Middle Tennessee women's basketball is now in week three of fall practice. Coach Rick Insell and his staff have been busy working on fundamentals and schemes for the upcoming season.

Recently, GoBlueRaiders.com sat down with sophomore transfer TiAnna Porter to talk about her experience so far at MT. Porter, a native of Paris, Tenn., transferred to MT from Pittsburgh earlier this year. While with the Panthers, Porter averaged 2.9 points in 21 games played. She will sit out the 2012-13 season due to NCAA transfer rules.



Q: How has your transition been to Middle Tennessee so far?
