend, the Chattanooga, Tenn., product has composed a .344 batting average over her last eight games. She also has 11 stolen bases this season which puts her second on the team behind Nina Dever. Strikeouts continue to be Davenport's downfall, however, as she is second on the Middle Tennessee team with 27. In addition, she has walked just five times while primarily serving as the Blue Raiders' lead-off batter.

FIRST BASE PHENOM

Kaycee Popham recently moved into first place on the Middle Tennessee all-time putout list. She now has 1,272 career putouts as she passed former Blue Raider catcher Melanie Manley who ended her career with 1,118. She entered the week second in the Sun Belt in putouts this season and she now has 341 on the year.

EXTRA! EXTRA!

After going the first 39 games of the season without playing an extra-inning game, Middle Tennessee played two in a two-week span in mid-April. The Blue Raiders knocked off FIU 2-1 in nine innings on April 18 before falling to Troy 6-5 in 10 innings on April 22.

WALKING OFF

Third baseman Kristi Marquez hit a one-out single to left field in the bottom of the ninth, scoring Samantha Nieves from third base to give the Blue Raiders a thrilling 2-1 walk-off victory in the squad's series finale with FIU on April 18. It was the third win of that fashion as Middle Tennessee also walked off with victories on March 10 against Eastern Michigan while defeating Eastern Illinois with a last-inning hit on March 14.

COMPLETE CRAZINESS

Middle Tennessee and FIU pitchers combined to throw four complete games in their doubleheader on April 17. Game 1 saw Blue Raider starter Shelby Stinnett allow two earned runs on seven hits in seven innings while she was countered by Panther pitcher Mariah Dawson who gave up just one earned run on three hits. Middle Tennessee's Katy Jutson and FIU's Jenn Gniadek followed with similar performances. Jutson surrendered one earned run on nine knocks compared to Gniadek who did not allow a run while limiting the Blue Raiders to just four hits.

ENTICING THE ERROR

Middle Tennessee starter Katy Jutson has been bitten by the error bug this season as she has given up 30 unearned runs this season in 126.0 innings pitched. The Phoenix, Ariz., native allowed nine unearned runs alone to UL-Lafayette on April 14.

THREE TIMES SIX

Blue Raider center fielder Nina Davenport currently leads the Sun Belt with six triples on the season. Chelsea Good and Kayla Toney are the only other Blue Raiders to record a three-bagger in 2012 as they both have one.

BLUE BATS A BELTIN'

Middle Tennessee is currently batting .272 as a team which ties them for third in the Sun Belt with Western Kentucky and Troy at week's beginning. The Blue Raiders meanwhile are slugging at a .429 clip which put them second in the league and their 41 home runs in 2012 is equal with North Texas for second as well.

GET LOW

The Blue Raiders currently have a record of 16-9 when holding its opponents to five runs or fewer while the squad is 0-22 when giving up more than five runs.

TURNING TWO

Middle Tennessee has turned 24 double plays this season which put them first in the Sun Belt at week's beginning. The squad had three twin-killings alone in their 3-0 defeat of Alabama State on March 11.

FIRST PRIORITY

The first inning has often told the tale early for the Blue Raiders in 2012. The squad is 3-16 when allowing its opponents to score in the first inning. Meanwhile Middle Tennessee is 4-18 when its opponents get on the board before the Blue Raiders.

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Defense is the recipe for success for Middle Tennessee this season. The squad is 10-6 when not committing an error and 6-25 when committing at least one. The Blue Raiders have made 64 errors this season while maintaining a .955 fielding percentage.

SIX INNING STORY

The Blue Raiders hold an 11-1 clip when having the lead after six innings of play. Conversely, the squad is 1-20 when trailing entering the seventh inning.

GIVE HER A HAND

Junior third baseman Kristi Marquez has already racked up a whopping 112 assists while manning the hot corner for the Blue Raiders, 12 more than Samantha Nieves who is second on the team. She entered the week second in the Sun Belt in the category.

BATTING BONANZA

Middle Tennessee and Troy combined for 86 at-bats, 28 hits and 45 total bases during their 10-inning contest on April 22. All are highs in the Sun Belt for the 2012 season.

SILLINESS IN THE SEVENTH

Middle Tennessee won a game in rather unusual fashion earlier this season. The Blue Raiders scored three runs in the bottom of the seventh to come from behind and defeat Eastern Michigan 6-5 on March 10. EMU pitchers hit four Middle Tennessee batters in the inning, including Laura Dukes who recorded the game-winning RBI after getting plunked, allowing Kayla Toney to score. Interestingly, the inning featured no hits or errors and the ball never left the infield.

Sue Nevar is in her fifth season as the head coach of the Middle Tennessee program.

Prior to coming to the Murfreesboro, Nevar was a highly-successful head coach at Kent State from 1986-96, leading the Golden Flashes to the Women's College World Series in 1990 while posting a 43-9 record.

Nevar was voted coach of the year in both the MAC and the NCAA Midwest Region in 1990 after leading the Flashes to their first-ever MAC and NCAA regional titles and finishing seventh in the country.

While in Kent, she coached 12 First Team All-MAC selections, two conference players of the year and six All-Midwest Region First Team honorees as well as one Canadian Olympic player. Nevar placed a high priority on academics from the day she stepped foot on campus at Middle Tennessee and she has quickly built a program that is extremely successful in the classroom. The Blue Raiders have won the Sun Belt Academic Team Award three of the past four years. She has continued her academic success from her tenure at KSU where she had 24 MAC First Team All-Academic selections, seven Academic All-America recipients and one Academic All-America Player of the Year.

Before becoming the head coach at Kent State, Nevar was an assistant at Texas A&M (1982-84) and Ohio State (1985). While in College Station, the Aggies won the AIAW national championship in 1982, an NCAA title in 1983 and finished second at the Women's College World Series in 1984.

The Fairlawn, Ohio, native played collegiately at Indiana, earning four varsity letters each in softball and volleyball from 1977-80. She won the Big 10 batting title as a junior and helped lead IU to a runner-up finish at the AIAW College World Series as a senior while earning All-America honors from the Amateur Softball Association (ASA). Nevar graduated from Indiana in 1981 with her B.S. in physical education.

In recognition of her outstanding coaching tenure with the Golden Flashes, Nevar was inducted into the Kent State Hall of Fame. She was also a member of the inaugural class of the Copley High School Athletic Hall of Fame in honor of her three-sport career from 1973-76.

Nevar and husband, Bob, have spent the last 15 years in the Middle Tennessee area with their three children - Brent (16), Katie (14) and Tyler (10). She worked as a scout for the National Scouting Report for four years in Tennessee before taking over the helm of the Blue Raiders, and also stayed involved with the game by giving private hitting and pitching lessons.
